NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF LOWAN.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905.

TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS REGISTRATION
BOARD.—REGULATIONS.

ANY person may be registered as a teacher of special subjects in respect of any subject or subjects included in any of the Public Examinations of the Melbourne University, or of any subject or subjects* which, in the opinion of the Board, may suitably be included in the curriculum of a sub-primary, primary, or secondary school, or of a technical school.

2. Any person may be registered as a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects, in the primary grade who, prior to the 1st January, 1906—

(i.) Had been employed in the instruction of pupils in such subject or subjects up to the full standard required in any school entitled to be registered as a primary school under the Act; or,

(ii.) Having been employed in teaching, shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is competent to teach in such subject or subjects up to the standard required in such subject or subjects in any school entitled to be registered as a primary school under the Act.

3. Any person may be registered as a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects in the secondary grade who, prior to the 1st January, 1906—

(i.) Had been employed in the instruction of pupils in such subject or subjects up to the full standard required in any school entitled to be registered as a secondary school under the Act; or

(ii.) Having been employed in teaching, shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is competent to teach in such subject or subjects up to the full standard required in such subject or subjects in any school entitled to be registered as a secondary school under the Act.

4. Prior to the 1st January, 1910, any person may be registered as a teacher of a special subject or of special

subjects in the primary grade who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is competent to teach in such subject or subjects up to the full standard in such subject or subjects in any school entitled to be registered as a primary school under the Act, such evidence to include proof of a sufficient knowledge of the subject or subjects to be taught and of competency to teach them.

5. Prior to the 1st January, 1910, any person may be registered as a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects in the secondary grade who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is competent to teach in such subject or subjects up to the full standard required in any school entitled to be registered as a secondary school under the Act, such evidence to include proof of a sufficient knowledge of the subject or subjects to be taught, and of competency to teach them.

6. After the 1st January, 1910, any person applying for registration as a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects in the primary grade or as a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects in the secondary grade must produce evidence that shall satisfy the Board—

- (i.) That such person has a sufficient general education;
- (ii.) That such person has acquired a sufficient knowledge of the subject or subjects in respect of which registration is sought after a sufficient course of training; and
- (iii.) That such person is competent to teach such subject or subjects.

In estimating the evidence submitted, the Board will require in the case of a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects—primary or secondary grade (as the case may be)—evidence under (ii.) and (iii.) above of qualification in respect of the subject or subjects as to which registration is sought not inferior to the qualification demanded from persons applying to be registered as primary or secondary teachers respectively, and in the case of a teacher of a special subject or of special subjects included in any of the Public Examinations of the Melbourne University, the Board may at its discretion require evidence under (i.) above that such person possesses a good general education of as high a standard as is demanded from persons applying to be registered as teachers in the same grade—primary or secondary (as the case may be).

[*E.G., Manual Training (in any of its branches), physical training or calisthenics, instrumental or vocal music, elocution, painting, modelling, needlework (in any of its branches), domestic economy (in any of its branches).]

The Marine Act 1890.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in Council, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1903, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1906, on which date paragraphs numbered 21, 73, 82, and 124, and clause (c) of paragraph 41, of the aforesaid Regulations shall be repealed.

2. For paragraph 21 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

21. If a Candidate has failed in his examination, but the subjects in which he has failed are not included in the subjects required for a Certificate of a lower grade, he may, if he so desires, proceed with the examination for the lower grade Certificate without further formal application or payment of fee, but in this case he will be required to complete the whole of the work prescribed for such lower grade, those subjects for the lower grade in which the Candidate has passed (if any), in connexion with the examination for the higher Certificate to be credited as passed for the Certificate of the lower grade.

3. In paragraph 29 of the aforesaid Regulations in respect of the fee to be charged for an Extra Master's Certificate, for the word "Nil," there shall be substituted the symbol and figures:—
£1 os. od.

4. For clause (c) of paragraph 41 of the aforesaid Regulations, there shall be substituted the following alternative qualification, namely:—

41. (c) He must have served six and a half years at sea, of which one year must have been in a capacity not lower than Second Mate of a foreign-going vessel, whilst holding a First Mate's Certificate for foreign-going vessels, provided that, if this service as Second Mate was performed under an Additional or Auxiliary First Mate it will only be accepted if a Third and Fourth Mate were also carried, and one year and a half must have been in a capacity not lower than Third or Fourth Mate of a foreign-going vessel in charge of a watch whilst holding a Second Mate's Certificate for foreign-going vessels; or

5. For paragraph 73 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

73. A candidate for examination as Master of a Home Trade ship must be not less than twenty years of age, and have served five years at sea, of which—

(a) one year must have been as Mate of a Home Trade ship of not less than 100 tons gross registered tonnage; or

(b) one year must have been in a capacity not lower than Second Mate of a foreign-going ship while in possession of a First Mate's Certificate for foreign-going ships; or

(c) two and a half years must have been in a capacity not lower than Second Mate of a Home Trade ship in charge of a watch, while in possession of a Mate's Certificate for Home Trade ships or a Second Mate's Certificate for Foreign-going ships.

6. For paragraph 82 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

82. A candidate for examination as Master of a Home Trade steam-ship must be not less than twenty years of age, and have served five years at sea, which—

(a) one year must have been as Mate of a Home Trade steam-ship of not less than 100 tons gross registered tonnage; or

(b) one year must have been in a capacity not lower than Second Mate of a foreign-going steam-ship while in possession of a First Mate's Certificate for foreign-going steam-ships; or

(c) two and a half years must have been in a capacity not lower than Second Mate of a Home Trade steam-ship in charge of a watch, while in possession of a Mate's Certificate for Home Trade steam-ships or a Second Mate's Certificate for foreign-going steam-ships.

7. For paragraph 124 of the aforesaid Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

124. Service as Additional or Auxiliary First or Second Mates in large foreign-going vessels, when, in both cases Third and Fourth Mates are also carried, will count as First Mate's or Second Mate's service, as the case may be, provided that the candidate was entered on the Articles in one of these capacities, and that he produces the necessary Certificate (see Regulation 123) showing that he was in charge of a watch or watches during the whole time claimed.

8. In every case where a candidate for a Master's Certificate of Competency for foreign-going vessels claims service as Second Mate, he must make a declaration upon his form of application to the effect that during his service as Second Mate he had only one officer over him, or, if more than one, that a Third and Fourth Mate were also carried; if the service claimed is as "Auxiliary Second Mate," the candidate must state the number of officers who served in a junior capacity.

9. A candidate with First Mate's service must make a declaration upon his form of application to the effect that he was a senior officer under the master, or, if not, he must satisfy the conditions of Regulation numbered 124.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this fifteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and six.

INSTRUCTIONS TO EXAMINERS AND NOTICE TO CANDIDATES.

COMMERCIAL CODE OF SIGNALS.

ON and after the date upon which the foregoing Amending Regulations come into operation, Appendix B to "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates" shall be annulled, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following:—

Appendix B.

Examiners are recommended to frame the examination in the International Code of Signals upon the instructions and illustrations given at the commencement of Parts I. and II. of the Signal Book. The information there given will be found sufficient to indicate all the characteristics of the code.

By the form of the hoist, an observer can at sight understand the nature of any signal he sees flying; the examination should, therefore, tend to elicit a clear knowledge of all the distinctive features of the Code.

With this object in view, the examiners should question the candidates as to the distinguishing forms of the respective hoists, which will be indicated according as a burgee, a pennant, or a square flag is uppermost, and also with regard to the number of flags, and the position of the code flag when used in the hoist; making the 1, 2, 3, and 4 flag signals on the models supplied for the purpose, and varying the signals made, showing 2 and 3 flag signals, with and without the code flag included, or a geographical or a vocabulary signal, the name of a merchant ship or of a ship of war.

As the two latter signals would not be found in the Signal Book, the candidate should know where to find them, and then be required to read them from the Code List of Ships.

The candidate should (a) be able to read a signal at sight, so far as to name the flags composing the hoist; (b) know the use of the code pennant and of the pennants C and D, "Yes" and "No"; also of the two burgees A and B, and the square flags S and P, and the flags used to indicate cholera, plague, &c., on board, and the quarantine flag; (c) be required to signal some word or words not included in the vocabulary of the code either by letters or by the spelling table (page 516) or both; (d) have a knowledge of the distant signals and of their object, and the different modes of signalling therewith, and be required to make, and read off, one or two signals on the models supplied for this purpose; (e) understand the Morse code, and know the special signals indicated by certain letters as given on page 550; (f) have a good knowledge of the distress signals and understand the penalty which may be incurred by their improper use.

EXTRA MASTERS' CERTIFICATES.

On and after the 1st January, 1907, the following alteration will be made in the examination for Extra Masters' Certificates:—

The lunar problem referred to in paragraph 64 (a) of the Regulations relating to the examination of masters and mates will no longer be set in this examination. In its place a paper on naval architecture will be given, the candidate being required to give written answers to six or ten questions on this subject, and also to satisfy the examiner in the supplementary *viva-voce* test. For the purpose of this examination the Board have adopted "The Modern Practice of Shipbuilding in Iron and Steel" as a text-book, from which the questions will be set.

BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law of the Borough of Clunes, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 20, for regulating the speed of motor-cars, motor-cycles, and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Clunes order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean any carriage, car, or other vehicle driven or impelled by steam, gas, electricity, oil, vapour, or other mechanical power.

2. No person shall drive or ride a machine along or across any street, or any other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of, or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven or ridden.

3. No person driving or riding a machine shall proceed at a greater rate of speed than twelve miles an hour upon or along any street or thoroughfare, nor shall proceed at a greater rate of speed than seven miles per hour upon or along any crossing, unless by the permission in writing of the Council of the said Borough first had and obtained.

4. Every person driving or riding a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

5. Every person driving or riding a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the street or thoroughfare, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

6. In every case where a person driving or riding a machine meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding the machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
