Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 39 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1893*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1893*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. M. D. ROBERTSON, MANUFACTURING CONFECTIONER, ARGYLE-STREET AND KERR-STREET, FITZROY,

for a period of eight weeks from the 15th July, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than one hundred females or more than fifty males under the age of sixteen years; for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said one hundred females and fifteen boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours, in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 39 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1893*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1893*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. RUSSELL, ROBSON, AND RUSSELL, DRESSMAKERS, BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of one week from 15th July, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than sixteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the making up of the wrappers tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such

person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than £1 16s. for a man and 16s. for a woman per week respectively; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF RICHMOND PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond in respect of Richmond Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and place of recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other

officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Richmond, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, it is provided that where any such land has been vested in Trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Richmond do hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of Richmond Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Richmond Park:

REGULATIONS.

1. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Trustees or Committee of Management appointed by the Trustees, shall ride, drive, or impel any bicycle, tri-cycle, velocipede, motor bicycle, motor car, or other machine in the park.

2. No person shall interfere with, cut, break, or remove the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, wattle-blossom, rockeries, or any property in the park, or commit any nuisance therein.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the park, or lie on the seats, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports shall not be played or take place, except in such portion or portions of the park as may be set apart for the purpose, and under such conditions as the Trustees or the Committee of Management may direct.

5. No person shall push, drive, or impel any hand-truck or barrow on, along, or across any of the pathways that have been formed and set out as such by the employes of or persons employed by the Trustees or the Committee of Management.

6. Every person having in his custody, possession, or control in the park any dog or dogs shall prevent such dog or dogs from jumping into the water-troughs therein.

7. No person shall ride, drive, worry, or chase, or in any way interfere with any of the horses belonging to the park keeper or other person appointed by the Trustees, or any of the horses admitted into the park for grazing purposes.

8. Every person having in his custody, possession, or control any horse or horses in the park, with the permission first had and obtained from the Committee of Management or the park keeper, or other person appointed by the Trustees, shall securely fasten such horse or horses by means of a halter or halters, and in no case shall any person fasten a horse by or with more than one halter.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Newstead, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and numbered 7, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles, and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, The President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Newstead order as follows:—

1. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads running through the township of Newstead at a greater speed than eight miles an hour, or along any other roads within the shire of Newstead at a greater speed than thirteen miles an hour without the permission, in writing, of the council of the said shire, or the president thereof, first had and obtained.

2. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off-side thereof; and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £10 for every breach thereof.
