ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day asserted, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Seven hundred and five thousand one hundred and thirty-nine pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and five and One thousand nine hundred and six."

"An Act to further amend the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1890.*"

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

1. For every house or land under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings and upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1906, and the rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1906.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

(b) In respect of coal forwarded by rail on the Up journey from any coal-field direct to any station, the rate for the haulage of such coal over the whole or any part of the line from the coal-field to Melbourne shall be $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per ton per mile (of which $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per mile shall be paid by the consignee or consignor, and $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per mile shall be paid to the Commissioners out of the Consolidated Revenue, in accordance with the direction of His Excellency the Governor in Council, dated 7th January, 1905), and the rate for the haulage of such coal on any other line shall be the difference between the rate specified in Clause (A) for the mileage journey from the coal-field to Melbourne or any portion of such journey over which the coal has been hauled and the rate prescribed in Clause (A) for the total mileage from the coal-field to the station of destination.

(c) The minimum charges shall be 2s. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 6 miles; 2s. 3d. per ton for distances over 6 and up to and inclusive of 8 miles; and 2s. 6d. per ton for distances beyond 8 miles, with a minimum truck load for bogie trucks of eighteen (18) tons, for fifteen (15) ton trucks of thirteen (13) tons, for twelve (12) and ten (10) ton trucks of nine (9) tons, and of one ton less than the actual tonnage capacity of the truck when such is less than ten (10) tons, provided that the minimum truck load shall in no case be less than six (6) tons.

(d) The provisions of this By-law shall be deemed to have become effective as from 1st October, 1905.

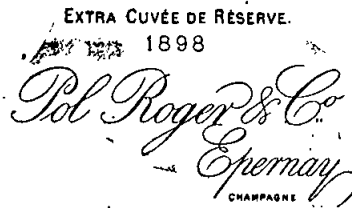

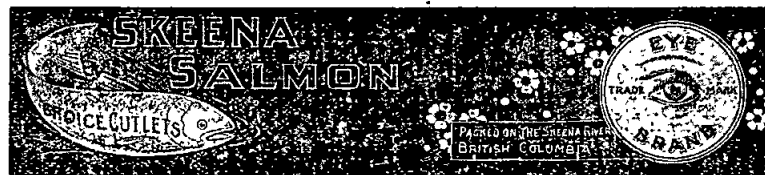

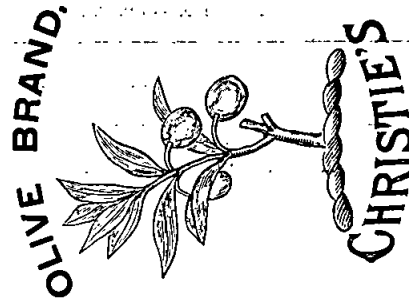

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF FRANKLIN, KNOWN AS "THE LITHIA SPRING PARK."

THE Council of the Shire of Mount Franklin, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the parish of Franklin, known as "The Lithia Spring Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE
PARISHES OF NEPEAN AND FINGAL, KNOWN
AS "OCEAN PARK."

WHEREAS by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations or to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the Reserve in the parishes of Nepean and Fingal, known as "Ocean Park":—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations the word "Park" shall embrace the whole of the reserve known as "Ocean Park," including that portion of the beach abutting thereon to low water mark, and the word "Committee" shall mean the members for the time being of the Committee of Management of such reserve.

2. No person shall disturb the soil within the Park in any manner or for any purpose, or erect any bathing box, tent, pavilion, building, fence, wall, bridge, or other structure without the previous consent, in writing, of the Committee. Such consent may be issued subject to such orders, terms, fees, and conditions as are deemed desirable by the Committee, which shall have the power to collect and receive all tolls, entrance fees, or other charges in connexion with the Park.

3. No person shall bathe from the shore of the Park unless attired in a proper bathing trunk or bathing dress or such other costume as shall be necessary to preserve public decency, and then only between the hours of Seven p.m. and Eight a.m.

4. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within the Park without leave of the officer appointed by the Committee, and then only in such place as he shall indicate; and no person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with the timber, trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, or birds, or with any vegetation, or break or damage the rocks in the caves and arches or the thatchings on the banks, or commit any nuisance in the Park.

5. No person shall climb, walk, or jump, or get upon, or over the thatched banks or any of the fences or gates of the Park, or cut, carve, break, or in any way remove, injure, or damage any of such fences or gates or any of the seats, buildings, bowers, posts, fences, gates, pavilions, rooms, or other erections therein, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any of such fences, gates, seats, or buildings, or roll or throw stones or missiles or leave any bottle, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish in the Park.

6. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale in the Park anything of any description without the previous written permission of the Committee.

7. No person shall ride or drive in the Park any horse, bicycle, tricycle, or vehicle of any description excepting upon the road on the left side leading from "Whitehall" to the Lower Refreshment Room.

8. No person shall behave in the Park in a disorderly or noisy manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit an act of indecency, or offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

9. No person shall put in the Park any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or poultry.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds.
