ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and ninety-eight thousand seven hundred and fifty-four pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and five and One thousand nine hundred and six.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

ORDER 16, RULE 9A.

9A. *Power to approve Compromise in absence of some of the persons interested.*—Where in proceedings concerning a trust a compromise is proposed, and some of the persons interested in the compromise are not parties to the proceedings, but there are other persons in the same interest before the Court and assenting to the compromise, the Court or a Judge, if satisfied that the compromise will be for the benefit of the absent persons, and that to require service on such persons would cause unreasonable expense or delay, may approve the compromise, and order that the same shall be binding on the absent persons, and they shall be bound accordingly, except where the order has been obtained by fraud or non-disclosure of material facts.

Reeves Lake.—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotomah Island.

McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.—From the 1st October to 31st March in each year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

Duck or Lady Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

McLennan's Straits — Western Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Wellington, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line starting from the northernmost point of the western bank, and extending N.E. to another point on the opposite bank.

By Night.—In approaching the anchorage vessels of deep draught should not bring the White Light on the old structure to bear north of N.E. by E. in order to avoid the four-fathom patch, which bears N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the Light on Wonga Shoal; then get No. 1 lead (which consists of two Red Lights vertical seven (7) feet apart and Two White Lights vertical seven (7) feet apart) in line; keep these in line passing between the Occulting Light on the Red Buoy and the Outer Green Light on the North Bank, also between the other Green Lights on the North Bank and the White Lights on the revetment mound.

Steer on the same line until the two Red Lights of No. 2 lead are coming on; then steer with them on line until the Red Light south of No. 3 Beacon is on with No. 4; then direct the course to pass a safe distance off No. 3; then steer for a like distance off No. 4, and so on from Beacon to Beacon round the point until No. 9 is reached.

From a safe distance off No. 9 the Lights of No. 10 lead will be seen; keep them in line until the Red Light is about a quarter of a point open to the right of the White Light of No. 11 lead; then gradually alter the course to bring the Lights of No. 11 lead in line; keep them in line (a sharp lookout being kept for the mooring buoys on the starboard hand) until the Lights of No. 12 lead are seen coming into line; proceed as before by altering the course before the Lights are on with each other. The same applies in the change from No. 12 to No. 13 leads; when the Lights on the Wharfs are seen opening out off Luff Point, alter the course so as to round the point at a safe distance, and then up the centre of the Channel, looking out for the Mooring Buoys on the starboard hand.

By Day.—The directions by day are the same as by night, merely substituting the Beacons for the Lights.

In going outwards the directions are just the opposite to those given for coming inwards; but in such case, in changing from one lead to another, the course should be gradually altered when abreast of the Low (Red) Beacon of each lead, excepting No. 2 lead. In this case, when abreast of No. 3 Beacon, gradually alter the course to bring the Light of No. 4 Beacon between the Light of No. 3 Beacon and the Red Light on the Beacon south of it, until the two Red Lights of No. 2 lead are coming in line, then bring the Red Light on with No. 4 Beacon, and proceed outwards with No. 2 lead in line.

During the progress of the work at the Light's Passage Harbor Works masters of vessels exempt from pilotage may, if they so desire, avail themselves of the services of a pilot to assist them in passing such works, either in or out, at one-half the usual rates.

If the usual exemption flag is not hoisted it will be taken as a signal that a pilot is required. At night, if a pilot is required, the usual signal for a pilot should be shown.

N.B.—Owing to the nature of the work in progress, this notice may require to be amended from time to time, and, therefore, should be treated as tentative only.

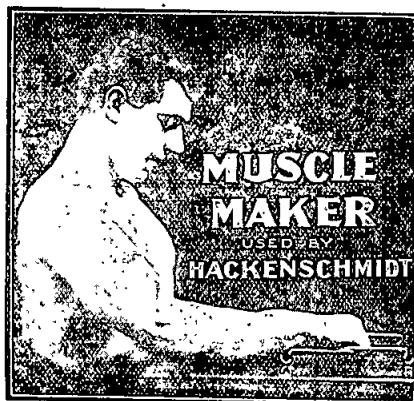

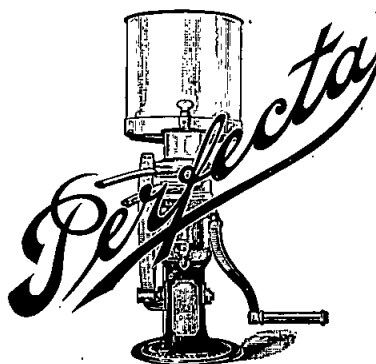

LODDON UNITED WATER TRUST.—REGULA- TION BY THE AUDITOR-GENERAL OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Loddon United Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Trust; and the said Trust has also failed to form a redemption fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Acts of Parliament in that behalf. REGULATIONS OF THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
CAPE CLEAR COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, on the 8th day of January, 1902, the managers of the Cape Clear Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Lands and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within 5 miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse, 10s. per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, 6s. per annum.

For every head of small cattle, 2s. per annum.

Progeny under six months old of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free.

3. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for a period of seven (7) days shall be liable to be impounded.

4. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the Common as the managers may set apart for the purpose, and sheep found on any other portions thereof shall be liable to be impounded.

5. No bull, entire-horse, ram, or he-goat shall be depastured on the Common without the permission (in writing) of the managers.

6. The managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the managers or the herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered or branded with the Common brand.

7. All stock without the Common brand found upon the Common shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be impounded forthwith by the herdsman.

8. No person shall be allowed to remove any stock from the Common without first having given notice to and obtained permission so to do from the managers or herdsman.

9. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the Common, but shall by their herdsman take every possible care of such stock, and in the event of loss thereof or injury thereto shall give to the owners of such stock every information and assistance.

10. The managers shall cause to be removed from the Common all diseased stock, or stock which by a competent person shall be deemed to be diseased and dangerous to the health of the other stock on the Common, and the owner of such diseased stock shall be required to keep the same off the Common, and should the owner refuse or neglect to do so the managers shall cause such diseased stock to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner thereof shall not be entitled to compensation therefor.

11. The managers of the Common shall be responsible for any damage done to property thereon, and shall obtain the permission of the Board of Lands and Works before proceeding with any works on the Common.

12. No person shall wilfully injure, or destroy, or unnecessarily disturb, or drive away from the Common, any stock legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

REGULATION No. 22.

A Regulation of the City of Footscray, made under the 44th section of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for prescribing the duties of the Meat Inspector, for fixing the fees for examining and branding carcases or meat of animals, and for the conduct of and for maintenance of cleanliness in abattoirs, and for imposing penalties.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, the Council of the Municipality of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray doth, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. Every Meat Inspector appointed for an abattoir or "appointed place" shall so far as regards such abattoir or appointed place—

- (a) Have free access thereto at all times and at any hour by day or by night, and full power and authority to inspect the same and all appurtenances and appliances appertaining, and to exercise all the powers of Health Officers under section 52 of the *Health Act 1890*.
- (b) Examine all animals intended to be slaughtered for human food before the same are slaughtered; condemn, destroy, or otherwise effectually dispose of all animals suspected of being affected with communicable disease, consistently with the provisions of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*.
- (c) Examine the carcases or meat of all animals after slaughter, cut into any part of such carcases or meat, and give such directions to the slaughtermen as may be necessary to prevent the parts and offal of one carcass being removed or mixed with the parts and offal of any other carcass prior to examination, and after examination, for the removal of such parts and offal forthwith.
- (d) Brand or cause to be branded with the Council's brand, in accordance with the branding regulations of the Board of Public Health the carcases or meat of all animals found to be sound, wholesome, and fit for human food, and personally superintend the rendering unusable for human consumption such carcases or meat as may be diseased or for any sufficient reason condemned.
- (e) Give certificates of the examination of all animals, carcases, or meat condemned, if required by the owner thereof, or by the Council, or by an officer of the Board of Public Health, or by an order of any competent Court, or by any member of the police, so to do.
- (f) Have the custody of the Council's brands and appliances required in the performance of his duties; report at every meeting of the Health Committee of the Council the number of carcases of each kind of animal examined and branded, the number of certificates issued and to whom, the number of animals, of carcases and parts thereof condemned and how disposed of, and any other particulars about which the Council may give directions.
- (g) Provide, subject to the consent and approval of the Council, a qualified substitute as Acting Meat Inspector, to carry out his duties in the event of his absence on leave, or of his absence from sickness, or of his absence for any other reason sanctioned by the Council, and such substitute or acting Meat Inspector shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities vested in the Meat Inspector during the absence as aforesaid of such Meat Inspector.
- (h) Exercise generally all the powers and duties imposed on Meat Inspectors by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, or any amendment thereof, or any regulations thereunder, and in addition so

far as may be prescribed the duties imposed on Inspectors by section 29 of the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1890*.

- (i) Every Meat Inspector shall keep a register of, inspect and report on to the Health Committee of the Council as frequently as directed, all butchers' shops, small goods factories, and such other places within the limits of the Meat Area within the city, as the Council may direct, and shall examine all carcasses, meat, offal, small goods, fittings, implements, and appliances at these places, and shall take such action in regard to these as may be authorized by the provisions of the Act.
2. (a) Abattoirs may be open, and slaughtering shall be permitted therein every day (Sundays excepted) as follows, viz.:—From 12.30 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Mondays, from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, from 3 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Fridays, and from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturdays; and the Council shall from time to time fix hours for killing at each abattoir, within the hours aforesaid.
- (b) At every abattoir during the absence of the owner, lessee, or manager, there shall be at all times some one person who shall be nominated as responsible for the conduct of the abattoir, and such nomination shall be notified to the Inspector.
- (c) The owner, lessee, or person in charge of every abattoir shall keep or cause the same, with its appurtenances and all appliances used thereat, to be kept in a strictly sanitary state; shall see that the clothing of all persons engaged in slaughtering or dressing carcasses therein is cleanly and inoffensive; shall prevent persons suffering from dangerous or communicable disease being employed in the handling of carcasses or meat; shall remove all accumulations of blood, offal, garbage, and refuse daily; shall maintain in a clean and wholesome state all carts and vehicles used for the transport of carcasses or meat; and shall cleanse, purify, and wash all walls, doors, floors, pits, bins, and receptacles on the conclusion of each day's operations.
3. (a) No person employed at any abattoir shall ill-treat, overdrive, overcrowd, or otherwise cause needless suffering to any animals taken there to be slaughtered.
- (b) No slaughterman or any other person engaged at any abattoir shall resort to unnecessary cruelty in driving any animals into the killing pens or in slaughtering them when there.
- (c) All animals brought to any abattoir to be slaughtered and kept there twenty-four hours shall be provided by the abattoir owner with sufficient food and water; and if any of them should be milking cows, he shall milk the said cows or cause the same to be milked.
4. The fees payable for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat, by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

For the carcass, part of carcass, or meat of every	
ox, cow, bull, heifer, steer, or calf ...	3d.
Sheep, lamb, or goat ...	4d.
Swine ...	3d.

And such fees shall be paid to the City Treasurer at the Town Hall, Napier-street, Footscray, once at least in each week, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

5. For every offence against any of the provisions hereof, the offender shall upon conviction thereof, before any two or more Justices of the Peace of the Court of Petty Sessions forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and for each continuing offence a penalty not exceeding (£2) Two pounds per day for each day during which the offence continues.

6. The above Regulations shall apply to all abattoirs or appointed places, and to all owners or lessees thereof and all persons using the same, and shall have full force and effect within all that part of the Metropolitan Meat Area included in the Municipal District of the City of Footscray.

SHIRE OF GOULBURN.

BY-LAW NO. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Goulburn, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 10, for prohibiting the use on any road in the Shire of any traction engine or other vehicle having projections on its wheels, and for regulating and defining the construction of any such wheels.

(2) The driving wheels of a traction used on any road shall be cylindrical and smooth soled or shod with diagonal cross-bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, extending the full breadth of the tire, and the space intervening between any two of such cross-bars shall not exceed three inches.

(3) Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.

(4) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
