SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1905.

IT is hereby notified that Monday, the 1st day of May next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Persons who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

NOTE.—As this is the year fixed for the Triennial General Renewal of Electors' Rights, all electors who have in their possession rights issued earlier than the 2nd November, 1904, must, not later than the 1st November next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof.

TOWN OF NORTHCOTE.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903* (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Town of Northcote, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Town of Northcote, and constituted a new municipality under the name and title of "The Borough of Thornbury."

Area described in petition:—The whole of the north and west wards of the town.

The petitioners state that the severance of the wards mentioned would be greatly to their interest and advantage, and a better supervision would be exercised over the area in question as to expenditure, works and maintenance, lighting and drainage. That the present large loan indebtedness of the town has mainly been incurred to meet the requirements of the other portion of the town.

The petitioners further state that from the published audited balance-sheets it is shown that the sum of £5,200 more should have been expended in the wards proposed to be severed than has been spent during the last ten years preceding the present year, &c., &c.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described and constitute it a separate municipality, under the name and title of "The Borough of Thornbury," such municipality to be not subdivided.

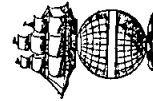

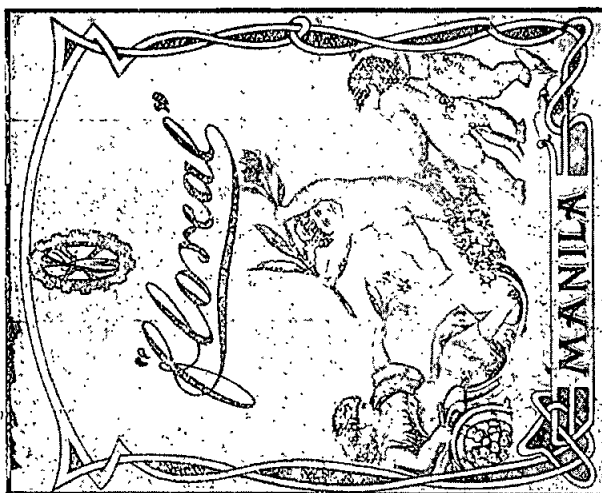

SHIRE OF BERWICK.

BY-LAW NO 4 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Berwick, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 33, 35, 253, and 259 of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 4, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil and closet-pans.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This By-law shall apply to and operate within the area of the township of Berwick, in the shire of Berwick, as may be defined by the Council from time to time.
3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the boundaries aforesaid from the operation of this By-law.
4. Every closet shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Council.
5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart.
6. An annual charge for emptying and cleansing of cess-pans shall be made by a resolution of the Council, under the provisions of section 259 of the Health Act 1890, such charge to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, and to be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said half-yearly charge shall constitute a breach of this By-law.

7. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Council shall be left in place of the one removed.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public-house, hotel, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, shall be paved or flagged with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the rise of the seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

9. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Council, or be trenched or ploughed into the ground in such locality as may be provided by the Council.

11. No occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

12. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet

to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

13. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other person, save those authorized by the Council, for the removal of night-soil, and no other person save those authorized by the Council shall remove any night-soil except in cases of exemption.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council over all premises, which premises may be inspected by the Council or its officers from time to time, or any other person duly authorized by the Council.

15. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the Justices before whom such penalties are sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

16. That all By-laws hitherto in force within the Shire of Berwick made under this Act, so far as they relate to any or all of the several things contained in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the twenty-first day of January, 1905, and confirmed the eighteenth day of February, 1905.

BY-LAW NO. 62.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 62 of the said Shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans in the parish of Ondit, and for fixing a charge for the same.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. By-law No. 57 is hereby repealed.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area in the parish of Ondit, namely:—Commencing at a point on the shore of Lake Beac, where the northern boundary of allotment 51A, parish of Ondit, meets the shore of the said lake; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said allotment and the southern boundary of allotments 54A and B, parish of Ondit, to a point forty chains easterly from the south-west corner of said allotment 54A; thence due north to the northern boundary of allotment 86A, parish of Ondit; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said allotment 86A and the northern boundary of allotment 87A, parish of Ondit, to the north-west corner of said allotment; thence southerly by the western boundary of said allotment 87A and the western boundary of allotment 87B, parish of Ondit, direct to the shore of Lake Beac; thence by the shore of Lake Beac to the point of commencement.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of seat towards the back of building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply

of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such an earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such earth-closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time to such place as the said council may have appointed. No one except the persons authorized by the said council shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The charge for emptying and cleansing the cess-pan to be paid by the occupier of any tenement under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act 1890* shall be as follows:—Once a week for each pan, per annum, £1 2s.; twice a week for each pan, £2 4s.; thrice a week for each pan, £3 6s. Such charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this By-law.

11. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The foregoing By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Colac this 18th day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five.
