## BANK HALF-HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1334), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each such day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 23TH DAY OF APRIL, 1906, at Wodonga;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF APRIL, 1906, at Warrnambool;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MAY, 1906, at Mildura.

### SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1906.

IT is hereby notified that Tuesday, the 1st day of May next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Persons who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

"Residential" Rights for the Legislative Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post, and any written application posted to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar not later than the 30th April instant will be in time for enrolment on the Lists. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

Electors' Rights for the Assembly can be obtained free of charge.

### NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

#### ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF GLENELG.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Assembly, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

*Voting by Post Act 1900.*  
NOTICE.

TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS REGISTRATION  
BOARD.

NOTICE AS TO REGISTRATION OF TEACHERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the provisions of section 13 of the *Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905*, the Teachers and Schools Registration Board has fixed the 2nd August, 1906, as the date to be notified by the Board in the *Government Gazette*, after which it shall not be lawful for any person to conduct or teach in a school unless such school shall have been registered under the said Act, and no teacher shall be employed in any school after the 2nd August, 1906, except in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

The Act provides for the imposition of penalties in respect of any contravention of any of its provisions.

Section 11 of the Act also provides that no person who is not a registered teacher shall, after the expiration of six months from the first meeting of the Board, have the right to sue in any court of law for services rendered as teacher in any school.

TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS REGISTRATION  
BOARD.

NOTICE AS TO REGISTRATION OF SCHOOLS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the provisions of section 5, sub-section (1), of the *Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905*, the Teachers and Schools Registration Board has fixed the 1st May, 1906, as the date to be notified by the Board in the *Government Gazette*, after which every school shall be registered with the Registrar either as a sub-primary or as a primary or as a secondary school, or as a school with any two or three of such departments, and the proprietor or head teacher of any such school who neglects within the three months next ensuing from the 1st May, 1906, so to register his school shall, if he carries on or teaches such school whilst the same is unregistered, be guilty of a contravention of the said Act.

In the case of a school opened after the 1st May, 1906, if the proprietor or head teacher neglects to register his school within three months of the date of such opening, he shall, if he carries on or teaches such school whilst the same is unregistered, be guilty of a contravention of the said Act.

The Act provides for the imposition of penalties in respect of any contravention of any of its provisions.

FOG-SIGNAL, TAIAROA HEAD.—ENTRANCE TO OTAGO HARBOR.

Marine Department,  
Wellington, N.Z., 2nd April, 1906.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after Friday, the 20th April, 1906, the following fog-signals will be sounded from a position just below the lighthouse on Taiaroa Head (on the harbor side of it).

The signals consist of explosions of cotton-powder charges at intervals of six minutes, and will be made when the land is likely to be obscured at a distance of about three miles from seaward by either fog, mist, falling snow, or continuous rain.

It is anticipated that these sound-signals will be heard at any distance under ten miles, varying according to the state of the atmosphere and the force and direction of the wind.

Special warnings to mariners concerning fog-signals, published by the Board of Trade, are as follows:—

"Sound is conveyed in a very capricious way through the atmosphere. Apart from wind, large areas of silence have been found in different directions and different distances from the signals, in some instances even when in close proximity to the sound-signal.

"The mariner should not assume—

"1. That he is out of ordinary hearing-distance because he fails to hear the sound.

"2. That because he hears a fog-signal faintly, that he is at a great distance from it.

"3. That he is near it because he hears the sound plainly.

"4. That the distance from and the intensity of the sound on any one occasion is a guide to him for any future occasion.

"5. That the fog-signal has ceased sounding because he does not hear it even when in close proximity."

## SHIRES OF MARONG AND EAST LODDON.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903 (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the shire of Marong described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said shire of Marong and annexed to the shire of East Loddon.

Area described in petition: Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, in the parish of Bridgewater, where the north side of the Railway reserve abuts thereon; thence easterly by such reserve to the north-western side of Lyndhurst-street, in the township of Bridgewater; thence north-easterly to the north-east angle of section 4 of such township; and further north-easterly across Brougham-street to the south-east angle of section 10; thence south-easterly across Lyndhurst-street to the western angle of section 11; thence south-easterly along the northern boundary of the Railway reserve to the south-eastern side of section 12; thence north-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment C; thence east by the three-chain road to the south-east angle of allotment 32; thence south to the south-west angle of allotment 33; thence east by the one-chain road to the eastern boundary of the parish of Bridgewater; thence north by such boundary to the north-east angle of allotment 49 in such parish; thence due east by a one-chain road to the Bendigo to Swan Hill Railway reserve; thence northerly by such reserve to the south-western boundary

of the borough of Raywood; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the boundaries of such borough to the intersection of such Railway reserve; thence north-easterly by such reserve to the south boundary of the parish of Yallock, being the south boundary of the shire of East Loddon; thence west, south, and west by the boundary of such shire to the Loddon River; thence up such river to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the head-quarters of the shire of Marong are at Lockwood, which is 17 miles from the nearest and 30 miles from the furthest portion of the area proposed to be severed, while the shire of East Loddon has its head-quarters at Serpentine, which is 14½ miles distant from the furthest and 6 miles from the nearest portion of such area.

The petitioners further state that the industries of the shire of Marong are largely mining or callings connected therewith, while those of the shire of East Loddon are almost exclusively pastoral and agricultural, as those of the petitioners, &c.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the shire of Marong above described, and annex same to the South Riding of the shire of East Loddon.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR  
PUBLIC GARDENS KNOWN AS LAKE RESERVE,  
IN THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Gardens known as the "Lake Reserve," in the Borough of Stawell, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
  3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or leave or roll stones therein, or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.
  4. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing, or other litter.
  5. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
  6. No person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
  7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
  8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog for coursing or other purposes, or on days on which fetes, sports, or shows are held; and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found in the Reserve, shall be liable to be destroyed.
  9. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to catch fish in the lake in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist

from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
