NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF GLENELG.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election. If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

CAPTAIN MUSSON, of the s.s. *Henley*, reports, that on the 24th January, 1906, being then in latitude 19 deg. 3 min. S., longitude 171 deg. 41 min. 30 sec. E., he observed large patches of discoloured water, having the appearance of coral or sandy shoals below the surface; passed at about 1½ miles distance.

As these shoal patches are not charted, and lie in the track of vessels navigating to Fiji and the South Sea Islands, a sharp lookout should be kept by Mariners when navigating in the vicinity.

REGULATIONS AMENDED, REPEALED, AND MADE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the "Commissioners") make the following amendment in the Regulation made and passed by the Commissioners on the fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and five:—

In Regulation No. 358, Part 2 thereof, the words "and the goods passed to the custody of the exporting ship" are hereby repealed, and the word "eight" substituted for the word "fourteen."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the "Commissioners") make the following amendments in the Regulations made and passed by the Commissioners on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred, viz.:—

In Regulation No. 296 of Part 2 thereof the words "whether pulling or sailing" are hereby repealed.

In Regulation No. 326 of the said Part 2, for the words "for every boat propelled by oars only," there shall be substituted the words "for every boat (howsoever propelled) licensed to carry not more than nine passengers," and for the words "for every sailing boat licensed to carry ten passengers," there shall be substituted the words "for every boat (howsoever propelled) licensed to carry ten or more passengers."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the "Commissioners") make the following Regulation, namely:—

Regulation No. 300 of Part 2 of the Regulations, made and passed by the Commissioners on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation shall be substituted, and shall be read and construed with and form part of Part 2 of the said Regulations of the Commissioners:—

300. Every licensed boat while plying for hire, whether propelled by oars, sails, steam, oil, electric or other power, shall have on board an efficient crew and a full complement of oars, masts, sails, and gear, and shall be maintained by the owner in good order. Not less than two licensed boatmen or watermen, one of whom shall be in charge, shall be deemed to be an efficient crew for boats

licensed to carry upwards of twenty passengers. All goods or property of a passenger left in any boat shall be delivered by the master or owner of the boat to the Harbor Master as soon as practicable after the same shall have been found. Any breach of this Regulation shall be punishable by a fine or penalty of Five pounds.

Nothing herein shall affect the right of the Commissioners to recover any money payable under the said Regulation made by the Commissioners on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred, for which the preceding Regulation is substituted.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, and of the *Wharfage and Harbor Rates Act 1904*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation, namely:—

374. On and after the first day of February, 1906, the tolls or rates set forth below shall be payable in respect of the goods, merchandise, and things therein referred to, viz., Phosphatic Rock, arriving from ports outside the Commonwealth—is. 8d. per ton.

This Regulation to be read and construed as part of Regulation No. 358, made and passed by the Commissioners on the 4th October, 1905.

THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called the Board), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and by so much of the *Water Act 1890* as is incorporated therewith, and in exercise and execution of any statutory and other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. Clauses 2 and 3 of By-law No. 4, which By-law was made and passed by the Board on the 20th day of May, 1894, and duly published in three consecutive numbers of the *Victorian Government Gazette*—namely, on the 1st, 8th, and 15th days of June, 1894, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes on and after the 1st day of July, 1906, is hereby determined as follows, that is to say:—

For all such lands and tenements a rate of Sevenpence in the Pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements.

Provided that where a rate of Sevenpence in the Pound of such valuation would amount to less than 10s., the sum of 10s. is fixed as the amount of the rate to be paid in respect of any such lands and tenements.

The valuation of the said lands and tenements for the purpose of such water supply shall in every year be the valuation of such lands and tenements during such year or the previous year by the corporation of the City of Melbourne or the Council of the borough or municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or if there be no such valuation the valuation of such lands and tenements by some Police Magistrate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and six, in the presence of—

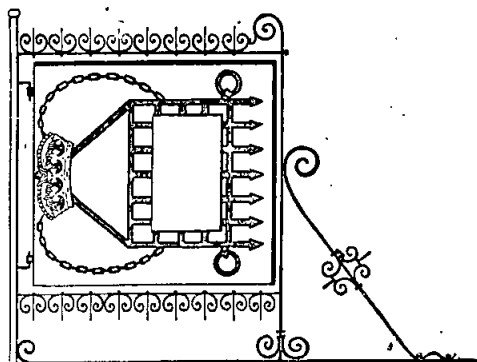

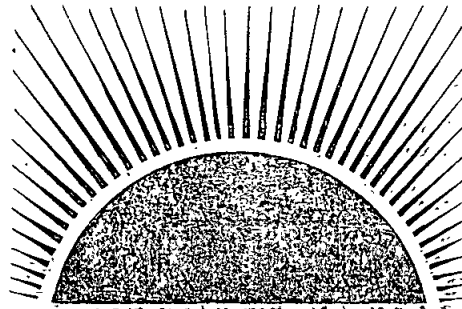

STAWELL BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.

1. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes and attach the same to any pipe of the Council or to any private service already laid and connected with the pipes of the Council, unless he can satisfy the Council or its officers that he is competent and licensed to execute such work.

2. No person shall lay private services and attach the same to the pipes of the Council or to any private service already connected with the pipes of the Council without being duly approved, licensed, and authorized by the Council to do such work.

3. No private service whatsoever to be laid by any authorized person unless he has ascertained at the Council's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the Engineer to execute such work.

4. After private services are laid and attached to the pipes of the Council, or otherwise to private service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall, within twenty-four hours after each service has been completed, report all work done by him at the office, and sign in a book kept for the purpose his name and the date when each service was completed.

5. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the street mains, or other property whilst attaching private services, or to private services already laid and connected with the Council's water supply. And any water lost by the Council through such injury or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such person to the Council within twenty-four hours after the time of such injuries having occurred.

6. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three (3) months after each service-pipe has been completed.

7. Every competent person, previous to being authorized to lay private services, shall deposit with the Council the sum of £1, which shall be retained during the pleasure of the Council as a guarantee against damage; and shall also pay annually a sum of Five shillings sterling as a fee for a licence, and the Council may at any time withdraw such licence and forfeit such deposit, when the same shall be absolutely void, and the name of such person shall be at once struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and be published in the local paper.

8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the above-mentioned clauses he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5).

The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to the directions of the Engineer or any other person the Council may appoint, and any dispute between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or as to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to any officer the Council may appoint, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

Quality of Materials required in Laying Private Services.

The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized wrought iron.

All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

All ends of pipes, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 350 feet.

All delivery cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of the best manufacture and pattern, and no meter to be provided and fixed unless previously approved by the Engineer.

No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

All jointings between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks to be made with red lead and flax only.

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity not exceeding five hundredweight or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, and every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle, shall carry and deliver or cause to be carried and delivered such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

3. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by clause 7 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

4. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any Inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

5. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than two miles.

6. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form :—
