## REGULATIONS AS TO MILK AND MEAT AND THEIR PRODUCTS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the following Regulations prescribing standards for the composition, strength, purity, or quality of milk and meat and of articles of food derived, prepared, or manufactured therefrom, and for the nature and proportion of certain substances that may be mixed with or used in the preparation or preservation of meat and milk and the said articles of food, and prohibiting or limiting the addition thereto of certain substances, that is to say:—

### MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS.

#### 1.—MILK.

##### Definition.

Milk is the normal secretion of the healthy udder of the cow.

##### Standard.

Milk shall contain not less than twelve (12) per cent. of total solids, not less than eight and one-half (8.5) per cent. of solids not fat, not less than three and three-tenths (3.3) per cent. of fatty solids (milk fats), and not more than one (1) per cent. of ash.

##### Prohibited Addition.

The addition to milk of any foreign substance, including colouring matter and preservative substance, is hereby prohibited.

#### 2.—PASTEURIZED MILK.

##### Standard.

Pasteurized milk is standard milk, which has been heated to a temperature of 156 deg. F. (69 C.) for a period of 20 minutes, or to a temperature of 165 deg. F. (73.9 C.) for a period of 10 minutes, or to a temperature of 170 deg. F. (76.7 C.) for a period of 5 minutes, the milk in each case being immediately cooled to a temperature of, or lower than, 50 deg. F. (10 deg. C.), and protected from re-contamination.

#### 3.—STERILIZED MILK.

##### Standard.

Sterilized milk is standard milk, in which all micro-organisms have been killed by the application of heat, and which has been protected from re-contamination.

#### 4.—MILK FOR THE PREPARATION OF DAIRY PRODUCE.

##### Prohibited Addition.

The addition of any foreign substance, including preservative substance, to milk supplied, sold, or used for the preparation or manufacture of dairy produce, is hereby prohibited.

#### 5.—SKIM MILK OR SEPARATED MILK.

##### Definition.

Skim milk or separated milk is milk from which a portion of the fat content only has been removed.

##### Standard.

Skim milk or separated milk shall contain not less than eight and one-half (8.5) per cent. of milk solids, and not more than one (1) per cent. of ash.

##### Prohibited Addition.

The addition to skim milk or separated milk of any foreign substance, including preservative substance and colouring matter, is hereby prohibited.

#### 6.—CREAM.

##### Definition.

Cream is that portion of milk, rich in butter-fat, which rises to the surface of milk on standing, or which is separated from it by centrifugal force.

##### Standard.

Cream shall contain not less than forty (40) per cent. of fatty solids (milk fats).

##### Prohibited Addition.

The addition to cream of any foreign substance, including preservative substance and succate of lime, viscogen, or other thickening substance, is hereby prohibited.

#### 7.—CONDENSED OR CONCENTRATED MILK.

##### Definition.

Condensed or concentrated milk is milk condensed or concentrated by the evaporation of portion of its water content.

##### Standard.

(a) Condensed or concentrated milk preserved by heat alone and protected from contamination, or preserved by heat and the addition of sugar, shall contain not less than thirty-two (32) per cent. of total milk solids, and not less than ten (10) per cent. of fatty solids (milk fats).

##### Standard.

(b) Condensed or concentrated milk preserved by heat and the addition of boron compounds, shall contain not less than thirty-six (36) per cent. of total milk solids, and not less than twelve (12) per cent. of fatty solids (milk fats).

##### Allowed Addition.

To condensed or concentrated milk sold in bulk or packed in other than hermetically-sealed packages, boron compounds may be added as preservative substance in a proportion, calculated as boric acid, not exceeding one-fourth (0.25) per cent.

##### Prohibited Addition.

The addition to condensed or concentrated milk of any foreign substance other than those substances allowed under this Regulation is hereby prohibited.

#### 8.—CONDENSED OR CONCENTRATED SKIM MILK OR SEPARATED MILK.

##### Definition.

Condensed or concentrated skim milk or separated milk is skim milk or separated milk from which a portion of its water content has been evaporated.

##### Standard.

Condensed or concentrated skim milk or separated milk shall contain not less than twenty-six (26) per cent. of milk solids, and not more than three (3) per cent. of ash.

#### 9.—BUTTER.

##### Definition.

Butter is the solid product obtained by the churning of cream or milk, with or without the addition of common salt.

##### Standard.

Butter shall contain not less than eighty (80) per cent. of milk fats, and not more than fifteen (15) per cent. of water.

##### Allowed Addition.

Boron compounds (estimated as boric acid) or saltpetre may be added to butter as preservative substance, in a proportion not exceeding one-fourth (0.25) per cent. by weight.

Harmless vegetable colouring matter may be added to butter.

##### Prohibited Addition.

The use of sesame oil (the pure oil expressed from the seeds of the *Sesamum Indicum* or the *Sesamum Orientale*) as a solvent in the preparation of any colouring matter added to butter or cheese, is hereby prohibited.

The addition to butter of any foreign substance, including foreign fat and preservative and colouring substance other than those substances allowed under this Regulation, is hereby prohibited.

#### 10.—RENOVATED BUTTER.

##### Definition.

Renovated butter is the product obtained by melting, re-churning, and re-working butter without the use or addition of any substance except milk, cream, water, and salt.

##### Standard.

Renovated butter shall contain not less than eighty (80) per cent. of butter fat, and not more than fifteen (15) per cent. of water.

##### Prohibited Addition.

The addition to renovated butter of any foreign fat is hereby prohibited.

#### 11.—MARGARINE.

##### Definition.

Margarine shall mean margarine as defined in section 2 of the *Margarine Act 1893*.

##### Standard.

Margarine shall contain not less than five (5) per cent. of sesame oil (the pure oil expressed from the seeds of the *Sesamum Indicum* or the *Sesamum Orientale*).

#### 12.—CHEESE OR WHOLE MILK CHEESE.

##### CHEESE.

##### Definition.

Cheese is the solid product obtained by coagulating the caseinogen of milk by means of rennets or acids, with or without the addition of ripening ferments or of seasoning substances.

## WHOLE MILK CHEESE.

*Definition.*

Whole milk cheese is cheese made from milk, from which no portion of the milk fats has been removed.

*Standard.*

Cheese or whole milk cheese shall contain in the water-free substance not less than fifty (50) per cent. of fats wholly derived from milk.

## 13.—SKIM MILK CHEESE.

*Definition.*

Skim milk cheese is cheese made from milk from which a portion of the fat has been removed.

*Standard.*

Skim milk cheese shall contain in the water-free substance not less than ten (10) per cent. of fats wholly derived from milk.

## 14.—CREAM CHEESE.

*Definition.*

Cream cheese is cheese made from milk and cream, or from milk containing not less than six (6) per cent. of milk fat.

*Standard.*

Cream cheese shall contain in the water-free substance not less than sixty (60) per cent. of fats wholly derived from milk.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition to cheese, whole milk cheese, skim milk cheese, and cream cheese of foreign fat, or of any preservative substance other than common salt, or of colouring substances other than harmless vegetable colouring substances, is hereby prohibited (see also Regulation 9).

## MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS.

## 15.—MEAT.

*Standard.*

Meat is any sound, dressed, and properly-prepared edible part of an animal in good health and condition at the time of slaughter.

The term "animal" as herein used, includes mammals, fish, fowl, crustaceans, molluscs, and all other animals used as food by man.

No meat shall be deemed to be standard meat in any Meat Area unless it is derived from a carcass inspected and branded in accordance with the provisions of the Meat Supervision Acts, or unless it otherwise complies therewith.

## 16.—FRESH MEAT.

*Standard.*

Fresh meat is standard meat from animals recently slaughtered, or standard meat which has been preserved only by being chilled to a temperature above its freezing point.

## 17.—REFRIGERATED OR FROZEN MEAT.

*Standard.*

Refrigerated or frozen meat is standard meat which has been preserved by being cooled at a temperature below its freezing point.

## 18.—SALTED, PICKLED OR CORNED, AND SMOKED MEATS.

*Standard.*

Salted, pickled or corned, or smoked meat is standard meat in bulk or in package preserved by means of common salt, saltpetre (sodium or potassium nitrate), sugar, vinegar, spices, or smoke, singly or in combination.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition to salted, pickled or corned, or smoked meat of any preservative substance other than those substances named in the standard, or of saltpetre in a proportion exceeding one-eighth (0.125) per cent., is hereby prohibited.

## 19.—MANUFACTURED MEATS.

*Definition.*

Manufactured meats are meats (other than fresh meat, refrigerated or frozen meat, salted or pickled or corned meat, and smoked meat), either simple or mixed, cooked or uncooked, whole or comminuted, in bulk or in package, with or without the addition of common salt, saltpetre (sodium or potassium nitrate), sugar, vinegar, spices, smoke, oils, or of wholesome fat.

*Allowed Addition.*

Saltpetre (sodium or potassium nitrate) may be used in the manufacture or preparation of manufactured meat in a proportion not exceeding one-eighth (0.125) per cent.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of any preservative substance, other than those substances named in the standard, to manufactured meats preserved in hermetically-sealed packages, is hereby prohibited.

## (a)—MINCED MEAT OR SAUSAGE MEAT.

*Definition.*

Minced meat or sausage meat is comminuted meat, in bulk or in skins or casings, and mixed with saltpetre, sugar, spices, or wholesome farinaceous matter.

*Standard.*

Fresh minced meat or sausage meat or saveley sausage meat shall contain the variety or varieties of standard meat demanded by the purchaser or designated by any accompanying notice or label or statement, and shall contain not less than seventy-five (75) per cent. of meat, not more than four (4) per cent. of farinaceous matter, calculated as starch, and not more than fifty-eight (58) per cent. of water, including added water.

*Allowed Addition.*

Sulphurous acid or sulphites may be added to or mixed with fresh minced meat or sausage meat as preservative substance in a proportion, calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), not exceeding three one-hundredths (0.03) per cent., during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April; and not exceeding one-fortieth (0.025) per cent. during the months of May, June, July, August, and September.

## (b)—COOKED, SMOKED, OR DRIED SAUSAGE MEAT.

*Standard.*

Cooked, smoked, or dried sausage meat other than saveley sausage meat shall contain not more than two and one-half (2.5) per cent. of farinaceous matter, calculated as starch.

*Allowed Addition.*

During the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April, sulphurous acid or sulphites may be added to or mixed with smoked or dried sausage meat, brawn, potted meat, and cooked pressed meats, as preservative substance, in a proportion, calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), not exceeding one-fortieth (0.025) per cent.

## 20.—DRIPPING.

*Definition and Standard.*

Dripping is fat rendered from standard meat.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition to dripping of any colouring matter or preservative substance other than common salt is hereby prohibited.

## 21.—LARD.

*Definition.*

Lard is fat rendered from standard pork.

*Standard.*

Lard shall be free from rancidity, and shall not contain more than one (1) per cent. of substances other than fatty acids, not fat, necessarily incorporated therewith in the process of rendering.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition to lard of any foreign fat or preservative substance is hereby prohibited.

Any person who manufactures or prepares or sells or keeps for sale, any article of food or substance or compound in contravention of the Pure Food Act, is liable, on conviction, for the first offence, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and for the second offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Fifty pounds, and for any subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds or more than One hundred pounds.

These Regulations shall take effect from the 1st day of October, 1906.

## LICENCE FEES.

WHEREAS under section II of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1905*, it is provided that the amount payable for a licence for a dairy farm within a milk area shall be such sum as may be prescribed, but not exceeding Sixpence per cow; for a dairy farm not within a milk area, such sum as may be prescribed, but not exceeding Sixpence per cow; and for a dairy or factory, such sum as may be prescribed, but not exceeding in each case Two pounds; and for a creamery attached to a factory such sum as may be prescribed, but not exceeding Five shillings; it is hereby prescribed that the annual amounts payable for such licences shall be:—

WHEREAS by section 129 of the *Water Act 1905*, No. 2016, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, from time to time, by order—

- (1) Divide any waterworks district into so many divisions of such size and with such boundaries as may be just and expedient, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the waterworks wholly or partly constructed for the benefit of such divisions respectively;
- (2) Direct that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed from the Governor in Council by any waterworks trust for the construction and maintenance of its waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied only in a certain division or certain divisions (to be by him specified) of the waterworks district of such waterworks trust;
- (3) Direct that such rates shall be levied differentially as between the various divisions of the waterworks district of such waterworks trust;
- (4) Determine the proportion in which such divisions of the waterworks district of such waterworks trust shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the waterworks constructed wholly or partly for the benefit of such divisions respectively.

And whereas for the purposes aforesaid it is deemed necessary to divide into divisions the waterworks district of the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust, a corporate body duly created:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in Council doth hereby order that, for the purposes aforesaid, the waterworks district of the said

Trust be divided into four divisions, and that the boundaries of each division shall be those described as portions 1, 2, 3, and 4 in a regulation made by the Commissioners of the said Trust, on the 13th February, 1900, which regulation was approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th April, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th April, 1900:

II. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of the machine.

IV. Every person who drives, rides, or propels a machine shall not proceed at a greater speed than ten (10) miles through the Borough per hour, and when crossing any streets or roads shall not proceed at a greater speed than eight (8) miles per hour.

V. Every person who drives, rides, or propels a machine shall keep the same upon the left-hand side of the carriage-way.
