## TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

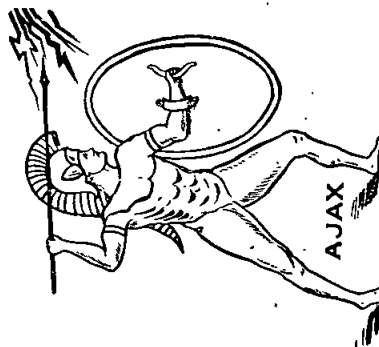

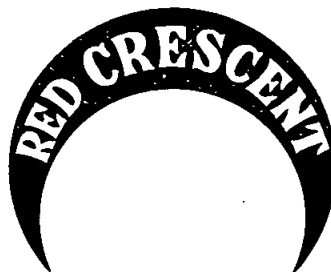

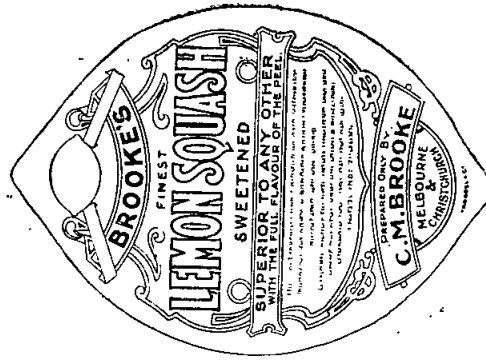

No. 1893) it is enacted that, at the request of the council of any municipal district, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that the provisions of Part XXII. of the said Act shall apply to and be of full force and effect in such district or portion of such district from and after a date to be specified in such Proclamation, not being within six months from the date of such Proclamation; and that, except in pursuance of a Proclamation under the said section, the said Part shall not have any force or effect in any municipal district: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in compliance with a request from the Council of the Municipality named hereunder, do by this my Proclamation declare that the provisions of Part XXII. of the Act aforesaid shall apply to and be of full force and effect in such municipality from and after the date hereunder set forth opposite the name of such municipality, that is to say:—

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say :—

- (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
- (4) Any person who shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water, from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said District, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

- (A) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (B) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1906, commencing on the 1st of January, 1906, as also the charges for every steam-boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable 1st July, 1906.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st January, 1906, and the 1st July, 1906.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

**MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1906.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following Regulations:—

**RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1906.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.
6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made. But on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that pound (£1).
9. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1906, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

  4. A minimum rate of One pound sterling, and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
  5. For every horse-trough a charge shall be made of Ten shillings sterling.
  6. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity allowed by rate payable in respect of the property to which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.
- The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January, 1906, and 1st day of July, 1906.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

**BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1906.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

**RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1906.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1906:—

1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of under Ten pounds (£10), and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

3. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds (£2) per annum.

5. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds (£3) per annum.

6. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.

7. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 10s.) per annum.

8. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.

9. For water supplied to Government Departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.) per annum.

10. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed upon, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

11. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

12. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.

14. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.

15. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

16. Except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, taps will be allowed to be fixed and hoses allowed to be used in gardens on payment of a special garden rate (in addition to the assessment rate) of Five shillings (5s.) per annum; but notwithstanding the payment of this special rate, the Trust will not allow any undue waste of water in connexion therewith, and may, if it think necessary, require the owner or occupier to substitute a meter; or it may, if such waste be continued after due notice being given, in writing, cut off the supply to such garden or gardens.

17. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

18. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such owner or occupier refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

19. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

20. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

21. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.

22. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

23. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.

24. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

25. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

26. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of the officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

27. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

28. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1906, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1906, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1906, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1906. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATION No. 15.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District), made the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelvepence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvepence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

The foregoing Regulation was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust on the seventeenth day of October, 1905, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in the presence of—
