SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1905.

IT is hereby notified that Monday, the 1st day of May next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Persons who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

"Residential" Rights for the Legislative Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post, and any written application posted to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar not later than the 29th April instant will be in time for enrolment on the Lists. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

Electors' Rights for the Assembly can be obtained free of charge.

NOTE.—As this is the year fixed for the Triennial General Renewal of Electors' Rights, all electors who have in their possession rights issued earlier than the 2nd November, 1904, must, not later than the 1st November next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof.

RATING REGULATION.—REGULATION FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1905, upon all the lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.
5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust a charge of Five pounds per annum shall be made.
6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.
7. Such rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st July, 1905.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

Where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use, the charge shall be One shilling per One thousand gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied. Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per One thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be Ten thousand gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on 1st January and 1st July, 1905.

4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1905.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

No. 1165), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of Ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such rules and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead : Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the General Rules for Ports in Victoria, that is to say :—

Port of Port Phillip.—Submarine mining in the vicinity of Swanspit buoy Light.—For the purpose of permitting practice in submarine mining, vessels shall not, on and from the 21st day of April, 1905, until including the 5th day of May, 1905, be navigated or anchored in the waters to the northward and westward of the No. 3 (Swanspit) buoy, West Channel, within the

area bounded by a supposed line running south-easterly from the Swan beacon to No. 3 (Swanspit) buoy; thence northerly to small black can buoy moored east by north 5 cables from the north-east end of Swan Island; thence westerly to the outer pile which marks the entrance to the channel leading to Swan Island Jetty; thence due south to Swan Point; and from thence southerly along the shore to the starting point.

BY-LAW NO. 35.

That all the words after the word "month" in the tenth line, down to and including the words "Rule 30" in the seventeenth line, be excised.

That the following words be added to By-law No. 35:—

"He shall be solely responsible for the admission and discharge of all patients. He shall exercise general supervision over all the members of the resident staff in conjunction with the matron, and should he observe any neglect he shall report the same to the Visiting Committee of the Board of Management in writing. He shall furnish to the Board of Management at every regular monthly meeting a report on the printed form which will be supplied for that purpose, and shall answer the questions therein set out, which are as follows:—

"1. Have you inspected the Institution as provided in By-law No. 35?

"2. Have any complaints been made to you either verbally or in writing by any member of the staff?

"3. Have you observed, or do you know anything in connection with the staff of the Institution which requires investigation by the Board of Management?

"4. Have any complaints been made to you by the patients during the month; if so, state the nature of such complaints?

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW NO. 14.

By-law.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under sub-sections (a) (b) of section 635 and sub-section 9 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 14, for regulating the market-place, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held, and for regulating public sales.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. That the ordinary day of holding the market shall be on Tuesday in each week, for the sale and purchase of dairy and store cattle, horses, pigs, poultry, and sundries; but the market shall also be held and be open on every other lawful day for the sale and purchase of dairy and store cattle, horses, and other animals when so required. The gates of the market will be open for receiving of animals for sale as follows:—On the day of sale—For milking cows, up to 12 o'clock noon; and for dry cattle, up to 1 o'clock p.m. All milking cows entering the gates of the market after 12 o'clock noon, and dry cattle after 1 o'clock p.m., shall be kept separate and apart from cattle received prior to the time herein fixed, and shall not be offered for sale by public auction until after all stock received for sale at or before the appointed time or times aforesaid shall have been submitted for sale, with this exception, however, that milking cows received for sale after the hour of 12 o'clock noon shall be submitted for sale immediately following milking cows received for sale prior to that hour.

That the sale of poultry shall commence at 10.30 o'clock a.m.; each person bringing poultry into the market for sale shall place the same in the coops provided by the Council, and empty crates must be removed from the yard. No poultry shall be offered for sale in the coops or boxes in which they are brought into the yard, except there is no room in the coops provided by the Council.

That sale of pigs and calves shall commence at 12 o'clock noon.

That milking cows shall have precedence of sale of all other cattle.

That horses shall not be offered for sale till the close of the cattle sales.

On each day of sale there shall be a drawing by lot by auctioneers desirous of selling milking cows in the market for priority of sale, which shall take place at Noon, and also a like drawing as to dry cattle at 1 o'clock p.m. Any auctioneer proposing to sell at any market shall, at or before any drawing takes place, furnish to the timekeeper the number of milking cows and dry cattle he intends to offer at auction. The drawing for priority of sale shall be conducted by the timekeeper, who shall provide ballot balls or papers which shall be consecutively numbered, and shall represent the order of sale to be observed by the person drawing the same, the number of ballot balls or papers to be equal in number to the auctioneers who shall have signified their intention of selling. The timekeeper shall place the ballot balls or papers in a box, bottle, or other vessel, from which each auctioneer shall draw one of the ballot balls or papers, the priority of drawing being determined as follows:—That the auctioneer who conducted the first sale on the preceding market day shall on the market day next held, be the last to draw; the auctioneer who was the last to sell at the preceding market shall be the first entitled to draw; and so on through the whole number, the order of precedence in drawing the ballot ball or paper being reversed from the position held at the preceding sale, until the whole ballot shall have been exhausted.

The timekeeper, immediately at the conclusion of each of the ballots for priority of sale of milking cows and dry cattle, shall post a list on some conspicuous part of the market showing the name of the auctioneer in the several positions of priority, and the time allotted to each auctioneer for selling.

The timekeeper or his assistant shall on each day of sale ring a bell at 12 o'clock noon, and the auction sales of milking cows and dry cattle shall then commence, in the order and subject to the conditions hereinafter provided.

The auctioneer or firm of auctioneers having priority of sale shall commence selling not later than ten minutes after 12 o'clock noon, and, except as hereinafter provided, the time allowed for each auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall be determined by the number of head of cattle entered for sale as follows:—

Number entered.	Number to be sold.
Not exceeding 500 head cattle	60 head per hour
Exceeding 500 head cattle and not exceeding 650 head cattle	80 head per hour
Exceeding 650 head cattle and not exceeding 750 head cattle	90 head per hour
Exceeding 750 head cattle	100 head per hour

But if such auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale cattle in lots exceeding 5 head, then the number of head to be sold per hour shall be proportionately increased, as such sale in lots exceeding 5 head shall be treated and counted, so far as time limit is affected, as one head; provided, however, that if the auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall have entered for sale any number of cattle not exceeding 30 head of milking cows and the like number of dry cattle, he shall be allowed two minutes for selling each head of milking cows and for dry cattle as follows:—

Any auctioneer not present when his time arrives to commence selling shall forfeit his right to sell, and shall be placed at the foot of the list of auctioneers entitled to sell. Any auctioneer, upon being informed by the timekeeper that his proportionate time for selling has expired, shall immediately cease to sell, and the next auctioneer on the posted list shall thereupon occupy the position thus vacated.

No auctioneer shall offer or cause to be offered any cattle a second time at the same market, until all other sales are disposed of and completed, and before offering for sale by auction any animal or animals sold on the same day in the market the auctioneer shall procure from the purchaser instructing him to resell the selling agent's pass for the same.

Any auctioneer or agent not proceeding with his sale as provided herein shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

Any person offering any cattle for sale in the market which are not sold, who shall afterwards sell the same privately without having first paid the dues, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

The market timekeeper shall be appointed by the Council, to whom all disputes with reference to or affecting the time, order, and otherwise of conducting the sales in the market by the auctioneers shall be referred, and his decision shall be final.

Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing by-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

The Rules and Regulations for the sale of Pigs and Calves and Sundries, Part II., and Rules and Regulations for the sale of Cattle, Horses, Pigs, and Poultry, Part III., contained and set forth in By-law No. 13 of the Shire of Dandenong, are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout such portion of the Municipal District, that is to say, all such parts thereof as are occupied or used for market purposes in the Shire of Dandenong. Resolution for passing this By-law No. 14 agreed to by the Council the fourteenth day of March, 1905, and confirmed the eleventh day of April, 1905.

SHIRE OF KOWREE.

BY-LAW No. 3.

A By-law of the Shire of Kowree, made under section 197, sub-section 22, of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Three, for regulating and controlling the speed of motor cars, motor cycles and bicycles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree order as follows:—

That (1) No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads running through the townships of Edenhope, Apsley, Goroke, and Harrow at a greater speed than eight miles an hour, or along any other roads within the Shire of Kowree at a greater speed than 16 miles an hour, without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said shire, or the president thereof first had and obtained.

(2.) No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

(3.) Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise, shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted, so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

(4.) Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse, or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right, or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible or sufficient warning of his or her approach.

(5.) In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving, or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

(6.) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

(7.) Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
