## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and seventy-nine thousand three hundred and forty-three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and six and One thousand nine hundred and seven."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventh day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and six, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

**BOROUGH OF SALE.**

*Health Act 1890.*

BY-LAW No. 18.

A By-law of the Borough of Sale, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered eighteen, for regulating the removal and disposal of nightsoil, and the description of pans for nightsoil, to be used in the Borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sale make the following By-law:—

1. The whole of By-law No. 5 is hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Sale.
4. The Council may, by resolution, exempt any portion or area of the Borough from the operation of this By-law.
5. The owner or occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
6. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of nightsoil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
7. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and the person using the closet or privy shall, before leaving such closet or privy cover the excreta in the cesspan with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
8. The owner, occupier, or manager of every premises shall cause a printed notice to be posted in a conspicuous place in each closet or privy on such premises inviting attention to the provisions of clause 13, and the penalties provided in the said clause for any breach of this By-law.
9. The Council shall, at least once a week, cause the pan or pans in use on each and every premises to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from such premises in the day or night time, as the Council may from time to time determine, and the other pan left in its place.
10. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy, the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed and disinfected by some efficient means.
11. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of nightsoil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
12. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of nightsoil, and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
13. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
14. No person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish, or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than nightsoil, or shall damage such pans and lids in any manner whatsoever.

REGULATIONS AS TO TEA, COFFEE, COCOA,  
JAM, CONFECTIONERY, ICE CREAMS, BEVER-  
AGES, AND OTHER ARTICLES OF FOOD.

**T**HE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the following regulations prescribing standards for the composition, strength, purity, or quality of tea, coffee, cocoa, jam, confectionery, ice creams, beverages, and other articles of food, and for the nature and proportion of certain substances that may be mixed with or used in the preparation or preservation of the said articles of food, and prohibiting or limiting the addition thereto of certain substances, that is to say:—

1.—TEA.

*Definition.*

Tea is the leaves and leaf-buds of various species of *Thea*, prepared by the usual trade processes.

*Standard.*

Tea shall not be inferior in composition or in quality to any standard fixed from time to time under the Commonwealth Customs Act, and shall not contain spurious or exhausted or decayed or mouldy leaves or stalks, or any prussian blue or lead or other foreign matter for facing or for any other purpose, and if described or sold as the product of any country or district, shall be the product of the country or district specified.

TEA DUST.

*Definition.*

Tea dust is the siftings or fannings of standard tea.

*Standard.*

Tea dust shall not contain more than five (5) per cent. of ash insoluble in water.

2.—COFFEE.

*Definition.*

Coffee is the seed of the *Coffea Arabica* or the *Coffea Liberrica*.

*Standard.*

Ground roasted coffee shall contain not less than ten (10) per cent. of fat, not more than one (1) per cent. of saccharine matter, not more than six (6) per cent. of ash, of which the proportion of soluble ash shall be not less than seventy-five (75) per cent., and shall contain no chicory.

COFFEE AND CHICORY.

*Standard.*

Coffee and chicory is any compound of coffee and chicory containing not less than fifty (50) per cent. of coffee.

CHICORY AND COFFEE.

*Standard.*

Chicory and coffee is any compound of chicory and coffee containing less than fifty (50) per cent. of coffee.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of any foreign substance (including starch) to coffee, or to coffee and chicory, or to chicory and coffee, is hereby prohibited.

3.—COCOA AND COCOA PRODUCTS.

*Definitions.*

Cocoa beans are the seeds of the cacao tree (*Theobroma Cacao L.*).

Cocoa nib or cracked cocoa is the roasted broken cocoa bean freed from its shell or husk, with or without the germ.

COCOA MASS OR COCOA SLAB.

*Definition.*

Cocoa mass or cocoa slab is the solid or plastic mass obtained by grinding cocoa nib.

*Standard.*

Cocoa mass or cocoa slab shall contain not less than forty-five (45) per cent. of cocoa fat; not more than twelve (12) per cent. of starch natural to cocoa; not more than three and one-half (3.5) per cent. of crude fibre; not more than four and one-half (4.5) per cent. of total ash; and not more than three (3) per cent. of ash insoluble in water.

The proportion of iron, estimated as ferric oxide, in the total ash shall not exceed one-fifth (0.2) per cent.

CHOCOLATE OR SWEET COCOA MASS OR CONFECTIONERS'  
CHOCOLATE OR CHOCOLATE COATING.

*Definition.*

Chocolate or sweet cocoa mass or confectioners' chocolate or chocolate coating is cocoa mass mixed with sugar, with or without the addition or the subtraction of cocoa fat, and with or without the addition of spices or other flavouring substances.

*Standard.*

Chocolate or sweet cocoa mass or confectioners' chocolate or chocolate coating shall contain in the sugar- and fat-free residue no higher proportion of starch or fibre or ash than is found in the fat-free residue of standard cocoa mass.

COCOA OR POWDERED COCOA OR COCOA ESSENCE.

*Definition.*

Cocoa or powdered cocoa or cocoa essence is cocoa nib deprived of a portion of its fat and finely pulverized.

*Standard.*

Cocoa or powdered cocoa or cocoa essence shall contain, after correction for cocoa-fat removed, no higher proportion of starch or fibre or ash than standard cocoa mass.

GRANULATED OR GROUND CHOCOLATE OR CHOCOLATE  
POWDER.

*Definition.*

Granulated or ground chocolate or chocolate powder is a compound of cocoa mass with sugar.

*Standard.*

Granulated or ground chocolate or chocolate powder shall contain in the sugar- and fat-free residue no higher proportion of starch or crude fibre or ash than standard cocoa mass, and shall contain not more than fifty (50) per cent. of sugar.

PREPARED COCOA, HOMOEOPATHIC COCOA, AND SWEETENED  
COCOA.

*Definition.*

Prepared cocoa or homoeopathic cocoa or sweetened cocoa is a mixture of cocoa mass with sugar or starch or with both.

*Standard.*

Prepared cocoa or homoeopathic cocoa or sweetened cocoa shall contain not less than forty (40) per cent. of cocoa mass, and not more than sixty (60) per cent. of added farinaceous matter and sugar, or shall be compounded of cocoa mass with sugar or farinaceous matter or with both in the proportions declared on the label accompanying any package of any such article, and shall, after correction for fat and starch removed, contain in the sugar- and fat- and starch-free residue no higher proportion of fibre or ash than standard cocoa mass.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition to prepared cocoa or homoeopathic cocoa or sweetened cocoa of foreign colouring matter is hereby prohibited.

SOLUBLE COCOA OR SOLUBLE COCOA ESSENCE.

*Definition.*

Soluble cocoa or soluble cocoa essence is cocoa treated with alkaline salts.

*Standard.*

Soluble cocoa or soluble cocoa essence shall contain not more than three (3) per cent. of added alkali or alkaline salt, estimated as potassium carbonate, and, after correction for removed fat and added alkali, shall contain no higher proportion of starch or fibre or ash than standard cocoa mass.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of cocoa husk, or weighting substance, or foreign fat, or paraffin or other injurious substance to cocoa or to any cocoa product, is hereby prohibited.

4.—JAM AND MARMALADE.

*Definition.*

Jam or marmalade is an article of food obtained by boiling sound whole fruit with sugar.

"Whole fruit" may include ginger or similar substances, or fruit which has been deprived of its rind or pericarp or stone or seed.

*Standard.*

Jam or marmalade shall contain no vegetable substance other than sound whole fruit or fruits of the variety or varieties designated, nor any preservative substance other than sugar, nor any foreign substance of the nature of gelatine or starch-jelly, nor any foreign flavouring substance, nor any glucose other than standard glucose.

## MIXED OR COMPOUNDED JAM OR MARMALADE.

*Definition.*

Mixed or compounded jam or marmalade is an article of food obtained by boiling with sugar two or more varieties of sound whole fruit.

*Standard.*

Mixed or compounded jam or marmalade shall contain no vegetable substance other than that derived from the sound whole fruits of the varieties designated, and shall contain not less than fifty (50) per cent. of the fruit of the variety first named on the label attached to any package of the compound.

## JELLY.

*Definition.*

Jelly is a fruit compound prepared from the juice of fruit and sugar.

*Standard.*

Jelly shall contain no vegetable substance other than that derived from the sound whole fruit or fruits of the variety or varieties designated, nor any preservative substance other than sugar, nor any foreign substance of the nature of gelatine or starch jelly, nor any foreign flavouring substance, nor any glucose other than standard glucose.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of colouring matter to mixed or compounded jam or marmalade or to jelly is hereby prohibited.

## 5.—CONFECTIONERY.

*Definition.*

Confectionery is a solid or semi-solid or gelatinous saccharine product with or without other food substances, such as butter, eggs, chocolate, nuts, and fruits, and with or without flavouring substance.

*Standard.*

Confectionery shall contain no paraffin, nor any foreign mineral substance, nor any injurious colouring agent, nor any chloroform or other injurious flavouring agent, nor any drug concerning which any restrictive regulation is in force, nor any glucose other than standard glucose.

## 6.—PROHIBITION OF SACCHARIN, ETC.

The use of saccharin, saxin, dulcin, glucin, or any synthetic sweetening substance in the preparation of confectionery or of any article of food (except diabetic foods and fermented alcoholic beverages containing less than two (2) per cent. of proof spirit), is hereby prohibited.

## 7.—JELLY CRYSTALS.

*Definition.*

Jelly Crystals are confectionery variously coloured and flavoured, composed of gelatin and sugar.

## FRUIT JELLY CRYSTALS.

*Standard.*

Fruit jelly crystals are jelly crystals flavoured with wholesome substances derived wholly from fruits or from other pure vegetable substances. The gelatine content shall be free from the products of decomposition.

## ARTIFICIALLY FLAVOURED JELLY CRYSTALS.

*Standard.*

Artificially flavoured jelly crystals are jelly crystals flavoured with harmless artificial essence. The gelatine content shall be free from the products of decomposition.

## 8.—STANDARD ICE CREAM OR ICE CREAM.

*Definition.*

Standard ice cream or ice cream is a frozen food substance made from fresh cream, fresh standard milk, and sugar, with or without fresh eggs or the pulp or juice of clean sound ripe fruit or nuts or harmless flavouring or colouring substance, the product being sterilized by heat or pasteurized, then cooled and frozen under conditions whereby it is protected from contamination.

*Standard.*

Standard ice cream or ice cream shall contain not less than eight (8) per cent. of milk-fat, and not more than fifty thousand (50,000) micro-organisms per cubic centimetre, and shall contain neither boric acid nor any other preservative substance.

## MIXED ICE CREAM.

*Definition.*

Mixed ice cream is a frozen food substance made from fresh standard milk and sugar, with or without fresh cream or fresh eggs or wholesome farinaceous matter or pulp or juice of clean sound ripe fruit or nuts or harmless flavouring or colouring substance, the product being sterilized by heat or pasteurized, then cooled and frozen under conditions whereby it is protected from contamination.

*Standard.*

Mixed ice cream shall contain not less than two and one-half (2.5) per cent. of milk-fat, and not more than fifty thousand (50,000) micro-organisms per cubic centimetre, and shall contain neither boric acid nor any other preservative substance.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of thawed ice-cream mixtures to standard ice cream or ice cream or to mixed ice cream is hereby prohibited.

## 9.—SUCROSE.

*Definition.*

Sucrose (known as cane sugar, beet sugar, or maple sugar) is a saccharine product derived from the sugar cane (*Saccharum Officinatum*), the beet root (*Beta Vulgaris*), and the maple tree (*Acer Saccharinum* or *Acer Barbatum*).

*Standard.*

Sucrose (cane sugar, beet sugar, or maple sugar) shall contain no mineral substance (including arsenic), and no injurious colouring substance.

## 10.—GLUCOSE PRODUCTS.

*Definitions.*

Starch sugar or grape sugar is the solid product obtained by hydrolyzing starch or a wholesome starch-containing substance until the starch is converted into dextrose.

Anhydrous starch sugar or grape sugar is starch sugar or grape sugar crystallized without water of crystallization.

Hydrous starch sugar or grape sugar (known as (a) "Brewers" sugar or "70" sugar, (b) "Climax" or "Acme" sugar or "80" sugar) is starch sugar or grape sugar crystallized with water of crystallization.

Glucose or mixing glucose or confectioners' glucose is a syrupy product obtained by incompletely hydrolyzing starch or a wholesome starch-containing substance, with subsequent decolorization and evaporation.

*Standards.*

Anhydrous starch sugar or grape sugar shall contain not less than ninety-five (95) per cent. of dextrose without water of crystallization, and not more than four-fifths (0.8) per cent. of ash, and shall contain no arsenic.

Hydrous starch sugar or grape sugar:—

(a) "Brewers" sugar or "70" sugar shall contain not less than seventy (70) per cent. of dextrose, and not more than four-fifths (0.8) per cent. of ash, and shall contain no arsenic.

(b) "Climax" or "Acme" sugar or "80" sugar shall contain not less than eighty (80) per cent. of dextrose, and not more than one and one-half (1.5) per cent. of ash, and shall contain no arsenic.

Glucose, mixing sugar, or confectioners' sugar shall have a density of between 41 deg. and 45 deg. Baumé (specific gravity 1.40 and 1.45 respectively), at a temperature of 100 deg. F. (37.70 deg. C.), and shall conform within these limits to the degree of density claimed by any label or statement, and shall contain not more than one (1) per cent. of ash, estimated on the basis of a degree of concentration equal to 41 deg. Baumé, and shall contain no arsenic.

Glucose, mixing sugar, or confectioners' sugar of density equal to 41 deg. Baumé, at the above-mentioned temperature, shall contain not more than 21 per cent. of water.

Glucose, mixing sugar or confectioners' sugar of a density of 45 deg. Baumé, at the above-mentioned temperature, shall contain not more than 14 per cent. of water.

## 11.—HONEY.

*Definitions.*

Honey, liquid or extracted honey, strained honey, or pure honey is the natural product of the honey-bee (*Apis Mellifica*).

Garden or flower honey is the nectar of flowers that has been transformed by the honey-bee.

*Standard.*

Honey, liquid or extracted honey, strained honey, pure honey, or garden or flower honey shall conform respectively to the foregoing definitions, and shall contain not more than twenty-six (26) per cent. of water, not less than sixty (60) per cent. of reducing sugars, and not more than three-fourths (0.75) per cent. of ash.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of glucose or invert sugar to honey, liquid or extracted honey, strained honey, pure honey, or garden or flower honey is hereby prohibited.

## 12.—VINEGAR.

*Definition.*

Vinegar is a mixture of acetic acid and water obtained by fermentation and oxidation or other chemical process with or without subsequent distillation, and carries in solution, if undistilled, extractives from the fruit, grain, vegetable substance, or syrup used in its preparation.

Fruit vinegar or malt vinegar or wine vinegar is vinegar made by fermentation from fruit juice or from an infusion of malted grains and sugar, or from wine.

Distilled vinegar is vinegar made wholly or in part by any process of distillation from wood or acetates or from liquor that has undergone acetous fermentation.

*Standard.*

Vinegar or fruit vinegar or malt vinegar or wine vinegar or distilled vinegar shall contain not less than 4 per cent. by weight of absolute acetic acid, and shall not contain free sulphuric acid or other mineral acid, or any arsenic or lead or zinc or copper, or any foreign colouring substance.

## 13.—FRUIT SYRUP OR FRUIT CORDIAL.

*Definition.*

Fruit syrup or fruit cordial is sugar syrup mixed with the juice of sound ripe fruit, or with other wholesome vegetable extractives of the variety or varieties designated.

*Standard.*

Fruit syrup or fruit cordial shall contain not less than thirty-five (35) per cent. of sugar, and shall contain no artificial essence.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition to fruit syrup or fruit cordial of artificial essences, or of colouring substances other than those derived from wholesome fruits or from wholesome vegetable substances, is hereby prohibited.

*Allowed Addition.*

Salicylic acid or sulphurous acid (one but not both), the latter calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), may be added as a preservative substance to cordials other than peppermint cordial, clove cordial, or quinine wine cordial, in a proportion not exceeding 16 grains to the gallon.

## SYRUP OR CORDIAL CONTAINING ARTIFICIAL FLAVOURING SUBSTANCE.

*Standard.*

Syrup or cordial flavoured with artificial essence shall contain no harmful substance.

*Allowed Addition.*

Harmless colouring substance may be added to syrup or cordial flavoured with artificial essence.

## 14.—ESSENCES.

*Definition.*

Dietetic essences are solutions of wholesome flavouring or colouring substances in ethylic alcohol or other non-injurious solvent or vehicle.

*Standard.*

Essences shall be true to name.

## 15.—AERATED WATERS.

*Definition.*

Aerated waters are waters impregnated with carbon dioxide under pressure, with or without flavouring or colouring substances or sugar, or with other substances specified by label.

*Standard.*

Aerated waters shall be free from lead or other injurious mineral substance, and shall contain not more than forty (40) micro-organisms per cubic centimetre, and, except in the case of soda-water, shall contain the mineral substances designated.

## 16.—BEER.

*Standard.*

Beer shall not contain strychnine or cocculus indicus or picric acid or lead, and shall not contain more than one hundred and fiftieth ( $\frac{1}{125}$ ) part of a grain of arsenic (As<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub>) per gallon, and not more than two (2) grains per gallon of sulphurous acid calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>)

*Allowed Addition (a).*

Sulphurous acid or sulphites may be added to beer as a preservative substance in such proportion that the total content of preservative substance, calculated as sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), shall not exceed eight (8) grains per gallon.

*Allowed Addition (b).*

To beer containing not more than two (2) per cent. of proof spirit, saccharin may be added in a proportion not exceeding two (2) grains per gallon.

## 17.—OATMEAL.

*Definition.*

Oatmeal is the meal produced by grinding oats (*Avena Sativa*) after removal of the husks.

*Standard.*

Oatmeal shall contain not less than five (5) per cent. of fats or ethereal extract, and shall contain no foreign vegetable substance.

## 18.—CREAM OF TARTAR.

*Definition.*

Cream of tartar (Potassium bitartrate K<sub>2</sub>H<sub>2</sub>C<sub>4</sub>H<sub>4</sub>O<sub>6</sub>) is the purified product obtained by the recrystallization of crude argols or wine lees.

*Standard.*

Cream of Tartar shall contain not less than ninety-five (95) per cent. of acid tartrates calculated as potassium acid tartrate (K<sub>2</sub>H<sub>2</sub>C<sub>4</sub>H<sub>4</sub>O<sub>6</sub>), and not more than two (2) per cent. of sulphates calculated as calcium sulphate (Ca SO<sub>4</sub>).

## 19.—BAKING POWDER.

*Definition.*

Baking powder is a salt or mixture of salts (with or without a farinaceous diluent substance), which evolves carbon dioxide on being moistened or heated, and which may be used in the preparation of articles of food as a chemical leavening substance.

*Standard.*

Baking powder shall contain not more than one (1) per cent. of sulphates calculated as potassium sulphate, and shall contain no alum, and shall yield not less than (ten) (10) per cent. by weight of carbon dioxide.

## 20.—MALT.

*Definition.*

Malt is the grain of barley or other designated cereal which has been caused to germinate, and has subsequently been dried.

*Standard.*

Malt shall contain not more than one one-hundred and fiftieth ( $\frac{1}{125}$ ) part of a grain of arsenic (calculated as As<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub>) to the pound of malt.

## 21.—MALT EXTRACT OR DIGESTIVE OR DIASTASIC MALT EXTRACT.

*Definition.*

Malt Extract or digestive or diastasic malt extract is the substance obtained by the concentration of an aqueous extract of malt.

*Standard.*

Malt extract or digestive or diastasic malt extract shall contain not less than seventy (70) per cent. of total solids derived wholly from malt. The diastasic power shall be such that one hundred (100) grains of the extract will in thirty minutes, at a temperature of 40 deg. C., convert two hundred and fifty (250) grains of starch (two and one-half times its weight) into a corresponding amount of maltose.

## BAKERS' OR COMMERCIAL MALT EXTRACT OR BAKERS'

## MALTOSE.

*Standard.*

Bakers' or commercial malt extract or bakers' maltose shall contain not less than seventy (70) per cent. of total malt solids.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of preservative substance to malt extract or digestive or diastasic malt extract, or to bakers' or commercial malt extract or bakers' maltose, is hereby prohibited.

## 22.—MALT EXTRACT AND COD-LIVER OIL.

*Definition.*

Malt extract and cod-liver oil is an emulsion compounded of malt extract and cod-liver oil.

*Standard.*

Malt extract and cod-liver oil shall contain not less than fifteen (15) per cent. of cod-liver oil.

## 23.—PEPPER.

*Definitions.*

Pepper is the dried pulp of the *Piper nigrum*.  
Black pepper is pepper ground without decortication.  
White pepper is ground decorticated pepper.  
Cayenne pepper or cayenne is the dried ripe fruit of various species of *Capsicum*.

*Standards.*

Black pepper shall contain not more than seven (7) per cent. of total ash and not less than seven (7) per cent. of extractive matter soluble in hot ethylic alcohol.  
White pepper shall contain not more than three and one-half (3.5) per cent. of total ash.  
Cayenne pepper or cayenne shall contain not less than fifteen (15) per cent. of ether extractives and not more than six (6) per cent. of total ash.

*Prohibited Addition.*

The addition of starch or colouring matter or any other foreign substance to black pepper or white pepper or cayenne pepper or cayenne is hereby prohibited.

## 24.—MUSTARD.

*Definition.*

Mustard is the ground seed of the *Sinapis Alba* or *Sinapis Nigra* (*Brassica Alba* or *Brassica Nigra*).

*Standard.*

Mustard shall contain not more than two and one-half (2.5) per cent. of starch and not more than 8 per cent. of total ash.

## 25.—SAUCES AND PICKLES.

The addition of preservative substances other than the common condimental substances to sauces and pickles is hereby prohibited.

Any person who manufactures or prepares or sells or keeps for sale any article of food or substance or compound in contravention of the Pure Food Act, is liable, on conviction, for the first offence, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and for the second offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Fifty pounds, and for any subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds or more than One hundred pounds.

These Regulations shall take effect from the thirty-first day of December, 1906.

## SHIRE OF WARANGA, BY-LAW No. 14.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Waranga, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall apply to that part of the Shire of Waranga comprised and within the township of Rushworth, and to that part of the said Shire comprised and within the following boundaries: Commencing at the intersection of the Goulburn River and Willoughby-street, in the township of Murchison; thence southerly by the western side of Willoughby-street to the southern boundary of the Railway reserve; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said Railway reserve to the eastern boundary of allotment 23, township of Murchison; thence northerly by that allotment to a road; thence northerly by a line to the southern boundary of allotment 1, township of Murchison; thence northerly by the western boundaries of all tenements having frontages to Impey-street, in the said township, and to the Goulburn River to the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 5, township of Murchison; thence easterly by that road and a line to the Goulburn River; and thence southerly and easterly by that river to the commencing point.

2. All former by-laws or regulations on the matters and things hereinafter provided are hereby repealed, except as to the acts done and penalties incurred and proceedings in law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.
3. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
4. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.
5. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinbefore provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
6. The Council of the said Shire may at any time, and from time to time, license or authorize any person to remove night-soil from premises in the above-described area, and may at any time revoke such licence or authority.
7. No occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises save in accordance with this by-law.
8. Once at least in each week the person contracted with by the Council shall close the pan in use with a tight-fitting lid, and remove the same in the day-time in a cart or other conveyance having springs and covered in, so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia, and at the time of such removal as aforesaid shall leave a pan cleansed by some efficient means approved by the Council in the place of the pan so removed.
9. All night-soil, when removed, shall be deposited only at such place or places, and in such manner, within the Shire as the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances shall approve.
10. Every occupier and other person having the control or management of any premises shall provide and keep in use in every closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.
11. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil, and for the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
12. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law shall be liable to a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed and continued.

The foregoing by-law was made and passed by the Council of the Shire of Waranga on the 4th day of September, One thousand nine hundred and six, and confirmed at meeting of Council, held on the 2nd day of October, 1906.

## BY-LAW No. 196.

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The Fare for the conveyance of Passengers in any Parlor Car shall be the sum of Four shillings (4/-), but no Ticket shall be issued to any person entitling him to enter into or travel in such Car unless he has paid the said amount of Four shillings (4/-), and is in addition the holder of a First Class Ticket or other authority entitling him to travel in a First Class Carriage of the train to which such Parlor Car is attached.

## CARRUM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY LAW BY THE AUDITOR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1906.

**W**HEREAS default has been made by the Carrum Waterworks Trust, formerly the Carrum Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in payment of the interest owing by it in respect of a certain loan granted to the Trust by the Governor in Council.

And whereas the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria then acting, having given one month's notice, in writing, of such default to such Trust on the 16th day of June, 1904, and after the expiration of such month, such default still continuing, did appoint Edwin Tiptree Drake to enter upon and take possession of the property of such Trust, under the powers conferred upon him in that behalf.

And whereas the said Edwin Tiptree Drake did, on the 28th day of July, 1904, enter upon and take possession of the property of the said Trust.

And whereas, subject to the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, the Waterworks District of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust was, by Order in Council dated the 11th day of September, 1906, divided into divisions for rating purposes, and it was in and by such Order directed—

- (a) That the rates necessary for the year 1906 for paying interest on all money borrowed by the Carrum Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of its works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied only in Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3 of the said Trust District, as described therein.
- (b) That the rates for the said year 1906 shall be levied differentially as between the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3, and doth hereby determine that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for Municipal purposes in the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3, shall be—

Division No. 1—Six shillings.  
Division No. 2—Three shillings.  
Division No. 3—Sixpence.

Now, therefore, the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, being in possession of the property of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, for the purpose of discharging the obligations of the said Trust to the Governor in Council in respect of unpaid interest upon the said loan, and to provide for the other payments required to be made by the said Trust for the maintenance and management of its works, and for other purposes under the said Act, make the following By-law:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for Municipal purposes, in the said Divisions Nos. 1, 2, and 3, as defined and limited in the aforesaid Order in Council, bearing date the 11th day of September, 1906, shall be—

Division No. 1—Six shillings.  
Division No. 2—Three shillings.  
Division No. 3—Sixpence.

The above rates are hereby made payable on the 28th day of December, 1906.

Such person or persons as the Auditor-General of Victoria may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

## THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

## By-Law No. 8.

**T**HE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Ballarat Water Supply District.

1. The following rate is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements which are rateable property, within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1903*, within the said district:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of the annual value of £20 and under, the annual minimum sum of £1, except for unoccupied lands where no water is laid on, and on these, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (c) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300, and not exceeding £500, the annual sum of £4 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (d) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, the annual sum of £4 per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (e) On every warehouse and wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes, the annual sum of £3 10s. per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rate is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1907, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1907, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1907.

3. Such persons as the Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be, and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing by-law was made and passed by the Ballarat Water Commissioners, and the common seal of the said corporation was hereunto affixed the nineteenth day of October, 1906, in the presence of—

## THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

By-Law No. 9.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby make the By-Law following for fixing the following scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and a minimum charge for water in cases where it is so supplied in the Ballarat Water Supply District, namely:—

1. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes, beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

2. For water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, unless otherwise specified, the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

3. For water supplied to Mining Companies, Manufacturers, and others, for steam boiler purposes, the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons. And the minimum quantity to be charged for water supplied to any such boiler shall be ten thousand gallons per month.

4. For water supplied to be used in crushing, puddling, sluicing, or washing auriferous stone or earth, the charge shall be at the rate of Threepence per thousand gallons.

5. Where water is supplied for domestic use and in addition is used to supply boilers for steam engines under ten horse-power, the charge shall be by special agreement or at the rate of Ten shillings per horse power per annum, in addition to the charge for domestic use (except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse power).

6. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, at the rate of Sixpence per thousand gallons.

7. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, at the rate of Sixpence per thousand gallons.

8. For water supplied to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

9. For water supplied to syphon pumps, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

10. For water supplied for private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

11. For water supplied to troughs in streets, Ten shillings each per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), at the rate of Sixpence per thousand gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings (5s.) five shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, brick work, and plastering.

14. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering or irrigation of private gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate, which would be payable upon the premises so supplied, if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be payable monthly, or as may be agreed upon.

### BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

#### BY-LAW NO. 18.

A By-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered eighteen (18), for regulating the traffic of motor-cars, motor-cycles, automobiles, and similar machines.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell order as follows:—

1. The expression "machine" in this By-law shall mean and include any motor-bicycle, motor-tricycle, motor-car,

motor-cycle, motor-vehicle, automobile, or other vehicle driven or worked by steam, electricity, or other mechanical power.
