## ROYAL COMMISSION AS TO THE PRACTICE OF SECRET COMMISSIONS ALLEGED TO EXIST IN THE BUTTER TRADE. EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE COMMISSION.

At an Executive Council, held at the Law Courts, Melbourne,  
on the 18th day of April, 1904.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 11th day of April, 1904,

GEORGE COWIE MORRISON, Esq.,  
The Honorable GEORGE GRAHAM, M.P., and  
HENRY GYLES TURNER, Esq.,

were appointed a Royal Commission to inquire and report as to the practice which is alleged to exist in the Butter Trade, of Secret Commissions, in the form of rebates of freight or commission, discount, brokerage, or otherwise, being given or made to certain exporters or agents for exporters or others by ship-owners or others, and also, so far as is necessary for the purposes of the above, to inquire as to all payments of whatever kind made in connexion with the shipment, carriage, or sale of butter: And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend the powers of the said Commission: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend the powers of the said Commission by defining the objects of the inquiry in the manner following, that is to say:—

To inquire into and report upon the alleged payments of secret commissions, rebates, discounts, brokerages, refunds, or other concessions on ocean freights on butter, the allegations of

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bribery or allowances to or on the part of agents, merchants, and others, the alleged improper preparation of or alterations in account sales, the alleged manipulation of brands, and all other matters appertaining to the production, transport, export and sale or realization of or other dealings with butter, or in connexion with any of the above matters or in anywise arising thereout.

This Order to have effect on and from the 11th day of April, 1904.

And the Honorable Sir Samuel Gillott, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

In 101 instances twins, and in four cases triplets, were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 12,012, the confinements must have numbered 11,903. Thus one mother in 109 gave birth to more than one infant, as compared with 1 in 91 in 1902, 1 in 96 in 1901, 1 in 85 in 1900, 1 in 87 in 1899, and 1 in 94 in 1898.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1903 numbered 1,031, or 27 less than in 1902. Over two-fifths of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 12, as against 1 in 12 in 1902 and 1901, 1 in 11 in 1900, and 1 in 12 in the eight previous years.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1903, and according to the average of the ten years 1892-1901. Births and deaths in hospitals, &c., are excluded, and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate in 1903 being placed first, and the rest in succession:—

It will thus be seen that in Greater Melbourne the birth-rate (exclusive of hospitals and asylums) for 1903 (21.78), as compared with the average of the ten years 1892 to 1901 (26.83), shows a large decline; including hospitals and asylums, the rates are 23.93 and 28.55 respectively.

The mortality in 1903 (excluding hospitals and asylums) is 11.01, as against 12.39 for the average of the ten years 1892 to 1901. Inclusive of hospitals and asylums, the rates are 14.37 and 15.76 respectively.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, there was an average of 3 persons to the acre at the end of 1903; but taking the principal towns only—which, although occupying considerably less than half the total area, contain nearly 97 per cent. of the total population—there was a density of 6½ persons to the acre. The density varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from 36½ persons to the acre in Fitzroy, 31½ in North Melbourne, and 31 in Richmond, to 1 person to the acre in Boroondara, and less than 1 in Oakleigh, Preston, and the outlying portions of the district. The following table shows the area of, and the density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

The proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last thirteen years, thus indicating that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum; and this is proved by a comparison of the results of the past two censuses, which show that the male population at those ages has increased from 1,532 in 1891 to 2,795 in 1901, and the females from 1,511 to 3,065. There are now nearly 12 persons aged 75 and upwards in every 1,000 of the population, as compared with a proportion of only 6½ ten years previously. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions.

Of the total number 1,256 took place in Melbourne City, 122 in North Melbourne, 87 in Kew, 69 in South Melbourne, 25 in Fitzroy, 37 in Northcote, 5 in Coburg, and 173 in the remainder of district. These figures, compared with the total deaths (7,217), furnish a proportion of 25 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 4 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1903 ended his or her days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol.

Nearly one-third of all who died at the age of 5 or upwards in 1903, three-fifths of those who died of typhoid fever, half of those who died of diphtheria, about one-third of those who died of cancer, or an accident, and more than one-fourth of those who died of phthisis, ended their days in hospitals, as will be seen from the following statement:—

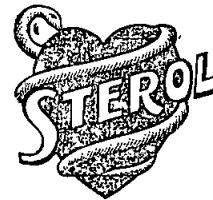

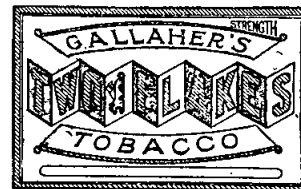

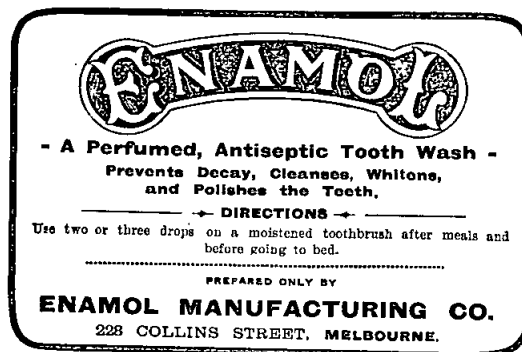

No. 1866), has, by an Order made on the 11th day of April, 1904, directed that the provisions of section 2 of the *Health Act* 1903 aforesaid be applied to the whole of the said Shires of Bairnsdale and Colac.

### SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

#### BY-LAW No. 6, UNDER THE "HEALTH ACT 1890."

A By-law of the Shire of Woorayl, made under the provisions of Sections 31, 32, 35, 253, and 259 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 6, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil and closet-pans.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl make the following By-law:—

1. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the area of the township of Leongatha, in the shire of Woorayl.
3. The council may upon the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances exempt any premises within the boundaries aforesaid from the operation of this by-law.
4. Every closet shall be furnished by the shire-council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the council.
5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the council may direct, in a suitable cart.
6. An annual charge for emptying and cleansing of cess-pans shall be made by a resolution of the council, under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act* 1890. Such charge to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, and to be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said half-yearly charge shall constitute a breach of this by-law.
7. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means, approved of by the council, shall be left in place of the one removed.
8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access, for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public house, hotel, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.
9. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.
10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered in-offensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator,

provided by the council, or be trenched or ploughed into the ground in such locality as may be provided by the council.

11. No occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish, or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

12. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant, for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

13. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other person, save those authorized by the council, for the removal of night-soil; and no other person, save those authorized by the council, shall remove any night-soil, except in cases of exemption.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the council over all premises, which premises may be inspected by the council or its officers from time to time, or any other person duly authorized by the council.

15. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

16. That all by-laws hitherto in force within the Shire of Woorayl so far as they relate to any or all of the several things contained in this by-law, are hereby repealed.

### REGULATION FOR HAIRDRESSERS AND BARBERS' SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CAMPERDOWN.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

1. The Regulation made on the 20th day of December, 1900, permitting Hairdressers and Barbers' shops in the Township of Camperdown within the East Riding of the Shire of Hampden to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Nine o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock shall, from and after the date hereof, be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. It shall be lawful for the shop of any Hairdresser and Barber in the Township of Camperdown within the East Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Hampden to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Nine o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock.

And the Honorable Sir Samuel Gillott, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

LENGTH OF VOYAGE FOR VESSELS CARRYING PASSENGERS FROM VICTORIA TO CERTAIN PLACES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation revoke so much of the Proclamation of the twelfth February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six as prescribes what shall be deemed for the purposes of *The Passengers Act* 1855 to be the length of voyage of any sailing vessel, auxiliary screw-propelling vessel, screw steam vessel, or paddle-wheel steam vessel carrying passengers from any port or place in Victoria to the places mentioned in the schedule hereto, and the whole of the Proclamations of the eighteenth June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and twenty-third April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, issued under the authority of *The Passengers Act* 1855, relating to the length of voyage for vessels carrying passengers from any port or place in Victoria to certain places; and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 366 of the *Merchant Shipping Act* 1894 (57 and 58 Victoria, chapter 60) hereby determine for the purposes of Part III. of the said Act that the length of the voyage of a ship carrying steerage passengers from any port in the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia to a port or place named in the first column of the schedule underwritten shall be the time set opposite to the name of such port or place in one of the other columns in the said schedule headed with a description of the means of propulsion used in navigation according as the means of propulsion used or provided for the navigation of the class of ship the length of the voyage of which has to be determined answers the description in the heading of one or other of such columns.

## SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

## BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Maffra, and numbered 15, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries in the Shire of Maffra, for the suppression of nuisances, and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Maffra order as follows, viz.:—

That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road within the undermentioned boundaries be impounded:

Commencing on the Macalister River at Grogan's Crossing; thence south by the parish boundary road to the north boundary of the Heyfield Common, west by that boundary to the west boundary of the parish of Glenmaggie, north by that boundary to Stony Creek, easterly by that creek to the Macalister River; thence south-east by the river to the commencing point.

That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—That all residents within the above-described boundary, or occupiers of land fronting any of the above-mentioned roads shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of 10 head, either or all cattle or horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the council of the Shire of Maffra half-yearly in advance, at the rate of 6s. per annum for every head of such cattle, and 8s. for every head of horses; so exempted, such payment to be a remuneration to the officer appointed by the council as a person in charge of such horses or cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

When the above fee is paid to the herdsman, he shall register each head of horses of cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose as exempt from the operation of the by-law, and in the case of cattle shall place a pitch brand on same in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall also be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, for the information and use of the council.

All calves or foals under the age of eight months, the progeny of cattle so exempted shall likewise be exempted.

No entire or bull shall be liable to be exempted without the special consent of the council.

A muster of all stock so registered and exempted shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement, at the close of every half-yearly period; and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock at the mustering yards on these occasions, and complete their registration; and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period the exemption fee shall be 2s. in the case of cattle, and 2s. 6d. in the case of horses for the remaining three months.

The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of the same to the council every six months on a day preceding each half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries have been made.

The council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any stock so registered and exempted, but it will be the herdsman's duty to see all stock exempted once in seven days, and, in the event of any stock straying outside the above-described limits, to give immediate notice thereof, to the owners.

The council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands abutting on to the above-described roads, or owning land in any situation whatsoever.

No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of two miles in each hour, and in the case of sheep at the rate of not less than six miles in each day.

No person will be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered and exempted as above, without due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing will be entitled without further charge to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registration period.

The council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from such streets or roads, and, in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner shall cause the same to be destroyed immediately upon receiving notice, failing which, the Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and cost.

Violation of the provisions of this by-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

## SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

A By-law of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 15, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles, and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh order as follows:—

(1) No person shall ride or drive, or impel, any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, along any of the roads or streets running through the townships of Bacchus Marsh, Maddingley, and Myrniong, at a greater rate than eight miles an hour; or along any other roads or streets within the Shire of Bacchus Marsh at a greater speed than sixteen miles an hour; without the permission in writing of the Council of the said Shire, or the President thereof, first had and obtained.

(2) No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the Shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

(3) Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

(4) Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the road; and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person overtaking such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, or other vehicle, or such horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

(5) In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the full control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as reasonably necessary.

## BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD.

THE Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of St. Arnaud, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Borough of St. Arnaud, known as the "Recreation Reserve," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, will after one month from the publication hereof submit the said regulations for the approval of the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*.

## REGULATION No. II.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for public recreation in the borough of St. Arnaud, known as the "Recreation Reserve."

The Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Board of Land and Works do hereby in pursuance of section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, make the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for public recreation in the borough of St. Arnaud, known as the "Recreation Reserve."

1. The reserve, for the purposes of this by-law, shall be divided as follows:—

1. The whole of the grounds with the exception of the pavilion and grand-stand, cycling track, and portion enclosed thereby.
2. Cycling track and enclosure.
3. Grand-stand and pavilion.

2. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, or trees in the reserve nor shall fires be lighted therein.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.

4. No person shall camp in the reserve or erect thereon any dwelling without authority, in writing, of the Council.

5. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports, fetes, or any cricket or football match where charge for admission is made, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the hirers of the ground duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle.

6. Every person paying for admission to the first division or any part thereof, or to the grand-stand shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

7. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

(a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket or sports ground.

(d) Being found in any part of the reserve and not producing, upon demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part and that the ticket of admission has been lost.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

8. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord without written permission of the Council, and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.

9. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match, sports, or shows, shall deposit any sum not exceeding £10 which the Council may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Council may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

10. All goats, pigs, poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing within the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall make use of the cycling track or the grounds within the cycling track without written authority of the Town Clerk.

12. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the 1st division and to the grand-stand and enclosure on such days as the Council may determine shall be as follow:—

(a) For admission of each person to the first division during any cricket or football match, sports, or shows such a sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding one shilling.

(b) For admission of each person to the grand-stand such a sum as the Council shall determine, not exceeding five shillings.

13. Provided always that the Council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges and fees.

14. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
