THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSIONER, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby makes the following Regulations, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

CHAPTER III.

APPOINTMENT AND TRANSFER TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 1133, Section 59 (II.) and (III).
Examinations and Tests.—Lower Classes.

1. Candidates for employment in the Clerical Division will be examined in the following subjects:—

	Full marks.
1. Handwriting—to be valued for clearness, regularity, simplicity, moderate size, and rapidity	300
2. Arithmetic—the first four rules (simple and compound), reduction, vulgar and decimal fractions, practice, proportion, and interest.	500
3. Spelling—to be tested by writing from dictation	200
4. Simple composition, and the correction of grammatical errors	300
5. Parsing, analysis, and derivation of words	250
6. Geography—outlines of physical and political geography, and of the geography of Australasia (particularly Victoria) in moderate detail	250
Total	1,800

2. In order to pass the required standard of examination a candidate must obtain at least two-thirds of the full marks in handwriting, in arithmetic, in spelling, and in simple composition, &c.; at least two-fifths of the full marks in each of the other subjects; and secure not less than 1,200 marks in all.

3. Candidates for employment in the Clerical Division in the under-named offices must, prior to registration for examination, comply with the following conditions to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, namely:—

(a) Assistant in Public Library.—The production of evidence of having passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne (or some examination which the Commissioner may judge equivalent) in Greek, in Latin, and in French or German.

(b) Clerk and Draughtsman, Department of Lands and Survey.—The production of a certificate of qualification from the Secretary for Lands or Surveyor-General, or Chief Draughtsman of the Department of Lands and Survey.

Examination and Registration.

4. The Commissioner shall give, in the *Government Gazette*, six weeks' clear notice of the date of every examination.

5. Every candidate for appointment to the Clerical Division must, prior to the date of an examination, be between the ages of sixteen and thirty years, and must forward to the Commissioner an application in his own handwriting on the proper form, stating his full name and address, and the date and place of his birth, together with a certificate satisfactory to the Commissioner of his good moral character and industrious habits.

6. Officers of the General Division who are candidates for examination must furnish a certificate by the Permanent Head of their Department of good conduct and health.

7. The names of the candidates who, in the opinion of the Commissioner, have complied with the requirements of the above Regulations, shall be entered in the "Register of Candidates."

8. All applications must be lodged with the Commissioner at least twenty-one clear days before the date fixed for the commencement of any examination.

9. The Commissioner shall publish in the *Government Gazette*, at least sixteen days before the date of any examination, the list of candidates entitled to present themselves thereat, and a statement of the places where the examination will be held.

10. Every candidate named in the list must, within seven days from the publication thereof, forward to the Commissioner a postal-note (across which two parallel lines should be drawn) payable to the Secretary to the Commissioner, Melbourne, for Ten shillings, being fee for the examination, and must state at which of the named places he desires to be examined. If a candidate fail to comply with this Regulation he will not be allowed to present himself for examination.

11. The Commissioner may appoint officers in charge for the purpose of presiding at examinations, and may award them such remuneration as appears to be reasonable.

12. Candidates shall observe any printed directions or any oral directions of the officer in charge of the examination.

13. Examiners and officers in charge will observe any general directions which may be issued by the Commissioner for the preparation, transmission, and marking of examination papers.

14. After any examination has been held the examiners shall, as soon as practicable, forward to the Commissioner a return, signed by every examiner, of all persons who have passed the required standard of examination, showing also the marks obtained by every candidate in each subject, and the total of his marks.

15. Immediately after an examination has been held, all the entries in the "Register of Candidates" shall be cancelled, and a new series of entries shall be commenced.

16. The Commissioner shall cause the names of all candidates for transfer from the General Division, and of candidates to be selected from outside the Service up to but not beyond the published number to be selected, who have passed the required standard of examination, and have forwarded evidence as hereinafter provided, that they are within the prescribed limits of age, and are in good health and free from physical defects, to be entered in the "Register of Qualified Candidates," in the order of their merit. If two or more candidates obtain the same number of marks the order of their merit shall be determined by the number of marks severally obtained for (1) arithmetic, (2) handwriting, (3) spelling, and, if these numbers be also the same, then by lot.

17. Candidates who have passed the required standard and are included in the number to be selected for appointment, shall furnish to the Commissioner, within seven days after being required so to do, a properly certified extract from some official register of births or other evidence of age satisfactory to the Commissioner, and also a certificate of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects from some medical practitioner registered in Victoria; or, at the option of candidates, such certificates may be forwarded prior to the examination. Provided that in the case of candidates who, pursuant to the provisions of any Act of the Parliament of Victoria, have served in South Africa or in China, it shall be sufficient if the said medical certificate sets forth that they are of sound bodily health, and do not suffer from any physical defect which would incapacitate them from the proper performance of the duties of the position for which they are registered.

18. The name of any candidate shall be removed from the register—

(a) on nomination for appointment by the Commissioner,

(b) if not already an officer in the General Division, or his attaining the age of thirty-one years.

These Regulations are in lieu of those made—Chapter III.—on the 22nd December, 1902, which are hereby repealed.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS ABOLISHED.

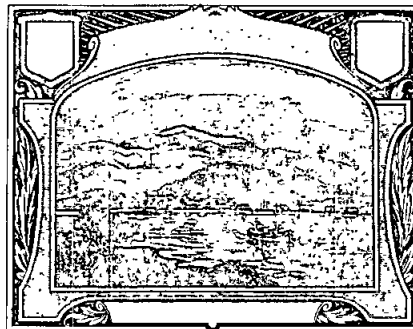

Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905.

TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS REGISTRATION BOARD.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16, sub-section (1), of the *Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905* upon the Teachers and Schools Registration Board enabling the Board to make Regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council) "for defining what schools shall for the purpose of this Act respectively be sub-primary schools, primary schools, or secondary schools (as the case may be)," and for "determining the courses of study and training and the examinations entitling persons to be registered as teachers, and generally for carrying this Act into effect," the Board doth hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations:—

I.—Sub-primary Schools.

1. A sub-primary school shall be a kindergarten school, an infant school, or a combination of both.
2. A kindergarten school is a school for young children, conducted in accordance with kindergarten principles, methods, and practice.
3. An infant school is a school in which the elements of at least the first seven of the following eleven subjects are taught:—
 1. Reading.
 2. Spelling.
 3. Writing.
 4. Recitation.
 5. Oral, or oral and written composition.
 6. Arithmetic.
 7. Drawing.
 8. Physical training.
 9. Manual work (such as paper folding, cardboard modelling, brushwork, needlework).
 10. Singing.
 11. Nature-study.
4. The age of children attending a sub-primary school should, in general, not exceed eight years.

II.—Primary Schools.

1. A primary school shall be a school in which at least six of the following ten subjects (including the subjects

numbered 1, 2, and 3) shall be fully taught up to the standard hereinafter referred to:—

1. Composition and writing.
2. English.
3. Arithmetic.
4. Geography.
5. Elementary experimental science, or nature-study.
6. Drawing.
7. History of the British Empire.
8. Music.
9. Physical exercises and drill.
10. Manual work (such as paper-work, cardboard modelling, wood-work, metal-work, needlework).

2. The instruction in a primary school shall be such as, in the opinion of the Board, is suitable to the age of the pupil, and in the case of schools taking pupils up to the age of fourteen years, shall be such as will enable them to attain in the subjects taught either the standard required to pass the Primary Examination, as now established by the University of Melbourne, or the standard required to pass in the same subjects the Merit Certificate Examination as now established by the Victorian Education Department.

III.—Secondary Schools.

1. A secondary school shall be a school in which, in the opinion of the Board, the course of study and the instruction are both of such a character as will enable pupils to attain the standard of education required to pass any of the following examinations of the Melbourne University:—

Junior Public Examination.
Senior Public Examination.
Junior Commercial Examination.
Senior Commercial Examination.
Matriculation Examination as in force on the 1st January, 1906.

2. No school shall be registered as a secondary school merely by reason of the course of study and the instruction in such school being higher than those prescribed for primary schools, unless such course of study and instruction be as high as that hereby fixed for a secondary school.

IV.—Sub-primary Teachers.

1. Any person may be registered as a sub-primary teacher who, prior to the 1st January, 1906, had been employed in the instruction of pupils in kindergarten or infant school work.

2. Prior to the 1st January, 1910, any person may be registered as a sub-primary teacher who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board of the applicant's fitness to teach in a sub-primary school, such evidence to include proof of sufficient knowledge of the subjects to be taught, and of competency to teach.

3. After the 1st January, 1910, any persons applying for registration as a sub-primary teacher—

- (i) Must have passed the Matriculation Examination, the Junior Public Examination, or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, or must have passed in the literary work for the Second Class Certificate or some higher certificate of the Victorian Education Department, or in some other examination approved for the purpose by the Board; and
- (ii) Must have passed an examination approved by the Board in the undermentioned subjects, either up to the standard required for the Second Class Infant Teacher's Certificate of the Victorian Education Department, or up to some other standard determined by regulation of the Board:
 - (1) Infant school management (theory and practice),
 - (2) Kindergarten principles,
 - (3) Kindergarten "gifts and occupations" (theory and practice),
 - (4) Psychology,
 - (5) Nature-study,
 - (6) Drawing,
 - (7) Singing;

or—

- (iii) Must hold a certificate of competency from some authority approved by the Board for the purpose of the registration of sub-primary teachers.

After the 1st January, 1910, no person shall be registered as a sub-primary teacher unless such person shall have spent at least one year as a student teacher under supervision and instruction in a school, approved for this purpose by the Board.

Provided that service as a student teacher for the purpose of this Regulation shall not be deemed to be employment as a teacher within the meaning of the Act or the Regulations; but no student teacher shall be employed in any school unless such school shall have been approved for this purpose by the Board.

V.—Primary Teachers.

1. Any person may be registered as a primary teacher who, prior to the 1st January, 1906, had been employed in the instruction of pupils in the subjects taught by such person up to the standard entitling a school to be registered as a primary school under the Act.

2. Prior to the 1st January, 1910, any person may be registered as a primary teacher who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board of the applicant's fitness to teach in at least five of the subjects referred to in section 1 of Regulation II. relating to primary schools up to the standard entitling a school to be registered as a primary school under the Act, such evidence to include proof of sufficient knowledge of the subjects to be taught and of competency to teach.

3. After the 1st January, 1910, any person applying for registration as a primary teacher—

- (i) Must have passed the examination prescribed for the Second Class Certificate or some higher certificate of the Victorian Education Department; or
- (ii) Must have passed the Matriculation Examination, the Junior Public Examination, or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, and also have passed in the theory and practice of teaching up to the standard required for the Second Class Certificate or some higher certificate of the Victorian Education Department; or
- (iii) Must hold some qualification, determined from time to time by the Board to be of equivalent standard to the qualifications set out in (i) or (ii) above.

After the 1st January, 1910, no person shall be registered as a primary teacher unless such person shall have spent at least one year as a student teacher under supervision and instruction in a school approved for this purpose by the Board.

Provided that service as a student teacher for the purpose of this Regulation shall not be deemed to be employment as a teacher within the meaning of the Act or the Regulations; but no student teacher shall be employed in any school unless such school shall have been approved for this purpose by the Board.

VI.—Secondary Teachers.

1. Any person may be registered as a secondary teacher who, prior to the 1st January, 1906—

- (i) Had been employed in the instruction of pupils in the subjects taught by such person up to the full standard entitling a school to be registered as a secondary school under the Act; or
- (ii) Having been employed in teaching, shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that such person is competent to teach in the subjects taught by such person up to the standard entitling a school to be registered as a secondary school under the Act.

2. Prior to 1st January, 1910, any person may be registered as a secondary teacher who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is competent to teach in the subjects taught by such person up to the full standard entitling a school to be registered as a secondary school under the Act, such evidence to include proof of sufficient knowledge of the subjects to be taught and of competency to teach.

3. After the 1st January, 1910, any person applying for registration as a secondary teacher—

- (i) Must hold a diploma of education from some University or other institution or authority approved for this purpose by the Board; or
- (ii) Must hold a degree from some University approved for this purpose by the Board, and must produce evidence satisfactory to the Board of having passed, either during his course for a degree or at some other time, an approved course in the theory and practice of teaching such as is included in the course for the Diploma of Education of the University of Melbourne, and of having passed a satisfactory examination therein; or
- (iii) Must produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has passed through a course of liberal education determined by the Board to be of equivalent standard to that of the Diploma of Education of the University of Melbourne, and that he has received adequate training and is possessed of the necessary skill in school management and school method.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne;

for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for the Insane; and for Royal Australian Artillery from the officer commanding at the forts named, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period. *It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.*

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for at" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, they must be prepaid, and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

4. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such penalty, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery; and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the times mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons

named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

19. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

20. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Federal or other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

21. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to

the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

22. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 21 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

24. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage and shall be employed subject to the condition specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
