That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than seventy-six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said seventy-six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-three hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

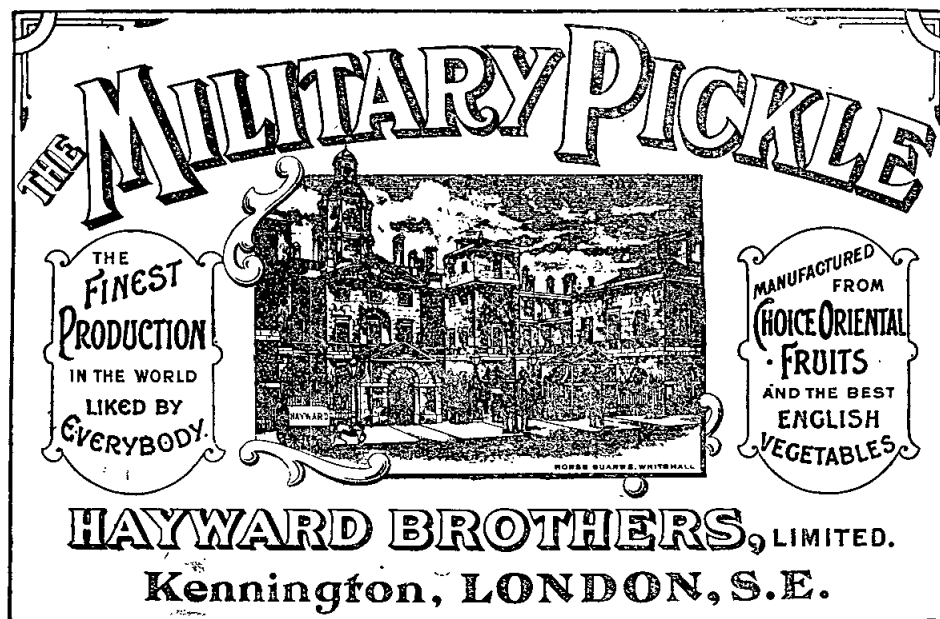

*Vegetation Diseases Act 1896.***IMPORTATION OF MANGOES INTO VICTORIA FROM QUEENSLAND PROHIBITED.****PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the plant hereinafter specified is likely to introduce disease or insects into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria from the State of Queensland in the Commonwealth of Australia of the plant following, that is to say:—Mango. (*Mangifera indica*.)

- That a substantial dwelling-house, to the value of at least £50, must be erected within one year from the date of the lease, and substantial improvements, to the value of a further £25, before the end of the second year.
- That the lessee shall reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by the wife or any child not less than eighteen years of age of the lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)
- That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the whole or any part of the allotment within the first six years of the lease.
- That the lessee shall not erect more than one residence or place of business on any one allotment.

- Such other conditions and covenants not inconsistent with the Act as the Governor in Council may by regulation prescribe.

The purchase money, with interest at 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.
