ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and forty-five thousand four hundred and seventy-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and five and One thousand nine hundred and six."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord One thou-sand nine hundred and six, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Mines Act 1897, has, by an Order made on the 31st day of July, 1906, ca neelled clause 5 (b) of the Regulations for granting Certificates to Mining Engine-drivers, and has substituted the following clause in lieu thereof, viz.:—

Clause 5 (b).—That he has been the holder of a second-class certificate under these Regulations, a first-class certificate of competency or service issued under the Factories and Shops Acts, an "ordinary" mining engine-driver's certificate issued in New South Wales, or a second-class mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive both loose, eccentric, and link motion winding engines—such experience to be for not less than twelve hours per week. Where only one class of the above engines or any other class of winding gear has been driven, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that class of engine only.

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 31st day of July, 1906, approved that the following alterations be made in the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, viz.:—

Clause 36 (a).—After the words "Public Vaccinators" insert the following paragraph:—

"In the cases of employes of the Victorian Railways who, when their pay arrives at their usual location, are absent on annual leave or sick leave, or by reason of their having been transferred elsewhere, form Ha annexed shall be used."

Clause 39 to be repealed, and the following clause to be substituted in lieu thereof:--

Clause 39 to be repealed, and the following clause to substituted in lieu thereof:—

"30. Heads of Departments and other officers authorized by the proper Minister may be supplied by the Treasurer, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, with funds, by way of advance, to enable them to defray salaries, allowances, wages, departmental contingencies, and other expenditure which it may be deemed desirable to defray by such means. Salaries may be paid twice during each month, viz.:—On the 15th and the last day thereof respectively. Whenever either of such days falls on a Saturday or Sunday payment may be made on the preceding Friday, and whenever either falls on a Public Holiday, payment may be made on the preceding day upon which the Public Offices are open for business, unless that day shall be a Saturday when the preceding Friday may be the day of payment. As regards pensions (with the exception of Old-Age Pensions) payment shall be made on the last working day other than Saturday of each month. These rules are not to be relaxed under any circumstances without the special direction of the Treasurer, but, in cases where wages are payable at a daily or weekly rate, they may be paid either weekly or fortnightly as the Head of the Department directs on the last working day of the term."

REGULATIONS AS TO THE LABELLING OF ARTICLES OF FOOD, OR OF WRAPPERS OR RECEPTACLES CONTAINING ARTICLES OF FOOD MIXED WITH PRESERVATIVE SUBSTANCES OR WITH FOREIGN COLOURING MATTERS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the Regulations following that is the coning, that is to say :-

- r. To every article of food mixed with a preservative substance, and to every article of food mixed with any foreign colouring matter, or to any wrapper or receptable containing any such article so mixed, there shall be attached a label distinctly and legibly written or printed, and setting forthand setting forth-
 - (a) The nature and amount of such preservative substance; and
- (b) The nature of such foreign colouring matter. This Regulation shall not apply to confectionery nor to the long-used, well-known condimental preservative substances, viz., common salt, sugar (sucrose or saccharose), spices, wood-smoke, and vinegar; nor, as regards wine, to the substances allowed under section 25 of the Pure Faced Act 1005.
- to the substances allowed under section 25 of the Fure Food Act 1905.

 2. The label so required to be attached shall, where the admixture is with a preservative substance, be in the form of Schedule A hereto, and shall contain no other matter, and the written or printed matter shall be on a white ground in black capital letters of a size not less than one-sixth of an inch in length.

 3. Every person who shall be guilty of a contravention of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such contravention.

 4. These Regulations shall come into force on the thirty-first day of December, 1906.

EGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION OF ARTICLES OF FOOD. REGULATIONS

OF ARTICLES OF FOOD.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria. by virtue of the power conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of certain articles of food, to wit, milk, cream, butter, cheese, cooked meats, bread, pastry, confectionery, honey, jam, fruit, and other articles of food to which flies are attracted, and which are ordinarily consumed in the condition in which they are purchased:

I. Any person who sells on any retail premises (including cafés, restaurants, and licensed premises) any of the

above-named articles of food in other than sealed packages shall, as far as practicable, protect such articles of food from dust and flies by storage in covered receptacles, or by means of metal covers, or wire gauze screems, or other effectual appliance.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION OF ARTICLES OF FOOD.

MIE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, His Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the power conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of certain articles of food, to wit, bread and meat, that is to say:—

1. No person who sells bread or meat, and no employé of such person shall receive into any place or vehicle for the reception or storage of bread or meat for sale any bread or meat which has been returned after delivery

any bread or meat which has been returned after delivery at any house.

2. No person who sells bread or meat shall use or cause to be used as a material for casing, covering, enclosing, or packing bread or meat for carriage or for sale any second-hand paper, or any newspaper or part of a newspaper, or any paper or substance on which there is printing which can come into contact with the bread or meat.

These Regulations shall take effect from the first day of September, 1906.

4. Any person contravening any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Any person contravening this Regulation shall be liable a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 16, sub-section (1), of the Registration of Teachers and Schools Act 1905 upon the Teachers and Schools Registration Board enabling the Board to make Regulations (with the approval of the Governor-in-Council) "for regulating the granting by the Board "of certificates of registration of teachers or of schools and the form of such certificates; providing for the keeping of the registers and mode of registering and making additions and revisions; and generally for carrying this Act into effect," the Board doth hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor-in-Council, make the following regulations:—

VIII.—REGISTER OF TEACHERS.

- 1. The Board shall make and keep a Register of Teachers in the form or to the effect of Schedule A of this Regulation, giving the names of and containing information concerning all teachers who have fulfilled the conditions set forth in the Regulations of the Board relating to the qualifications of Teachers.
- 2. All entries to be made in the Register of Teachers, other than those made under section 7 below, shall first be authorized by the Board at a meeting, and initialled by the President or some member elected by the Board to act as Chairman in the absence of the President at such meeting.
- 3. The following abbreviations may be used in making entries in the Register of Teachers concerning the qualifications of Registered Teachers:
 - (a) The words "Employed prior to Act," when used in a column headed "Registered by virtue of employment before the passing of the Act," will indicate that the person named has been registered by virtue of employment before the passing of the Act.
 - (b) The words "Fitness to teach," when used in a column headed "Evidence produced satisfactory to the Board of fitness to teach," will indicate that the person named has produced evidence satisfactory to the Board of fitness to teach in a school of the classification specified in such registration.
 - (c) The common, accepted, or generally understood abbreviations for the short titles of degrees, diplomas, and other certificates of qualification may be entered in the Register.

Entries with respect to any teacher may be made at any time under any or all of the qualifications (a), (b), and (c).

- 4. Entries may from time to time be made in the Register of Teachers, showing that persons already registered have obtained or produced evidence of holding additional qualiscations, and registration may be granted accordingly.
- 5. A Certificate of Registration in the form or to the effect of Schedule B of this Regulation will be forwarded to each Registered Teacher.
- 6. If any such certificate as aforesaid is alleged to be worn out, destroyed, or lost, the Board may, if they think fit, upon such evidence of the wearing out, destruction, or loss being furnished, and such indemnity or undertaking being given as they may think sufficient, permit a duplicate of such certificate to be issued on payment of One pound, or such other sum as the Board may prescribe; and if any such duplicate is alleged to be worn out, destroyed, or lost, may, if they think fit, upon such evidence, indemnity, undertaking, and payment as aforesaid, permit the certificate to be again in like manner renewed.
 - 7. (a) Registered teachers must within one month of changing their professional address notify the Registrar of such change of address.
- (b) Registered teachers whose status has been changed may, if they so desire, have such change entered in the register. Entries made in the register in accordance with this section will be made without fee.

- 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- approval or the custees.

 6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or certar). sexton).
- 7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5

throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin piaced therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be one to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily through-

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box. Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

COND TIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.
- Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the
 contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
- 4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
- 5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
- 6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
- 7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
- 8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, thich must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.
- 9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
