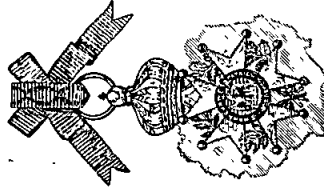

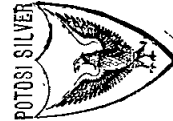

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF YEA.

WE, John Curthew Sanders, John Quinlan, Charles Tyson, Edward McCristal, and David Benjamin Olney, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of public recreation, in the parish of Yea, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—
 - 1st. The inner enclosure known as the Saddling Pad-dock.
 - 2nd. The Judges' Box, Stewards' Room, Weighing Yard, and Grand-stand.
 - 3rd. The course proper.
 - 4th. The remainder of the Reserve.
2. No person except the judge and time-keeper or any person whom the judge may call to his assistance shall enter the judge's box.
3. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room except the stewards of the Yea Racing Club or such persons as they may invite.
4. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard except the Committee of Management of the Reserve, the stewards and committee of the Yea Racing Club, and those authorized by such Committee of Management, stewards, or committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.
5. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these Regulations, shall enter upon the Reserve or any division or part thereof, except such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.
6. Every member of the Yea Racing Club and every person paying for admission to the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce or (if required) surrender to any gate-keeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards to demand the production or surrender of tickets of admission.
7. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand-stand, or any portion thereof respectively, or any booth or other structure upon the Reserve, shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, in reference to the Reserve, and the buildings and other erections thereon.
8. Any person committing in the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:—
 - (a) Assaulting any other person.
 - (b) Being drunk.

- (c) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course when the horses are running for any race.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (e) Being found in any of the divisions of the Reserve and not producing upon demand or not surrendering (if required) to any gate-keeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, to demand production of the same a ticket duly authorizing admission to the division in which the person is so found, unless he shall forthwith satisfy such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards that the proper charge for admission has been paid, and the ticket supplied to him has been lost or surrendered.
- (f) Obtaining admission to the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, when disintituled to such admission under these Regulations.
- (g) Remaining in the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the Reserve.

9. The following is the scale of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges which may be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races:—

For the admission of every person in the first division	s. d.
For the admission of any person to the fourth division	2 6
For the admission of any person to the fourth division	1 0

Provided always that the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards may exempt any member of a racing club, wholly or partially, from the payment of all or any such tolls, entrance fees, or other charges, and that the moneys received as tolls, entrance fees, or other charges shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied towards the permanent improvement of the Reserve for racing and recreation purposes, or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the Reserve, or in prizes for any race or for the owner of any horse engaged in any race, or in such other manner in or upon the Reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and recreation purposes.

10. No person shall after the 15th day of May, 1905, carry on any trade, business, or calling whatsoever on any portion of the Reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club for the carrying on of such trade, business, or calling, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards.

11. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the Reserve until he shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) That at every race meeting in the Reserve, before he commence his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall deposit with the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), which sum shall be held by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, until after the last race has been run, when, if it be proved to the satisfaction of such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, that he has not been a defaulter, such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, shall forthwith return to him the sum deposited as aforesaid.
- (b) That he shall pay to the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, a sum not exceeding One pound one shilling (£1 1s.) per diem, as a fee to entitle him to carry on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, such sum to be paid on each day he carries on his trade, business, or calling as aforesaid in the Reserve.
- (c) That during the time he shall be carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the

committee or stewards of the Yea Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

WE, Edwin Sydney Watts, Arthur Pobjoy, George Henley, William Mair, Frank Walker, William Treadwell, Arthur Henry, John Kerr, and Martin Alfred Arvidson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Lang Lang East, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entrance therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements,

on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates; stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
