

# CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 58.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the City of Richmond, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councilors, and Citizens of the said city, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, numbered 58, that is to say:—

r. The occupier or person in charge of any marine store, or flock, or bedding, or furniture manufactory, shall cause

all rags or other material of a kind commonly used in the manufacture of flock or similar bedding to be thoroughly washed or cleansed, and to be disinfected by one of the following processes within twenty-four hours of such rags or material being taken in, or before such rags or material are taken in, to such store or manufactory, namely:—

- (a) By being boiled for thirty minutes in a solution consisting of one part of washing soda (carbonate of soda) to fifty parts of water;
- (b) By being subjected to saturated steam for thirty minutes at a pressure not less than ten pounds per square inch; or
- (c) By being soaked for one hour, in a wooden vat, in a solution consisting of one part of corrosive sublimate (bi-chloride of mercury) to 500 parts of water, and being afterwards washed in hot water.
- 2. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Richmond.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Richmond on the fourteenth day of December, 1905, and confirmed the eleventh day of January, 1906.

WILEREAS by section 2 of the Stock and Detentures Registers Act 1905 (5 Edw. VII. No. 2001), it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for anabling the holders of any Victorian Government Inscribed Stock or Victorian Government Consolidated Inscribed Stock or Victorian Government Depontures which are redeemable in London to have any such stock or delegatures if the holders thereof so desire transferred from the registers of such stock or debentures kept in London to registers to be opened and kept in the Treasury at Melbourne and for prescribing the

fees chargeable for any such transfers: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth heroby make the following

- 1. Applications for transfer of Victorian Government Inscribed Stock and Victorian Government Consolidated Inscribed Stock from the London registers to the Melbourne registers shall be made by letter, signed by the registered holders of the stock or their attorneys under approved power, addressed to the London and Westminster Bank Limited, Lothbury, London.
- 2. The London and Westminster Bank will thereupon issue to the applicant a certificate in the form of Schedule A to these regulations, and forward by next available post to the Treasurer of Victoria, Melbourne, the duplicate of such certificate.
- 3. On receipt of the said certificate and duplicate the stock will be inscribed in the stock ledgers to be kept for such purpose in the Treasury, Melbourne, and in the Audit Office, Melbourne, and all transactions relating to such stock shall thereafter be made in Melbourne.
- 4. On the issue of a certificate the London and Westminster Bank shall transfer the stock named therein from the account in which it is inscribed and shall credit it to an account to be called "Stock Transition Account" until receipt of advice, as per Schedule B, from the Treasury, Melbourne, when the said stock shall be removed from the London registers finally.
- No dealings whatever shall be made in the stock while in the "Stock Transition Account."
- 5. All the conditions relating to such stock at the time of its original inscription shall continue in force excepting the place for payment of interest and redumption, but after inscription in the Melbourne registers the mode of transfer shall be the same as prescribed by the Victorian Government Stock Act 1896, No. 1468.
- 6. Stock Certificates and Debentures.—Victorian Government Stock Certificates to bearer and Victorian Government Debentures redeemable in London shall, on presentation at the Treasury, Melbourne, by the holders thereof, be registered in the Melbourne registers, to be opened for the purpose, and with all unpaid coupons thereon shall be marked in such a way as to show clearly that they are domiciled in Melbourne, and the Auditor-General shall be advised by the Treasurer of every such receiverstion. registration.
- 7. The London and Westminster Bank Limited or the Chairman of Contracting Banks, as the case may be, shall be advised by the Treasurer immediately on the registration in Melbourne of any stock certificate or debenture hitherto redeemable in London by a notice in the form of Schedule C, and upon receipt of such notice the debenture or stock certificate shall be removed from the London registers and the London and Westminster Bank or Chairman of Contracting Banks shall advise the Treasurer of the removal when completed.
- 8. The provisions of the Victorian Stock and Debentures Conversion Act 1905 shall apply to all Stock and Debentures and Stock Certificates transferred from the London registers after registration in Melbourne in accordance with the Act.
- 9. The fees chargeable under the Act shall, until ordered by the Governor in Council, be as follow, and shall be collected in Victorian duty stamps at the Treasury, Melbowrne:—

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering atany University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

#### CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

. 12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.
