BY-LAW No. 6.

N pursuance of the Water Act 1890, and of every other right, title, or power in any wise enabling it in that behalf, the Corporation styled The Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby make the Regulations fol-

lowing, that is to say:

1. Visitors will be allowed access to the Gong Gong and Kirk's Reserves only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of each day.

2. Public conveyances or vehicles used for hire will be permitted to enter the reserve known as Kirk's for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, but must retire to such stand or portion of the reserve as may be set apart for such conveyances, or as may be pointed out by the caretaker or other employés of the Commissioners, and in no case and under no pretext will the owners or persons in charge of such vehicles be permitted to ply for hire from any other stand or place within the reserves.

3. Private or public vehicles conveying visitors will be permitted to enter or pass through such portions of the water reserves as the Commissioners may from time to time approve, but drivers of such vehicles and visitors will be held personally responsible for the properly closing and fastening of any gate or gates opened or passed through by them.

10. No person shall shoot or snare wild fowl or carry fire arms in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the convenience of the commissioners or council.

11. All dogs found upon lands reserved for water supply purposes shall be liable to be destroyed.
