REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE GRANT OF £50 AS A REWARD FOR AN IMPROVED MACHINE FOR GRADING POTATOES AND ONIONS.

ASUM not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved machine for grading potatoes and onions.

2. The reward shall be payable only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall more efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform the work of grading, without bruising or damaging same, potatoes or onions, and have each grade separated ready for bagging.

3. Such machine must be an improvement on any machine for the same purpose which has been used in Australia.

4. One or more trials shall be made of the machine at such place or places, and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working of the machines, at the times to be appointed, shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister of Agriculture may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed Fifty pounds (£50) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the State of the said invention or inventions.

8. Persons intending to compete must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture not later than the 1st November, 1906.

REGULATION FIXING RATES FOR PAYMENT OF PUBLIC ANALYSTS FOR ANALYSES UNDER THE HEALTH ACTS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

The fee to be paid to a public analyst for each analysis made by him under the Health Acts, and in respect to which he has given to the purchaser or officer who forwarded or submitted the portion or sample to him a certificate, in the prescribed form, of the result of his analysis, shall be a sum not exceeding Ten shillings and sixpence.

This Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1906.

BOROUGH OF PORT FAIRY.

BY-LAW No. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts, and in the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of any other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the Borough of Port Fairy, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution, makes the following By-law, being By-law No. 3, that is to say:—

Every occupier of a house or premises, and every owner of an unoccupied house or premises, shall cause all house refuse, organic waste matter, or edible substances to be kept while on the premises in ratproof receptacles, and shall, unless there is a dog or cat efficient in both cases for ratkilling, kept in such house or premises and given constant access to the places where rats are likely to go from cover, set in suitable places a trap or traps for catching rats, and shall cause all rats caught to be killed, and shall also, if required to do so by the Council, the Officer of Health, or an Inspector of the Council, take either or all of the following measures, namely:—

(1.) Cause sulphur fumes or other lethal gas to be pumped into the places in the premises likely to harbor rats.

(2.) Lay effective poison baits in such places as the rats are known to frequent.

(3.) Cause all box thorn growing on the premises, except such as forms part of a properly trimmed and well kept hedge, to be eradicated and destroyed or removed.

Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Port Fairy.

Resolution for passing this By-law No. 3 agreed to by the Council the 1st day of August, 1906, and confirmed the 29th day of August, 1906.

2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1907:—

1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
2. For any shop which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount not supplied with water, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
3. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.
5. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds (£2) per annum.
6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds (£3) per annum.
7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.
8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 10s.) per annum.
9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.
10. For water supplied to Government Departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
11. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.
12. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.
13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.
14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.
15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.
16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.
17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust, as being in proper working order.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such owner or occupier refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

23. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.

25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.

27. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

29. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of the officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

30. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

31. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1907, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1907, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1907, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1907. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

LEONGATHA WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-LAW No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Leongatha Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, and pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following by-law:—

By-LAW No. 1.

For fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and a minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied, and for regulating the construction, disposition, custody and inspection of meters and for other purposes.

1. For water for domestic and other than domestic purposes supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be paid.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure, shall be as follows:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied shall be 15,000 gallons for each quarterly period.

For gardens and lawns, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during any quarterly period shall be as follow:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less 2,000 gallons.

Above one-sixteenth, but not more than one-eighth of an acre, 3,000 gallons.

Above one-eighth, but not more than a quarter of an acre, 4,000 gallons.

Above a quarter, but not more than half of an acre, 7,000 gallons.

Above half, but not more than one acre, 10,000 gallons.

Livery and carriers' stables, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during any quarterly period for each stall or space of five feet shall be 750 gallons.

Stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of 100 gallons or under, one shilling shall be charged, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first 100 in any one load, Sixpence shall be charged.

Payments for such water to be made at the time of taking delivery.

All charges for water supplied by measure shall be due and payable in each year on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December.

The water supplied shall be received and used under and in accordance with this by-law and the *Water Act* 1905, or any Act amending the same.

(1) Meters, how placed:—Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and, as far as practicable, where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto.

A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service pipe or other pipe of the Trust unless permitted in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the Trust. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being tested by the Trust's officer to be inaccurate, and no meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust.

(2) Use of hose prohibited:—No cock or tap with any connexion for attaching hose shall be affixed to any service pipe, connexion, or fitting, and no hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing houses, walls, or vehicles, or animals, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter, without the written authority of the Trust, under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

- (3) Penalty for illegally using water:—Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service pipes, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (4) Licence to lay service pipes:—Penalty for breach of this clause:—Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (5) Licence fee:—Licences to affix and lay or alter or repair service pipes, to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services, may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the Trust of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work, upon payment of an annual fee of One pound.
- (6) It shall not be compulsory on the Trust to grant a licence to every or any applicant who shall prove his competency.
- (7) Deposit as security for good faith:—Every person previous to being licensed to lay services shall deposit with the Trust Secretary the sum of Two pounds sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the provisions and conditions contained in this by-law, and in the case of the non-observance or non-performance of any of such provisions or conditions at any time by such licensed person, the Trust shall be entitled to declare his deposit absolutely forfeited, and the same shall be forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person shall at once be struck off the roll of licensed persons. On surrender of the licence to the Trust, the deposit, if not forfeited, shall be refunded.
- (8) Responsibility of licensee:—In every case a licensee shall be responsible for the acts, errors, and omissions of his employees, and the Trust shall have power to cancel the licence at any time.
- (9) Service pipes at cost of consumers:—All service pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer as the Trust may appoint.
- (10) Connections:—The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have at the main a stop-cock to which a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached, and another high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line, at a uniform distance of one foot from the building line. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "conner-bit" joints be allowed on water-service pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber, who by himself or his workmen shall break this by-law.
- (11) All service pipes, tees, bends, &c., shall be of best galvanized iron, and together with all cocks, which must be of brass of best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, shall be capable of withstanding a pressure of 300 lbs. to the square inch, and such may be tested after being screwed into position, should the Trust or its officer deem it necessary to do so. All service pipes for domestic supply of premises shall, unless by special permission of the Trust, be of the following diameters in the bore:—

For all premises the annual value of which shall not be more than £66, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch.

For all premises over £66 and not exceeding £134 annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch.

For all premises over £134 annual value, 1 inch.

Where the service pipes pass under any foot-path they shall be laid within a 3-inch diameter iron or earthenware pipe, extending from the kerb to the building line. All service pipes shall have a stop-cock at the main, with brass ferrule.

- (12) No pipe to be fixed, nor afterwards removed, without permission of the Trust. It shall be unlawful for any person, whether licensed or not, to open any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, or a communication or service pipe belonging to or used by the owner, occupier, or consumer, or any other person, or to make any alteration in any such communication or service pipe, or in any apparatus connected therewith, or remove such service pipe or apparatus without the consent in every such case of the Trust; and if any person act in any respect in contravention of the provisions of this clause, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without prejudice to the right of the Trust to recover damages from him in respect of any injury done to its property, and without prejudice to its right to recover from him the value of any water wasted, mis-used, or unduly consumed.
- (13) Defective service pipes:—Penalty for neglect to repair:—If any person shall neglect to have repaired any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from an officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires to be repaired, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence after notice to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after such offence is continued, after notice thereof from the Trust.
- (14) Water-troughs and cisterns:—To prevent overflow all water-troughs and cisterns must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall at all times be maintained in good working order.
- (15) Boilers, steam-pipes, &c.:—No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- (16) All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed direct from the pipes of the Trust.
- (17) Baths:—In every bath the inlet must be distinct and unconnected with the outlet. The inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof: and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted, except where the supply is taken by measure.
- (18) Water-closets:—Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.
- (19) Entry of Trusts' officers for purposes of inspection:—The officers of the Trust may between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon enter any house, tenement, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust in order to inspect the instruments, pipes, and apparatus for conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of examining if there be any waste or mis-use of such water.

(20) Regulations for laying service:—The following regulations shall be observed by all persons in connexion with the laying of services, &c.:—

i. The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., shall be sound and free from defects, and all ends of pipes, bends, &c., shall be properly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c. All delivery cocks shall be high pressure, and the best quality in workmanship, and in all exposed places to be opened and shut by movable key or handle. All jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks shall be made with red lead and flax.

ii. No service pipe shall be laid in any street at a depth below the surface of less than ten inches, or as may be directed by the engineer of the Shire of Woorayl. After service pipes have been laid in any street the trench or trenches shall be properly filled and thoroughly rammed to the satisfaction of such engineer, and any subsidence therein which may appear within six months shall be immediately made good by the owner or occupier of the premises supplied by such service pipe, to the satisfaction of the said engineer. Before any street or pavement is broken up or trench made therein for the purpose of receiving, removing, altering, or repairing, or extending a service pipe, three clear days' notice thereof shall be given in writing to the Shire Secretary, Shire Engineer, or other proper officer of the Shire of Woorayl, except in cases of emergency arising from defects in any pipes or other works or fittings, and then so soon as possible after the beginning of the work or after the necessity for the same has arisen.

iii. Each application for a new service which shall necessitate the breaking up of any street or pavement must be accompanied by a certificate from the Shire Secretary, Shire Engineer, or other proper officer as aforesaid, that such notice in writing has been given.

iv. No private service whatsoever shall be laid or removed or extensions made by any licensed person unless he has ascertained at the Trust's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officer of the Trust to have such work executed.

v. Within twenty-four hours after the completion of each service the licensed person by whom such service shall have been laid shall report at the office of the Trust the completion thereof.

vi. If at any time such licensed person shall wilfully act contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, either by himself or his workmen, his name may be erased from the Trust's list of licensed persons.

vii. Each licensed person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for service pipes being laid and completed by him or his workmen in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and maintained in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three months after such service pipe has been completed.

(21) In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Leongatha Waterworks Trust.

(22) Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall, in addition to the penalty that may be imposed for such breach, be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907 FOR THE PURPOSE
OF LEVYING RATES WITHIN THE RURAL
PORTION OF THE DISTRICT OF THE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 64.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 5th day of December, 1900, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust District (exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899, and the 5th day of December, 1900, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of September, 1901, and also that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 25th day of February, 1905), into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of its waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—No. 1 Division and No. 2 Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions; and has, by a further Order, made the 25th day of September, 1906, determined the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another for the year 1907.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the district of the Trust, the boundaries of which such divisions are fully set forth in the Order in Council of the 5th December, 1900, first above mentioned:—

1. In No. 1 Division, Fourpence in the pound sterling; in No. 2 Division, Threepence in the pound sterling. The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above described, according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates for the Shire of Numurkah. The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1907, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1907.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1907.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust on the 11th day of October, 1906.

WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT OF THE CLUNES
BOROUGH COUNCIL.

By-Law No. 5.

THE Corporation intituled "The Clunes Water Commissioners," doth hereby pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the *Water Act* 1905, No. 2016, make the following by-law for the due administration and the carrying out of the powers conferred on it respecting the water supply of the Clunes Borough Council.

"The charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic and other purposes by the Commissioners.

1. The Commissioners may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within the Water Supply District using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days after the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter.

2. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers stables, or for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants or trees, &c., without labour), or for water power, or fountains, fish ponds, or for any ornamental or other purpose, not provided for in this by-law.

SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE.

3. The charge for water supplied for use in crushing quartz or other mine products shall be at the rate of Three-half pence per 1,000 gallons.

4. For water supplied for puddling, sluicing, or washing auriferous stone or earth, Twopence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Water supplied for steam boiler purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

6. Where water is supplied for domestic use, and is also used to supply boilers for steam engines under ten horse-power, the charge shall be by special agreement, or at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum, in addition to the charge for domestic use, except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power.

7. For water supplied for irrigation, and to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, until the amount so payable is equal to the amount of the assessed annual rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied other than by meter. For a further supply, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that when the value of the water used as above shall equal the sum of Five pounds (£5) the charge for water then used in excess of such value shall be reduced to Twopence per 1,000 gallons.

SPECIAL CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED.

8. For water supplied to troughs in streets of the Borough, Fifteen shillings per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stone work, brick work, and plastering, or the Commissioners may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

10. The minimum charge per annum for water supplied for any of the above-named purposes upon any rateable property shall in all cases be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied other than by measure.

CHARGES FOR WATER FOR STOCK.

11. Providing the occupier or owner provides a suitable wrought-iron trough, with strong cover for locking down, and fixes a suitable ball-cock, the following shall be the scale of charges per annum for supplying stock with water, unless the Commissioners decide that the water must be taken by measure, and at such a rate per 1,000 gallons as fixed by them.

12. On land not exceeding 20 acres, the sum of Ten shillings.

13. On land above 20 acres, but not exceeding 50 acres, the sum of Fifteen shillings.

14. On land above 50 acres, but not exceeding 75 acres, the sum of Twenty shillings.

15. On land above 75 acres, but not exceeding 100 acres, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

16. On land above 100 acres, the sum of Thirty shillings.

17. In addition to the foregoing scale of charges, there shall be paid the sum of £5 per centum per annum on the valuation of such land or lands and tenement. All payments to be made in advance.

GENERAL.

18. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering of stock or irrigation of private or other gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises so supplied, if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

19. All accounts for water supplied in terms of this by-law shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.

20. Any person supplied with water for domestic or other purposes, wilfully or negligently allowing the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5, and to the supply being discontinued.

21. If any meter shall cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Commissioners may estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

22. No meter shall be affixed unless it is first approved of by an officer of the Commissioners, and the dial of same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons. All repairs to meters shall be paid by the owners thereof.

23. Any person receiving water from the Commissioners, who shall take or permit such water to be carried away from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Commissioners, or who shall sell the water supplied him by the Commissioners to any other person shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. Any person not having agreed with the Commissioners for a supply taking or carrying water away from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five pounds.

25. Any officer of the Commissioners may, between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon, and four o'clock in the afternoon, enter premises, building, or land, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Commissioners by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter such premises, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Commissioners, and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and the Commissioners may cut off the supply of water to such premises, &c.

26. Upon the coming into force of this by-law No. 5, all by-laws heretofore made relating to the charge for the supply of water by measure to troughs, watering stock, &c., within the Water Supply District of the Clunes Borough Council shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any charges due and payable thereunder.

The foregoing by-law No. 5 was made and passed by the Clunes Water Commissioners on the 26th day of September, 1906, and to take effect from the date of its approval by the Governor in Council.

The rates hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year ending the 30th September, 1907, in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Commissioners, and such rates shall be payable in two moieties, one on the first day of October, 1906, and the other on the first day of April, 1907.

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 sterling, except for unoccupied lands where no water is laid on, and on these the sum of £5 per centum on the amount of valuation.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £100, the sum of £5 per centum on the amount of valuation.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £200, the sum of £4 10s. per centum on the amount of valuation.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, and not exceeding £300, the sum of £4 per centum on the amount of valuation.

5. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300, the sum of £3 10s. per centum on the amount of valuation.

6. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of £3 10s. per centum on the amount of valuation.

7. Such person as shall be appointed for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of the rates hereby made.

(I.) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partially as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, shall be paid, provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to any tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building.

(II.) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling according to the municipal valuation of such allotment, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1906, and shall be due and payable in advance, subject to the provisions of Division 8 of Part VI. of the *Water Act* 1905.

4. Such person as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

No. 1. Health Act 1890.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE
INTRODUCTION OF HORSES FROM QUEENSLAND TO VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act* 1890, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas the Regulations made by Order in Council the 6th day of February, 1899, in respect to the introduction of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs, were amended by Regulations made the 4th day of May, 1904: And whereas Regulations of 4th May, 1904, were repealed by Regulations of 28th June, 1904: And whereas it is now desirable to repeal Regulations of 28th of June, 1904, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Regulations of the 28th day of June, 1904, are hereby repealed.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Orders in Council above referred to horses and dogs from Queensland may be introduced into Victoria as follows:—

(a) *Introduction of Horses and Dogs by Land.*—

Stabled and groomed horses in actual work may be introduced by rail. The introduction into Victoria of horses which have been regularly stabled and groomed during the four weeks preceding their departure from Queensland may be permitted at the port of Wodonga, provided every requirement of the State of New South Wales in respect of the introduction of horses from Queensland in actual work, and which have been regularly groomed and stabled has been carried out, and that such horses are accompanied by the certificate of the Inspector of Stock for the State of New South Wales stationed at Wallangarra to the effect that all such requirements have been complied with; but should the owner or person in charge of any such fail to produce such certificate to the Inspector of Stock at Wodonga it shall be permissible for such inspector to order that such horses shall be smeared by the owner with such medicaments as the said inspector shall provide to the satisfaction of the inspector, and the cost of such medicaments shall be defrayed by the owner, and no such horses shall be permitted introduction from Queensland into Victoria until the inspector at Wodonga shall grant authority for their introduction. Not less than 24 hours' notice must be given by an owner to the inspector at Wodonga of his intention to introduce such horses from Queensland. Such horses must be inspected by the inspector at Wodonga during the day-time, and shall not be introduced into Victoria after dark. The inspector may, for the purpose of inspection or smearing, order the detention of any horses at the port of Wodonga until such time as he is satisfied that every requirement of this Order has been carried out to his satisfaction. Any such horses which have been smeared at the port of Wodonga shall not be washed with a view of removing the medicament within three days after smearing. In the event of any such horses in actual work which have been regularly groomed and stabled as aforesaid having been disentrained in any portion of New South Wales, the owner shall produce a certificate from an inspector of that State showing that all the requirements of that State have been fully complied with prior to their being introduced into the State of Victoria. Horses travelling by rail not in active work, and which have not been regularly groomed and stabled as aforesaid, which it is desired to introduce into Victoria, must be accompanied by a certificate from the New South Wales Inspector of Stock at Wallangarra, showing that all necessary requirements of that State have been complied with. The owner of any such horses shall give the inspector at the port of Wodonga not less

than 48 hours' notice of his intention to introduce such horses into Victoria. When the Inspector of Stock has satisfied himself that all requirements are fully complied with in this respect he may permit of their introduction into Victoria under the same conditions as stated in respect of horses in actual work; but no such horses shall be introduced into Victoria after dark, and the inspector may order the detention of any such horses for the purpose of inspection or smearing, and any such horses which have been smeared at the port of Wodonga shall not be washed with a view of removing the medicament within three days after smearing. Horses from Queensland which have been travelled by road from that State on the hoof during the entire journey may be introduced at the ports of Wodonga, Wahgunyah, Tocumwal, or Echuca provided that the owner give not less than 48 hours' notice to the inspector at the port at which it is proposed to introduce such horses. The owner shall produce a certificate from the New South Wales Inspector of Stock at the port at which such horses are proposed to be introduced, showing that all the requirements of that State have been fully complied with prior to their being introduced therein. Should the said owner fail to produce such certificate the said horses shall remain in New South Wales for a period of one calendar month from the date of their introduction into that State. The owner shall further provide the necessary yards for the purpose of inspection or if necessary crush examination of such horses prior to their introduction into this State. If the inspector is not satisfied after crush examination of such horses that they are free from ticks, he may order that such horses shall be smeared by the owner with medicaments supplied him by the inspector, and to the satisfaction of the said inspector; but the owner shall defray the cost of such medicaments: No such horses shall be permitted to enter this State after dark. Failure on the part of the owner to carry out any of the above provisions in respect of any horses he may so desire to introduce shall prevent their introduction into this State for a period of one month from the date of their introduction into New South Wales.

Mules and donkeys may be introduced from Queensland into Victoria under the same conditions as horses.

Dogs may be permitted introduction by road or rail from Queensland provided they are accompanied by a certificate from the New South Wales Inspector of Stock showing that every requirement of that State had been complied with prior to introduction therein.

(b) *Introduction of Horses and Dogs into Victoria by Sea:—*

- (1) Only horses in actual work which have been regularly groomed and stabled during the four weeks immediately preceding their departure from Queensland shall be introduced into Victoria by sea, and any such horses shall not be introduced into Victoria if any of the undermentioned conditions are not complied with.
- (2) Such horses shall only be landed at the port of Melbourne.
- (3) The owner or consignee of such horses shall, upon their arrival at the port of Melbourne, forthwith give notice of same to the Chief Inspector of Stock.
- (4) No such horses shall be landed in Victoria without the authority of an inspector of stock.
- (5) Any such horses must be accompanied by a declaration from the owner in the form of Schedule A.
- (6) The horses shall be dipped or smeared by their owner to the satisfaction of the Queensland Inspector of Stock at the port of shipment, and the declaration in the form of Schedule A indorsed by the said inspector to that effect.
- (7) Such horses shall be dipped or smeared not more than 24 hours prior to being shipped for their destination.
- (8) The owner or consignee shall produce to the inspector at Melbourne the declaration in the form of Schedule A hereinbefore mentioned on the arrival of such horses.

- (9) The horses shall be examined by an inspector at the port of Melbourne, and, if found free from infestation, and are dipped or smeared to the satisfaction of such inspector by the owner with medicaments supplied by the inspector, but the cost of which shall be borne by the said owner, a permit may be issued for their introduction by the inspector.
- (10) The horses must not be washed for a period of three days after smearing or dipping with a view to removing any medicament applied by dipping or smearing.
- (11) Any horses from Queensland introduced by sea into New South Wales may be introduced from that State without being dipped or smeared, provided they are accompanied by a certificate from the New South Wales inspector at the port of shipment stating that all the requirements of that State in respect to the said horses have been complied with; but prior to the introduction into Victoria of any such horses they shall be disinfected to the satisfaction of an inspector of stock, and no such horses shall be granted introduction without the authority of an inspector of stock.
- (1) Dogs may be permitted introduction from Queensland into Victoria by sea only at the port of Melbourne, provided they are accompanied by a declaration in the form of Schedule B by the owner to the effect that they are free from infestation, and shall have been dipped within the 24 hours immediately preceding their being placed on board the ship at the port of shipment. Provided further that such declaration as aforesaid in the form A shall be indorsed by the Queensland Inspector of Stock at the port when shipped to that effect.
- (2) The owner shall produce to the Inspector of Stock at the port of Melbourne the declaration in the form of Schedule A as aforesaid, and shall at his own expense disinfect any such dog to the satisfaction of the said inspector.
- (3) No dog from Queensland shall be permitted introduction into Victoria without the authority of an inspector of stock, and not until every condition as aforesaid has been complied with.
