TREATY RESPECTING FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

NICARAGUA EXTRADITION TREATY ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 11TH MAY, 1906.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of May, 1906.

PRESENT:

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty;

Lord President,
Lord Chamberlain,

Lord Ribblesdale,

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the nineteenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and five, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Nicaragua, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Treaty between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Nicaragua for the Mutual Surrender of Fugitive Criminals.

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Nicaragua, having determined, by common consent, to conclude a Treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India: Herbert William Broadley Harrison, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires in the Republic of Nicaragua; and His Excellency the President of Nicaragua; Doctor Adolfo Altamirano, Minister of Foreign Affairs; who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

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ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes and offences:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of puberty, according to the laws of the respective countries.
6. Indecent assault.
7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
8. Abandoning, exposing, or detaining children.
9. Abduction.
10. Bigamy.
11. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
12. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
13. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
15. Arson.
16. Burglary or house-breaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.
17. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company,

18. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

19. (a) Counterfeiting or altering money or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument, tool, or engine adapted or intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.

20. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.

21. Crimes against bankruptcy law.

22. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.

23. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

24. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition offences.

25. Dealing in slaves in such a manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

Extradition shall also be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

Provided that the surrender shall be made only when, in the case of a person accused, the commission of the crime shall be so established as that the laws of the country where the fugitive or person so accused shall be found would justify his apprehension and commitment for trial if the crime had been there committed; and, in the case of a person alleged to have been convicted, on such evidence as, according to the laws of the country where he is found, would prove that he had been convicted.

Extradition shall not be granted if, according to the laws of either country, the maximum punishment for the offence charged is imprisonment for less than one year.

ARTICLE III.

No Nicaraguan shall be delivered up by the Government of Nicaragua to the Government of the United Kingdom, and no subject of the United Kingdom shall be delivered up by the Government thereof to the Government of Nicaragua.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Nicaragua, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Nicaragua or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of Nicaragua, should be under examination for any crime in the territory of Nicaragua or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime, or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place. This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents, or duly recognised Consuls-General of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition,

and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by a sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

ARTICLE X.

The extradition shall not take place before the expiration of fifteen days from the apprehension, and then only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the commitment of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime has been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition.

ARTICLE XI.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as entirely valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, provided such documents are signed or certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of such State, and are authenticated by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of State.

ARTICLE XII.

If sufficient evidence for extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, he shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XIII.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend, not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XIV.

The High Contracting Parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered and his conveyance till placed on board ship; they reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

ARTICLE XV.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty. The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions, shall be made to the Governor or Chief authority of such Colony or possession by the chief Consular officer of Nicaragua in such Colony or possession.

Such requisitions may be disposed of (subject always, as nearly as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty) by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

His Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Nicaraguan criminals who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal from any Colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVI.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at London on the thirteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and six:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 25th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and six, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the Republic of Nicaragua, under and in accordance with the said Treaty:

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land surveying, for the period of , viz., from (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(f) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(g) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

REGULATIONS.

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and, on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.

GEELONG PROTESTANT ORPHAN ASYLUM.

AT a Meeting of the Corporation of the above Institution, held at the Board Room, 43 Malop-street, Geelong, on Friday, 25th May, 1906, the old By-laws of the Institution were rescinded, and new and amended By-laws adopted, such rescission and adoption being duly confirmed at a Special Meeting of Governors and Contributors, held at the Mechanics' Institute, Geelong, on Thursday, 26th July, 1906. The following are the new and amended By-laws so adopted, not including such of the old By-laws as were re-adopted without material alteration:—

BY-LAW NO. 2 (in lieu of old By-law No. 2, rescinded).

The Institution shall be called the Geelong Protestant Orphan Asylum, Incorporated, and shall have for its objects the reception, maintenance, and education of children deprived of one or both of their parents by death, insanity, permanent desertion, or such other circumstances as shall in the opinion of the Committee of Management cause the welfare of the child or children to be imperilled. The Asylum shall be supported by voluntary or other contributions, together with such aid as may be obtained from the public revenue.

BY-LAW NO. 3 (in lieu of old By-law No. 3, rescinded).

The Asylum shall be under the government of a Committee of Management, consisting of thirteen persons, male or female, who shall be annual contributors, including a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and nine members of Committee, who shall be elected by the contributors as hereinafter provided.

BY-LAW NO. 7 (in lieu of old By-law No. 8, rescinded).

A donor of £20 and upwards—any minister collecting in his church within one year the sum of £20 and upwards—any person appointed by any society contributing £20 and upwards in one year—the executor first named in any will by which a bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the Asylum—and any person recommended by the Committee for special services rendered (such recommendation to be approved of by the contributors in general meeting) shall be entitled Life Governors, with the liberty of voting in accordance with the By-laws of the Institution.

BY-LAW NO. 8 (in lieu of old By-laws Nos. 9 and 10, rescinded).

All persons subscribing the sum of £1 or upwards each year to the funds of the Asylum shall be entitled Annual Contributors, with the liberty of voting in accordance with the By-laws of the Institution. Such subscriptions shall be deemed to be due on the 1st January in each year, and no person shall be entitled to vote as an annual contributor unless his subscription for the current year has been paid, or he expresses his willingness to pay it when demanded. A person nominated by any church, Sunday school, or society contributing £1 or upwards in any one year may be deemed to be an annual contributor, with the liberty of voting as such at any meeting of contributors during that year.

BY-LAW NO. 9 (in lieu of old By-law No. 9, rescinded).

Every Life Patron and Life Governor under clauses 6 and 7, and every annual contributor of £10 shall be entitled to three votes; every annual contributor of £5 shall be entitled to two votes, and every annual contributor of £1 shall be entitled to one vote, at all special and general meetings of the Institution. All persons so entitled may be referred to shortly as contributors.

BY-LAW NO. 12 (new).

Nominations of contributors for election to the vacancies in the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and members of Committee caused by the retirements above provided for must be made in writing by a contributor or contributors, accompanied by the candidate's consent, and lodged with the Secretary three clear days before the date of the annual meeting. If the nominations are not more in number than the vacancies to be filled, the chairman of the annual meeting shall declare the candidates duly elected. If the nominations are more in number than the respective vacancies, then a ballot must be taken.

If, after such nominations as aforesaid have been disposed of, any office remains vacant by reason of the election of any non-retiring member of Committee to the office of President, Vice-President, or Treasurer, or by reason of insufficient nominations having been received, such vacancy or vacancies shall be filled up at the said annual meeting.

BY-LAW NO. 13 (in lieu of old By-law No. 12, rescinded).

Should any vacancy occur in the office of President, Vice-President, or Treasurer at any time prior to the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint one of its members to fill the same until such meeting.

BY-LAW NO. 16 (in lieu of old By-law No. 14, rescinded).

At all meetings of contributors, seven entitled to vote shall form a quorum, and it shall be lawful for any who reside more than five miles from the place of meeting to vote by proxy; the proxy to be in writing, and in favour of a contributor, and shall be in force only for the meeting specially named therein. Such proxies to be lodged at the office of the Secretary not later than forty-eight hours prior to the time appointed for holding the meeting.

BY-LAW NO. 19 (in lieu of old By-laws Nos. 17 and 21, rescinded).

The Committee of Management shall conduct the general business of the Asylum; admit and discharge children; appoint and discharge paid officers; enter into contracts; receive, expend, and manage the funds, and have the charge of the property of the Asylum. They shall have power to make, repeal, amend, or alter regulations for the internal management of the affairs of the Asylum, and to do all such acts or things, and exercise all such powers in relation to any of the purposes of the Asylum as are not hereby expressly directed or required to be done or exercised by the contributors in general meeting. They shall meet once a month, or oftener, if necessary, and may enter upon business when a quorum of five is present. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and, in cases of equality, a casting vote. The Committee shall also, from themselves, appoint one or more members (not being members of the House Committee) to be visitors for the month, who shall at the next monthly meeting report the state of the Institution as found by them at their visits. At the monthly meeting in June of each year the Committee shall consider and determine the rate of salaries and wages of the officers and servants of the Institution for the ensuing year; and should vacancies occur, or by giving three months' notice, they shall have power to alter or amend rates of salaries and wages then determined upon.

BY-LAW NO. 23 (in lieu of old By-law No. 22, rescinded).

Applications for the admittance of children, which must be made by the parent, relative, guardian, or next friend, upon the prescribed form (surrendering all control of such children to the Institution, and recommended by a contributor) shall be dealt with by the Committee of Management at their monthly meetings, and, if approved by the Committee, such children may be admitted to the Asylum and retained until the age of fourteen years in the case of boys, and fifteen years in that of girls, has been reached, if not previously apprenticed, boarded out, or discharged by the Committee. Provided that before such admission the Medical Officer's certificate of freedom from disease shall be obtained and produced, and that the child or children so admitted shall not be above the age of ten years, except when special circumstances (of which the Committee shall be the sole judges) render the admission of children above such age desirable. Provided also that it shall be lawful for the House Committee, in cases of extreme urgency (of which they shall be the sole judges), to temporarily admit any child or children at any moment, subject to such House Committee making such arrangements as will insure the removal of the child or children so admitted, should such admission not be confirmed by the Committee of Management. No child shall be removed from the Asylum without the consent of the Committee of Management.

BY-LAW NO. 29 (in lieu of old By-law No. 28, rescinded).

Persons desirous of obtaining children as such apprentices or servants shall sign a printed form of application to be provided for that purpose, which shall include references as to character and suitability of the applicant.

BY-LAW NO. 30 (in lieu of old By-law No. 29, rescinded).

Persons obtaining children as apprentices or servants shall be required to furnish a report at such periods as may be determined by the Committee of Management, upon the conduct of each child apprenticed or hired to them, such report expressly to state whether they are satisfied with the behaviour or conduct of their apprentice or servant.

BY-LAW NO. 33 (in lieu of old By-laws Nos. 32 and 33, rescinded).

Subject in all cases to the rules and internal arrangements of the Asylum and the convenience of the management, visitors may be admitted to view the Asylum; and relatives and friends of the children may be admitted to visit them, on such days and hours, and subject to such conditions as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered Twenty-one, for the Destruction of Rats.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and in the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

That every occupier of a house or premises, and every owner of an unoccupied house or premises, shall cause all house refuse, organic waste matter, or edible substances to be kept while on the premises in rat-proof receptacles; and shall, unless there is a dog or cat efficient in both cases for rat-killing kept in such house or premises, and given constant access to the places therein where rats are likely to go from cover, set in suitable places a trap or traps for catching rats, and shall cause all rats caught to be killed; and shall also, if required to do so by the Council, the Officer of Health, or an Inspector of the Council, take either or both the following measures, viz.:—

(1) Cause sulphur fumes or other lethal gas to be pumped into the places in the premises likely to harbor rats.

(2) Lay effective poison baits in such places as the rats are known to frequent.

Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Bairnsdale.
