PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honourable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each such day, at each of the places specified, that is to say:—

THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF MAY, 1904, at Camperdown and Colonaire;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF JUNE, 1904, at Elmore.

REGULATIONS.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby substitutes the following Clauses for Clauses 26 and 26A of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the provisions of section 123 of the *Public Service Act 1890*, and approved on the 31st December, 1903:—

Clause 26. *Officers in the Public Service not to take part in politics.*—In order that officers of all ranks may render loyal and efficient service to Government, they are expressly forbidden, except as stated in the next following Clause, directly or indirectly to canvass or use their influence for or against the return of any candidate for election as a Member of Parliament, or in any other way to take part in political affairs.

Clause 26A. *Elections by public officers.*—In connexion with the election of Members of Parliament as their representatives under *The Constitution Act 1903*, public officers may take such action as is necessary and usual to ascertain the views of candidates and to further the election of candidates whom they desire to see returned, but they shall not criticise the Government or any Member thereof or any act of the Government, and public officers, if candidates for election, may take all necessary and usual action to make known their views and obtain the support and votes of the electors.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 178.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

(a) All goods shall, unless otherwise provided, be charged under the rates and conditions governing the carriage of goods for their respective classes, subject to a minimum charge for each class in accordance with the Tariff for "Smalls" as specified hereunder.

The Tariff for "Smalls" is computed only to 3 cwt., and above that weight actual tonnage rates shall be imposed, subject to a minimum charge as for 3 cwt. at the Tariff for "Smalls."

(b) When, however, goods classified in two or more classes are forwarded at one and the same time to one consignee, such goods, if it be cheaper than to charge each class separately at the Tariff for "Smalls," may be grouped in one or more lots, and the total weight of each such lot charged under the rates and conditions for the goods of the highest class in each such lot, subject to a minimum charge for each lot, in accordance with the Tariff for "Smalls."

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

(1) Wheat, flour, bran, pollard, and sharps consigned from any station in the North-Eastern, Northern, Midland, or Western district (Geelong excepted) to any station on the Eastern, South-Eastern, Healesville, Whittlesea, Eltham, or Stony Point line, or on any branch thereof, shall be charged the tariff rate to Melbourne, plus the tariff rate from Melbourne to the destination, except that such goods carried under the Agricultural Produce Class rates and conditions to the following places shall be subject for the latter portion of the journey to a maximum charge as specified here under in respect of each place named, viz.:—

(2) Wheat, flour, bran, pollard, and sharps consigned by rail from Melbourne or from any suburban station within a radius of 10 miles thereof, or from Geelong to any station on the Eastern or South-Eastern line, or on any branch thereof, shall be charged the tariff rate, except that such goods carried under the Agricultural Produce Class rates and conditions to the following places shall be subject to a maximum charge as specified hereunder in respect of each place named, viz.:—

(3) Special rebates on flour, bran, pollard, and sharps will be allowed as specified hereunder, viz.:—

- (a) Wheat consigned by rail from any country station for any flour mill at any other country station, and there manufactured and reconsigned thence by rail in the shape of flour, bran, pollard, or sharps to Melbourne or to any station within a radius of 10 miles thereof, or to Geelong, Warrnambool, Port Fairy, or Portland, shall, subject to the provisions of clause (c) hereunder, be charged the tariff rate for the total distance plus 1s. 6d. per ton.
- (b) Wheat consigned by rail from any country station for any flour mill at any other country station (with the exception of Geelong, which is provided for under clause 2), and there manufactured and reconsigned thence by rail in the shape of flour, bran, pollard, or sharps to any station situated outside of a radius of 10 miles from Melbourne on the Eastern, South-Eastern, Healesville, Whittlesea, Eltham, or Stony Point line, or any branch thereof, shall, subject to the provisions of clause (c) hereunder, be charged the tariff rate for the total distance to Melbourne with 1s. 6d. per ton added, plus the tariff rate from Melbourne to destination, subject to the same exceptions as provided for in clause 1.
- (c) In respect of sub-clauses (a) and (b), the tariff rate for each portion of the journey, subject to the provisions of clause 1, shall be charged in the first instance for the total quantity of flour, bran, pollard, and sharps consigned by rail from each flour mill at any country station, and rebate to the amount of the charges computed as specified in sub-clauses (a) and (b) respectively will afterwards be granted on all or so much of the tonnage of the flour, bran, pollard, and sharps consigned by rail from the flour mill as does not exceed the tonnage of the wheat consigned by rail from any country station or stations for the flour mill.

In determining the amount of the rebate due, the quantity of wheat consigned by rail from the most distant despatching station to the flour mill will first be taken into account, and then the quantity similarly consigned from each succeeding despatching station in order of greatest distance.

Stock Diseases Act 1890.

QUARANTINE DISTRICT FOR STOCK.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of section 60 of the Regulations made under Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1141), and bearing date the 11th day of November, 1890, the lands hereinafter described have become a Quarantine District until the determination and declaration of the Governor in Council relative thereto: It is hereby notified that the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 4th day of May, 1904, declared the said lands to be a Quarantine District for Stock, in pursuance of section 61 of the Regulations aforesaid, viz:—

Lands in the occupation of Mrs. Catherine Stafford, of Winton.

Health Act 1890.—Section 122.

THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

THE provisions contained in section 122 of the *Health Act 1890*, having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the said section, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this

behalf, doth make the following Regulations for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as the bubonic plague, that is to say:—

I. The Regulations made by the Board of Public Health on the 5th September, 1900, are hereby revoked.

II. The owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any vessel arriving in any waters of Victoria from any place proclaimed as plague infected or any place which may hereafter be so proclaimed, hereinafter called the suspected vessel, shall observe, do, or carry out, or cause to be observed, done, or carried out, all the matters and things following, namely:—

1. He shall keep the suspected vessel off from the wharf or pier by a distance of at least 4 feet by means of fenders substantially constructed (preferably of wood), and shall prevent listing towards the wharf or pier, and shall place all fenders directly opposite mooring posts or piles.

2. He shall apply and keep applied to each end of every hawser and rope connecting the suspected vessel with the wharf or pier—(a) tar kept constantly in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and (b) either a funnel at least 12 inches in diameter, or a stout metal disc at least 12 inches in diameter, and so constructed and so placed (one at each end) as to prevent transit of rats, the application of tar being made just beyond the side of the suspected vessel and just above the end attached to the wharf or pier, the tar being applied over a length of at least 1 foot at each end of each hawser and rope, and the application of the funnel or disc being made at each of the two tarred portions of the hawser or rope. The tar may be applied on bagging fixed round the hawser or rope.

3. He shall tar the fender and the fender-slings on such parts as to prevent migration of rats, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

4. He shall not use any net between the suspected vessel and the wharf or pier, whether in connexion with the gangway or the hatches, unless the central part of the net for a width of at least 18 inches be thoroughly tarred, or be effectually covered with thoroughly tarred material, and the tar be kept in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and shall remove any such net, though tarred, between Seven p.m. and Six a.m., except only in case cargo is being discharged or delivered during that time.

5. He shall draw up and keep drawn up all gangways from the suspected vessel when not required for the discharging or the receiving of cargo from Seven p.m. until Six a.m., and shall apply tar to each gangway while down over a length of at least 1 foot at each end, just beyond the side of the suspected vessel and just above the end resting on the wharf or pier, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

6. He shall suspend over the side of the suspected vessel along the wharf or pier four sets (or more if required) of electric or other lights, distributed so as to afford thorough illumination fore and aft along the whole length of the side of the suspected vessel.

7. He shall supply one watchman by night, shall furnish him with a stick, and see that he constantly parades on wharf or pier alongside the suspected vessel from stem to stern, and that he takes all practicable measures to prevent the passage of rats between the suspected vessel and the wharf or pier. He shall supply the watchman with a pot of tar and a brush, and see that he renews the tarring of gangways, nets, hawsers, and ropes, so as to keep the tar in a sticky condition.

8. He shall completely obstruct all pipes, ports, cabin scuttles, and other holes in the side of the suspected vessel next to the wharf or pier, and shall keep the same obstructed while the suspected vessel is alongside, in order to prevent both ingress and egress of rats.

9. He shall prevent any refuse matter from being discharged from the suspected vessel into the river.

10. He shall not allow any vessel or any lighter alongside the suspected vessel unless precisely the same conditions are observed on the lightering side of the suspected vessel as set out above on the wharf or pier side of the suspected vessel.

11. He shall not allow the landing of any rags, or of any cordage, or clothing, or bedding, or of any produce-bags whatever from the suspected vessel.

12. He shall tar the wharf the whole of the length of the moorings of the suspected vessel, to a width from the edge of 1 foot, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

13. He shall destroy or cause to be destroyed all rats on the suspected vessel, and shall on its arrival have the suspected vessel properly fumigated to the satisfaction of the Board of Public Health.

III. The owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any lighter or vessel going alongside any suspected vessel as hereinbefore defined, shall observe, do, or carry out, or cause to be observed, done, or carried out, all the matters and things following, namely:—

1. He shall keep the lighter or vessel from the suspected vessel by a distance of at least 4 feet by means of fenders substantially constructed (preferably of wood), and shall prevent listing towards the lighter or vessel.

2. He shall apply and keep applied to each end of every hawser and rope connecting the lighter or vessel with the suspected vessel—(a) tar kept constantly in a sticky condition, by repeated applications, and (b) either a funnel at least 12 inches in diameter or a stout metal disc at least 12 inches in diameter, and so constructed and so placed (one at each end) as to prevent transit of rats, the application of tar being made just beyond the side of the suspected vessel and just beyond the side of the lighter or vessel, the tar being applied over a length of at least 1 foot at each end of each hawser and rope, and the application of the funnel or disc being made at each of the two tarred portions of the hawser or rope. The tar may be applied on bagging fixed round the hawser or rope.

3. He shall tar the fender and the fender slings on such parts as to prevent migration of rats, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

4. He shall not use any net between the suspected vessel and the lighter or vessel, whether in connexion with the gangway or the latches, unless the central part of the net, for a width of at least 18 inches, be thoroughly tarred or be effectually covered with thoroughly tarred material, and the tar be kept in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and he shall remove any such net, though tarred, between Seven p.m. and Six a.m., except only in case cargo is being discharged or delivered during that time.

5. He shall draw up, and keep drawn up, all gangways from the suspected vessel when not required for the discharging or the receiving of cargo from Seven p.m. until Six a.m., and shall apply tar to each gangway while down over a length of at least 1 foot at each end just beyond the side of the suspected vessel, and just beyond the side of the lighter or vessel, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

6. He shall supply one watchman by night, shall furnish him with a stick, and see that he constantly parades the lighter or vessel from stem to stern, and that he takes all practicable measures to prevent the passage of rats between the suspected vessel and the lighter or vessel. He shall supply the watchman with a pot of tar and brush, and see that he renews the tarring of gangways, nets, hawsers, and ropes so as to keep the tar in a sticky condition.

Any person who fails to comply with any of these Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 326 of the *Health Act 1890*, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

TRAMWAYS AT BALLARAT.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that Tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the council of the municipality of the City of Ballarat has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said City of Ballarat: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the council of the municipality of the City of Ballarat shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the City of Ballarat.

Routes.

That the routes of such tramway shall be as follows:—

1. Commencing at a point in Sturt-street at its intersection with Morrison-street (westerly) to its intersection with Hamilton-street (west side of convent), thence along Hamilton-street to Wendouree-parade.
2. Commencing at a point in Wendouree-parade at its intersection with Morrison-street; thence along Wendouree-parade to Webster-street (completing loop).
3. Commencing at a point in Lydiard-street at its intersection with Macarthur-street, thence along Lydiard-street to Gregory-street (city boundary).
4. Commencing at a point in Sturt-street at its intersection with Drummond-street, thence along Drummond-street to Macarthur-street.
5. Commencing at a point in Main Creswick-road at its junction with Macarthur-street, thence along Main Creswick-road to Gregory-street (city boundary).
6. Commencing at a point in Sturt-street West at its junction with Hamilton-street, thence along Sturt-street to city boundary.
7. Commencing at a point in Ripon-street at its junction with Sturt-street, thence along Ripon street to Rubicon-street (city boundary), also that part of Rubicon-street between Ripon and Skipton streets.
8. Commencing at a point in Leith-street at its junction with Skipton-street, thence along Leith-street to its junction with the Yarrowee Creek or River Leith or city boundary.

Tramway where crosses Railway to be under control of Commissioners of Railways.

That the tramway to be constructed upon so much of the said route as crosses the Victorian railway line in Creswick-road shall be under the absolute control of and be subject to all such regulations and orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners of Railways, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injurious consequences which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said route crossing the railway line.

Gauge.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4' 8½"), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one to eleven inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they are set out in detail in this Order.

Motive Power.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity or horses or both.

Maximum Speed.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be 15 miles in the hour.

Time of Completion.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic as regard routes numbered 1, 2, 3, and 4 within the period of three and a half years from the 25th of November, 1902, and as regards routes numbered 5, 6, 7, and 8 within the period of 30 years from the 25th day of November, 1902.

Traffic.

That such tramway shall be used for passengers, passengers' luggage, light goods, and parcels.

Necessary precautions for safety of Passengers and Public to be observed.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the routes of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the said municipality.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down Passengers.

That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of all streets, and at such other points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and Charges.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

- From Grenville-street to Botanical Gardens, *via* Drummond-street north and Macarthur-street, or any lesser distance between, or *vice versa* } Threepence 3d.
- From Botanical Gardens loop line around lake, or any lesser distance, between or *vice versa* } Threepence 3d.
- From Sturt-street along Lydiard-street to Gregory-street, or any lesser distance between, or *vice versa* } Threepence 3d.

For the carriage of luggages, light goods, and parcels the charge shall be as follows:—

If in charge of passenger, when weight exceeds 20 lbs. or 2 feet in length, 18 inches deep, and 1 foot wide, a single fare; or, if permitted to occupy seat space, fares according to space taken up. Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, for every package not exceeding the above dimensions or weight 6d. for any section or part thereof.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of Breach of Order.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in Clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said Clause 26 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease, and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the City of Ballarat shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure or to provide funds therefor.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Councils of the Municipalities of the Town of Essendon and the Borough of Flemington and Kensington shall be and are hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the Municipal Districts of the Town of Essendon and the Borough of Flemington and Kensington.

Routes.

That the routes of such tramway shall be as follows:—

(a) Commencing in Mount Alexander-road at the Flemington-bridge, and thence along that road to Puckle-street, thence along Pascoe Vale-road to Fletcher-street, thence along Fletcher-street to Mount Alexander-road, and thence along that road to Lincoln-road together with a line from Mount Alexander-road along Puckle-street to Moonee Ponds railway station.

(b) Commencing in Racecourse-road at the Moonee Ponds Creek, thence along that road to Epsom-road, thence along Epsom-road to Union-road, thence along that road to Maribyrnong-road, thence along that road to the Saltwater River, together with a line along Victoria-street from Racecourse-road to Mount Alexander-road.

(c) Commencing at the intersection of Mount Alexander-road and Lincoln-road, thence along Lincoln-road and Buckley-street, Waverley-street, Bent-street, Macpherson-street, and Albion-street to the Maribyrnong-road.

Gauge.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be 4ft. 8½in., and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one to thirteen inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive Power.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

Maximum Speed.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be 14 miles in the hour.

Time of Completion.

The approximate time required to construct the proposed tramway is, as to routes A and B, 21 months from the date of delegation of this Order in Council, as to route C, seven years from the date of delegation of this Order.

Nature of Traffic.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers, luggage, light goods, and parcels only.

Necessary precautions for safety of Passengers and Public to be observed.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said councils of the said municipalities.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down Passengers.

That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers on either one side of the Newmarket Bridge and at the intersection of Union-road and Maribyrnong-road, of Mount Alexander-road and Fletcher-street, and at Mount Alexander-road and Puckle-street for the space of not less than 20 seconds, and at such other points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and Charges.

That the tolls and charges to be made on the said tramway may be but are not to exceed Twopence for each adult passenger, and One penny for each child under thirteen years of age for any single journey between the terminal points on any of the said lines except the line from Mount Alexander-road along Puckle-street to Moonee Ponds Railway Station, on which the fare for each passenger is One penny. Provided that on any day on which horse races shall be held on any race-course in or adjoining either of the municipal districts of the said councils, or upon any public holiday or any day upon which any show or other function shall be held on the National Agricultural Show Ground, there may be charged fares not more than double the said rates.

The Councils not at any time to enter into any agreement with the Melbourne Tramway and Omnibus Company or its successors or assigns for a reduction of fares for the carriage of through passengers per tramway from any part of Essendon and Flemington and Kensington districts to or from the City of Melbourne.

For the carriage of luggage, light goods, and parcels the charge shall be as follows:—

If in charge of passenger, when weight exceeds 20 lbs. or 2 feet in length, 18 inches deep, and 1 foot wide, a single fare; or, if permitted to occupy seat space, fares according to space taken up. Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, for every package not exceeding the above dimensions or weight, Sixpence for any section or part thereof.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of Breach of Order.

That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order, and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in Clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said schedule.

If, upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said Clause 26 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way

either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct, and, in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Councils of the said Municipalities of the Town of Essendon and the Borough of Flemington and Kensington shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the councils of the said municipalities finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the councils of the said municipalities shall take upon themselves all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Minister of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NEW SOUTH WALES.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered, from time to time, to make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas by Order in Council, dated the thirteenth day of October, 1903, Regulations were made prohibiting the introduction of swine into Victoria from New South Wales, &c.: And whereas it is desirable to amend the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council above referred to, and dated the thirteenth day of October, 1903, the introduction of swine into Victoria from New South Wales may be permitted, provided that such swine come from that portion of the State of New South Wales situated south of the Murrumbidgee River and the 35th parallel of latitude, and further that such swine have been in the possession of their owners and located in the said portion of the State of New South Wales for a period of three months.

2. Fat pigs only shall be introduced under these Regulations.

3. All pigs so intended to be introduced shall be legibly branded with a fire brand of the letter "N."

4. All pigs introduced under these Regulations, if intended for sale, shall be offered for sale in the corporation yards, Melbourne, for slaughter within six days within the Metropolitan meat area, or at some bacon factory approved in writing by the Chief Inspector of Stock, and, if not intended for sale, shall also be slaughtered within six days within the Metropolitan meat area or at some bacon factory, approved in writing by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

5. Prior to the introduction of any pigs under these Regulations the owner shall make a declaration in the form attached before the Inspector of Stock at whose crossing-place it is intended to introduce such pigs.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council above referred to, and dated the sixth day of February, 1899, horses from Queensland may be introduced into Victoria by land provided that before such introduction they are sprayed with a medicament approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, and that such spraying is carried out in the presence and to the satisfaction of an officer appointed by the Chief Inspector of Stock to supervise same.

NEW ZEALAND

is infected with plague, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.
7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall retain the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities as to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.
10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.
11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.
12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.
13. 14. 15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.
