PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each such day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Surveyors Board appointed under the *Land Surveyors Act 1895* hereby gives notice that the next examination will commence on Tuesday, 27th March, 1906.

All applications from intending candidates must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 19th March, 1906.

Regulations for the examination of Land Surveyors are published hereunder.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40–20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisinal, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tellometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

REGULATIONS.

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and, on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.
- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the Commissioners) make the following Regulation, namely :—

Sub-clause (a) of the clause numbered 348 of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the fifteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and five, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sub-clause is substituted and read as part (a) of the said clause :—

(a) For every day or part of a day (not including Sundays or public holidays, unless where the vessel casts off from the wharf on Sundays or any public holiday) during which any vessel, other than a vessel mentioned in sub-clause (b), or a vessel licensed under clause numbered 340 hereof, or any ferry boat plying within the port, shall use any wharf of the Commissioners, there shall be paid One half-penny per ton of the net register tonnage (British standard) of such vessel. Provided that if any vessel without having left the port in the interim shall use one or more wharfs for more than six days in the whole, and shall have paid the rates for such six days, the rate to be paid for every day she uses any wharf after such six days shall be One farthing per ton aforesaid. Provided also that in lieu of the preceding rates a lump sum of Three pounds per annum may be paid in respect of any vessel the net register tonnage of which does not exceed Fifty tons. A vessel lying in tier outside a vessel moored to or alongside any wharf of the Commissioners shall be liable to the preceding rates as if she were directly moored to the wharf. This sub-section shall not apply

to those berths at the wharfs on the north and south sides of the Yarra Yarra, known as No. 16 on the north side and A, B, C, D, E, F, and G, coal berths, on the south side, which have been specially appropriated for the exclusive accommodation of the lessees of such berths so long as the leases thereof are in force respectively, and the said berths are only being used by the vessels of such lessees respectively. No quayside rates will be charged on the day of arrival when a vessel is not berthed before Five p.m. on that day, and only lands passengers and their luggage.

Nothing herein shall affect the right of the Commissioners to recover any moneys payable under the said sub-clause (a) made by the Commissioners on the fifteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and five, for which the preceding sub-clause is substituted.

REGULATION RESCINDED.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners hereby rescind Regulation No. 372, hereunder set forth :—

REGULATION No. 372.—COODE CANAL.

No vessel inward-bound shall enter the Coode Canal until any vessel outward-bound which may then be in the canal, or any outward-bound vessel which may be approaching the canal and will in all probability be in it before the inward-bound vessel could have passed through the canal shall have passed clear of the lower or western end of the canal, the intention being that no two vessels of the aggregate gross tonnage hereinafter mentioned shall be navigated in the canal at the same time. This Regulation shall only apply to an inward-bound vessel, whose gross tonnage, with that of any outward-bound vessel aforesaid, shall exceed 8,000 tons. The inward-bound vessel shall remain at a safe distance below the lower or western entrance of the canal until every outward-bound vessel aforesaid shall have passed clear of the entrance.

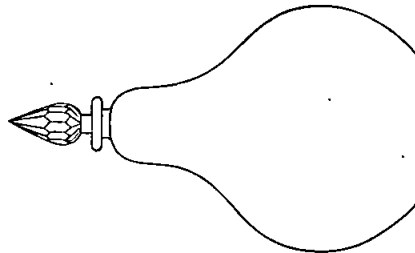

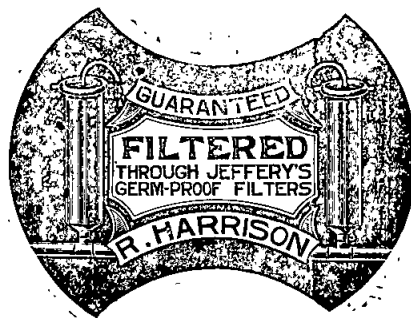

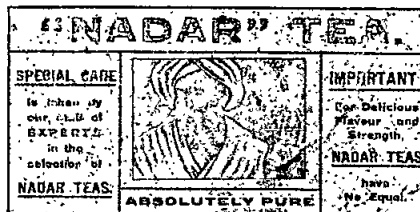

SWAN HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 5.

Regulation for the making of a rate on all the rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the district of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, such district having been proclaimed an Urban District under Division 9 of Part II. of the Water Act 1890.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being, of all tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill; and that a rate of Six shillings (6s.) per half-acre and Three shillings (3s.) per quarter-acre, with a minimum rate of Three shillings (3s.) on all vacant allotments within the Trust area served by the Trust with water, is hereby made for the year 1906, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1906.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in two half-yearly instalments, one-half on the first day of January and the second half on the first day of July, 1906.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and sue for the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust this twenty-fifth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and five.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING REGULATIONS.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust Area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st March, 1906.
2. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).
3. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.
4. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.
5. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.
6. Water supplied by measure, to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purpose beyond such an amount as aforesaid.
7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.
8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.
10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings.
12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick-work, or plastering.

BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION No. 19.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the power conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulations for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, by the Trust within the Urban Division, and further purposes, during the calendar year 1906:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situated in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall

pay in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, to such lands, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1906, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1906; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates:—

(a) On every house or tenement of Twenty-two pounds rateable annual value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual rateable value of Twenty-two pounds, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.

(c) On all vacant allotments of land, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.

(d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping or any other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof; and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or Water Supply, under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this Regulation, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(f) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(g) Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, shall be charged by measurement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per annum.

(h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

(i) The charge for water supplied to gardens, and for any other than domestic purposes, shall be at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum, the quantity of water so used not to exceed 12,000 gallons per annum; a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer when, in the opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.

(j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of One pound (£1) per cent. on the contract price for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation shall be paid by and recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1906, and on the 1st day of July, 1906, except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time, and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by Division 1 of Part I. of the *Water Act 1900* the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Korumburra Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 4th day of April, 1906, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 4th day of April in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday or any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the *Water Act 1900* in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 12th day of March, 1906, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the *Water Act 1900*, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the command of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Korumburra township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form to the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the

said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Acts in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule. Notice of Poll. Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Korumburra township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before polling day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Korumburra township a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

16. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

17. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

18. Mode of voting.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

19. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

22. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

23. Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately on the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall determine by lot the candidate to hold office.

24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

25. Minister to determine question arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by the Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereat, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

27. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners any vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are not filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.

30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

31. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Water Act 1900 it is enacted that where, under section 25 of the Principal Act (the Water Act 1890), a municipal council, together with one or more persons not being members of such council, have been appointed by the Governor in Council to be the Commissioners of a Waterworks Trust for a Waterworks District, the Governor in Council, upon the petition of a majority of the ratepayers in so much of any municipal district or districts as is within the Waterworks District of such Trust, may, if he think fit, declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of such Trust by virtue of their office as municipal councillors, or by appointment of

CLOSING OF A ROAD, PARISH OF DERBY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Closer Settlement Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII., No. 1962, section 58) it is enacted that where unused or unformed and unused roads intersect any land acquired by the Crown pursuant to the provisions of the aforesaid Act, and are not suitable to the subdivision of such land, such roads may, with the consent of the municipal council in the municipal district in which such roads are situated, be closed by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter may be dealt with as part of the land so acquired which they intersect: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice proclaim that the unused road in the parish of Derby, as defined in the following description, be closed, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET AND RECREATION GROUND AT LILLYDALE.

THE Council of the Shire of Lillydale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Cricket and Recreation Ground at Lillydale, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick hills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and, who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A By-law of the Borough of Castlemaine, made under section 604 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 86, for the control and management of the Public Baths, situated in the Botanical Gardens, within the said Borough.

1. The baths shall be open to males and females respectively at such respective times as may be ordered from time to time by resolution of the Council.
2. The said Council may from time to time, by resolution, determine the charges to be made for admission to the baths for males and females respectively.
3. No male person shall loiter about the vicinity of the baths during the hours set apart for females.
4. No person shall emerge from the baths enclosure until his or her clothing is properly adjusted.
5. No person shall use obscene language within the precincts of the baths.
6. No person shall write on or deface or damage any portion of the baths.
7. No person shall use soap in the baths.
8. No person shall enter the swimming basin without first washing himself in the shower bath.
9. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter the swimming basin.
10. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall enter the baths.
11. No person shall smoke within the precincts of the baths.
12. The hours for males and females shall be indicated by a red flag and a white flag respectively.
13. No person shall enter the baths at any time other than the times when the same shall be open to males and females respectively.
14. All dogs found within the baths enclosure may be destroyed.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

A BY-LAW OF THE SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS, No. SIXTEEN.

A By-law of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, made under section 197, sub-section 29, *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 16, for prohibiting the use on any road within the boundaries of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings of any vehicle not having the nails on its wheels countersunk in such manner as is hereinafter specified, or having on its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections.

- (a) No vehicle shall be propelled or drawn over any road within the boundaries of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings unless the nails or bolts or rivets in the tires of the wheels are countersunk below the surface of the tires so as to be perfectly flush and present no uneven or projecting part on the outer surface of the tire.
- (b) No vehicle shall be propelled or drawn over any road within the boundaries of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings if it have on its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections causing the tire to present an uneven surface to the road when passing over it.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, on first conviction, forfeit and pay a sum of not less than Five pounds or more than Ten pounds, and on the second conviction forfeit and pay Ten pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Frankston and Hastings.

SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

BY-LAW NO. 17.

A By-law of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, made under Section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 17, for regulating the market-place and the buildings and pens therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; for fixing the days, and the hours during each day, on which the market shall be held; for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district; and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences; and for regulating the use of the weighing machine provided by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Bacchus Marsh Corporation Sale-yards, and shall be held at the place, and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market, situated in the township of Bacchus Marsh, fronting Bennett-street, and the said market shall be used for the sale of live stock, produce, sundries, &c.
2. The said market shall be open for the reception, delivery, and sale of live stock, produce, sundries, &c., on every lawful day, from sunrise to sunset. A weekly market shall be held every Saturday; but in the event of any weekly market day falling on Christmas Day, or a public holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the Council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said weekly market.
3. The Council shall appoint a Market Inspector, whose duties will be as follows:—To see that this By-law, and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, relating to markets, are duly observed. To demand and collect all market tolls and dues. To allot the principal and drafting yards to persons bringing cattle to the market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before Five o'clock p.m. on the day of sale, except with the consent of such Inspector. No persons shall obstruct the Market Inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, without the consent of the Market Inspector; nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market; or cause any riot or disturbance; or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct, within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

4. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls or dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied; and if any cattle be not removed within 48 hours after the close of the market, another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

5. The horses, dairy, fat, and store cattle, shall be offered by the auctioneers in rotation named; and no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than three minutes in offering any one lot for sale, or more than two hours in disposing of stock in his hands for sale. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands within the specified time, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all similar stock that day in the market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale. And in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to sell stock by auction at the same time.

6. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction, the Market Inspector's decision shall be final.

7. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

8. The Council may license any yards or premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and the annual licence-fee shall be Five pounds for each yard or premises so licensed.

9. The weighbridge, situate in Grant-street, Bacchus Marsh, shall be the Market Weighbridge, and be subject to such tolls and dues as the Council may from time to time appoint.

10. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach, or default of this By-law, shall, on conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The sum of Five pounds sterling shall be the amount of the annual licence-fee to be paid for the issue of a licence authorizing an auctioneer to sell in the said market and its approaches; provided that the fee for such licence shall only be in proportion to the period from which such licence shall be issued to the period at which it shall expire; every such licence expiring on the 31st day of December in each year.

3. For any auctioneer who does not pay the annual licence of £5, desiring to use the yards for a special sale, the licence-fee shall be £2.

4. No auctioneer shall exercise his vocation within the said market, or its approaches, without such consent, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms thereof.
