PUBLIC HEALTH.

Section 125 of Act No. 1038.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1830*, notice is hereby given that it appears to the Board of Public Health that the Shire of Wyndham is affected by the dangerous infectious or contagious disease diphtheria; and the said Board doth therefore hereby require all medical practitioners, deputy registrars, school teachers, and members of the police force residing in such shire, and the occupier or person in charge of any house in which any case of such disease may occur, to report such occurrence immediately on its coming to his or their knowledge, by letter, to the said Board and to the council of the said shire; and the said Board doth prescribe that such notification shall be in the form following (that is to say):—

To the Board of Public Health (or to the Council of the Shire of Wyndham).

BYADUK PUBLIC CEMETERY.*

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the vault or grave is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary of the cemetery between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. of the day previous to the interment.
3. The certificate of the registration of death must be produced at the time of applying for the order of burial.
4. The procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m.
6. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary.
8. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
9. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the cost and charges.
10. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.
11. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, except when a brick grave or vault is required, which must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some other person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
12. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

13. Each vault to be bricked in securely, cemented or covered with stone, slate, or iron.

14. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, epitaph, or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for their approval; in the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

15. Wooden picket permanent fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees, after due notice to the owner.

16. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected.

17. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the fulfilment of such duties.

18. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done any damage to any monument or tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

19. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

20. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these Regulations.

21. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

WITH reference to preliminary Notice No. 31 of 1904, issued by this Department on the 19th April last, notice is hereby given that on and after Friday, the 1st July, 1904, a light will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise from the lighthouse which has been erected on Jack's Point, about 3 miles south of Timaru, East Coast, South Island, in latitude 44° 27' S. and longitude 171° 14' E. (approximate).

The light, which is a dioptric fixed white light of the fourth order, is about 94 feet above the level of the sea at high water, and is visible to seaward over an arc of 168 degrees of the horizon for a distance of about 14 miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above the sea.

The tower is an octagonal cast-iron structure, and is painted white. It is 29 feet in height from the surface of the ground at the base to the top of the lantern.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Acts 6 Victoria No. 7, and 8 Victoria No. 12, and by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the By-law and orders as follows:—

1. All persons may hawk any marketable commodities in any part of the City except that portion described in clause 2 of the by-law, who shall have duly obtained from the Inspector of General Markets of the City or other person for

the time being appointed by the said council to issue permits in conformity with this by-law, a permit to hawk such commodities.

2. The excepted portion of the city mentioned in clause 1 hereof shall be the portion which is bounded as follows:—Commencing at the north-east corner of the intersection of Bourke-street and Swanston-street, thence along the east side of Swanston-street to the north side of Flinders-street, thence along the north side of Flinders-street to the east side of Russell-street, thence across Flinders-street to the east side of the Russell-street entrance to the railway station, thence along the south side of Flinders-street to the east side of Swanston-street, thence along the east side of Swanston-street to the north-east corner of Prince's-bridge, thence across Swanston-street to the north-west corner of Prince's-bridge, thence along the west side of Swanston-street to the south side of Flinders-street, thence along the south side of Flinders-street to a point in line with the west side of Elizabeth-street, thence along the west side of Elizabeth-street to the north side of Bourke-street, and thence along the north side of Bourke-street to the commencing point aforesaid.

3. Applications for permits and permits may be in such form as the council may from time to time provide.

4. The said inspector and said other person appointed as aforesaid shall not be bound to issue a permit to any person except he be of good repute and be of cleanly habits, nor to any person who has committed any breach of this by-law.

5. All permits shall be issued for the week or the calendar month for which application is made for the same, and shall remain in force for the said week or month and no longer.

6. The following shall be the fees payable in respect of permits:—

7. A permit shall not authorize the hawking of marketable commodities on any Sunday.

8. The holder of a permit who uses a cart, dray, barrow, basket, or other vehicle for the hawking of marketable commodities must, when hawking, have and keep his permit attached to some conspicuous place on the exterior of such vehicle.

9. No person hawking in any street shall occupy any fixed stand and shall move on upon being so required by any inspector of the said council or any police constable on duty in such street.

10. If the holder of any permit be convicted of any breach of this by-law, the authority to hawk conferred by such permit shall thereupon be deemed to have been cancelled.

11. The penalty for any offence against this by-law shall be any sum not exceeding £10.

12. All by-laws and regulations and parts thereof respectively inconsistent with or repugnant to this by-law are hereby repealed.

1. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads running through the townships of Casterton, Sandford, Merino, Chetwynd, or Dergholm at a greater speed than eight miles an hour, or along any other roads within the Shire of Glenelg at a greater speed than sixteen miles an hour without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near, or left-hand, side of the road, and, whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right, or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger, proceeding along the road, such person shall within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
