## THE PLAGUE ORDINANCE OF NETHERLANDS INDIA.

*Government Gazette 1902, No. 112, as Amended and Enlarged.*

### IN THE NAME OF THE QUEEN!

THE Governor-General of Netherlands India, with the advice and consent of the Council of Netherlands India, sends greeting,

To all who shall see this or hear read:  
and makes known:

Whereas He has found it expedient to enact special provisions having for their purpose the prevention of the introduction and spread of Plague;

Having considered Articles 20, 29, 31, and 33 of the Regulations for the Administration of the Government of Netherlands India:

Has approved and enacted the following:—

### § 1. REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE PLAGUE IN NETHERLANDS INDIA.

#### Article 1.

To prevent the introduction of Plague into Netherlands India, besides the regulations of the Epidemic Ordinance in as far as these can be brought in accordance therewith, the following special stipulations are applicable.

#### Article 2.

Every medical officer is bound, as soon as a case of Plague has been discovered by him, to report same immediately to the chief local authority.

#### Article 3.

1. As soon as the chief local authority receives information that one or more cases of Plague have occurred in his district, he is to immediately report same, if possible telegraphically, to the Director of Education, Religion, and Industry.

2. This communication should also mention the place or district where, and the date when, the first case or cases of Plague occurred, also the number of persons attacked and the mortality; and further, whether only persons who have come from other places have been attacked by the disease, or whether Plague has occurred amongst persons, who, during the last five days, had not been absent from the place.

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#### Article 4.

After the first communication, referred to in Article 3, the Chief of the Residency must forward a weekly statement to the Director of Education, Religion, and Industry, containing, besides particulars of the number of persons attacked and the mortality, also the date (if such had not been previously mentioned) on which the first case or cases of Plague had been noticed amongst those persons, who, during the last five days, had not absented themselves from the place; further, in detail, the precautions taken to prevent the spread of this disease, as also the prophylactic measures, with regard to sanitary investigation, isolation, and disinfection.

#### Article 5.

1. A town or district will be declared infected by Plague by the Chief of the Residency whenever three or more persons, who had not absented themselves from the place during the last five days, have been attacked by this disease.

2. The declaration of infection will be withdrawn by the Chief of the Residency whenever no fresh case of Plague has occurred during five days after the recovery or death of the last-Plague patient.

#### Article 6.

1. The Chief of the Residency immediately gives notice, if possible telegraphically, to the Director of Education, Religion, and Industry, of the declaration of infection by Plague, and the withdrawal of that declaration.

2. At the same time, the Chief of the Residency must as far as possible take measures to make public the declaration in his Residency.

3. The Director of Education, Religion, and Industry advertises the declaration of infection and the withdrawal thereof in the *Government Gazette*, and informs the Chief of the Residency, if possible telegraphically, that such has been done. When it refers to a seaport or a district situated on the sea coast, the advertising will take place after consultation with the Chief of the Medical Service.

#### Article 7.

1. The Director of Education, Religion, and Industry conveys to the Governor-General and the Consular representatives of Foreign countries at Batavia all information referred to in Articles 3 and 4, and advises them of the declaration of infection or withdrawal of same.

2. The information referred to in Article 3, will be conveyed telegraphically, while that referred to in Article 4, together with the declaration of infection and withdrawal thereof, will be conveyed in writing, by the Governor-General to the Government of the States signatory to the Sanitary Convention of Venice, who are not represented at Batavia, if possible through the intermediary of Her Majesty's representatives accredited to these Governments.

## Article 8.

1. The following goods may not be exported from places or districts, neither can they be transhipped at seaports, which have been declared infected by Plague:

- (a) Wearing apparel and worn clothing, carpets, as also used bedclothes and used embroidery.  
The wearing apparel, &c., mentioned above includes all clothing left by deceased soldiers and sailors, which is being forwarded to their heirs.
- (b) Rags and tatters, not even excepting those which are pressed together by hydraulic power, and are conveyed as merchandise in bales.
- (c) Used bags.
- (d) Untanned hides, including hides that have been salted or cured by arsenic.
- (e) Fresh animal offal, hoofs, manes, bristles, animal hair in general, and raw wool.
- (f) Human hair.
- (g) Pigs and pork.

2. From the prohibition regarding export and transhipment contained in the preceding paragraph are exempted:—

- (a) Goods as mentioned in sub. (a) of the preceding paragraph, when they are conveyed as luggage or, in consequence of a change of residence, and have been disinfected according to the stipulations referred to in Article 33 of the Epidemic Ordinance.
- (b) Goods as specified in Article 9, letter (c).

## Article 9.

The import into other portions of Netherlands India, of the goods referred to in Article 8, first paragraph, from places or districts which have been declared infected by Plague, is prohibited, except in the following cases:—

- (a) Whenever wearing apparel or worn clothing, carpets, as also used bedclothes, and used embroidery are conveyed as luggage or in consequence of a change of residence, in which case they may be imported after having been disinfected in accordance with the regulations referred to in Article 33 of the Epidemic Ordinance.
- (b) Whenever the goods have left a place or district, at least five days before the date on which, according to the declaration of infection, it is considered that such place or district has been infected with Plague.
- (c) Whenever they come from a place or district not declared infected by Plague, and are packed in such a manner that in case of conveyance through, or transhipment at, territory infected, no infection could have taken place by contact.

## Article 10.

1. The chief local authority is authorized, after having taken medical advice, to isolate one or more dwellings in which cases of Plague have occurred, or are still occurring, by means of a cordon of guards or otherwise. The adjacent dwellings may also be included in this isolation.

2. By isolation it is understood that nobody is allowed to enter the infected sphere, with the exception of those who, in their official capacity, are appointed or authorized to do so, or have obtained permission to do so from the chief local authority, and that no person in the isolated sphere may pass the boundary thereof until after having submitted to the regulations which have been found necessary by the competent medical authority.

3. The conveyance of goods and provisions out of the isolated sphere is prohibited.

## Article 11.

1. Houses, sheds, and ships or boats in which cases of Plague have occurred can, in urgent cases, by order of the chief local authority, after obtaining medical advice, be burnt after compensation or expropriation, in accordance with the stipulations laid down in Articles 25, 26, 27, and 28 of the Epidemic Ordinance.

2. This regulation will only be applied to isolated cases of Plague, and only if, through the isolated position of such houses and sheds, there is sufficient guarantee that burning can thoroughly prevent the spread of infectious germs.

## Article 12.

1. The chief local authority is authorized, after obtaining medical advice, to transport persons suffering from Plague or showing symptoms which lead one to suspect Plague, and all those who have been in contact with such persons, to a separate establishment for treatment, to cause the dwelling or dwellings in which such patients were living (and if necessary also the adjacent buildings and plots of ground) to be evacuated by the remaining occupants; these last being kept separate from the sick and put under observation for five days in a special establishment.

2. The conveyance of the persons referred to in paragraph 1 is conducted with strict observance of the stipulations prescribed in Article 31 of the Epidemic Ordinance.

3. Persons not found sick will not be conveyed to the isolation establishments until they themselves, their wearing apparel, and everything they take with them, have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, while they will also have the opportunity afforded them of having themselves treated with anti-plague serum.

4. If necessary the chief local authority will provide board, treatment, and burial of those isolated. The cost must be refunded to the Government by the patients themselves or their heirs (except in the case of those in necessitous circumstances), in accordance with a tariff fixed by the Director of Education, Religion, and Industry.

5. After evacuation, the dwellings and everything found therein, must be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected or burnt, in accordance with the regulations for disinfection referred to in Article 33 of the Epidemic Ordinance.

## Article 13.

The buildings situated in the vicinity of evacuated dwellings must be inspected for a month, if possible daily, by a medical officer, who at once reports all new cases of Plague to the chief local authority, who obtains for him free access to those buildings for purposes of inspection.

## Article 14.

1. At seaports which have been declared infected by Plague, no passengers may be allowed to embark with the intention of being conveyed by sea to a place either in or out of Netherlands India, unless they have been previously medically examined and found free from symptoms of Plague.

2. The medical inspection takes place at the request of the master, owner, or agents of the ship, by day, on shore, as shortly as possible before the embarkation; all the passengers to be examined must be present at a place and hour to be stated by the chief local authority to the applicant for the inspection.

3. The inspection at Batavia and Padang is conducted by the medical officer referred to in Article 16 of the Ordinance of 26th October, 1898 (*Government Gazette* No. 294), and at other places by the medical officer, charged with the medical inspection referred to in Article 15, para. 1, sub-letters (a), (b), and (c) of the Quarantine Ordinance, or in case of the absence of such medical officer, by a medical officer, if possible, European, appointed by the chief local authority.

4. The Consular representative of the country to which the ship belongs can be present at the inspection.

## Article 15.

1. Whenever, for the same vessel, there are more than twenty passengers to be inspected, in accordance with the foregoing Article, a fee of 1f. (One Guilder) is due to the Government for each medically-inspected passenger.

2. The master, owner, and agent are severally held responsible for the payment of this fee.

## Article 16.

1. For each passenger inspected by him, a payment of 1f. is made from the Government Treasury to the inspecting officer, referred to in Article 14, with a minimum of 10f. (Ten Guilders) for European, and 3f. (Three Guilders) for Native medical officers, in case the passengers to be inspected number less than ten and three respectively.

2. Whenever his residence is at a distance of more than 6 paaal from the place appointed for the inspection, the medical officer referred to in the preceding paragraph is also allowed travelling and boarding expenses in accordance with the stipulations of the Ordinance of 20th December, 1887 (*Government Gazette* No. 241), and 12th October, 1894 (*Government Gazette* No. 215).

## Article 17.

Articles 14, 15, and 16 are not applicable to pilgrim ships as referred to in the Ordinance of 26th October, 1898 (*Government Gazette* No. 294), in the port from which they start the voyage bound to a port situated outside Netherlands India.

## § 2. REGULATIONS CONCERNING PLAGUE OUTSIDE OF NETHERLANDS INDIA.

## Article 18.

Besides the Quarantine Ordinance (as far as this is in accordance with the regulations to be mentioned hereafter) the following special regulations have reference to outbreaks of Plague in places outside of Netherlands India.

## Article 19.

1. A seaport or district outside of Netherlands India, can be declared by the Governor-General to be infected by Plague whenever it has been officially reported that

three or more persons in that port or district, who have not been absent therefrom for five days previously, have been attacked by Plague.

2. The declaration of infection must be confined to the sphere infected (by which is meant a portion of the territory under supervision of a well defined administrative authority, for example, a province, an island, a town, a port), provided the Government of the infected territory takes the necessary measures to prevent the export from that sphere, of articles which are likely to spread infection.

3. The declaration of infection will be withdrawn as soon as it has been officially reported that at least five days have elapsed since the recovery or death of the last Plague patient, and provided the necessary measures for disinfection have been carried out, or when it refers to a port in Southern China, as soon as the Consular official concerned has declared that to the best of his knowledge the port has been free from Plague during the preceding five days.

4. In special cases, a longer term than five days for the withdrawal of the declaration of infection may be applied, but only when it concerns a State which has not signed the Convention of Venice.

#### Article 20.

1. The declaration of infection and the withdrawal thereof will be advertised in the *Government Gazette* on behalf of the Governor-General as soon as possible and communicated, if possible, telegraphically, to the Dutch Consular official of the place infected, or within whose district the infected place is situated, and those Chiefs of Residences and those Harbor Masters to whom it may be of importance to receive a prompt notification of same.

2. That communication must at the same time be made to the Consular representative of the country declared infected residing at Batavia, or in case it concerns a State signatory to the Convention of Venice, which has no representative at Batavia, if possible telegraphically, through the intermediacy of Her Majesty's representative to that country or to that of the foreign colony concerned.

#### Article 21.

The regulations of the Quarantine Ordinance and the stipulations of this Ordinance are applicable to all ships arriving in the roadstead or harbor of a Netherlands Indian port or anchoring there after arrival:—

(a) if they, having had no Plague cases on board, and no great mortality amongst the rats, have touched at ports on their voyage, or come from ports which at the time of their departure were declared infected with Plague, and have not yet undergone the prescribed medical inspection in a Netherlands Indian port and been granted free pratique.

These ships must hold no communication with the shore and with other vessels until five days have elapsed since their departure from the last infected port.

They are, however, granted free pratique—

1st. If they, in the roadstead of the infected port, have voluntarily gone into quarantine, that is to say, only landed passengers, discharged mails and cargo or taken in mails, without the ship having had communication with the shore, and the remaining passengers and crew with the inhabitants of the port, which voluntary action must be confirmed by a declaration on oath made by the Master.

2nd. If on arrival the declaration of infection of the port referred to has already been withdrawn or is withdrawn after arrival.

(b) Whenever Plague has occurred on board during the last voyage or the disease breaks out on board while the ship is at anchor in the roads.

In this case, the ship must hold no communication with the shore and with other vessels until seven days have elapsed after the recovery or death of the last Plague patient on board.

(c) When the ship has, at a port or ports outside of Netherlands India, taken persons or goods on board who, within a shorter period than seven days, have left a place declared infected with Plague or have come from a ship on board of which Plague has occurred, and seven days have not yet elapsed since the recovery or death of the last Plague patient on board.

Such vessel will only be granted free pratique after five days have elapsed since the embarkation of said passengers or goods.

If in the cases referred to sub. (b) and (c), a great mortality has taken place among the rats on board, a period of ten days must be allowed to elapse, during which time all possible endeavours must be made to destroy the rats on board.

#### Article 22.

Ships destined for Palembang, Bajoenglentjir, or Djambi, which, according to the stipulations of Article 21, are bound to remain some time without communication with the shore, may not enter those ports until after having undergone the prescribed medical inspection either at Muntok or at Tandjong Pinang at their option, and are granted free pratique at those ports.

#### Article 23.

1. As long as free pratique is withheld, the permission referred to in Article 22 of the Quarantine Ordinance to the passengers and crew to go ashore without hindrance, will not be granted by the authority charged with the medical inspection.

2. Those of the crew, who, on medical inspection, are found suffering from Plague or show symptoms, which give reason to suspect a case of Plague, will be isolated and treated on shore in accordance with the stipulations of Articles 23, 24, and 25 of the Quarantine Ordinance. The remainder of the crew must stay on board, and must as far as possible be inspected daily by the authority charged with the medical inspection.

3. Only after the period of prohibition of communication with the shore, and with other vessels has expired, will permission be granted to haul down the yellow flag after disinfection has taken place in accordance with Article 20 of the Quarantine Ordinance.

#### Article 23A.

1. During the term of prohibition of communication with the shore as mentioned in Article 21, the Harbor Master is authorized to grant permission for the loading and discharging of petroleum, with the assistance of tubes and pipes, into and from tank vessels, and for the taking in of coal, such with due observance of the following conditions:—

(a) That at the medical inspection it was ascertained that there were no Plague patients on board.

(b) That labourers from shore may only be allowed to work on board provided a thorough supervision of the work can be kept on board, and all communication with the passengers and crew can be prevented.

(c) That all shore labourers and their wearing apparel shall be disinfected after the work is finished, as also all implements used in connexion with the work in so far as they do not belong to the ship.

(d) That no objection is raised by the Harbor Master in view of the danger of infection to the berth that the vessel must take up for discharging or loading oil or for the taking in of coal, and that such berth is distant at least 50 metres from the shore or jetty.

2. The loading and discharging of petroleum or the taking in of coal, can take place during the night, provided the place of working can be sufficiently lighted.

#### Article 23B.

1. Permission can be given by the Harbor Master to vessels, which, in accordance with the stipulations of Art. 21, sub-letter (a), are not granted free pratique, to discharge their passengers and cargo, with the exception of those articles of which the import has been prohibited, into discharging vessels (lighters) kept in readiness, and such with due observance of the following regulations:—

1st. That the discharging vessels (lighters), the passengers and cargo thereof are brought to a place, appointed by the Harbor Master in consultation with the Chief of the Residency and the authority charged with the medical inspection, and which must be situated at a distance of at least 100 metres from shore, remain without communication therewith, and other vessels until five days have elapsed after the departure from the last infected port of the ship from which they loaded cargo.

2nd. That the passengers and crew of the lighters, after expiry of the aforesaid five days, must be daily inspected for a similar period by the authority charged with the medical examination.

3rd. That the crew of the lighters be chosen by preference from members of one and the same company (kongste).

4th. That the necessary precautions are taken to prevent the rats from the ship getting on board the lighters.

2. Paragraph 1 of this Article is only applicable to ships in the roads of Sabang (Achin and Dependencies) arriving from Calcutta and Rangoon.

3. The Governor-General is empowered to make paragraph 1 of this Article also applicable to ships other than those mentioned in paragraph 2.

#### Article 23c.

1. At Sabang (Achin and Dependencies), permission can be granted by the Harbor Master to ships which, in accordance with the stipulations of Article 21, are not granted free pratique to take up a berth at a distance of 2 metres from the jetty, provided:—

1st. From the medical and bacteriological examination undertaken by the authority in charge of the medical inspection, and from a sworn declaration of the ship's surgeon, or in the absence of same, of the master, it appears:

- (a) That the ship, neither before her departure from the last infected port nor during her voyage from that port to Sabang, nor in the roads there, had any cases of Plague on board.
- (b) That no plague-infected rats have been discovered on board.
- (c) That no extraordinary mortality has been observed amongst the rats on board.

2nd. No deck passengers or pilgrims are on board.

2. This permission will be granted subject to the following conditions:—

- 1st. All hatches of the vessel, with the exception of those required for the loading of coal, must be closed before the vessel proceeds to the jetty, and may only be opened after the departure of the ship.
- 2nd. The stay of the vessel at the jetty may not last longer than is strictly necessary in the judgment of the Harbor Master.
- 3rd. Neither the passengers and crew nor the cargo, nor the loading gear belonging to the ship may have communication with the shore.
- 4th. The ship may only have communication with the shore by means of hawsers and chains necessary for mooring the ship, and these must be fitted with rat-shields having a diameter of about 2 metres, similar to the pattern prescribed by the Director of Education, Religion, and Industry, and deposited with the Harbor Master, who shall prescribe the manner in which these shields must be fixed to the hawsers and chains.
- 5th. The emplacement on shore from which the coals are loaded must, in the judgment of the authority charged with the medical examination, be sufficiently partitioned off from its surroundings by a fence, movable if preferred, of so called wire netting, at least 2 metres high, and of such mesh that no rats or mice can go through it.
- 6th. Shore labourers may be used for the loading of coal whenever it is absolutely necessary, and by thorough supervision, in the judgment of the authority charged with the medical examination, all contact with the crew can be entirely avoided.
- 7th. After the work is finished, the shore labourers, their wearing apparel, and the tools used must be disinfected. This disinfection must take place inside the fence mentioned in sub. 5.

3. The loading of coal can also take place at night, provided the place of work is, in the judgment of the Harbor Master, sufficiently lighted.

#### Article 24.

1. Whenever, on board a ship, falling under one of the categories referred to in Article 21, on or after arrival many cases of Plague occur, or owing to other special circumstances, as, for example, the over-crowding of emigrant ships, the danger of infection for the healthy passengers and members of the crew is great, opportunity must be given to the healthy passengers and crew after consultation with the authority charged with the medical inspection to disembark at a place where they can remain isolated during the quarantine period, and also be shut off from communication with the ship.

2. In special cases, permission to disembark in a similar manner can also be granted to the passengers and crews of vessels on board of which no cases of plague have occurred, should these vessels be so over-crowded with emigrants or other passengers that, in the opinion of the authority charged with the medical inspection, a somewhat lengthy detention in quarantine on board would be dangerous to health.

3. The isolation of the crew and passengers includes that nobody may enter the appointed place of quarantine with the exception of those who, in their official capacity, are appointed or authorized to do so, or have obtained

permission from the chief local authority for the purpose. The chief local authority will take measures to insure the rigorous enforcement of the conditions of isolation.

4. The authority charged with the medical inspection or a physician specially appointed for this purpose, inspects, as far as possible, daily, all temporarily disembarked persons.

5. The chief local authority takes measures for housing and at the same time for transport, treatment and boarding of the persons temporarily disembarked. The expense hereof must be borne, as far as the crew is concerned, by the ship, and as far as the other passengers are concerned, by themselves or their heirs, payment being made in accordance with a tariff fixed by the Governor-General.

6. Destitute passengers will be conveyed and nursed at Government expense.

#### Article 25.

Ships on board of which Plague has occurred or broken out, finding themselves at ports where there is no establishment for the treatment of Plague patients with sufficient precautions against the spread of the disease, are bound, when ordered by the authority referred to in Article 11 of the Quarantine Ordinance, to proceed to an anchorage appointed elsewhere, where a quarantine station has been provided for the isolation of the sick and passengers and crew. They are bound to remain there till such time as free pratique has been granted.

#### Article 26.

Except in cases and under the circumstances mentioned in Article 9, all goods mentioned under letters (a) to (f) of the first paragraph of Article 8 may not be imported into Netherlands India, if they originate from a port or district declared infected with Plague, or have been loaded or transhipped there.

#### Article 27.

1. Whenever the master of a vessel falling under one of the categories referred to by Article 21, refuses to submit to the stipulations of this Ordinance, or to the orders given him by the competent authority, he is at liberty to proceed to sea.

2. Previous to this, he can be authorized by the authority charged with the medical inspection, to discharge his merchandise, with the exception of that of which the import is prohibited, after the necessary precautions have been taken, such as: Isolation of the vessel with passengers and crew, discharge of the bilge water after it has been disinfected, and the replacing of the drinking water on board with pure water from the shore.

3. The passengers who declare their preference therefor can be given the opportunity by the last-named authority to disembark with their luggage, but only when there is an establishment on shore, in the judgment of the chief local authority, in which they can be isolated in accordance with Article 24, for so long as free pratique has not been granted.

### §3. CONCLUDING AND PUNISHMENT REGULATIONS.

#### Article 28.

In case of difference of opinion as to whether goods may be considered to fall under the application of Articles 8, 9, or 26, the chief local authority shall decide, and his decision shall be final.

#### Article 29.

The violation of Article 2 will be punished by a fine of from Ten to one hundred guilders, or, as far as regards Europeans and those assimilated thereto, with imprisonment, and as regards natives and those assimilated thereto, with imprisonment with hard labour for from 3 to 8 days.

#### Article 30.

1. Trespasses against one of the prohibitive measures of Articles 8, 9, or 26, shall be punished, as far as Europeans and those assimilated thereto are concerned, with imprisonment, and as regards natives and those assimilated thereto with simple imprisonment with hard labour for from 14 days to one year, or a fine of from Twenty-five to five hundred guilders.

2. The destruction of goods imported, exported, or transhipped in contravention of the prohibitive measures can be ordered by judgment even when acquittal takes place.

#### Article 31.

The master of a vessel who permits passengers to be embarked in contravention of Article 14 will be punished by a fine of from One hundred and ten to five hundred and fifty guilders for each person thus embarked.

#### Article 32.

Any one who obstructs or opposes the carrying out of the stipulations of this Ordinance will be punished, as

far as Europeans or those assimilated thereto are concerned, with imprisonment, and natives or those assimilated thereto with simple imprisonment, with hard labour, from one month to two years, and a fine of from One hundred to two thousand guilders, together or separately.

## Article 33.

For the due observance of the commands given, in terms of the Ordinance and for the guarding of the isolated places or isolated establishments, the chief local authority may call in the help, if necessary, of the Naval or Military authorities.

## Article 34.

The coming into force of this Ordinance cancels the Ordinances of 3rd December, 1898 (*Government Gazette* No. 329), and 22nd April, 1901 (*Government Gazette* No. 174).

## Article 35.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Plague Ordinance."
2. It takes effect on the 28th of February, 1902.

## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act for the incorporation of an Association called the Municipal Association of Victoria."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven, and in the seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

## The Marine Act 1890.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

## ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

Every candidate for a certificate of competency for the grade of master or mate of a foreign-going ship, or of a home-trade ship exceeding 100 tons gross registered tonnage, in addition to the present requirements of the Regulations respecting the International Code of Signals, will be required to satisfy the examiner that he knows both the Morse and the British Movable Semaphore Alphabets, and that he has a good working knowledge of the *British Signal Manual* prescribed for facilitating communication between British war-ships and vessels of the British Mercantile Marine.

This Regulation shall form portion of *The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates*, made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1903, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1908.

The foregoing additional Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this ninth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven.

## Marine Act 1890.

## REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 133 of the *Marine Act 1890*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

The following Regulation shall form portion of and be read as Article 9 of the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, made by the Board on the 16th day of February, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of April, 1900, and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1907, on which date Article numbered 10 of the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, contained in the First Part of the Sixth Schedule to the *Marine Act 1890*, shall be annulled:—

## NEW REGULATION.

ARTICLE 9.—Fishing vessels and fishing boats, when under way, and when not required by this Article to carry or show the lights hereinafter specified, shall carry or show the lights prescribed for vessels of their tonnage under way:—

- (a) Open boats, by which is to be understood boats not protected from the entry of sea water by means of a continuous deck, when engaged in any fishing at night with outlying tackle extending not more than 150 feet horizontally from the boat into the seaway, shall carry one all-round white light.

Open boats, when fishing at night with outlying tackle extending more than 150 feet horizontally from the boat into the seaway, shall carry one all-round white light, and, in addition, on approaching or being approached by other vessels, shall show a second white light at least 3 feet below the first light, and at a horizontal distance of at least 5 feet away from it in the direction in which the outlying tackle is attached.

- (b) Vessels and boats, except open boats, as defined in subdivision (a), when fishing with drift nets, shall, so long as the nets are wholly or partly in the water, carry two white lights where they can best be seen. Such lights shall be placed so that the vertical distance between them shall be not less than 6 feet and not more than 15 feet, and so that the horizontal distance between them, measured in a line with the keel, shall be not less than 5 feet and not more than 10 feet. The lower of these two lights shall be in the direction of the nets, and both of them shall be of such a character as to show all round the horizon, and to be visible at a distance of not less than 3 miles.

- (c) Vessels and boats, except open boats, as defined in subdivision (a), when line-fishing with their lines out and attached to or hauling their lines, and when not at anchor or stationary within the meaning of subdivision (h), shall carry the same lights as vessels fishing with drift-nets. When shooting lines, or fishing with towing lines, they shall carry the lights prescribed for a steam or sailing vessel under way respectively.

- (d) Vessels when engaged in trawling, by which is meant the dragging of an apparatus along the bottom of the sea:—

1. If steam-vessels, shall carry, in the same position as the white light mentioned in Article 2 (a), a tri-coloured lantern, so constructed and fixed as to show a white light from right ahead to two points, on each bow, and a green light and a red light over an arc of the horizon, from two points on each bow to two points abaft the beam on the starboard and port sides respectively; and not less than 6 nor more than 12 feet below the tri-coloured lantern, a white light in a lantern, so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon.

2. If sailing vessels, shall carry a white light in a lantern, so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon, and shall also, on the approach of or to other vessels, show, where it can best be seen, a white flare-up light or torch in sufficient time to prevent collision.

All lights mentioned in subdivision (d) 1 and 2 shall be visible at a distance of at least 2 miles.

- (e) Oyster dredgers and other vessels fishing with dredge-nets shall carry and show the same lights as trawlers.

- (f) Fishing vessels and fishing boats may at any time use a flare-up light in addition to the lights which they are by this Article required to carry and show, and they may also use working lights.

- (g) Every fishing vessel and every fishing boat under 150 feet in length, when at anchor, shall exhibit a white light, visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile.

Every fishing vessel of 150 feet in length or upwards, when at anchor, shall exhibit a white light, visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile, and shall exhibit a second light as provided for vessels of such length by Article 11.

Should any such vessel, whether under 150 feet in length or of 150 feet in length or upwards, be attached to a net or other fishing gear, she shall, on the approach of other vessels, show an additional white light at least 3 feet below the anchor light, and at a horizontal distance of at least 5 feet away from it in the direction of the net or gear.

- (h) If a vessel or boat when fishing becomes stationary in consequence of her gear getting fast to a rock or other obstruction, she shall, in daytime, haul down the day-signal required by subdivision (k); at night, show the light or lights prescribed for a vessel at anchor; and, during fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rainstorms, make the signal prescribed for a vessel at anchor. (See subdivision d, and the last paragraph of Article 15.)

- (i) In fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rainstorms, drift-net vessels attached to their nets, and vessels when trawling, dredging, or fishing with any kind of drag-net, and vessels line fishing with their lines out, shall, if of 20 tons gross tonnage or upwards, respectively, at intervals of not more than one minute, make a blast; if steam-vessels, with the whistle or syren, and, if sailing vessels with the foghorn; each blast to be followed by ringing the bell. Fishing vessels and boats of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned signals; but, if they do not, they shall make some other efficient sound signal at intervals of not more than one minute.

- (k) All vessels or boats fishing with nets, or lines, or trawls, when under way, shall, in daytime, indicate their occupation to an approaching vessel by displaying a basket or other efficient signal where it can best be seen. If vessels or boats at anchor have their gear out, they shall, on the approach of other vessels, show the same signal on the side on which those vessels can pass.

The vessels required by this Article to carry or show the lights hereinbefore specified shall not be obliged to carry the lights prescribed by Article 4 (a), and the last paragraph of Article 11.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this ninth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven.

4. Determine the proportion in which such divisions of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the waterworks constructed wholly or partly for the benefit of such divisions respectively.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of September, 1906, the Waterworks District of the Carrum Waterworks Trust was divided into divisions for rating purposes:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated this 27th day of August, 1907, the aforesaid Order in Council of the 11th day of September, 1906, was repealed:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to further divide the Waterworks District of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust into divisions for rating purposes:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the Waterworks District of the said Carrum Waterworks Trust shall be divided into the following four divisions, that is to say:—

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Orders made on the 27th day of August, 1907, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petitions of the Councils of the Municipalities of the Cities of Ballaarat, Bendigo, Footscray, and South Melbourne, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the election of Councillors for the Municipalities of the said Cities respectively, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the officials to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerks respectively of the said Cities.

And His Excellency, by the Orders hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

1. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* as applied to Municipal Elections, viz:—

All Justices of the Peace, All Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire, All Municipal Clerks, All Clerks of Courts, All Head-masters of State Schools, And every member of the Police Force,	} throughout the State of Victoria.
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2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

The above-mentioned Orders are in lieu of the Orders in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th, the 16th, and the 18th August, 1905.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on

any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein:

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb any tree, or climb upon or get over or through any fences, or interfere with, damage, or destroy any tree, plant, property, or any thing whatsoever in the Reserve.

4. No person shall place in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment

shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or in any building erected therein.

6. No person shall engage in any game or sport, or in dancing in the Reserve, or use the bicycle track therein on Sundays.

7. All dogs, except as hereinafter provided, and all goats and poultry found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

8. No person shall paint or otherwise display advertisements on the fences or any other structure upon the Reserve, nor upon any tree growing therein.

9. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the Reserve, and every club, association, or person renting the Reserve for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or bicycle races, or holiday amusements, shall be required to enforce the provisions of the *Sports Betting Suppression Act 1901* for the prohibition of betting in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve on such days as fees of admission thereto are charged as provided herein.

12. No person shall play football, cricket, or any other game in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only on such place or places as may be first approved of and pointed out or fixed.

13. No person shall remove or carry away from the Reserve any soil, gravel, earth, or sand, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. All moneys derived from the sale of such soil, gravel, earth, or sand, shall be expended in the improvement of the Reserve.

14. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or holiday amusements, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated plot within the Reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered, on demand, to the gatekeeper, or other person duly authorized to collect tickets.

15. Any person being drunk, or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee of Management to keep order, for the time being, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at \_\_\_\_\_," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day: and a copy of those conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
