By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to repeal the *South Melbourne Land Act 1905*."

"An Act to provide for the Prevention of Juvenile Smoking."

"An Act to revoke the permanent Reservation of Timber Reserve, Parish of Borhoneyghurk."

"An Act to provide for Creating or Issuing Victorian Government Stock or Victorian Government Debentures when required for paying off re-purchasing or redeeming Government Securities or for exchanging therefor."

"An Act relating to the Municipal Endowment."

"An Act to amend the *Opium Smoking Prohibition Act 1905*."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to Investment by Trustees in Government and Public Securities."

That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

for a period of eight weeks from the 10th September, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Municipal Grounds Act 1905.

CITY OF BALLAARAT.

BY-LAW NO. 97.

Regulating charges for admission to, and the conduct of persons at the City Oval.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and of the *Local Government Act 1903* and of any other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the City of Ballarat, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction make the following by-law, being By-law No. 97, that is to say:—

1. Definitions.—“The Council” shall mean the Council of the City of Ballarat.

“The City Oval” shall mean all those pieces of land containing thirteen acres three roods thirty perches and eight-tenths of a perch or thereabouts, being Crown allotments 2 and 3 of section 1, parish of Ballarat, county of Grenville, and every section of these pieces of land, the tracks, paths, grandstand, training and refreshment rooms, the fence surrounding the pieces of land, the subdivisional fences within the boundary fence, and every structure upon any part of these pieces of land.

2. The City Oval shall be open to the public on week days free from Eight a.m. till sunset, excepting on such days and at such hours as a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council of the City of Ballarat.

3. No person shall enter any portion of the City Oval or City Oval premises when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

4. No person shall enter any portion of the City Oval premises, for admission to which a special charge is made under the authority of the Council, without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

5. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure on the City Oval.

6. No person shall use indecent or abusive language on any part of the City Oval, or enter upon any part of it when intoxicated, or remain on the City Oval when in a state of intoxication.

7. No person shall climb upon or over or get under any fence at the City Oval.

8. No person shall bet on the City Oval.

9. No person shall play any unlawful game on the City Oval.

10. No person shall be noisy, rowdy, or other unseemly behaviour interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others at the City Oval.

11. No person shall write upon, cut, or in any other way deface or injure any wall, fence, or other erection upon the City Oval.

12. No person shall injure the trees or plants or pluck the flowers growing upon the City Oval.

13. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder the caretaker of the grounds or other officer of the Council in authority there in the prosecution of his duty.

14. No person shall remain on the City Oval at any time when directed by an officer of the Council to leave it.

15. No person shall be required to leave after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

16. No person shall vend any article of food or drink or other commodity, or operate any merry-go-round or other money-making amusement, without first obtaining from the Council authority to do so.

17. No person shall commit a nuisance at the City Oval.

18. No person shall do any indecent act on the City Oval.

19. No charge or fee for entrance to the ground of the City Oval shall exceed One shilling per adult person; no fee for entrance to the grandstand on the City Oval shall exceed One shilling per adult person, unless the Council previously authorize a higher charge.

20. The Council shall have power to hold musical performances at the City Oval, and to charge for entrance thereto fees not exceeding those fixed as the maximum in clause 19 of this By-law.

Penalty.

21. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Municipal Grounds Act 1905.

SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

A By-law of the Shire of Buln Buln, made under section 2 of the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905*, and the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 12, for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon or in the Drouin Recreation Ground, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance-fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon such Ground.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905*, and the *Local Government Acts*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Buln Buln order as follows:—

1. The Drouin Recreation Ground, hereinafter referred to as the Ground, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Ground may be set apart for sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Ground.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Ground who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Ground.

4. No person shall place in the Ground any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or light fires therein, without the written consent of the Council.

5. No person shall camp in the Ground or in any building erected thereon.

6. No person shall engage in any game or sports, or in dancing, in the Ground, or use the bicycle track, on Sundays.

7. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the Ground; and every club, association, or person renting the Ground for sports, fêtes, or bicycle races shall be required to enforce the provisions of the *Sports Betting Suppression Act 1901*, for the prohibition of betting in the Ground.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Ground.

9. No dogs shall be allowed in the Ground on such days as fees of admission thereto are charged as provided herein.

10. No person shall enter the Ground on any day set apart for sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or holiday amusements, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Council or any club, association, or person authorized by

the Council to issue such tickets, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date for which issued; nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Ground, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons duly appointed to collect same.

11. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council or the club, association, or person renting the Ground for the time being to keep order, shall be liable to be removed from the Ground, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

12. Upon application to the Council, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Ground for the holding of sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons, horses, carriages, or other vehicles, subject to the provisions of this By-law, and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer the following charges for such exclusive use, that is to say:—

For any sports meeting, fête, or bicycle race, held on any one day, the sum of £2 10s.

For any cricket or football match, the sum of 10s.

The Council, however, reserves to itself the right to refuse any such application.

Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more Justices, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against this By-law, and who, after he has been warned by any constable or officer of the Council, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such constable or officer of the Council and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Pure Food Act 1905, Section 41.—Health Acts.
REGULATIONS AS TO LABELLING PACKAGES
CONTAINING DISINFECTANTS, GERMICIDES,
ANTISEPTICS, OR PRESERVATIVES.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for carrying out certain provisions of the *Pure Food Act 1905*, relating to the information and directions to be set out on any label attached or affixed to any package containing any substance or compound named or described as, or sold apparently with the intention that the same may be used as, a disinfectant, or germicide, or antiseptic, or preservative.

For the purposes of these Regulations, the words "Disinfectant" and "Germicide" shall mean any substance or compound which, when used as directed by any label or statement accompanying such substance or compound, will kill the germs or the spores of germs which cause disease in man or in the domestic animals.

The word "Antiseptic" shall mean any substance or compound which, when used as directed by any label or statement accompanying such substance or compound, will arrest the development of germs, and prevent the decomposition of animal and vegetable substances.

The word "Preservative" shall mean any substance or compound which is described or sold as a preservative of articles of food, and which, when used as directed by any label or statement accompanying such substance or compound, will, when applied to, or dissolved or incorporated in any article of food, effectually retard or prevent decomposition.

1. Any person packing or selling any substance or compound under the name or description of, or apparently with the intention that the same may be used as, a disinfectant or germicide shall, in or on any label attached or affixed to any package containing such substance or compound, set out explicit information and directions as to—

(a) the strength or proportion and the manner in which such substance or compound must be used in order that it may act as a disinfectant or germicide;

(b) any matter, or condition, or circumstance, in the presence of which the disinfecting or germicidal effect of such substance or compound is counteracted or rendered inoperative, or is interfered with.

2. Any person packing or selling any substance or compound under the name or description of, or apparently with the intention that the same may be used as, an antiseptic, shall, in or on any label attached or affixed to any package containing such substance or compound, set out explicit information and directions as to—

(a) the strength or proportion and the manner in which such substance or compound must be used in order that it may act as an antiseptic;

(b) any matter, or condition, or circumstance in the presence of which the antiseptic effect of such substance or compound is counteracted or rendered inoperative, or is interfered with.

3. Any person packing or selling any substance or compound under the name or description of, or apparently with the intention that the same may be used as, a preservative, shall, in or on any label attached or affixed to any package containing such substance or compound, set out explicit information and directions as to—

(a) the nature of the active agent or agents in such preservative substance or compound;

(b) the strength or proportion and the manner in which such substance or compound must be used in order that it may act as a preservative;

(c) the articles of food for sale with which such substance or compound may lawfully be mixed or incorporated, and the proportion above which such substance or compound must not be mixed with or incorporated in any article of food for sale;

(d) any matter, or condition, or circumstance in the presence of which the preservative action of such substance or compound is counteracted or rendered inoperative or ineffectual, or is interfered with.

4. These Regulations shall take effect from the 31st December, 1906.

5. Any person contravening any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS CONDITIONING CONSENTS
UNDER SECTION 255 OF THE HEALTH ACT
1890.

THE Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and the *Health Act 1903*, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations conditioning consents to be issued by Councils for disposal of night-soil, &c., in or upon any land or garden, that is to say:—

Every consent by a Council under section 255 of the *Health Act 1890*, or section 3 of the *Health Act 1903*, shall be given subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

1. That no night-soil or human urine or solution of night-soil excreted by a person suffering from typhoid fever or cholera, or by a person who has suffered from either of those diseases within the previous two months, shall be placed, deposited, or spread in or upon any land or garden.

2. That no night-soil, human urine, or solution of night-soil shall be placed, deposited, or spread in or upon any land or garden within the water catchment of any dam, reservoir, river, or open channel containing or conveying water of a public domestic water supply, at a distance of less than one mile from such dam, reservoir, river, or open channel.

3. That no night-soil, human urine, or solution of night-soil shall be placed, deposited, or spread in or upon any land or garden at a distance of less than—

- (a) 850 yards from any such dam, reservoir, river, or open channel containing or conveying water of a public domestic water supply;
- (b) 440 yards from any stream or water-course;
- (c) 440 yards from any building in which cows, the milk or milk products of which are sold, are milked, or in which milk or cream is cooled or stored for sale;
- (d) 220 yards from any growing edible vegetables, or from any fruit trees in bearing or in bloom.

4. That immediately after any night-soil, human urine, or solution of night-soil has been placed, deposited, or spread in or upon any land or garden, it shall be covered and kept covered with a layer of clean earth not less than 6 inches in depth.

5. That no area upon which any night-soil, human urine, or solution of night-soil has, under these Regulations, been deposited, shall be used for the grazing of milch cows within three (3) months from the date of the last deposit thereon of any of the said material.

SHIRE OF AVOCA.

BY-LAW NO. 4.

Under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avoca hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. Clauses 10, 12, and 20 of By-law No. 1, made under the said Act so far as they relate to the matters and things hereinafter provided, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the Township of Moonambel.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall provide in every earth-closet belonging thereto, a closet-pan constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, with handles attached thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

4. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

5. No person shall deposit night-soil in any place except on land set apart by the Minister of Lands as a night-soil depot, or on land which the Council may from time to time appoint; and it shall be deposited in the manner following, that is to say:—Cut a trench 4 feet wide and 2 feet deep, and on the night-soil being deposited therein to a depth not exceeding 9 inches immediately cover the same with clean earth to 6 inches above the surface.

6. The occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law and By-law No. 1 aforesaid.

7. The charge for the removal of night-soil to be paid by the occupier of any house or premises under the provisions of section 259 of the *Health Act 1890* shall be:—Once a week for each pan per annum, (12s.) Twelve shillings. Such charge shall be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this By-law.

8. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CARRUM WATERWORKS TRUST.—TRUST DISTRICT DIVIDED INTO DIVISIONS FOR RATING PURPOSES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of September, 1906.

WHĒREĀS by section 129 of the *Water Act 1905*, No. 2016, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, from time to time by Order:—

1. Divide any Waterworks District into so many divisions of such size and with such boundaries as may be just and expedient, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the waterworks wholly or partly constructed for the benefit of such divisions respectively.

2. Direct that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed from the Governor in Council by any Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of its waterworks or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied only in a certain division or certain divisions (to be by him specified) of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust.

3. Direct that such rates shall be levied differentially as between the various divisions of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust.

4. Determine the proportion in which such divisions of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the waterworks constructed wholly or partly for the benefit of such divisions respectively.

And whereas for the purposes aforesaid it is deemed necessary to divide into divisions the Waterworks District of the Carrum Waterworks Trust, a corporate body duly created under the provisions of the said *Water Act 1905*.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council doth hereby divide the Waterworks District of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust into the following four divisions, that is to say:—

DIVISION No. 1.

Commencing at a point on the Dandenong Creek at the intersection therewith of the road forming northern boundary of allotment 1, parish of Eumemmering; thence easterly along road to the north-east angle of said allotment 1; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said allotment 1 to the south-west angle of allotment 3; thence easterly along south boundaries of said allotment 3 and allotment 4 to the south-east angle of allotment 4; thence southerly by the road forming eastern boundary of allotments 5, 6, and 7; to the south-east angle of allotment 7; thence westerly by road forming north boundary of allotment 94 to the north-west angle thereof; thence in a general southerly direction by road forming western boundaries of allotments 94, 89, 88, and 75, and the west boundary of allotments 74 and 73 to the south-west angle of allotment 73; thence westerly by road forming south boundary of allotment 95 to south-west angle thereof, all in the parish of Eumemmering; thence south-westerly and southerly by road forming east boundaries of allotments 111, 110, 109, 108A, 107, 98; 96, to south-east angle of said allotment 96; thence further southerly and easterly by that road to east boundary of allotment 95; thence south-westerly, westerly, and northerly by the east, south, and portion of west boundary of allotment 95, parish of Lyndhurst, to road forming south boundary of allotment 97B; thence westerly by that road forming south boundaries of allotments 97B, 92, and 91 to its intersection with Railway Reserve forming west boundary of allotment 91; thence in a general north-westerly direction along west boundaries of allotments 91, 101, 102, 145, 144, 143, 142, 141, 140, 139, and 138 to north-west angle of allotment 138; thence north-easterly by road to west boundary of allotment 137; thence north-westerly by west boundaries of allotments 137 and 136 to north-west angle of said allotment 136; thence north-easterly by northern boundary of allotment 136 to the north angle thereof; thence north-westerly, westerly, and northerly by south-western boundaries of Drainage Reserve to the Mordialloc Creek, all in the parish of Lyndhurst; thence northerly and north-easterly by that creek to the south-west angle of allotment 8, parish of Mordialloc; thence northerly by western boundary of said allotment 8 to the north-west angle thereof; thence north-easterly and easterly by road forming north-west boundary of allotment 8 and north boundary of allotments 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 to the north-east angle of said allotment 1, parish of Mordialloc; thence

A strip four chains wide, being two chains on either side of the Eumemmering Creek: Commencing at the west boundary of the parish of Eumemmering; thence along creek in a north-easterly direction along that creek to road forming east boundary of allotment 59, parish of Eumemmering.

A strip four chains wide, being two chains on either side of drain: Commencing at the western boundary of allotment 64, parish of Dandenong; and thence westerly and in a general south-westerly direction by drain through allotments 64B, 64A, 63A, 56, 57, and 58 to the road forming north boundary of allotment 89, parish of Dandenong.

DIVISION No. 2.

Comprising the whole of allotments 19, 20, 21; and 22 in the township of Mordialloc; the whole of allotments 62A, 63A, 64B, 64D, and the Quarry Reserve west of the last-named allotment, all in the parish of Dandenong; and the whole of allotment 135 in the parish of Lyndhurst.

DIVISION No. 3.

Comprising the whole of allotments 78, 80, 81, 82A, 82B, 82C, 83, 85, 85, 87, 88, 89, 93, 94; the portion of allotment 79 east of the Carrum to Frankston railway line, and the portion of allotment 56 north-west of a straight line from the south-east angle of allotment 85 to the south-east angle of allotment 95, all in the parish of Lyndhurst.

DIVISION No. 4.

Comprising the whole of allotments 57 and 58 in the parish of Eumemmering; the whole of allotments 57, 60, 61, 69, 70, and 71 in the parish of Lyndhurst; allotment 60, in the parish of Dandenong; the southern half of allotment 1, of section XXI., and the southern half of allotment 2 of section XXII., in the parish of Mordialloc.

And His Excellency the Governor as aforesaid doth hereby direct:—

(a) That the rates necessary for the year 1906 for paying interest on all money borrowed by the Carrum Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of its works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied only in Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3, of the said Trust District as described herein.

(b) That the rates for the said year 1906 shall be levied differentially as between the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3, and doth hereby determine that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows; that is to say:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for Municipal purposes in the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3, shall be:—

Division No. 1—Six shillings.

Division No. 2—Three shillings.

Division No. 3—Sixpence.

WHEREAS by section 570 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by measurement: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations pertaining to the municipal district of the Shire of Omeo, viz. :—

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons in charge of heavily laden waggons or drays shall show the inspector, when asked to do so, true and correct way-bills of their loads when such consists of any goods other than described in the undermentioned Schedule, and shall, if required, make statutory declarations as to the correctness of such way-bills.

2. The weight by measurement of each of the descriptions or classes of goods named in the Schedule hereunder shall, in the municipal district of the Shire of Omeo, be one ton, viz. :—

Hardwood, not otherwise specified—35 cubic feet.
Pine and other soft woods—55 cubic feet.
Firewood, measured in bulk—60 cubic feet.
Fencing posts, split, 6½ feet long, 7 in. by 3 in.—35 posts.
Fencing posts, split, 6½ feet long, 7½ in. by 3½ in.—30 posts.
Fencing posts, split, 6½ feet long, 8 in. by 4 in.—25 posts.
Other lengths and cross sections in proportion.
Fencing rails, 9 feet long, 7 in. by 2½ in. to 1¼ in.—40 rails.
Fencing rails, split, 9 feet long, 9 in. by 3 in. to 1½ in.—25 rails.
Other lengths and cross sections in proportion.
Mine laths, split—200 laths.
Stone, building or in large spalls—13 cubic feet.
Stone, for crushing or road metal—23 cubic feet.
Bricks, tiles, or terra cotta—18 cubic feet.
Earth, gravel, or sand—23 cubic feet.
Pyrites or metalliferous minerals—6 cubic feet.
Iron in any form—5 cubic feet.
Wool, unwashed—6 bales.
Wool, washed—8 bales.
Cement—5 ordinary casks.
Fencing wire, including barbed—20 coils.
Wire netting, 3 feet wide, 1½ in. mesh, 17 gauge—14 coils.
Other widths, meshes, and gauges in proportion.
Beans, peas, and wheat—9 4-bushel bags.
Maize—9½ 4-bushel bags.
Barley or wheaten flour—11 4-bushel bags.
Oats—14 4-bushel bags.
Bran and pollard—18 4-bushel bags.
Chaff—40 4-bushel bags.
Potatoes—12 4-bushel bags.
Hay, pressed, loose—300 cubic feet.
Straw, pressed, loose—450 cubic feet.

For railway or ship-borne goods, the railway or shipping way-bill weights to be deemed correct. For goods from local stores the way-bill weights to be deemed correct if certified to by the manager of, or a partner in, the business.

The contents of bags other than 4-bushel bags to be deemed proportionate to their size—the 4-bushel bag to be taken as a standard.

The weights of any weighbridge approved by the Omeo Shire Council to be deemed correct.

The driver of any vehicle of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do if riding upon such vehicle by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the Police Force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

6. Between the hours of Nine o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of any day, no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

7. 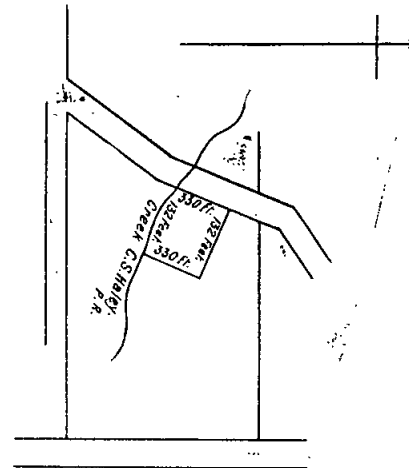
