### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each such day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF MAY, 1906, at Tatura and Wangaratta;

THURSDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF MAY, 1906, at Bendigo and Warrnambool;

THURSDAY, THE 31ST DAY OF MAY, 1906, at Bruthen;

WEDNESDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF JUNE, 1906, at St. Arnaud.

## GENERAL NOTICE.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works having made sewers for carrying off the sewage from each and every property which, or any part of which, abuts on the streets or parts of streets in which such sewers are laid, and which are included within the sewerage areas hereinafter described, doth hereby declare that on and after the 16th day of June, 1906, each and every property which, or any part of which, abuts on the said streets or parts of streets, shall be deemed to be a seweraged property within the meaning of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts 1897*.

BOROUGH OF CAMBERWELL AND BOROONDARA.—Starting at the intersection of Canterbury-road and Myrtle-road; thence south-easterly along Myrtle-road to Matlock-street; thence south-westerly along an easement 12 feet wide acquired by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works for the Canterbury Branch Sewer to a line being the prolongation of the southern boundary of "Prestonville" (Matlock-street); thence westerly by the said line and said southern boundary of "Prestonville" to Spencer-crescent; thence southerly along Spencer-crescent a distance of about 48 feet; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of allotments fronting Matlock-street to the eastern boundary of the Outer Circle Railway line; thence northerly along the said eastern boundary of the Outer Circle Railway line to the southern boundary of the Box Hill Railway line; thence westerly along the said southern boundary of the Box Hill Railway line to Stanhope-grove; thence across the Railway line to Oliver-street; thence northerly along Oliver-street to its intersection with Canterbury-road; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along Canterbury-road to the starting point at the intersection of Canterbury-road and Myrtle-road.

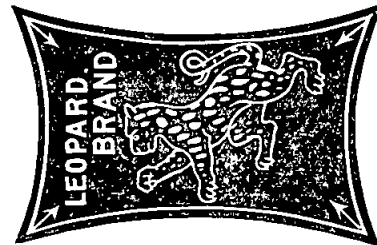

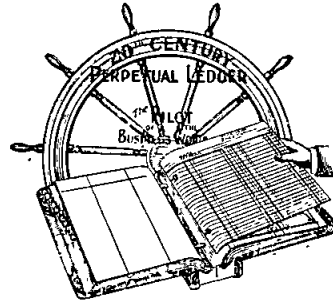

**TOWN OF WILLIAMSTOWN.**

**REGULATION No. 8.**

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers it enabling, the Council of the Town of Williamstown, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein or intended so to be—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

- (a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or
- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat, unless—

- (a) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings, and all appliances, are—
  - (1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;
  - (2) then dried with clean cloths; and



- (3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and
- (b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned and disinfected, as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).
4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—
- (a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit.
- (b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.
5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.
- Resolution for passing these Regulations agreed to by Council the nineteenth day of December, 1905; and confirmed the twenty-third day of January, 1906.

The honorary medical staff shall consist of twelve honorary medical officers, four of whom, to be called infirmary surgeons, shall have charge of the infirmary and out-door departments; other four of whom, to be called midwifery surgeons, shall have charge of the midwifery department; and the remaining four, to be called assistant surgeons, shall assist the infirmary surgeons in the treatment of out-door patients; but all appointments of these officers shall be in respect to either the infirmary department, the out-door department, or the midwifery department.

24. In addition to the twelve honorary medical officers appointed, the committee may, in their discretion, appoint the lecturer on obstetrics at the Melbourne University to be *ex officio* a member of the honorary medical staff of this hospital, provided he be qualified under By-law 25; any such lecturer so appointed shall be attached to the hospital, and his appointment shall be for such time as the committee think fit, and the committee may define his duties in connexion with the aforesaid appointment.

25. No person shall be an honorary medical officer in this Corporation unless, in addition to the requirements of the *Medical Act 1890*, he possess a degree in medicine of an Australian University, or a degree in medicine of one of the recognised universities of the United Kingdom, or of some foreign university recognised by the University of Melbourne, or be a member or licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of London, Edinburgh, or Ireland, and in addition to the above he shall possess a degree in surgery of some university in the Australian States, or in the United Kingdom, or be a member, fellow, or licentiate of some college of surgeons in the United Kingdom, and shall have been engaged in the actual practice of his profession not less than five years. One year of actual practice in a hospital for treatment of diseases peculiar to women is to be considered and counted as equal to two years of ordinary practice, but not more than one year is to be thus counted in favour of any one candidate.

26. All honorary medical officers, except such as hold office under By-law 24, shall be appointed for a period of seven years, and shall be eligible for, but not entitled to, re-appointment to the positions previously held by them respectively for a second similar period. Provided that all honorary medical officers, whether holding office as university lecturers or otherwise, shall, upon attaining the age of 60 years, cease to hold office in the hospital. This By-law shall not lengthen or shorten the terms of office of any honorary medical officer appointed or elected thereto before the coming into operation of this By-law.

27. Not less than seven days before the occurrence of any vacancy in the honorary medical staff, the committee shall cause an advertisement to be inserted in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne, notifying that such vacancy is about to occur, and inviting applications for appointment thereto.

28. All applications for appointment as surgeons must be in writing, and lodged with the superintendent within fourteen days from the date of the advertisement referred to in By-law 27, and must be accompanied by evidence of qualification.
29. Where, at the expiration of such period of fourteen days, there is only a sufficient number of duly qualified candidates for the position or positions vacant, the committee may declare him, her, or them to be duly appointed, or in their discretion may from time to time postpone the appointment, and may advertise anew as hereinbefore directed, provided that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for more than six weeks.
30. Where, at the expiration of such period of fourteen days, there are more than a sufficient number of duly qualified candidates for the vacant position or positions, the superintendent shall convene a special general meeting of the committee for the appointment by such meeting of some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices, and shall give to each member of the committee not less than seven days' notice in writing of such meeting, and of the names of such candidates, and the committee shall at such meeting, or at any adjournment thereof, appoint the necessary number of surgeons required to fill the vacancy or vacancies.
31. No honorary medical officer shall be absent from the hospital for more than fourteen consecutive days, without permission from the committee. If absent for more than seven days, one of the other honorary medical officers shall be appointed to take charge of his patients, and in case of absence on leave for more than a month the committee may appoint a qualified *locum tenens*, who shall be subject to the same rules as the honorary medical officers.
32. The committee may, by an absolute majority of their body, suspend any honorary medical officer, and in that event shall, within seven days thereafter, convene a general meeting of the contributors to consider such suspension. If the meeting confirm the same, the office of the person so suspended shall thereupon become vacant, and a fresh appointment shall be made by the committee. But should the meeting refuse to confirm the suspension, the same shall forthwith cease.
33. Every honorary medical officer shall at least twice in every week attend at the hospital to see the patients under his charge, and shall record in the book kept for that purpose the day and hour of each of his visits to the hospital.
34. When any honorary medical officer has served for ten years, the committee may, upon his request, declare him to be an honorary consulting medical officer of the Corporation.
35. The above By-laws Nos. 22 to 34, both inclusive, shall come into operation on the 30th day of June, 1906.


