PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the fifth day of June, 1906: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Wednesday, the twenty-seventh day of June, 1906, and I do hereby fix Wednesday, the twenty-seventh day of June, 1906, aforesaid, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the State Parliament Houses, situate in the Carlton Gardens, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BARWON.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat; who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

POINT GELLIBRAND LIGHT, PORT PHILLIP.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 150, dated 31st January, 1906, notifying the removal of the Point Gellibrand Floating Light-vessel, consequent upon the erection of a Pile Lighthouse in its position, and also notifying the temporary arrangements made for marking such position, Mariners and others are now hereby notified that on or about the 1st August, 1906, an occulting light, having periods of 15 seconds light and 3 seconds eclipse, and visible at a distance of 12½ miles, will be exhibited at an elevation of 50 feet above high water, from the tower of the new Pile Lighthouse off Point Gellibrand in lat. 37 deg. 52 min. 43 sec. S.; long. 144 deg. 54 min. 53 sec. E. Such occulting light will have the following characteristic periods, viz.:—

From seaward between the bearings of N. 39½ deg. E. and N. 33 deg. W.—White, 6 seconds; Red, 3 seconds; White, 6 seconds.

From the waters adjacent to the western and eastern shores of Port Phillip between the bearings of N. 39½ deg. E. and N. 63 deg. E., and between the bearings of N. 33 deg. W. and S. 63 deg. W.—Red, 15 seconds.

From Hobson's Bay between the bearings S. 63 deg. W. and south—White, 6 seconds; Red, 3 seconds; White, 6 seconds.

All bearings are magnetic.

The dioptric apparatus to be employed for projecting the light will be of the second order for the principal navigable waters of Port Phillip, and of the fourth order for Hobson's Bay and the waters adjacent to the eastern shores of Port Phillip.

Simultaneously with the exhibition of such occulting light, the existing temporary arrangements for marking Point Gellibrand will be discontinued.

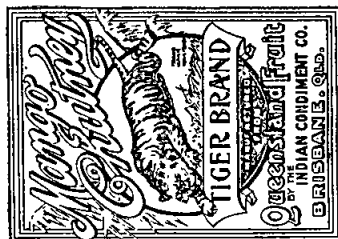

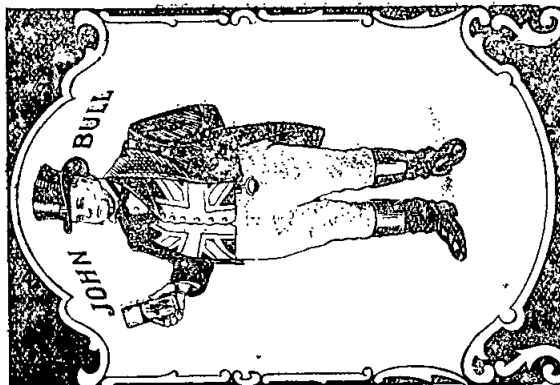

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

By virtue of the Water Acts, Regulations for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1906, namely :—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of under Twenty-two pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Twenty-two pounds and upwards, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an

undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per (1,000) thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1906.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The word "Willis" appearing in the Fourth Schedule in the Order in Council dated the 11th November, 1890, hereinbefore referred to, shall be eliminated.
