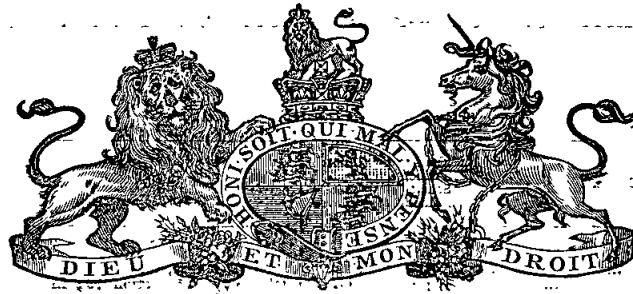

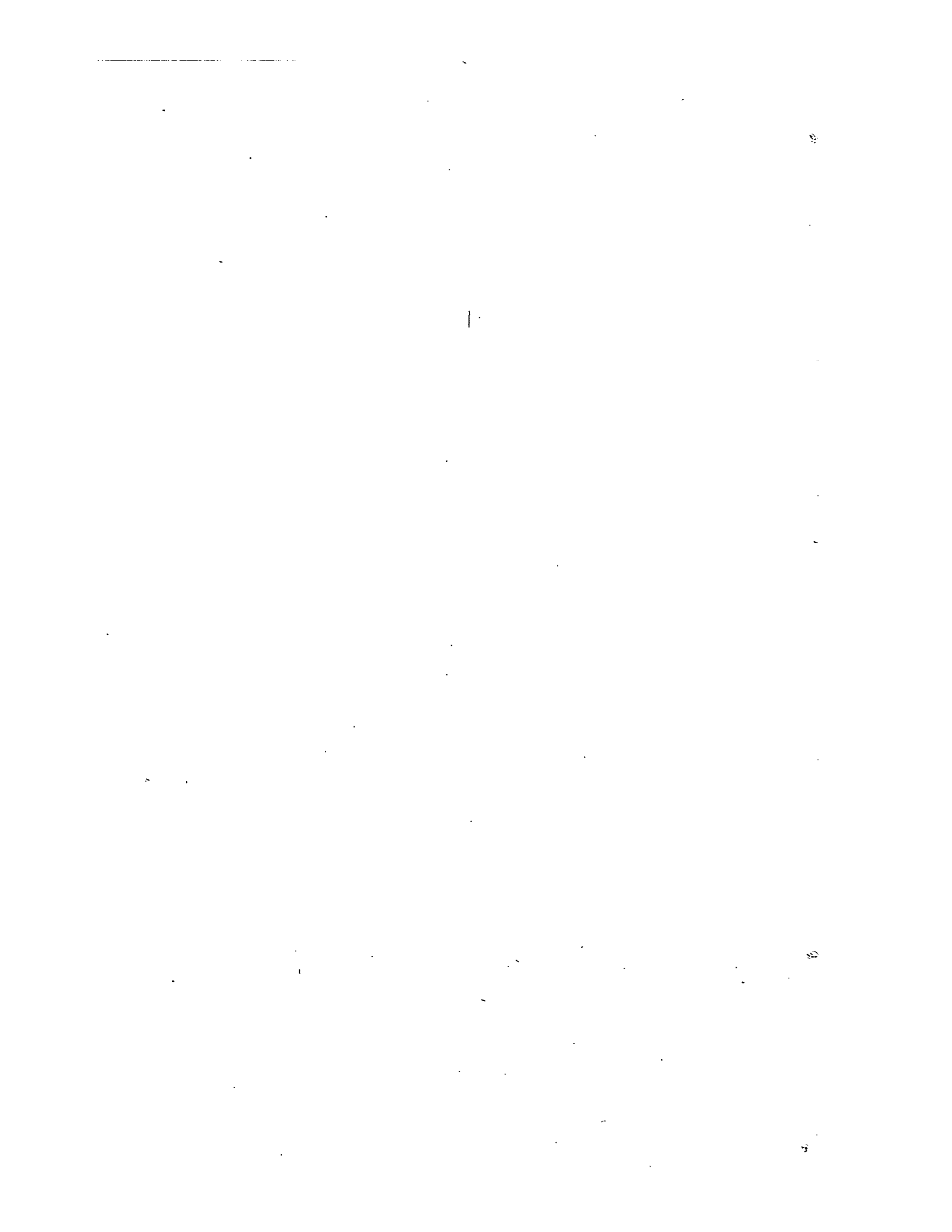

## NEW REGULATIONS.

## MEDICAL ACT 1890, PART II., AND DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Medical Act 1890*, Part II., and the *Dentists Act 1898*, hereby repeal Regulations VI. and VII. of the Regulations made by the Board on the 18th day of December, 1903, and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council on the 2nd day of February, 1904, and doth in lieu thereof make the following Regulations, viz:—

## "B. AS REGARDS APPRENTICESHIP.

"VI. Subsequent to such preliminary examination, every candidate (hereinafter called a student) shall be apprenticed under Articles of Apprenticeship for a period of not less than three years with a dentist registered in any part of the British Empire. Such apprenticeship shall not be recognised or registered by the Board if the number of students apprenticed to any one dentist in his private practice is thereby increased to three or more at one and the same time: Provided that, in the case of students apprenticed on or before the 31st day of December, 1901, the preliminary examination may be passed at any time before the student enters on the last two years of the course of professional study.

"VII. A copy of the Articles of Apprenticeship shall, in every case, be filed with the Registrar of the Board within three months from the date of their execution, or within such time as the Board may in any special case determine."

These Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria held on the twenty-seventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and five.

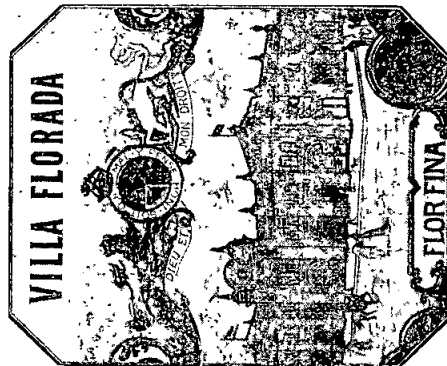

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

**R**EGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1905, and 31st December, 1905, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st March, 1906. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1905, and 31st December, 1905; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government, between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1905.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1905 (vide Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park or Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF BORHONEYGHURK.

WHEREAS by section 202 of the *Land Act* 1901 it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works to appoint and remove any number of persons not less than three, or any municipal council, or the governing body of any corporation, to be a Committee of Management of any specified Crown land reserved, either temporarily or permanently, for any of the purposes set out in section 10 of the *Land Act* 1901, and not conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby appoint Abel Parkinson, John Ferguson, Henry Glasson, Thomas Morrison, and Henry Barnes to be a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 4th January, 1883, as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Borhoneyghurk.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PARK AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF CONNEWARRE, KNOWN AS THE "GERMANTOWN RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Henry Reinhold Winter, Albert Gustav Decker, Frank Julius Otto Rau, Charles Daniel Audresson, and Frederick Rhinold Pacholke, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Park and Recreation purposes, in the parish of Connewarre, known as the "Germantown Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for the holding therein of *fêtes*, or sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or tie horses thereto, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No sports or games shall be played on any part of the reserve except on the portion set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose.

Every persons offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence: and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense. 1. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Forty-eight, for Regulating Traffic and Processions; Regulating the Use of Barbed Wire; Prohibiting Wandering Cattle; and for Maintaining the Good Rule and Government of the Municipal District.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood order as follows:—

1. *Interpretation Clause.*—In this By-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith—“City” means the City of Collingwood; “Council” means the Council of the said City; “Municipality” means the Corporation of the said City; “Person” includes a corporation; “Street” includes any public or private street, road, highway, right-of-way, lane, thoroughfare, public bridge, footway, square, place, court, alley, passage, or cul-de-sac; “Cattle” includes horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, lambs, goats, and swine, and the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular.

2. *Definition of “Motor Car,” “Motor Cycle,” and “Bicycle.”*—The words “motor car” and “motor cycle” shall, whenever occurring in this By-law, mean and include

locomotive wheeled vehicles propelled or driven, or the motive power for which shall be by means of petrol, steam, or other vapour, or by electricity; the words “motor cycle” shall mean any bicycle or tricycle driven or impelled by the like means; and the word “bicycle” shall mean any bicycle or tricycle propelled by the feet.

3. *Repeal of Previous By-laws and Regulation.*—The By-laws of the City of Collingwood, numbered 31 (Thirty-one) and 41 (Forty-one), and the Regulation numbered 6 (Six) shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

4. *Use of Advertising Vehicles Regulated.*—No person shall carry about on any vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal, or drawn or propelled by such person or on any animal or on foot in any street within the city, any picture, placard, bill, notice, advertisement, plan, flag, or symbol, whether painted, written, or printed, or partly painted, partly written, or partly printed upon, pasted upon, or otherwise adhering to, or placed upon or attached to any part of such animal, vehicle, or person so as to cause or create or add to any obstruction to public traffic, or to be likely to cause any damage to persons or property.

5. *Vehicles to be Lighted at Night.*—No person shall, between one half-hour after sunset of any day, or before one half-hour before sunrise of the succeeding day, drive or permit or allow to be driven or impelled any wheeled vehicle of any description whatever (not being a motor-car), whether drawn or impelled by himself or drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, whether licensed or not, upon or along any street being a thoroughfare within the city, without carrying thereon a good serviceable and effectual lamp with a light burning therein sufficiently bright to be seen at a distance of fifty yards in front therefrom, securely fixed to the off side of such vehicle.

6. *Processions.*—No procession of persons, animals, or vehicles of any description shall march, parade, or pass along any of the streets of the city for other than funeral purposes unless the persons or some one or more on their behalf organizing or intending to take part in such processions, or conducting the same, shall have previously obtained the written consent of the Mayor of the city, and then only by the route and during the hours specified in such written consent, nor unless the recipient thereof shall have given twenty-four hours' written notice of the time, place, and route intended, with other particulars, of such consent to the officer for the time being in charge of the police of the city.

7. *Rule of the Road.*—Every person driving any animal or vehicle whatever, or riding any animal, shall keep to the left or near-side of the carriage-way of any street within the city, and when passing any other vehicle or animal going in the same direction shall go or pass on the right or off-side of such other vehicle or animal, and shall allow any person desirous so to do to pass on the right or off-side; save and except that in passing tram-cars travelling in the same direction drivers, riders, and propellers of vehicles and foot passengers shall pass such tram-cars on the left side.

No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal on the right-hand or wrong side of any street within the city without justifiable cause, and every person driving any vehicle or riding any animal shall keep as near as practicable to the footpath on his left side, so as to permit other persons going in the same direction to pass freely on the right-hand or off-side.

8. *Vehicles Obstructing a Street.*—No person shall leave any cart or other vehicle in or on any street being a thoroughfare within the city so as to obstruct or be detrimental to the traffic.

9. *Vehicles not to be left Unattended.*—No driver of any vehicle shall be away from his horse or cattle so as to be unable to have full control of it or them unless one of the wheels of such vehicle be securely fastened by a chain or strap so as to effectually prevent the rotation thereof.

10. *No Wandering Cattle Allowed.*—No person shall permit or allow cattle of which he is the owner or the person in charge thereof to graze or wander upon any land within the city not enclosed by a substantial fence.

11. *Rule of the Footpath.*—Persons walking along the footpath of any street within the city shall, unless for reasonable cause, or with reasonable excuse, keep on their respective right-hand sides of the path so as to pass other persons, meeting them on the left-hand side.

12. *Loitering Prohibited.*—No person or persons shall obstruct the carriage-way or footway of any street within the city by standing or loitering thereon after having been required by any member of the police force or by any officer of the council specially authorized in writing in that behalf to discontinue such standing or loitering.

13. *Barbed Wire.*—No person shall place, or use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street within the city, any wire with spikes or jagged projections unless the same be placed on the inside of the posts of such fence or erection, and so as not to render liable to be torn the clothing of any person passing along such street.

14. *Advertising on Paths, &c.*—No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road within the city, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality, or under the control and management of the council unless special written permission of the council shall have been obtained.

15. *Motor Cars, Motor Cycles, and Bicycles.*—No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car or motor cycle or bicycle upon or along any street within the city at a greater speed than ten miles an hour.

16. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle upon, along, or across any footpath within the city save across any such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon for the purpose of entering or leaving such premises.

17. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the times between one half-hour after sunset and one half-hour before sunrise of the succeeding day shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

18. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way of the street within the city, and whenever overtaking any other vehicle (save only a tram-car) or any horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the carriage-way, such person shall keep to the off or right side thereof (except in the case of tram-cars, which he shall always keep on his right); and such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach.

19. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by any horse or other beast of burden, and such horse or other beast of burden may on such meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person riding, driving, or impelling such motor car or motor cycle or bicycle shall dismount or cause the same to become stationary as speedily as possible, and shall assist to prevent an accident, and shall remain stationary so long as may be reasonably necessary. And in the event of any accident shall, upon request by a police officer or officer of the council, give his true name and address, and also the true name and address of the owner of the motor car or motor cycle or bicycle as the case may be.

20. *Operation of By-law.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city.

21. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall wilfully offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Forty-nine, for Suppressing Nuisances; Providing for the Health of the Residents in the City of Collingwood, and against the Spreading of Contagious and Infectious Diseases; Prohibiting Spitting or Expectoration on Footpaths, and for Maintaining the Good Rule and Government of the Municipal District.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood do hereby order as follows:—

1. *Interpretation Clause.*—In this By-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith—“City” means the City of Collingwood; “Council” means the Council of the said City; “Municipality” means the Corporation of the said City; “Person” includes a corporation; “Street” includes any public or private street, road, highway, right-of-way, lane, thoroughfare, public bridge, footway, square, place, court, alley, passage, or cul-de-sac; and the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular.

2. *Noisy and Musical Instruments, &c.*—No person shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, ring any bell, cry any goods, bawl or sing in any street in the city within fifty yards of any dwelling house or place of business after being required by any member of the police force to desist, and no vendor of ice-cream, aerated waters, fruit, or cordials shall offer for sale such goods on a Sunday in the streets or lanes of the city.

3. *Re Hawking on Wednesday Afternoons.*—No person shall hawk in the city any fruit, vegetables, or other green-grocers' merchandise after One o'clock p.m. on Wednesdays during the months of May, June, July, August, September, and October.

4. *Placing Refuse in Street.*—No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop, house, or vehicle into any street within the city, or vacant land within the city, any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, throw down and leave in any street within the city any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.

5. No person shall throw down and leave in any street within the city any bill, placard, or other substance intended or apparently intended for the purpose of advertising.

6. No person shall throw down or leave in any street or on any vacant land within the city, any bill, placard, or other paper which shall have been torn off or removed from any premises.

7. *Bottles, Broken Glass, &c.*—No person shall throw down, place, or leave any bottle or broken glass, nail, or other sharp substance on or in any street within the city in such a position as to be likely to cause injury to passengers or animals or damage to property.

8. *Spitting.*—No person shall spit or expectorate upon the footpath of any street of the city.

9. *Orange Peel, &c.*—No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any public footway within the city any fruit skins, vegetable matter, or other substance.

10. *Foul Water to be put into Sewers.*—No person on premises within the city connected with the sewerage system of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works shall deposit or throw any household slops, soap-suds, or other foul or offensive fluid or matter upon any street within the city, or upon any part of such premises other than directly into drains or sinks, by which such fluid or matter will pass directly into the sewers of the said Board.

11. *Operation of By-law.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city.

12. *Penalty.*—Any person who shall wilfully offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 50.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Fifty, for Preserving Good Order and Decency in any Building belonging to the Municipality, or under the Control and Management of the Council; Preventing Damage to such Building or to the Furniture or Fittings thereof; and Regulating any Meeting or Gathering held therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood order as follows:—

1. *Preserving Order in Municipal Buildings.*—No person shall, in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council of the City of Collingwood, and whether at any meeting or gathering held therein or not—

- (a) behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner; or
- (b) deface the walls by writing thereon, or otherwise injure or damage the said building or any of the furniture or fittings thereof.

2. *Preserving Order and Regulating Meetings and Gatherings.*—No person shall at any meeting or gathering held in any such building—

- (a) stand upon any chair or seat, or stand or sit upon any window sill, dado cornice, balcony railing, or staircase railing; or
- (b) disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering; or
- (c) curse or swear, or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language; or

- (d) conduct himself in an insulting or riotous manner; or
- (e) be drunk; or
- (f) take part in any disturbance or disorder; or
- (g) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such building, or in the corridors, aisles, or passages within the same.

3. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each such breach.

No person with barrow or other vehicle shall, for the purpose of selling, offering, or exposing for sale fruit or any other article of trade or commerce, linger or loiter or occupy any fixed stand in any of the streets or specified portions of streets within the city of Collingwood set out in the schedule hereto attached; but such person shall keep moving along any such street or specified portion of a street on the side thereof situated on his left hand at a reasonable walking pace, and shall travel at the rate of not less than one mile per hour, and shall not travel any such street or specified portion of a street more than once in the same hour.

*Meat Supervision Act 1900, No. 1652.*

BOROUGH OF COBURG.—REGULATION No. 3.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers it enabling, the Council of the Borough of Coburg, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, do hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

- (a) any meat other than such as is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or
- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat unless—

- (a) At least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings and all appliances are—

- (1) Scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;
- (2) then dried with clean cloths; and
- (3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

(b) Once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned and disinfected, as provided for under (a) sub-clauses (1) (2) and (3).

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

- (a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft

soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit.

(b) That is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.

Resolution for passing the foregoing Regulations was agreed to by the Council on the 2nd day of October, 1905, and confirmed on the 14th day of November, 1905.
