1. Regulation number 35, as approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th day of December, 1900, and Regulation number 46, as approved of by the Governor in Council on the 27th day of May, 1903, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

1A. This By-law shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such District is proclaimed and defined by Orders in Council bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899; and to the Urban District of Nathalia, as such District is proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of December, 1900; and to the Urban District of Strathmerton, as such District is proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of September, 1901; and to the Urban District of Wingham, as such District is proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of February, 1905.

2. The water supplied under this By-law for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, and the charges for all water so supplied shall be paid half-yearly, or as may be agreed upon.

3. For water supplied by the Trust, by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling for every one thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.

4. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract, and extras for brickwork, stonework, and plastering.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for per half-year to the various owners or occupiers herein-after mentioned shall be as follows:—

In respect of steam-boilers, for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder, 4,000 gallons.

In respect of livery and carriers' stables, for each stall, 1,000 gallons.

In all other cases the minimum shall be a quantity which, at One shilling per one thousand (1,000) gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

7. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such owner or occupier. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto. The keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

8. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year; or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

9. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons, and no meter shall continue to be used if it is found to be inaccurate.

10. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order, after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

11. If any plumber fix or refix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Trust without having first obtained a certificate from the Trust that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person remove or alter the position of or in any way interfere with any meter without giving six days' notice, in writing, to the Trust, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Trust, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 6 of this Regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

14. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

15. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

16. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than 10 inches.

17. Excepting with the permission of the Trust, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

18. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

19. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting of the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

21. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the *Water Act 1905*, or of this By-law.

23. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum, but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

24. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do,

or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

26. No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

27. Ordinary connexions with mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which for iron services a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at £20 per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter, and for houses exceeding £20 but not more than £100 rateable value per annum, the bore of such service-pipe is not to exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, and for premises rated over £100 per annum the bore of such pipe must not exceed 1 inch. For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

28. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

29. Lead piping shall be of the following weights:—

and galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed.

30. The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—

For 3-in. and 4-in. pipes, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. tapping.

For 6-in. pipes, 1-in. tapping.

31. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

32. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber, who by himself or his workmen shall break these regulations.

33. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.

34. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

35. All properties on which a trough is situate shall pay a rate of not less than One pound per annum, such rate to be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first days of January and July in each year. To prevent overflow all water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall at all times be maintained in good working order.

36. No hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing-houses, or walls, carriages, or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

37. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

38. For every offence against any provision of this By-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.
5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the first day of July, 1907.
6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

**MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1907.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Act, make the following By-law:—

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement over Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.
6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and 6 a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision, or wastes, or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made. But on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).
9. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
12. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.
13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1907, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.
14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1907, No. 17.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1907 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty-six pounds (£26) annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty-six pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land, if not more than Five shillings annual municipal valuation, a rate of Five shillings for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

4. For every allotment of land exceeding Five shillings annual municipal valuation fronting a street wherein a main pipe of the Trust is laid, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid.

5. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1907.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or land under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings and upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, except in the case of the supply by meter to the Mooroopna Hospital, to which institution the charge shall be Eightpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. For every public and private water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

2. For all unoccupied allotments facing the mains a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 30,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling, and for each additional load, *pro rata* on the above scale.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

Where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied. Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on 1st January and 1st July, 1907.

4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1907.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST. —RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907, No. 18.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover, the said rate.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1907.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the Shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

(2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(4) Any person who shall obtain water or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be:—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1907, commencing on the 1st January, 1907, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on 1st July, 1907.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on the 1st January, 1907, and the 1st July, 1907.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

The lessee must reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by a wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. For police stations, excepting the depôt and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depôt and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oatens, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorinn grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatens hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depôt may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depôt for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

4.
