DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

Regulations for Technical Schools.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 4th day of July, 1905, rescinded the Regulations for Technical Schools made on the 20th December, 1900, and has substituted the following Regulations in lieu thereof:—

REGULATIONS FOR TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

1. Payments from the Annual Vote for Technical Schools shall be made only to such schools as may receive the approval of the Governor in Council, and the Governor in Council may at any time either withdraw approval from, or reduce the grant allotted to, any school.

2. Each school shall be under the control and management of a Local Committee or Council, to whom grants-in-aid of maintenance will be paid by the Minister of Public Instruction, who may, if he think fit, appoint one or more representatives on any of the Local Committees or Councils.

3. Accounts shall be kept in all schools showing the receipts under the heads of—(1) students' fees, separately for Science, Art, Trades, and as far as possible for each class held in the school; (2) donations and subscriptions, specifying those contributed for scholarships in Science, Art, or Trades; (3) Government grants; (4) all other receipts; and the expenditure under the heads of payments—(1) to instructors, specifying the actual amount paid to each during the year; (2) for clerical assistance, with names of recipients; (3) for apparatus and repairs, specifying whether for Science, Art, or Trades; (4) for students' materials in Science, Art, and Trade classes; (5) lighting, cleaning, and fuel; (6) printing and advertising; (7) other expenses in full detail. An annual balance-sheet shall be submitted by each school to the Secretary, Education Department, not later than the 31st January in each year, showing the receipts and expenditure under the above heads. The Minister may, at any time, authorize any person to audit the accounts of any of the schools subsidized under these Regulations.

4. The Minister of Public Instruction must be satisfied that the various instructors employed in any school receive a due proportion of the Government Grant to such school and of the fees paid by the students.

5. All Technical Schools shall be open to inspection by any officer appointed for the purpose by the Minister of Public Instruction. Should an adverse report be received from such officer, or from the auditor mentioned in Regulation 3, the grant-in-aid may be partially or wholly withdrawn.

GRANTS.

6. (a) Annual grants for maintenance, subject to the conditions specified in these Regulations, will be made to the undermentioned Technical Schools:—

(b) The Councils of all Technical Schools shall, as a condition of their receiving a grant-in-aid from this Department, undertake, if required, the instruction of State-school teachers in such subjects of Lists A and D, and under such conditions, as may be provided for from time to time by the Minister of Public Instruction.

(c) The Minister of Public Instruction, upon the certificate of the Director of Education, may nominate annually one State-school scholar for each One hundred pounds of the grant-in-aid for instruction, for a period of one year, in one or more of the subjects of either List A or D, the aggregate fees for which do not amount to more than five pounds per annum. Such scholars shall be admitted to courses of instruction in Technical Schools without fee, and any scholar may be nominated for any succeeding year.

(d) The expenditure of grants-in-aid of buildings is subject to the following conditions:—

That the plans and specifications are approved by the Department before the commencement of the work, and that 25 per cent. of the grant be retained until the work has been passed by the Public Works Department.

(e) Grants for the purchase of furniture and apparatus may be made by the Department, at a rate of not more than two-thirds of the amount to be expended. Grants for the purchase of museum specimens, at the rate of not more than half the amount to be expended, may be made by the Department. No grant, however, for such purposes will be made unless plans and specifications of furniture and details and estimated cost of apparatus or specimens be first submitted to the Department for the approval of the Minister.

8. Should the Council of a School desire the inclusion of any subject of instruction not mentioned in Regulation 7, special application must be made to the Minister for Public Instruction.

9. (a) Sanction will not be given for the teaching of any approved subject in a Technical School unless the Minister of Public Instruction is satisfied that the teacher is competent to give instruction in that subject.

(b) No new appointments of teachers are to be confirmed unless the approval of the Minister shall have been first obtained.

10. The course of study in each subject taught in Technical Schools under these Regulations shall be defined by a Syllabus, approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction.

11. Examinations in the subjects mentioned in Regulation 7, or in any subject added with the approval of the Minister to those therein mentioned, will be held in the months of November and December of each year, or at such other times as may be deemed expedient, by examiners appointed by the Minister of Public Instruction.

12. Should the examiners' reports show that the teaching during the year has been of an unsatisfactory character, the grant-in-aid is liable to be partially or wholly discontinued.

13. In those subjects of List B which are preceded by an asterisk (*), and in all the subjects of List D, the year's school work of the students must be retained in the school for examination.

In all modelled work executed in connexion with the subjects of List D, one example only of each student's work, in each subject, need be retained. Such representative works, if executed in clay, must always be cast in plaster.

All work retained under this Regulation must be legibly and indelibly dated.

14. (a) Successful candidates at examination will be classified as follows:—

List A. (Ordinary examinations in all grades).—
Passed, or passed with credit.

A special examination paper (or additional questions on the ordinary paper) will be set for "Honours" in the final grade of the following subjects:—

Euclid.	Assaying.
Algebra.	Metallurgy.
Trigonometry.	Geology.
Theoretical Chemistry.	Mining Geology.
Practical Chemistry.	Applied Mechanics.
Mineralogy.	

Candidates will be allowed to enter either for "Pass" or "Honours" (not both); but if a candidate who works a special "Honour" paper falls below the standard required for "Honours," the Examiner will decide whether the marks gained are sufficient to entitle him to a "Pass."

In Assaying, candidates for "Honours," in addition to the written work and the practical tests set at the ordinary examination, will be required to submit themselves to a

special practical examination, either at their own schools or in Melbourne at a laboratory to be named by the examiner.

List B. Passed or passed with credit.

List D. Passed or passed with credit, and, in Design, Honours.

(b) A student recorded as "passed" at the examination in any grade of a subject may, at the next succeeding examination, present himself for the higher qualification.

15. (a) In the subjects of the General Syllabus of Examinations, it is expected that students should take up the several grades in the order therein set forth. The Pass, Credit, or Honours in the higher grades of each subject will not, therefore, be awarded to any candidate until he has given evidence of satisfactory proficiency in the preceding grade or grades.

An exception to this rule is made in the subject of Perspective. List D. (See General Syllabus of Examinations—Art Subjects.)

(b) In the subjects of List A, candidates, as a rule, will not be allowed to present themselves for more grades than one of a subject at each annual examination. A student, however, who fails in the elementary or intermediate grade of a subject may be examined in that and also in the next higher grade at a subsequent annual examination. If it is desired that other students may be examined in more grades than one of a subject at the same annual examination, special application must be made to the registrar of the school, giving reasons for the request in the case of each student named, at least three months before the commencement of the annual examinations.

16. Students must have recorded at least fourteen attendances during the year to be eligible for examinations in the subjects in which yearly examinations are held; in the subjects examined half-yearly, students must have recorded seven attendances during the half-year preceding the examination; in the single subjects of List D, such as Geometry, Architecture, or Woodcarving, students must have recorded at least fourteen attendances in each; and in grouped subjects, such as Drawing, Painting, or Modelling Ornament, candidates must have recorded twenty attendances in the group during the year to be eligible for examination. (See p. 30, General Syllabus of Examinations—Art Subjects.)

17. (a) Certificates will be issued by the Department to candidates for the particular subject in which they may be successful at the Department's examinations held under these Regulations. No certificate will be issued for any subject of List B until the student has passed in the final grade. A small charge will be made for these certificates.

ELEMENTARY TECHNICAL ART CERTIFICATE.

(b) A special group certificate will be issued to candidates who succeed in passing in the following subjects of List D:—

1. Geometrical Drawing (Art). GA.
2. Elementary Perspective. P.
3. Drawing from a Flat Example, Advanced Stage—OL1.
4. Drawing with the Brush—OW1 and 4, LNW1 or 3 and 4.
5. Drawing from Models or Objects—OL2A.
6. Drawing Ornament from the Cast—OL2B.
7. Drawing in Light and Shade from a Cast—OS2.
8. Drawing Plant Forms from Nature—LN3.
9. Drawing Plant Forms from Memory—LN3M.
10. Modelling Ornament from the Cast—OM2.
11. Elementary Design.
12. Architecture and Architectural Drawing—Grades I. and II., or Drawing for Builders and Artisans.

NOTE.—This certificate will not be issued in respect to any examinations in the above subjects held prior to the year 1904.

18. Any person not being a student in a Technical School may, upon the payment of a fee of 10s. for each subject, be examined in, and, if successful, receive a certificate for, such subject.

The Regulation for the payment of the above fee will be waived in the case of State-school teachers who desire to be examined in any of the subjects of Lists A or D, required for teachers' certificates under Regulation XI.—Examination and Classification of Teachers.

DIPLOMAS.—CERTIFIED SCIENCE SCHOOLS.

19. The Department will grant diplomas to students who have completed full courses, and passed the required examinations in Metallurgy, Mining Engineering, &c., at a Certified Science School. These diplomas will be indorsed with the name of the school at which the student has been educated. Students to whom State-school exhibitions are awarded will be allowed to attend courses for diplomas at Certified Science Schools.

The following conditions must be fulfilled in order that a school may be recognised by the Department as a Certified Science School:—

- (a) That the school is regarded by the Department as suitable for the training of students in specified science courses.
- (b) That the regulations framed by the Council of the school for the instruction and general management of these course classes are approved of by the Department.

NOTE.—Under (b) are included the standard of education required for admission to the courses, the subjects and grades of subjects prescribed for the several years of a course, time-tables, &c.

REGISTERS.

20. (a) A General Register must be kept in each school, in which must be entered the register number, name, age, and occupation (if any) of each student, class or classes in which enrolled, and date of passing any examination of the Education Department held under these Regulations. The instructions issued by the Department for keeping this Register must be strictly adhered to.

(b) A register of the students' attendances must be kept, and must be correctly posted up daily, in accordance with the instructions issued by the Department.

(c) A fee-book, in which all fees paid by students are to be inserted, must also be kept.

(d) All Attendance Registers in use during the year must be forwarded to the Department within seven days after the closing of the fourth term. These Registers will be retained by the Department.

21. An abstract, showing the number of the term attendances of all students enrolled in the several classes and grades of classes, or, in the case of List D, the attendances of students in subjects and groups of subjects, must be forwarded to the Secretary, Education Department, not later than seven days after the close of each term.

22. An annual return must be submitted by each school to the Secretary, Education Department, not later than the 31st January in each year, giving—

- (1) The number of individual students (male and female separately) on the roll for the year.
- (2) The number of students who have attended seven times or more during the fourth term of the year.
- (3) The maximum and minimum fee paid by students.
- (4) The number of (a) artisans, (b) apprentices, (c) those attending State or private schools on the rolls for the year.
- (5) Number of teachers.

23. There shall be four terms in each year, each of not less than ten weeks' duration.

GENERAL.

24. A copy of the time-table for each term shall be forwarded to the Department not later than three weeks after the commencement of each term.

25. Classes in which the lectures or lessons are less than one hour in duration will not be recognised. In all subjects of Lists A and B (Regulation 7), marked with a †, the practical work of the class must be at least of one and a half hour's duration.

26. Lectures or lessons in each grade of any subject of Lists A and B on the time-table of any school must be held at least twice weekly, and on separate days. No departure from this course will be sanctioned except by the special permission of the Minister of Public Instruction.

27. No class will be recognised in which the fee charged is less than Five shillings per term.

NOTE.—A modification of this Regulation will be allowed in connexion with the subjects of List D. In connexion with those subjects of List B to which the letter A is prefixed, the necessary drawing, modelling, design, &c., should be included in the one fee. (See p. 31, General Syllabus of Examinations—Art Subjects.)

28. No portion of the annual grants for maintenance, nor any portion of the fees paid by students for tuition in subjects subsidized under these Regulations, is to be paid by Councils of schools for the maintenance of classes in subjects other than those mentioned under Regulation 7, or subjects otherwise approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction. Any infringement of this Regulation will render a school liable to the withdrawal of the whole or a part of the grant-in-aid.

29. The expenditure necessary for examinations in connexion with these schools shall be a charge on the vote for Technical Schools.

30. Each Technical Art School subsidized by this Department, and giving instruction in subjects included in Lists B and D, shall be open for instructional purposes for not less than 20 hours per week. Classes shall be held at least three evenings each week for two hours each evening, and for at least four hours on each Saturday during each School term.

Reasonable facilities should be afforded both day and evening students for practice in the school outside of class hours.

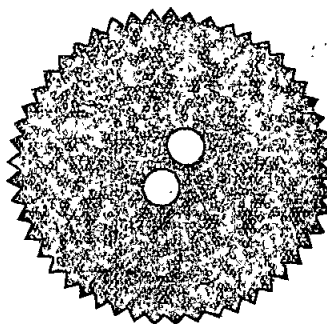

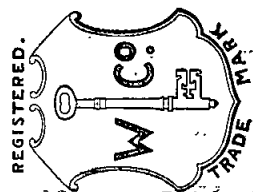

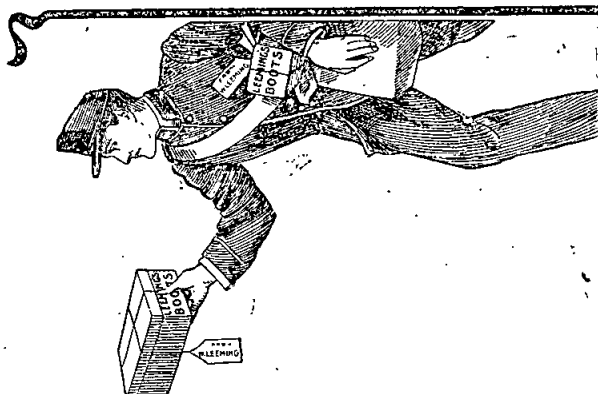

The area named in section 4 of By-law No. 55 as the area within which the provisions of the said By-law No. 55 shall apply shall be extended to embrace also the area in the township of Colac; bounded on the east by Armstrong-street; on the south by Wilson-street; on the west by Sinclair-street; and on the north by Stodart-street and Lake Colac. The whole of the provisions of By-law No. 55 shall apply to and have operation within the last-named area also.

YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

PART 1.—ORDINARY AND SPECIAL AND COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

1. *Vacancy of Office of Chairman.*—If any vacancy shall occur in the office of chairman by death, resignation, disqualification, or otherwise, the same shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, by a majority of votes of those present, and such election shall be the first business on the notice paper for such meeting. Such chairman so elected to fill any such vacancy shall hold office only so long as the chairman in whose place he has been elected would have continued to hold office without re-election. Provided that, in the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a chairman, the Minister of Water Supply may, by writing, under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be chairman; to hold office so long as any chairman elected by the Trust would have held office.

2. *Special Business.*—Where any business, other than ordinary business, is required or intended to be transacted, done, or adopted at any ordinary meeting of the Trust, notice thereof shall be given to each Commissioner, and no such extraordinary business nor any new rules or regulations shall be transacted or adopted at the ordinary meeting of the Trust unless due notice thereof have been given at a prior meeting of the Trust, or sent to each Commissioner, in writing, at least three clear days before the meeting at which same is to be dealt with.

3. *Revocation of Resolutions.*—No resolution or other act of the Commissioners at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless such meeting be specially convened for the purpose, nor unless such notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each Commissioner three clear days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

4. *Special Meetings.*—Three clear days' notice of any special meeting of the Trust shall be given or sent to each Commissioner; such notice shall state the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business shall be transacted at such special meeting than that stated upon the notice convening the same.

5. *Notice of Meetings.*—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be delivered or sent by post by the secretary of the Trust to the usual or last known place of abode of each Commissioner at least three clear days before the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

6. *Committees of Trust.*—The Trust may, from time to time, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix a quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall report to the Trust, and the Trust may from time to time alter or discontinue any such committee.

7. *Chairman of Committee.*—Every such committee shall appoint one of the members thereof to be chairman of such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman, and may, in the absence of the chairman at any meeting of the committee, appoint a vice-chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

8. *Meetings of Committee.*—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and adjourn from place to place as they may think proper, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members, if any, fixed by the Trust, and if no quorum be fixed three members be present, and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members of the committee present, and in case of an equal division of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote, in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

PART 2.—THE REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, CONTROL OF OFFICERS, ETC.

9. *General Conduct of Business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

10. *Minutes.*—Entries of all proceedings of the Trust and of all Committees appointed by the Trust, with the names of the members who attend, which meeting shall be made in books to be provided and kept for that purpose under the direction of the Trust, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust shall be read at the close of such meeting.

11. *Minutes to be Read at Subsequent Meetings.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and

the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman.

12. *Order of Business at Meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business as an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be applicable, but for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Resumption of debate on motion or orders of the day lapsed at previous meeting.
2. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
3. Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
4. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
5. Presentation of reports.
6. Payments.
7. Ordinary business.
8. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
9. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
10. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
11. Notice of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

14. *Addresses to the Governor.*—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

15. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be in writing, and shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or at such time before the next meeting of the Trust as will permit the secretary to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for special meetings, and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

16. *Notice of Motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject apart from the ordinary business of the Trust for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

17. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

18. *Motions to be Moved in Order.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

19. *Motion to be Moved by Member giving notice.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

20. *Motion Appointing a Committee.*—The mover of a motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

21. *Draft Address or Petition.*—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting submit a draft of same.

22. *Order of Debate.*—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amending or taking part in any discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner, if any, calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

23. *Nature of Motion to be Stated.*—Any Commissioners desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

24. *Motion how Withdrawn.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

25. *Motion to be Seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

26. *Mover of Motion.*—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

27. *Designation of Commissioners.*—The Commissioners in meetings of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.

28. *Priority of Commissioners.*—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

29. *Commissioners Addressing Trust.*—Every Commissioner, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust, but the chairman shall not leave the chair on such occasion.

30. *Commissioner not to Speak Twice on same Question.*—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or with the permission of the chairman in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

31. *Points of Order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

32. *Commissioners not to Digress.*—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

33. *Commissioners to Apologize for Disorderly Expressions.*—Wherever any Commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Commissioner, the Commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

34. *Commissioner Called to Order to sit down.*—A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the chairman to explain.

35. *Commissioner Guilty of an Offence.*—Any Commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order and to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty for breach of this regulation.

36. *Strangers.*—If any person not being a Commissioner, who having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the chairman to do so, may be forthwith removed by him or by his directions, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation, and any constable or police officer or any person requested by the chairman so to do may remove such person.

37. *Call of the Trust.*—Any Commissioner not attending in compliance with such call without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the Trust, or who being present at the meeting leaves the same without the permission of the chairman before all the business has been concluded, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty for breach of this regulation. Notice of such call shall be sent to each Commissioner in the manner and time required for special meetings. The chairman of the Trust or any three or more Commissioners may make a call of the whole of the Trust to attend any ordinary or special meeting of the Trust.

38. *Commissioner may Demand Documents.*—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents applying to the question under discussion.

39. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and any person not voting, and not being disabled by law from so doing shall be guilty of an offence.

40. *Question—How Declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

41. *Motion to be in Writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the chairman, be reduced into writing signed by the mover and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved.

42. *Second Amendment.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

43. *Effect of Rejection of Words in Original Motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

44. *Effect of Negating an Amendment.*—If any amendment be negated, then a second one may be moved to the question to which the first mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

45. *Mover of Motion to have Right to Reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no other mover shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

46. *Motion for Adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried the debates on motion moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point of which it was so interrupted.

47. *Protests.*—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary and signed by such Commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof, but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

48. *Lapsed Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted at the next meeting, unless otherwise decided by the Trust.

49. *Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

50. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of other reports numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust, and the secretary, when possible, shall attend all meetings of committees.

51. *Meetings of Committees.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or at any other time by order of the Trust or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

52. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

53. *Petitions to be Respectful.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and of any documents appended thereto, and shall ascertain that they do not contain anything disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any regulation of the Trust or any provision thereof.

54. *Commissioners to Affix their Names.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

55. *Petitions to be in Writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.

56. *Petitions to be Signed by Petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks in their own handwriting, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness proved to the satisfaction of the Trust.

57. *Commissioners Confined to Statement of Certain Facts.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement from the persons from whom it comes of the number of signatures attached to it, of the general allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

58. *Appointment of Officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust not already made shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Waterworks District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates is in excess of the number required the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

59. *Salary of Officers.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

60. *No Commissioner to be Surety for Officer.*—No Commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Trust or for any work to be done for the Trust.

61. *Secretary.*—The secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust of any committee of the same, and shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform or control the performance of all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust, and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or committees when required, and at the office for transaction of business as provided in this regulation, and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the secretary to discharge. In the temporary absence of the secretary by leave of the Trust or through illness or through causes satisfactory to the Trust, the Trust may appoint an acting secretary to perform the duties of the secretary during his absence. Clause 58 of this regulation shall not be applicable to such temporary appointment.

62. *Collector.*—The collector shall give no receipts, except upon the printed forms provided for such purpose, and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him containing particulars of moneys received and from whom.

63. *Disbursement of Money in Certain Cases.*—It shall be lawful for the secretary from time to time to disburse such moneys as have been appropriated by the Trust for the purposes of this clause and as are required for any necessary occasion not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the Trust the sum of £5.

64. *Payment by Trust.*—All payments of the Trust exceeding the sum of One pound shall be made by cheque drawn on the Trust's bank signed by any three Commissioners, duly authorized by the Trust, and countersigned by the secretary or acting secretary.

65. *Letters and Accounts.*—All accounts and letters must be lodged with the secretary of the Trust not later than Four o'clock p.m., on the Tuesday preceding the Trust's meetings, otherwise they will not be considered until the next following meeting.

66. *Suspension of Rules.*—Any one or more rules contained in this part of this regulation may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present at that meeting.

67. *Common Seal.*—The secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the Common Seal, and shall be responsible for the same, and the impression shall only be made by order of the Trust verified by the signature of the chairman and a member and secretary or acting secretary.

68. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

In this Regulation the word "Trust" shall mean the Yarram Waterworks Trust; "secretary" shall mean the secretary of the Trust, or a person for the time being discharging the duty of that office.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1905.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Eleven pounds eight shillings and sevenpence, or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount equal to One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Eleven pounds eight shillings and sevenpence sterling annual value, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1905, shall be as follows:—

For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, which would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, only 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, Police Station, Churches, Court-house, Post Office, State School, Show Yards, Cricket Ground, Bowling Green, Shire Hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1905.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps, to prevent overflow.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Orders and Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind same : And whereas by Order in Council dated the 25th day of August, 1903, Regulations were made in respect to the disease known as swine fever : And whereas it is desirable to amend such Regulations : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say) :—

1. Clause 3, Part I., of the aforesaid Regulations of the 25th August, 1903, is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation substituted therefor :—

PART I.

Clause 3. On death of three or more swine, owner or person in charge of same to notify fact to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne.

In the case of three or more swine dying on a farm or holding, within a period of seven days, from any cause whatever, in any portion of the State of Victoria, the owner, or person in charge, of the said swine shall forthwith give notice, in writing, or by telegram of such deaths to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, and shall forthwith isolate all swine that have been in contact with the deceased swine from all other animals, by removing them to a distant part of the farm or holding, so as to avoid the spread of contagion, if any, and shall at once destroy by fire any litter with which the deceased swine have come in contact, and cleanse and disinfect all places in which any swine on the farm or holding have been kept, or had access to. Such cleansing and disinfection to be repeated, if necessary, to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

All carcasses of swine which may have died shall be retained intact until otherwise authorized by an Inspector of Stock.

 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall any fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so

offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under the provisions of section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 145, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, and hoardings in the City of South Melbourne.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith, hoarding shall include a timber or other enclosure of a height greater than 7 feet from the level of the street, round, or partly round, a building where the latter is in course of erection, or undergoing alterations or repairs, and any erection or construction, whether for advertising purposes, or otherwise, upon land other than a street of a height greater than 7 feet, measured from the actual level of the footpath of any street within 30 feet from any part of such erection or construction, but shall not include any house, room, office, or stable—"street" shall include any public or private street, road, right-of-way, lane, or thoroughfare.

2. That from and after coming into operation of this regulation no hoarding, for advertising purposes or otherwise, shall be erected upon any land within the City of South Melbourne which does not conform to the regulations now made.

3. Such hoardings, for advertising purposes or otherwise, may be built on any portion of the land owned, leased, or otherwise held by the person desiring to build such hoardings, provided that when such hoardings are erected, added

to, or altered, after the coming into operation of this By-law, and abutting to or within 30 feet of a street, the owner, lessee, or holder, of any such hoarding, or proposed hoarding, shall lodge with the surveyor, for the time being, of the City of South Melbourne, at the office of such surveyor, a plan showing, in detail, the method of construction of the proposed hoarding, together with a specification of the scantlings of timber to be used in connexion with such erection.

4. The materials of which such hoardings is to be erected, or with which it is to be added to, or altered, shall be such as may be approved by the said City Surveyor, due regard being had to the height, position, and site of the hoarding, and shall have such struts, posts, with iron bolts and supports, as may be required by the said City Surveyor.

5. No hoarding shall be permitted to be erected which does not comply with the requirements of the said City Surveyor, and without the issue of a permit under the hand of the said City Surveyor.

6. A fee of 5s. for every 20 feet of frontage, or part thereof, shall be paid to the Council for the permit to erect such hoarding.

7. The said surveyor will inspect all hoardings now erected, or hereafter built, from time to time, and the owner, lessee, or the holder of such hoarding, shall make any repairs or alterations as shall be required by the City Surveyor within seven days after receiving notice, in writing, from the said City Surveyor to such effect.

8. Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

9. The keeper of any weighing instrument shall be paid for the use thereof for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the following fees :—

For every load 3d.

10. If any person be guilty of any offence or misfeasance, or wilful act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

By-Law No. 5.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 5, for regulating the manner of cleansing, emptying, and managing of earth closets, and privies, and for regulating the disinfecting or deodorizing of night soil.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho order as follows :—

1. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

2. Instead thereof every privy or closet shall be furnished with a double pan service for the removal of night-soil.

3. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and shall be and remain its property, and every occupier of premises shall permit such pans to be placed in every such privy or closet, and such pans shall be the only ones used in connexion with such premises.

4. Any occupier who fills, or permits or suffers to be filled, beyond three inches from the top, the pan in the privy or closet on the premises occupied by him, will be supplied with and charged for a weekly or bi-weekly service as in the opinion of the inspector shall be necessary.

5. At least fortnightly, or as much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every closet should be closed with a tight fitting lid and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed in such manner as shall be approved of by the council shall be left in the place of the pan so removed.

6. The occupier of every premises shall daily place in each pan in use in every privy, or closet on such premises a quantity of a suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to efficiently disinfect and deodorize such pan and the contents thereof.

7. No occupier of any premises or other person shall place or deposit or permit to be placed or deposited in any pan in use in the privy or closet on such premises any article or material other than human excrement and urine and the disinfectants and deodorants aforesaid.

8. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the respective areas included in the pan charges made, or that may hereafter be made, by the council in respect of the following townships and their respective environs, namely :—Korumburra, Jumbunna, and Outtrim, and to no other portion of the said shire.

9. If any person commit a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law the person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, the person offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

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SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

By-Law No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho made under the *Health Act 1890* and numbered 6, to prescribe the position and manner of construction of Privies, Earth Closets, and Urinals in the said Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho hereby order as follows :—

1. All privies, earth closets, and urinals shall be constructed of stone, brick, iron or wood, and in such manner, dimensions and design as may be approved of by the Council.

2. Every owner or occupier of any premises upon which any privy, closet or urinal shall be constructed, shall place and keep such privy, closet, or urinal in such position on the said premises as the said Council or its Inspector may direct, and every owner or occupier of any premises upon which there is any privy, closet, or urinal shall within one month next after the service of notice in writing by the Council for that purpose, remove such privy, closet, or urinal to such position on the same premises as shall be mentioned in the said notice.

3. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be placed or built in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than three feet from any street, lane, or right-of-way of a greater width than twenty feet, unless the walls thereof be constructed of brickwork of not less than nine inches in thickness, or at a less distance than six feet from the door or window of any dwelling or two feet from any partition fence.

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4. No privy or closet, except such as abut upon a street, lane or right-of-way of twenty feet or less in width shall have a trap-door or opening on the said street, lane, or right-of-way.

5. Access for removal of pans or for cleansing by night-men or others to all privies, closets, and urinals constructed upon premises abutting upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding twenty feet in width, must be obtained through and from the premises on which such privies, closets, or urinals are placed. Provided that the provisions of this clause (five) of this by-law shall as to privies, closets, and urinals which are in the opinion of the Inspector in a perfectly sanitary condition, apply only where there are or may hereafter be any premises abutting upon any such street, lane, or right-of-way used as dwelling-houses, and access to the front of which dwelling-houses, is obtained from such street, lane, or right-of-way.

6. Only such of the existing privies, closets, and urinals as in the opinion of the Inspector are in a perfectly sanitary condition shall be allowed to remain for more than three months abutting upon any street, lane, or right-of-way of more than twenty feet in width.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the respective areas included in the Pan Charges made or that may hereafter be made by the Council in respect of the following townships and their respective environs, namely:—Korumburra, Jumbunna, and Outtrim.

8. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and not less than five shillings or if such breach be a continuing act or default the person committing same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and not less than five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this by-law agreed to by the council this 21st day of March, One thousand nine hundred and five, and confirmed the 18th day of April, One thousand nine hundred and five.

No person shall at any time keep or store any night-soil, substance, matter, or thing which in the opinion of the Council shall be or is offensive or injurious to health in or upon any premises upon which there is a dwelling-house or in or upon any premises or in any position, locality or place upon any premises near or adjacent to any dwelling-house, without having first obtained the consent of the Council to the same being so kept or stored upon such premises.

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SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

By-Law No. 8.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and numbered 8—

(a) For regulating the market places, yards and premises, and the buildings, stalls, pens and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein and the immediate approaches thereto, and

(b) For fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held;

(c) For preventing the sale, or exposure for sale, of unwholesome provisions in the market; and

(d) For licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho order as follows:—

1. The municipal markets at Poowong and at Korumburra shall be open for the receipt or sale of stock, marketable commodities, garden, farm and dairy produce, on such

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days during the year and for such hours during each day as the council may from time to time determine, from sunrise to sunset, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day and Good Friday, on which days no business shall be transacted therein.

2. That the market at Poowong shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on every fourth Friday, and the market at Korumburra on every second Friday from 10 o'clock in the forenoon to 7 o'clock p.m. of the same day. Should any of the days hereby fixed for the sale of stock or produce fall on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or New Year's Day, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the market shall be open on the day preceding or on such other day as the council may substitute and appoint in lieu thereof for the holding of such market.

3. That all cattle yarded in the Poowong, the Korumburra, or any other market or yard within the municipal district for sale by public auction shall be divided into three classes as follows:—

No. 1. Dairy cows, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot and springers.

No. 2. Stores or other cattle not exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.

No. 3. Stores or other cattle exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.

In the municipal markets all cattle shall be sold in classes and in the order as below set out. All the cattle in each class shall be sold or offered for sale before the sale of another class is commenced.

Cattle in Classes Nos. 1 and 2 shall be sold in the selling yard, and cattle in No. 3 class may be sold in the pens or selling yard, at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

The Market Inspector shall settle all disputes as to the classification of cattle or stock under the provisions of this by-law, and his decision shall be final.

4. No yard or premises (other than the municipal markets) shall be used for the sale of cattle within the municipal district unless for the time being licensed by the council, and the dues payable in respect of such licence shall be a fee of 2s. 6d. in respect of each yard or premises so licensed, and payable on the issue of such licence, and also such dues as are required to be paid and are payable for the sale of cattle under and by virtue of a special order relating to the Poowong and Korumburra Markets and other yards and premises.

5. On each day when any market yard or premises are open, and upon which sales by auction take place, such sales shall be held in the following rotation:—

(a) Fat pigs; (b) Store pigs; (c) Fat sheep; (d) Store sheep; (e) Fat cattle; (f) Dairy cattle; (g) Store cattle; (h) Horses; (i) Sundries;

and in the municipal markets, auctioneers having the sale of cattle and stock, shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class in the presence of the Market Inspector or other officer of the council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle or stock in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

6. No two auctioneers shall sell or offer any cattle for sale by public auction in either of the municipal markets at the same time.

7. There shall be appointed by the council an inspector or other officer for the said municipal markets who shall

(a) See that the market regulations are duly observed;

(b) Demand and receive the market tolls and dues;

(c) Preserve order, cleanliness and regularity in the market, and to eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or swearing or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct;

(d) Inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as may be deemed unfit for use, to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

8. All stallages, rents, tolls, and dues chargeable under the special order of the council dealing with stallages, rents, tolls and dues in all markets, yards and premises, shall be payable and collected as follows:—

Sec. I.—On the entrance of the produce into the market yards or premises and prior to any sale.

Sec. II.—Immediately upon any bargain, agreement or sale, and prior to any live stock leaving the market yards or premises.

Sec. III.—Immediately upon the stock being yarded, and as in the special order provided.

9. Any person who shall place anything or any matter so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart, vehicle, carriage, wheelbarrow, sign-board, or any other article whatsoever in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

10. No person shall go into or appear in the market in a drunken or disorderly state.

11. No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, or peg, or other instrument, into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall without the consent of the council in writing.

12. Any person resisting or obstructing, or interfering with the inspector in the discharge of his duties, shall, independently of any penalty incurred for assault, improper behaviour, or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

13. No person shall offer for sale in any part of the market any commodity, produce, goods, horses or cattle, &c., before or after the hours fixed for holding the said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the council as a day upon which the market will be open, without the sanction of the council in writing.

14. No holder of any stall or right of selling in the said market, shall neglect or refuse to remove therefrom and from the precincts of the market, when required to do so by the inspector or other officer of the council, any fat, offal, or refuse, liable to or in a state of putrescence.

15. All horses or cattle must be removed out of the market before 12 o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale, provided that all horses or cattle sold, or offered for sale, at the monthly sales on Fridays shall be removed from the market yards before 8 o'clock p.m. on the day of sale.

16. Any person or persons guilty of any breach of or offence against this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more Justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

17. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the municipal markets both at Poowong and at Korumburra, and so much of it as is applicable shall apply and have operation in all yards and premises (other than the municipal markets) used for the sale of cattle within the municipal district.

In respect of the use of the market yards for branding purposes:

For every sheep 1d. with a minimum charge of 5s.
For every head of cattle 2d. with a minimum charge of 10s.
For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule 1s. with a minimum charge of 5s.

For all produce, implements, or materials not removed from the market before 12 o'clock noon on the day following any market or sale day for each week and every part of a week, and in respect of every 200 superficial feet or under of space ... 1s.
