SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1906.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF GLENELG.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on pesting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Pestal Ballotpaper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poli of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

NOTICE AS TO REGISTRATION OF TEACHERS.

NOTICE AS TO REGISTRATION OF TEACHERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the provisions of section 13 of the Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905, the Teachers and Schools Registration Board has fixed the 2nd August, 1906, as the date to be notified by the Board in the Government Gazette, after which it shall not be lawful for any person to conduct or teach in a school unless such school shall have been registered under the said Act, and no teacher shall be employed in any school after the 2nd August, 1906, except in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

The Act provides for the imposition of penalties in respect of any contravention of any of its provisions.

Section 11 of the Act also provides that no person who is not a registered teacher shall, after the expiration of six months from the first meeting of the Board, have the right to sue in any court of law for services rendered as teacher in any school.

NOTICE AS TO REGISTRATION OF SCHOOLS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the provisions of section 5, sub-section (1), of the Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905, the Teachers and Schools Act 1905, the Teachers and Schools Registration Board has fixed the 1st May, 1906, as the date to be notified by the Board in the Government Gazette, after which every school shall be registered with the Registrar either as a sub-primary or as a primary or as a secondary school, or as a school with any two or three of such departments, and the proprietor or head teacher of any such school who neglects within the three months next ensuing from the 1st May, 1906, so to register his school shall, if he carries on or teaches such school whilst the same is unregistered, be guilty of a contravention of the said Act.

In the case of a school opened after the 1st May, 1906, if the proprietor or head teacher neglects to register his school within three months of the date of such opening, he shall, if he carries on or teaches such school whilst the same is unregistered, be guilty of a contravention of the said Act.

FOG-SIGNAL, TAIAROA HEAD.—ENTRANCE TO OTAGO HARBOR.

Marine Department, Wellington, N.Z., and April, 1906.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after Friday, the 20th April, 1906, the following fog signals will be sounded from a position just below the lighthouse on Taiaroa Head (on the harbor side of it).

The signals consist of explosions of cotton-powder charges at intervals of six minutes, and will be made when the land is likely to be obscured at a distance of about three miles from seaward by either fog, mist, falling snow, or continuous rain.

It is anticipated that these sound-signals will be heard at any distance under ten miles, varying according to the state of the atmosphere and the force and direction of the

Special warnings to mariners concerning fog-signals, published by the Board of Trade, are as follows:

- "Sound is conveyed in a very capricious way through the atmosphere. Apart from wind, large areas of silence have been found in different directions and different distances from the signals, in some instances even when in close proximity to the sound-signal.
 - "The mariner should not assume-
- " 1. That he is out of ordinary hearing-distance because he fails to hear the sound.
- "2. That because he hears a fog-signal faintly, that he is at a great distance from it.
- 3. That he is near it because he hears the sound plainly.
 4. That the distance from and the intensity of the sound on any one occasion is a guide to him for any future occasion.
- "5. That the fog-signal has ceased sounding because he does not hear it even when in close proximity.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS KNOWN AS LAKE RESERVE, IN THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Gardens known as the "Lake Reserve," in the Borough of Stawell, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservations of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901.

REGULATIONS.

- . 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or leave or roll stones therein, or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.
- 4. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing, or other litter.
- 5. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any article. A hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Manage-
- 7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog for coursing or other purposes, or on days on which fetes, sports, or shows are held; and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found in the Reserve, shall be liable to be destroyed.
- o. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to eatch fish in the lake in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desir

from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
