## QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 31ST MARCH, 1905.

*Population.*—The estimated population on the 31st December, 1904, was 1,210,304—605,035 males, 605,269 females; on the 31st March, 1905, it was 1,210,530—604,587 males, 605,943 females—thus showing an increase of 226 persons. The natural increase was 3,399, and the excess of emigration was 3,173. The immigration as recorded was 24,760, and the emigration 26,026. New South Wales gained from this State 35 persons by sea, and lost 401 by rail and road; Western Australia gained 1,149; and New Zealand 1,028 persons.

*Vital Statistics of the State.*—Compared with the previous quarter, the births decreased by 22 in the quarter under review; the deaths increased by 549, and the excess of births over deaths decreased by 562; the marriages decreased by 59. Of the total number of deaths, viz., 3,912, 298 were due to phthisis and 70 to other tubercular diseases; 234 to cancer; 65 to typhoid fever; 26 to diphtheria; and 2 to measles.

*Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.*—The births during the quarter numbered 2,935, equal to a daily average of 32·61. This includes 33 cases of twins, and 229 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,717, or 19·08 daily, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,218, or an average of 13·53 daily. The deaths from diphtheria numbered 13, from typhoid fever 24, and from tubercular diseases 203, as against 8, 35, and 218 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,717, of whom 412 were under twelve months of age; in Ballarat of 297 deaths 83 were of infants; in Bendigo 203 and 60 respectively. The deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 14 per cent. of the births—a rate considerably higher than that of the whole State for the year 1904, viz., 7·79. In the three towns mentioned there were 622 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 28 per cent. of the total.

*State Revenue and Expenditure.*—The total revenue for the quarter was £1,992,656, a decrease of £135,905 on the corresponding quarter of the previous year—the principal sources being Railways £1,018,301, Probate Duty £54,455, Stamp Duty £46,033, and Balance of Commonwealth Revenue £527,938. The total expenditure was £1,273,646, a decrease of £119,716 on that of the corresponding quarter of 1904.

*Commonwealth Revenue and Expenditure in account with the State of Victoria.*—The total Commonwealth Revenue credited to this State (from returns of later date than those published for Victoria) was £827,881, as against £853,744 in the corresponding period of 1904, being a decrease of £25,863 for the quarter under review. The principal sources were import duties on Stimulants and Narcotics, £179,456; Sugar, £26,831; Apparel and Texture, £145,417; Agricultural Products and Groceries, £43,234. From excise, Spirits yielded £18,651; Beer, £46,430; Tobacco, £35,585. The total expenditure on transferred services was £231,838 (Defence, £60,563; Postmaster-General, £155,060), and "new" expenditure, £46,674—a total of £278,512, as against £211,630 in the corresponding quarter of 1904—an increase of £66,882.

*Railway Statistics.*—The total railway revenue for the quarter ended March was £1,013,005, as against £1,066,852 in the corresponding quarter of 1904; the expenditure was £524,033, inclusive of gratuities and pensions, which amounted to £23,525, as against £526,926 in the corresponding quarter of 1904. Comparing the two periods, there was an increase of 134,472 train miles run; the revenue and the expenditure per train mile were about stationary. The number of passengers carried was 1,5,027,373, an increase of 497,696. The tonnage of goods and live stock carried was 1,119,177, an increase of 9,085.

*Victorian Banking Returns.*—On the 31st March, the total liabilities of the banks were £34,668,654, and the assets £37,593,741, as against £32,531,047 and £38,020,855 on the 31st March, 1904. The reserves amounted to £4,316,192, paid-up capital to £12,917,024. The ratio of coin and bullion to liabilities was 18·38 per cent.

*Savings Banks.*—On the 31st March, the amount at credit of the 444,071 depositors was £10,629,236. During the quarter 17,735 accounts were opened and 13,524 were closed; the deposits made were £1,928,475, and the withdrawals £1,863,378.

*Gold Yields.*—The yield from quartz mines was 130,324 ounces, valued at £514,275, returning dividends to the extent of £83,946. From alluvial workings the yield was 43,668 ounces, valued at £175,270, and the dividends declared were £13,276. The total yield of gold up to the end of March, 1905, was estimated to be 67,731,345 ounces.

*Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.*—For the first quarter of 1905 the total value of these exports was £649,937, of which £114,836 went to other States, £440,276 to the United Kingdom, £76,954 to South Africa; and £17,871 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £452,531; Fruit and Fruit Pulp, £47,081; Frozen Rabbits and Hares, £47,404; Frozen Meat, £71,369; and Bacon and Hams, £12,425.
