## GARDENER AT CARLTON GARDENS POISONED.

£100 REWARD.

WHEREAS at about Mid-day on the 5th May, 1905, a man placed a bottle of beer in a gardener's wheelbarrow at the Carlton Gardens, saying to the foreman gardener, James Mulgrove, "Here is a bottle of beer; drink it with your lunch": And whereas, after drinking some of the beer, a gardener named Richard Barry died in less than half-an-hour, and James Mulgrove and Constable Lancaster, who drank a small quantity, were seriously ill: And whereas the Government Analyst found that the beer contained a large quantity of cyanide of potassium: And whereas the man who placed the bottle in the barrow is described as being a stranger to James Mulgrove, and as being about 35 years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches in height, having a dark-brown beard, whiskers, and moustache, and dressed in a blue-black sac coat, dark trousers and waistcoat, with black boxer hat: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of One hundred pounds (£100) will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who caused the death of the gardener, Richard Barry.

## Fisheries Act 1890.

## NETTING IN GIPPSLAND LAKES.

**I**T is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation revoking Proclamations dated 26th day of June, 1878, and 20th day of September, 1879, relative to use of nets, &c., in Back Lake, Bunga Lake, Lake Reeves, McMillan's Straits, McLellan's Straits, Avon and La Trobe Rivers, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation prohibiting the use of Trammels, Trawls, or other Nets or Engines, as follows :—

**Bunga Lake.**—The whole year, within a line running S.S.E. from Clear Point, at the S.W. extremity of Jubilee Head, passing the N.E. extremity of Crescent Island, to a point on the opposite shore.

**Reeves Lake.**—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotomah Island.

**McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.**—The whole year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

**Duck or Lady Bay.**—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

**Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.**—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Mond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

**McLellan's Straits—Western Entrance.**—The whole year, in Lake Wellington, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line starting from the northernmost point of the western bank, and extending N.E. to another point on the opposite bank;

**Eastern Entrance.**—The whole year, in Lake Victoria, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme or outward point of either bank, or side, to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point, where the waters of the straits herein specified enter Lake Victoria or any bay thereof.

**Avon and La Trobe Rivers.**—The whole year, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the rivers specified herein enter Lake Wellington or any bay thereof.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

## SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

## BY-LAW No. 1/1905.

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen made under the Health Acts, and numbered 1/1905, for regulating the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby orders as follows, that is to say :—

1. By-law No. 1/1901 fixing the fees for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk is hereby repealed.

2. From and after the coming into force of this By-law the fees for such registration shall be :—

Persons keeping five cows or under	2	6
Persons keeping from six to ten cows	5	0
Persons keeping from eleven to fifteen cows	7	6
Persons keeping from sixteen to twenty cows	10	0
Persons keeping from twenty-one to thirty cows	12	6
Persons keeping over thirty cows	15	0
Purveyors of milk, who are not cowkeepers, paying a fee of Five shillings or upwards	5	0

Provided that only one fee shall be charged to persons engaged in more than one of the above occupations.

3. That this By-law shall be read as one with By-law 1/89, passed by this Council.

## SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of South Barwon, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law Number 6 of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating pan-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pools in the townships of Belmont and Torquay within the said shire.

2. By-law number 2 is hereby repealed so far as it relates to the matters and things provided for in this By-law.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the undermentioned areas, the boundaries of which are described as follows, viz.:—

*Township of Belmont*—Commencing at the Barwon Bridge on the Barwon River; thence westerly along the Barwon River to Princes Bridge; thence southerly along Cook's-road to Roslyn-road; thence easterly along Roslyn-road to the intersection of the Colac-road and the Germantown-road; thence along the Germantown-road to the Waurn Ponds Creek; thence along the said creek to the Mount Colite-road and thence along the Mount Colite-road and the Colac-road to the commencing point.

*Township of Torquay*—Commencing at the south-east corner of allotment 71, of the parish of Puebla; thence by a straight line running east along the south boundary of allotment 64, of the said parish, to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast, south-westerly to Spring Creek; thence by Spring Creek to the south boundary of allotment 67, of the said parish; thence east by that boundary to the south-east angle of the said allotment; thence by a straight line running along the east boundary of the said allotment 67, and across a Government road to the commencing point.

4. The contents of any cess-pool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., nor until they shall have had mixed with them carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of a pan-closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed

and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of at least half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every pan-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or of other material to be approved by the council, properly rivetted and soldered or constructed so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and such closet-pan shall always be kept in an efficient state of repair.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street, lane, or right-of-way.

9. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

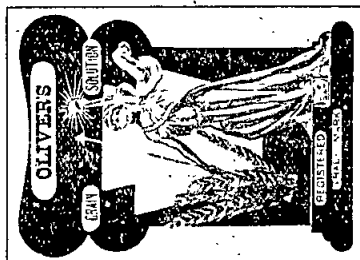

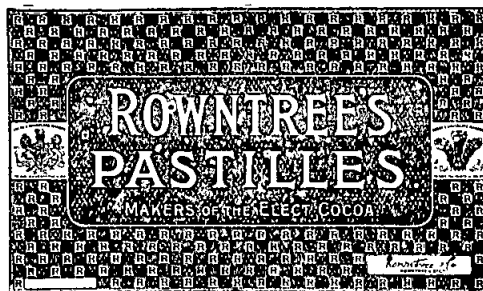

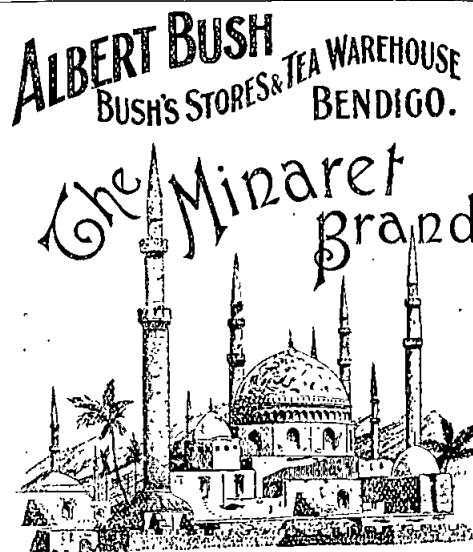

**W**HEREAS by section 55 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII. No. 1962) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing, amongst other things, the form and manner of application for allotments, and the issue of permits for immediate occupation of allotments, and the rates of registration permit and lease fees payable, and generally for fully carrying

out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations which were made by Order of the 25th February, 1905, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st March, 1905, that is to say:—

Clause 8 is hereby repealed.

Clauses 9 and 10 are hereby repealed, and the following Clauses are substituted in lieu thereof:—

9. Every applicant shall lodge with his application a deposit, consisting of an amount equal to one instalment of the purchase money of the allotment of the highest value of those applied for, together with the sum of One pound five shillings—£1 to defray the cost of the preparation of the lease, and 5s. the registration fee. The deposit may be made either in cash or by post-office order, or postal notes, or bank draft.

10. The Secretary to the Board, or the officer with whom the application is lodged shall indorse the same with the date that it was lodged with him, and, in the case of an officer other than the Secretary, such officer shall forthwith transmit the application with the instalment of purchase money, the registration fee, and the lease fee to the Secretary.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act* 1890, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or vary and revoke such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such order direct; and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

The introduction of swine into Victoria from the State of Tasmania is hereby prohibited.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDENS IN THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY (GORDON AND CROSS STREETS).

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, in respect of the Reserve for a Public Park and Gardens in the said City of Footscray (Gordon and Cross streets), it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park and Gardens and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Footscray: And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Footscray do hereby make the Regulations following in respect of the said Reserve for a public Park and Gardens in the city of Footscray (Gordon and Cross streets).

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the trees, fences, or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage the trees, fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing, or any litter.

5. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, and no person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council, shall put into the Reserve any vehicles or any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals (except dogs led as provided) found in the Reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted.

7. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Reserve, except by permission of the council.

8. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any other like game in the Reserve without the authority, in writing, of the council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any intoxicating liquors, goods, or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the council.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
