**DETERMINATION OF THE CLOTHING BOARD.**

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Special Board appointed to determine the Lowest Price or Rate which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, the following articles of Men's and Boy's Clothing or Wearing Apparel, namely, Coats (including Overcoats and Cloaks of every description), Vests, Trousers, Jackets, and Knickerbockers, except indiarubber waterproof garments, has made the following Determination, namely:—

The Board has fixed the first day of February, 1907, as the date from which the following Determination shall come into force. All previous Determinations of the Board shall, from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force, be cancelled and annulled.

**ORDER GARMENTS—WAGES—MALES.**

That the lowest rate of Wages to be paid to Males engaged in the manufacture of order garments shall be as follows:—

Tailors, Cutters, Trimmers, Pressers, Machinists, 1½d. per hour or 45s. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

That the number of Improvers who may be employed in any factory or work-room in the Clothing Trade shall be as follows:—  
MALES.

One Improver to every three Males or fraction thereof employed in a factory or work-room, and being paid not less than 45s. per week of 48 hours or piece-work rate.

That the rate of Wages to be paid to Male Apprentices or Improvers engaged in the manufacture of order garments shall be as follows:—

**OVERTIME.**

That any male person over the age of sixteen years who may be employed in the manufacture of Coats (including Overcoats and Cloaks of every description), Vests, Trousers, Jackets, and Knickerbockers, for more than 48 hours per week, shall be paid for such extra hours at the rate of time and a half.

**HOLIDAYS—SPECIAL RATES FOR.**

That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons for all work done on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, and Eight Hours Day shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for such person or persons or classes of persons.

**PIECE-WORK RATES FOR ORDER GARMENTS—MALES.**

That the lowest price or rate of payment to any Male person for wholly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following schedules of prices or rates, or for doing work of the kind specified in connexion with the preparation or manufacture of any such article, shall be the price or rate fixed by such schedules in respect of such article or work, as the case may be, subject to such extras or reductions as by the said schedules provided.

In this Determination the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

- “Order garments” shall mean garments generally known as “bespoke garments” made to individual measure.
  - “First class” shall mean all faced cloths, moltons, corkscrews, fancy vestings, silks, velvets, Hooper’s white elastic, and white cashmere.
  - “Second class” shall mean indigo and black worsteds, tweeds, sergerettes, serges, vicunas, Bedford cords, flannel, alpaca, and similar materials.
  - “Third class” shall mean moleskin, corduroy, drill, linen, and similar material.
  - “Hand-made” shall mean that the garments shall be made wholly by hand.
  - “Extras” shall mean any work that is not specified in starting price.
- All extras not specified to be calculated at the rate of 10d. per hour. All sewings and trimmings to be provided by the employer free of charge to the maker.
- Where maker machines garment, machining to be paid extra according to schedule of prices for machining.

That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons for all work done on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, and Eight Hours Day shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for each person or persons or classes of persons.

PIECE-WORK RATES FOR ORDER GARMENTS—FEMALES.

The lowest price or rate of payment to any female for wholly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following Schedules of Prices or Rates, or for doing work of the kind specified in connexion with the preparation or manufacture of any such article shall be the price or rate fixed by such Schedules in respect of such articles or work as the case may be; subject to such extras or reductions as by the said Schedules provided.

In this Determination the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

- "Order garments" shall mean garments generally known as "bespoke garments" made to individual measure.
- "First class" shall mean all faced cloths, meltons, corkscrews, silks, velvets, fancy vestings, Hooper's white elastic, and white cashmere.
- "Second class" shall mean indigo and black worsteds, tweeds, sergerettes, serges, vicunas, Bedford cords, flannel, alpaca, and similar materials.
- "Third class" shall mean moleskin, corduroy, drill, linen, and similar material.
- "Hand-made" shall mean that the garments shall be made wholly by hand.
- "Full price by machine" shall mean making, machining, and pressing.
- "Lined" shall mean coats lined back and foreparts (or foreparts only with bogies) and sleeve linings.
- "Unlined" shall mean coats without linings through back, foreparts, and sleeves.

- "Extras" shall mean any work not specified in starting price.
  - "Extras by machine" shall mean parts of extras usually done by machine on machine-made garments.
  - "Fitting up" shall mean cutting facings, collars, welts, bands, straps, and all fittings and linings.
  - "Deductions" shall mean parts of garments usually done by special hands which can be deducted from full price.
  - "D.-B." shall mean double-breasted.
  - "S.-B." shall mean single-breasted.
- All extras not specified to be calculated at the rate of 6½d. per hour. All sewings and trimmings to be provided by the employer free of charge to the operator.
- NOTE: Where maker machines garment, machining to be paid extra according to Schedule of prices for machining.

The rates provided in this Determination shall be exclusive of all linings, interlinings, trimmings, sewings, and all other materials used in manufacturing garments. Out-door worker to be paid both making and machining price for each garment.
