The white iron buoy off the Breakwater foundation has been painted black, thus giving a clear passage in daylight in accordance with the rule of red buoys to star-board and black buoys to port when entering the harbor.

**W**HEREAS by section 87 of the *Water Act* 1905 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, amongst other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date 16th day of October, 1897, a Trust known as the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were, in and by the said Order in Council, defined and limited:

And whereas it is deemed necessary to increase the district of the said Trust:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that the Waterworks District of the said Wycheproof Waterworks Trust shall be and the same is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the lands comprised within the following boundaries:—

And whereas the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act* 1886, and the Irrigation and Water Supply District thereof was duly defined by Order in Council.

And whereas by the Ninth Schedule to the *Water Act* 1905 it is set forth that the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply District is to be abolished, and to become a Waterworks District under the jurisdiction of the Western Wimmera Waterworks Trust.

**W**HEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Clause 7 of Regulation VIII. made under the *Education Acts*, and doth substitute the following Clause in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

#### **REGULATION VIII.—NIGHT SCHOOLS.**

7. In estimating the average attendance, only such scholars shall be reckoned as are above fourteen years of age, and are not in attendance at, or employed as teachers, junior teachers, or monitors in, a State school.

Scholars between the ages of twelve and fourteen years may be reckoned provided they have been granted by the Minister a special exemption from compulsory attendance at a day school, or have gained a certificate of having been educated up to the standard.

This regulation to take effect from the 1st day of August, 1906.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Orders made on the 18th day of July, 1906, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petitions of the Councils of the Municipalities of the Shires of Bacchus Marsh, Melton, Preston, and the United Shire of Beechworth, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipalities of the said shires respectively, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of subsection (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the officials to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerks respectively of the said Shires.

And His Excellency, by the Orders hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

1. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* as applied to Municipal Elections, viz:—

All Justices of the Peace,	} throughout the State of Victoria.
All Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire,	
All Municipal Clerks,	
All Clerks of Courts,	
All Head-masters of State Schools,	
And every member of the Police Force,	

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

#### **SCHEDULE.**

PROVISIONS OF THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900 APPLICABLE TO THE ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS FOR THE SHIRES OF BACCHUS MARSH, MELTON, PRESTON, AND THE UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH RESPECTIVELY, AND ALTERATIONS TO BE READ AS MADE THEREIN FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUCH APPLICATION.

The following provisions, with the necessary alterations thereof, as shown or indicated, of the *Voting by Post Act* shall apply to the election of Municipal Councillors for the Shires of Bacchus Marsh, Melton, Preston, and the United Shire of Beechworth respectively:—

Section 2 shall apply, omitting all the words after the word "of" where it appears the second time on the first line down to the word "therein" on the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "a Municipal Council"; inserting after the word vacant in the fourth line the words "or not less than six days before the day appointed for holding the annual election"; and omitting the words "the *Government Gazette* and unless otherwise prescribed in two Melbourne daily newspapers and also in" in the fifth and sixth lines; omitting the words "any province or" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting the words "Member or members" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors"; omitting all the words after the word "effect" in the tenth line.

Section 3 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the second line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "who" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "whose name"; omitting the word "from" in the third line, and substituting therefor the word "upon"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it first appears in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting the words "province or district" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."



Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

#### WANGARATTA AND WHITFIELD RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST DISSOLVED.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of June, One thousand nine hundred and six, after reciting that the purposes for which The Wangaratta and Whitfield Railway Construction Trust (hereinafter called "the said Trust") was constituted and incorporated, have been fulfilled and completed, and that all moneys borrowed or owing by the said Trust have been repaid, it was declared that the power of the said Trust to make rates should cease: Now therefore I, the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 76 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, No. 1288, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, dissolve the said Trust, and the same is dissolved accordingly: And I hereby order that the sum of Forty-nine pounds seventeen shillings and fivepence, being the whole of the undisposed property of the said Trust, shall be disposed of by the said Trust by paying out of such sum of Forty-nine pounds seventeen shillings and fivepence the sum of Ten pounds to the Wangaratta Ladies' Benevolent Society, and the sum of Thirty-nine pounds seventeen shillings and fivepence to the Wangaratta District Hospital.

#### IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN TREES AND PLANTS INTO VICTORIA PROHIBITED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the trees and plants of the kind hereinafter specified, and any part of the fruit or other product of the same, are likely to introduce disease or insects into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation prohibit, except subject to the regulations for the time being in force under the said recited Act, the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree or plant, including any part of the fruit or other product of the same, of the following kinds, that is to say:—

Apple trees, Apricot trees, Almond trees, Cherry trees, Currant trees, Trees of the Citrus family, Fig trees, Gooseberry trees, Loquat trees, Nectarine trees, Peach trees, Pear trees, Persimmon trees, Plum trees, Quince trees, Banana plants, Blackberry plants, Cucumber plants, Granadilla plants, Melon plants, Passion fruit plants, Pine-apple plants, Raspberry plants, Strawberry plants, Sugar canes, and Tomato plants.

This Proclamation is in substitution for a Proclamation made the sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, under the said Act by the Governor in Council.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY  
GARDEN.**

**W**HEREAS by Section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the regulations made by the said Board on the 9th day of June, 1892, in regard to the Treasury Garden, and doth hereby make the regulations following in respect thereof :—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Garden, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.
2. No person shall interfere with, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, birds, fish, or any property in the Garden, or throw stones or other missiles, or beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires in the Garden, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or seats in or around the Garden, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
4. No person shall bring into the Garden any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or constable.
5. No person, except workmen employed in the Garden, shall enter any plots of ground specially inclosed for plantations or for other purposes in the Garden, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Garden without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.
6. No bicycle or tricycle, other than children's bicycles or tricycles, shall be ridden in or through the Garden, and no carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except perambulators or go-carts, shall be allowed to enter or remain in the Garden unless such cart or other vehicle be used or required in connexion with works therein.
7. No person, unless authorized by the Minister of Lands, shall offer for sale in the Garden any article.
8. Any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, fruits, or other property from the Garden, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from the Garden, and to be prosecuted.
9. Cricket, football, or other games or sports shall not be played or take place in the Garden.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with Section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence: and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
