THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called the Board), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and by so much of the *Water Act 1890* as is incorporated therewith, and in exercise and execution of any statutory and other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following :-

1. Clauses 2 and 3 of By-law No. 4, which By-law was made and passed by the Board on the 20th day of May, 1894, and duly published in three consecutive numbers No. 45.—APRIL 20, 1906.—4088.—2.

of the *Victorian Government Gazette*—namely, on the 1st, 8th, and 15th days of June, 1894, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes on and after the 1st day of July, 1906, is hereby determined as follows, that is to say :-

For all such lands and tenements a rate of Sevenpence in the Pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements.

Provided that where a rate of Sevenpence in the Pound of such valuation would amount to less than 10s., the sum of 10s. is fixed as the amount of the rate to be paid in respect of any such lands and tenements.

The valuation of the said lands and tenements for the purpose of such water supply shall in every year be the valuation of such lands and tenements during such year or the previous year by the corporation of the City of Melbourne or the Council of the borough or municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or if there be no such valuation the valuation of such lands and tenements by some Police Magistrate.

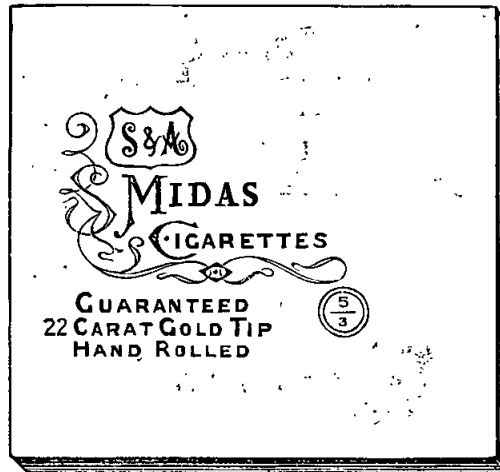

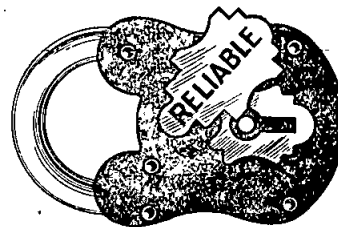

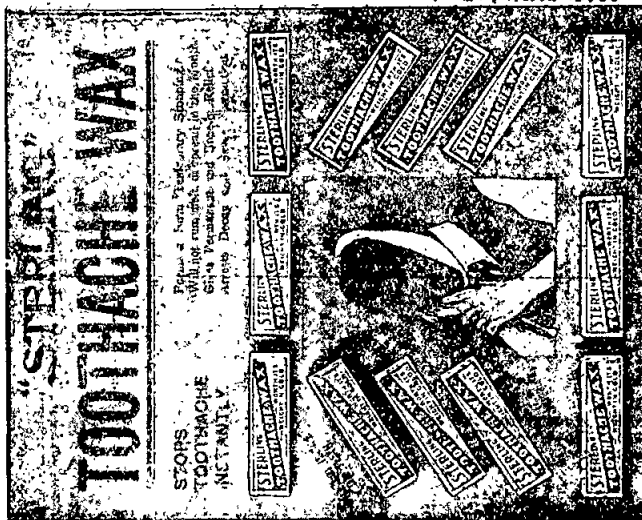

COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1906.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rate payable for the year 1906 for water supplied within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of two shillings in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value, upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as domiciles, shall be thirty shillings (30s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street, Queen-street from Station-street to High-street, Main-street from Station-street to High-street, Punt-road from Station-street to High-street, Bank-street from Punt-road to High-street, and High-street from Queen-street to Pine-street, a minimum rate of ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged, and on all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land, a minimum rate of five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

4. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in one moiety on the 5th day of April, 1906.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling them, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of one pound (£1) per annum shall be charged.

2. For every water trough on vacant allotments or pieces of land supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be charged.

3. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where the water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons.

4. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge shall be two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the municipal valuation of the property so supplied.

5. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show yards, cattle yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements), provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

6. For water supplied from standpipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons, or under, sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering: or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stone-work, brick-work, or plastering, the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement at the

rate of two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until first authorized in writing by the Trust to do so.

8. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any service pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

9. No person shall use or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of nine (9) p.m. and eight (8) a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

10. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

11. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust, who shall, or who, having so agreed, shall contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

12. No person shall use any water or allow any water to run for the purpose of watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, or watering any land by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit, or otherwise in any manner whatsoever at any time other than between the hours of eight (8) a.m. and nine (9) p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit, or other means of watering shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present, and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

13. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done, for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

14. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all reasonable times enter any house, tenement, or land, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any such person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water, until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

15. The fixed charges herein specified to be made under clauses 1, 2, and 3 shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, and all other charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time as the Trust may in any case determine.

16. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said charges.

17. The word "person" in this Regulation shall include "corporation."

18. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts, on Monday, the fifth day of March, 1906.

MARQUIS HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION BY THE AUDITOR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1906.

WHEREAS default has been made by the Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, being an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly constituted under and subject to the provisions of the Water Acts, in payment of the interest owing by it in respect of certain loans granted to the Trust by the Governor in Council under the said Acts: And whereas the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria then acting having given one month's notice, in writing, of such default to such Trust on the 17th day of August, 1904, and after the expiration of such month, such default still continuing, did appoint Edwin Tiptree Drake to enter upon and take possession of the property of such Trust, under the powers conferred upon him by the said Acts: And whereas the said Edwin Tiptree Drake did, on the 23rd day of January, 1905, enter upon and take possession of the property of the said Trust.

Now therefore the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, being in possession of the property of the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, for the purpose of discharging the obligations of the said Trust to the Governor in Council in respect of unpaid interest upon the said loans, and to provide for the other payments required to be made by the said Trust for the maintenance and management of its works, and for other purposes under the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

A rate of five shillings in the pound sterling, upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated within the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, is hereby made and shall be payable for the year 1906.

The above rate is hereby made payable on the 2nd day of July, 1906.

Such person or persons as the Auditor-General of Victoria may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rate.

MARQUIS HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Auditor-General in and for the State of Victoria, being in possession of the Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation providing for the sale of water:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be paid for by measure, and all quantities shall be determined by the officer of the Trust deputed for that purpose.

2. All water shall be supplied through properly constructed outlets.

3. All persons requiring water from the Trust works shall make application for same to the Water-Bailiff, who shall enter same in a book supplied for that purpose, and every applicant shall be supplied as nearly as possible in the order that his name appears in the order book (if water is available). Each application for water must be accompanied by a deposit of ten shillings. The Trust does not incur any liability through failure to supply any order for water, no matter from what cause such failure may arise.

4. The manipulation of the works of the Trust shall be solely in the hands of the officers of the Trust, and any person not being duly authorized who shall in any way interfere, damage, or tamper with any of the works shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

5. The rate or price to be charged for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation, when the supply is being drawn direct from the River Murray, shall be as follows:—

For cereal crops, seven pence per inch per acre;
For fodder crops (including amber-cane, sorghum, lucerne, &c.), five pence per inch per acre;
For grass land, two pence per inch per acre;
For fallow land, four pence per inch per acre.

Three inches in each case to be deemed a watering.

6. The rate or price to be charged for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation, when the supply is being drawn from the Kow Swamp storage, shall be as follows:—

- For cereal crops, eight pence per inch per acre;
- For fodder crops (including amber-cane, sorghum, lucerne, &c.), seven pence per inch per acre;
- For grass land, four pence per inch per acre;
- For fallow land, six pence per inch per acre.

Three inches in each case to be deemed a watering.

7. For filling tanks when the supply is being drawn direct from the River Murray, the charge shall be ten shillings for each 1,000 cubic yards capacity; and twenty shillings for each 1,000 cubic yards capacity when the supply is being drawn from the Kow Swamp storage.

8. Surplus water may be disposed of at rates or prices twenty-five per centum below the charges fixed in clauses 5 and 6 of this Regulation.

9. For the irrigation of gardens, an annual charge of ten shillings per acre, or fractional part of an acre, shall be made.

10. The minimum charge for all water supplied within the Trust District shall be ten shillings.

11. All water wasted shall be charged for at the rate or price fixed by this Regulation in respect of the purpose for which water is being supplied.

Education Act 1901.

REGULATION XXVI.—AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOLS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
eleventh day of April, 1906.*

WHEREAS by section 18(a) of the *Education Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1777), it is provided that regulations may be made for the establishment and control of continuation schools: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXVI.—AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOLS.

1. The Minister of Public Instruction may establish Continuation Schools, to be called Agricultural High Schools, under the following conditions:—

- (a) At least one-half of the cost of the necessary buildings and equipment shall be contributed by local subscription.
- (b) An area of ground of not less than 20 acres, situated in a position convenient to the High School, shall be provided, and vested in the Minister.
- (c) At least 50 students paying prescribed fees shall be guaranteed before a proposal to establish a High School is entertained.

2. (a) Agricultural High Schools shall be under the control of the Minister, who will be assisted in the questions affecting course of study and general policy by a committee, consisting of the Minister of Agriculture, the Director of Education, and the Director of Agriculture.

(b) A local council, consisting of five members, to be appointed by the Governor in Council, shall be established for each district High School. Their duties will be to exercise a general oversight in matters affecting their school, to expend the maintenance allowance allotted to each school, to exercise such supervision as the Minister may authorize over the farm operations, and to advise the Minister in all matters specially pertaining to the school.

3. The qualifications for enrolment of students shall be as follow:—

- (a) Pupils must have obtained the Certificate of Merit, or must have passed the primary or some higher examination of the Melbourne University; or must have satisfied an inspector of schools that they are qualified to profit by the course of study in such school.
- (b) They must furnish satisfactory evidence that they are of good moral character, and of good general health.
- (c) They must be at least fourteen years of age at the date of enrolment.

4. The Minister may grant in each year scholarships entitling holders thereof to free tuition for two or more years in any approved courses of study prescribed in Agricultural High Schools.

5. The Council of any Agricultural High School may nominate for free instruction in any prescribed courses of study in that school students who possess the qualifications stated in section 3, provided that the number of students so nominated shall not in any year exceed 10 per cent. of the total number of students paying full fees enrolled in that school.

6. The course of study shall include such subjects as may be determined upon by the Minister, with the advice of the committee named in section 2a.

7. At least one-third of the time devoted to instruction shall be spent in the study (both practical and theoretical) of the sciences bearing upon agriculture, and one-third of the time shall be devoted to manual and practical work on the school farm or in the school workshop.

8. During their course in an Agricultural High School, students will be required to attend lessons regularly and punctually in the subjects prescribed for their course, and may further be required to devote such time to practical outdoor work as the Principal may direct.

9. The fees to be paid by pupils shall be £8 8s. per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

10. No pupil shall be enrolled after the expiration of the first quarter unless with the special sanction of the Director of Education.

11. Any students may be excluded from attendance at the school on the ground of idleness or misconduct.

12. Holders of scholarships under Regulation XXI. 1 (b) may be admitted as students at any Agricultural High School, and attendance at such school shall be held to comply with the conditions laid down in such Regulation for attendance at a Continuation School or Secondary School.

13. Candidates for admission to the teaching service of the Education Department may be admitted to an Agricultural High School under the conditions of Regulation X. for admission to a Continuation School, and all the provisions of such Regulation so far as they may be applicable shall be held to apply to Agricultural High Schools as regards such students.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Pure Food Act 1905* it is, amongst other things, enacted that the members of the Food Standards Committee other than those employed in the State Public Service shall be paid attendance fees of such amount as may be prescribed by regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council doth make the following regulation, that is to say:—

The fee payable to each member of the Food Standards Committee who is not employed in the State Public Service shall be One pound one shilling (£1 1s.) per sitting.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

FIRST MILDURA IRRIGATION TRUST.
REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS AND
AUDITORS.

WHEREAS by the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Acts from time to time make regulations for the purposes following:—

- (a) For determining the period or different periods, not exceeding three years, for which commissioners of any Trust, including commissioners for Urban Districts, shall hold office, the time of their election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of commissioners and auditors shall be held, and in which lists or rolls of voters thereat shall be prepared, and the mode of voting thereat, and the time, mode, place, and all other matters connected with the nomination of commissioners and auditors.
- (c) For determining the mode of appointment or election of returning officers and their deputies, and their powers and duties.
- (d) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners or auditors shall be filled up.
- (e) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner or auditor.
- (f) For prescribing any other matters necessary for giving effect to the said Acts.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts doth, so far as regards the First Mildura Irrigation Trust under the said Acts, make the regulations following, viz. :—

1. The regulations made on the fourth day of September, 1896, providing for the election of commissioners and auditors for the said Trust, as also those relating thereto and bearing date the twenty-fourth October, 1904, are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following regulations are hereby made, and shall apply to the election of commissioners and auditors for the said Trust.

2. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Act" shall mean the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts; "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation District, as described in the First Schedule of the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*, No. 1409.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in regard to any election of commissioners or auditors for the said Trust, held under the regulations hereby repealed, the two persons who were elected to hold office as commissioners for the period ending the twenty-first of January, 1907, shall hereby retire, and cease to continue in office as such commissioners after the thirtieth May, 1906; the two persons who were elected to hold office as such commissioners for the period ending the twenty-first January, 1908, shall hereby retire, and cease to continue in office as such commissioners after the thirtieth May, 1907; the two persons who were elected to hold office as such commissioners for the period ending the twenty-first January, 1909, shall hereby retire, and cease to continue in office as such commissioners after the 30th May, 1908; the two persons who were elected to hold office as auditors for the period ending twenty-first January, 1907, shall hereby retire and cease to continue in office as such auditors after 30th May, 1906.

4. These regulations shall apply to the election of six commissioners and two auditors for the First Mildura Irrigation Trust. An election shall be held annually for the election of two commissioners and two auditors, on the 31st May, and the first election hereunder shall be held on the 31st May, 1906, for the election of two commissioners and two auditors, provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Period for which commissioners and auditors shall hold office.—Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said Trust shall hold office shall be three years, and the period for which the auditors shall hold office shall be one year.

6. Annual retirement of commissioners.—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, be eligible for re-election.

7. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner or auditor be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner or auditor during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner or auditor whose seat shall have become vacant.

8. Voters' list to be prepared yearly.—Before the first day of May in each year the Trust shall cause to be prepared a voters' list.

9. Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the said Acts, and shall also specify the extent of and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such person, in respect of which he appears by the assessment books of the Trust to be rated, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Acts, each such person is entitled.

10. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.—In the case of partners, joint occupiers, joint-owners, or tenants in common, the person whose name shall appear first on the assessment book shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were occupied or owned solely by him, and he alone shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

11. Copy of list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, at some convenient place within or near to the irrigation district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

12. Grounds of objections to list to be lodged in writing with the chairman of Trust.—All objections to the said list shall be lodged in writing with the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

13. Special meeting of Trust to be held to revise list.—List to be certified.—Within five days after the date fixed for lodging objections against the said list as provided by the last preceding clause, a special meeting of the Trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been so lodged with the chairman shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

14. Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll to be used at the election of commissioners and auditors to be held on the 31st May then next ensuing, and shall be the voters' roll to be used at any election for the purpose of filling any vacancy in the office of any commissioner or auditor that may arise within twelve months from the said 31st May.

15. Disqualification of voter.—No person whose name shall appear upon the voters' list, who shall be more than three months in arrear with the payment of the whole or any part of the rates due by him to the Trust in respect of the land described in such list, shall be entitled to vote for land in which he is so in arrear.

16. Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at elections.—For the purpose of every election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the Trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if, at the time of any election, the office of chairman of the Trust should be vacant, or the chairman being a candidate, the

commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election; and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do, and the returning officer may appoint two poll clerks to assist him when necessary.

17. Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates for commissioners and auditors.—Third Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners and auditors under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Three o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Three o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer or his deputy a nomination-paper in the form of the Third Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule, and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named. Every candidate for election as a commissioner, or some person on his behalf, shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds (£10) to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and, in case the nomination be for election as a commissioner who or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

18. Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

19. Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.—Fourth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, then the returning officer shall, in respect of the offices for which there is such excess of candidates, forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian and surname of the candidates in full, in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall cause notices to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the Trust district, or to be posted up in conspicuous places throughout the district, giving the names of the candidates nominated, and setting forth the date and place at which the poll shall be taken, and the time at which the poll shall commence and be closed, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Twelve o'clock noon and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

20. Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

21. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, and his deputy, and poll clerks, and the scrutineers, and any persons, not exceeding six in number actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

22. Pencils and ballot-box to be provided.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein, capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

23. Mode of voting.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall deliver to every voter who requires the same

a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, and, so long as the Mildura Riding of the Shire of Mildura forms part of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust District, he shall also deliver twenty-nine ballot-papers to such one of the councillors representing the Mildura Riding in the Shire of Mildura as all or a majority of the said councillors shall, in writing, nominate for that purpose, which written nomination shall be produced to and lodged with the returning officer or his deputy. Every ballot-paper delivered as aforesaid shall be initiated by the returning officer or his deputy; and every person voting shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. In case any person voting is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. All the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and, except as hereinafter expressly provided as to voting by proxy, no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

24. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number in the roll set opposite to the name of the person entitled to vote, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such person's name as having voted. In the case of the twenty-nine ballot-papers to be delivered to one of the councillors as hereinbefore provided, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall, instead of a number, write the initials of his name only.

25. Informal ballot-papers.—If any person voting suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect as to the offices for which such greater number is suffered to remain.

26. What questions may be asked.—The returning officer or his deputy may, if he sees fit, or, if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person claiming to vote in his own right tendering his vote the questions following:—

- (1) Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll in use at this election?
 - (2) Are you more than three months in arrear with the payment of the whole or any part of the rates levied by the First Mildura Irrigation Trust upon the land described opposite to your name in the said roll?
- And to any person claiming to vote as proxy for another the questions following in respect of each proxy:—
- (3) Is the signature (A.B.) at the foot of the proxy form presented by you, to the best of your belief, in the actual handwriting of (A.B.) personally?
 - (4) Is the said (A.B.) the person whose name appears in the roll in use at this election?
 - (5) Is the said (A.B.) more than three months in arrear with the payment of the whole or any part of the rates levied by the First Mildura Irrigation Trust upon the land described opposite to the said (A.B.) name in the said roll?
 - (6) Are you (C.D.) the person named in the said proxy form?
 - (7) Have you already received ballot-papers in respect of three proxies at this election?

and no other question shall be put to any person tendering a vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such questions, or who shall not answer the second, fifth, and seventh questions absolutely in the negative; and all the other questions absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

27. Voting by proxy.—Fifth Schedule.—All proxy forms shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these regulations or to the like effect, and shall in all cases be signed by the person entitled to vote by proxy in his own actual handwriting, or, if unable to write, by his own mark, and such signature or mark shall be attested by a magistrate, a justice of the peace, a commissioner for taking affidavits or declarations, a legal practitioner, a bank manager, a public or State school

teacher, or a postmaster or postmistress, either in Victoria or elsewhere, and all such proxy forms shall be lodged with the returning officer or his deputy at least forty-eight hours prior to the hour fixed for the opening of the poll.

28. False answer, polling twice, and personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, in his own right or in right of the same person, or who shall use or attempt to use more than three proxies, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as he is entitled so to do.

29. Result of polling, how ascertained.—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number, or, in the case of the hereinbefore mentioned twenty-nine ballot-papers, the initials written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and, as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners or auditors of the Trust (as the case may be); and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote in addition to any other vote or votes he may have.

30. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall, forthwith after the declaration of the poll, indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and shall deliver such sealed packet to the secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the Trust.

31. Questions arising upon elections to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner or auditor at any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such questions shall be determined by the commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been determined, and a majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

32. Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

33. Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.—If at any election of commissioners or auditors no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

34. Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election, shall be defrayed by the Trust.

35. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

Meat Supervision Act, No. 1652.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING CLEANLINESS IN MEAT STORES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers it enabling the Council of the Town of Malvern, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulation, being Regulation No. 13 of the Town of Malvern; with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat and the premises appurtenant thereto and of the appliances used thereat and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein, or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards and lockers therein are moveable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place, for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing

- (a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or
- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat unless

(a) At least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings, and all appliances are

(1) Scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(2) then dried with clean cloths; and

(3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

(b) Once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned and disinfected as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place

(a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit.

(b) That is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be

liable for every such offence on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.

Resolution for passing this Regulation No. 13 agreed to by the Council of the Town of Malvern the 30th day of October, 1905, and confirmed the 4th day of December, 1905.

REGULATION No. 4.—FOR SECURING CLEANLINESS IN MEAT STORES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers it enabling the Council of the Borough of Camberwell and Boroondara, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulation with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat, and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are moveable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing

(a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or

(b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or

(c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists, for storing fresh meat, unless

(a) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings, and all appliances are

(1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather; the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(2) then dried with clean cloths; and

(3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime, of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place

(a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food, are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather; the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Regulation, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Regulation, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Twenty shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.
