PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of One thou-proving public parks and garden under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

10 sand five hundred pounds (£1,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1904, and 31st December, 1904, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st March, 1905. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1904, and 31st December, 1904; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1904.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1904 (ride Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced pro ration.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be r

IN compliance with an application in writing under the pro-visions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MRS. F. C. SHAW, LAUNDRY, MORELAND-STREET, FOOTSGRAY,

for a period of eight weeks from the 19th January, 1905, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:--

- 1. SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

BY-LAW NO. 23.

A By-law of the Council of the Shire of Bellarine, made under section 31 of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 23, for repealing certain By-laws of the Shire of Bellarine which the Council of the said Shire does not think it desirable to retain.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows:—

1. From and after the coming into force of this By-law the By-laws hereafter mentioned to the extent hereafter mentioned shall be repealed.

(a) All the clauses except 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 14 of a By-law in reference to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk, made under the provisions of the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, dated the third day of November, 1886, and allowed and confirmed by the Central Board of Health on the 10th day of December, 1886, and numbered 16. bered 16.

(b) A By-law for providing for the use and cleansing of pans for night-soil and the removal and disposal of night-soil therefrom, made under the provisions of the Health Act 1890, dated the 7th day of January, 1891, and numbered 17.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 8th day of November, 1904, and confirmed the 14th day of December, 1904.

- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or
- 5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works
- No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 7. No races, sports, or fêtes shall be held in the reserve, or in or on the lake therein, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 8. No person shall camp in the reserve, nor erect thereon any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
- 9. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots or enclosures therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or
- no. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail, except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and

every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.

- 11. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the committee of management to keep order, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission
- 12. No person shall bathe in the lake in the reserve, except within such boundaries as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only at the times and upon the conditions as to dress and payment following:—
 - No person shall bathe in the lake after the hour of Nine o'clock in the forenoon on Sundays, but upon week days bathing shall be allowed during the hours the reserve is open to the public.

- 14. No boat shall be allowed upon the lake in the reserve without the written consent of the committee of management first obtained.
- 15. No boatman shall ply for hire or let any boats to hire unless he shall have first paid a licence-fee according to the scale following:—

For boat to carry one person a sum not exceeding 10s. per annum.

For boat to carry two persons a sum not exceeding 15s. per annum.

For boat to carry three persons a sum not exceeding

20s. per annum.
For boat to carry four or more persons a sum not exceeding 30s. per annum.

- 16. The maximum charge for admission for every adult to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports, shall be 2s.
- 17. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of a public charitable institution, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence. And every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD, KNOWN AS THE "RECREATION RESERVE."

THE Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for a Public Park and for Recreation Purposes in the Borough of St. Arnaud, known as the "Recreation Reserve," and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 199 of the Land Act 1901:— REGULATIONS.

r. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, or trees in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted

2. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.

3. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect thereon by dwelling without the authority, in writing, of the

Council.

4. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve :-

(a) Being drunk, or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.

abusive language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports; or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket or sports ground.

when crossing of trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket or sports ground.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs; nor bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the Council, and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs; to trespass within the Reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law.

6. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, for the occasion of any cricket or football match, sports, or shows, shall deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) which the Council may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Council may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Council in reference to the Reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures, for the time being thereon.

7. All goats, pigs, poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

8. No person shall make use of the cycling track without the written authority of the Council.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding. Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction,

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1903, for the regulation and government of drivers of motor-cars and auto-

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean any carriage, car, or other vehicle, driven or impelled by steam, gas, electricity, oil, vapour, or other mechanical power.

2. No person shall drive a machine along or across any screet, or any other public thoroughfare, furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of, or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven.

3. No person driving a machine shall proceed at a greater rate of speed than 12 miles an hour upon or along any street or thoroughfare, nor shall proceed at a greater speed than 7 miles per hour upon or along any crossing.

4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing By-law, No. 69, was adopted by the Council of the City of St. Kilda, by Special Order, on the 19th December, 1904, and confirmed on 16th January, 1905.

(b) Expectorate or spit upon the floor, walls, furniture, or fittings of such building; or
(c) Injure or damage the said building or any of the said furniture or fittings thereof.

2. No person shall at any meeting or gathering held

2. No person shall at any meeting or gamering held in any such building—
 (a) Stand upon any chair or seat, or stand or sit upon any window-sill, cornice; or
 (b) Disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gather-

ing; or

ing; or

(c) Curse or swear or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language; or

(d) Be guilty of any insulting or riotous conduct; or

(e) Be drunk; or

(f) Take part in any disturbance or disorder.

3. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing by-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Five shillings, for each such breach.

This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication in the Government Gazette, as provided by the Local Government Act 1903.
