CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AS MASTERS, MATES, OR ENGINEERS ON BOARD BRITISH SHIPS.

SIR,

With reference to Lord Knutsford's Circular despatch of the 31st of August, 1891, and to Mr. Lyttelton's Circular despatch of the 7th of February, 1905, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, two copies of an Order of the King in Council* issued under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, amending the Order in Council of the 9th of May, 1891, issued in pursuance of the *Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869*, with regard to the Colonial authorities competent to grant certificates of competency to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships.

*Order in Council, 22nd October, 1906.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 22nd day of October, 1906.

WHEREAS by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* it is (amongst other things) enacted that where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the examination of and grant of certificates of competency to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade report to His Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient with the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said

Act, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner, His Majesty may, by Order in Council—

1. Declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Act;
2. Declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Act which relate to certificates of competency granted under that Act shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order;
3. Impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the said certificates and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof as His Majesty may think fit, and impose penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regulations:

And that upon the publication in the *London Gazette* of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid the Order shall, as from the date of the publication or any later date mentioned in the Order, take effect as if it were enacted by Parliament:

And whereas at the coming into operation of the said *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, there were in force the Orders in Council of the 9th day of May, 1891, and the 23rd day of November, 1893, hereinafter mentioned, being Orders in Council made under enactments repealed by the said *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and it was provided by the said *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* that Orders in Council so made should remain in force as if made or granted under the said *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*:

And whereas by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* it is further provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order in Council made under the *Merchant Shipping Acts*:

And whereas by the said Order in Council of the 9th day of May, 1891, it was declared, *inter alia*, that Colonial certificates of competency granted by certain authorities therein named and described in the case of the several British Possessions therein mentioned to persons intending to act as therein mentioned on board British ships should be of the same force as if they had been granted under the Acts relating to merchant shipping:

And whereas by the said Order last mentioned the regulations set out in the Schedule A thereto with respect to the said Colonial certificates of competency were imposed and made, and it was declared that the regulations set out in the said Schedule A thereto should apply to all Colonial certificates of competency that might theretofore have been or should thereafter be granted:

And whereas by the said Order in Council of the 23rd day of November, 1893, it was declared that Colonial certificates of competency granted by the Marine Board of Victoria from and after the 21st day of December, 1888, as therein mentioned should be of the same force as if they had been granted under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and should be subject to the same conditions and regulations as set out in Schedule A to the said Order in Council of the 9th day of May, 1891:

And whereas by the provisions of the *Navigation (Amendment) Act 1899* passed by the Legislature of New South Wales, and by the provisions of the *Shipping and Seamen Act 1903* passed by the Legislature of New Zealand, certain changes were made in the authorities authorized by the said Legislatures respectively to grant Colonial certificates of competency in those Possessions respectively, and other similar changes may be made by the Legislature of the British Possessions referred to in the said Orders in Council with regard to the authorities authorized to grant such certificates in such several Possessions:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient that the said Orders in Council should be so altered as to apply to certificates of competency granted by the proper authority for the time being in the British Possessions mentioned in the said Orders in Council:

Now therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of His Privy Council, is hereby pleased—

To declare that the Colonial certificates of competency granted or to be hereafter granted by the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, Head of the Government, Minister, Board, Body, or Corporation of or in any British Possession mentioned in the said Orders in Council for the time being authorized by the Legislature or Legislative Authority of such Possession to grant Colonial certificates of competency (hereinafter called "the proper authority") from and after the respective dates in the case of the several Possessions with reference to the several kinds of certificate in the said Orders in Council mentioned shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and shall be subject to the same conditions and regulations as are set out in Schedule A to the said Order in Council of the 9th day of May, 1891, and the said Orders in Council shall be read and construed as if the proper authority had been originally mentioned therein in the case of each such Possession in lieu of the authority in each case actually named and described therein.

FOOD AND LIQUOR INSPECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. - (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Kerang, the office of the Municipality of Swan Hill at Swan Hill, and the Post Office at Goschen, a rate of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan, a rate of One shilling and four and one-half pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

To the Court of Disputed Returns.

THE petition of THOMAS KENNEDY, of Cobram, in the State of Victoria, farmer, respectfully sheweth:-

1. That your petitioner was a duly nominated candidate at the election on the twelfth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and six, for the Division of Echuca for the House of Representatives for the Commonwealth of Australia, the other candidate, who on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and six, was declared by the Returning Officer duly elected for such division being Albert Clayton Palmer, of Euroa, flour miller.

2. That the said Returning Officer so declared that your petitioner had received 7,624 votes, the said Albert Clayton Palmer 7,656 votes, and that there were 867 informal votes.

3. That at such election several persons who were qualified to vote thereat were not permitted to do so.

4. That ballot-papers were improperly rejected by the Returning and Presiding Officers.

5. That ballot-papers which were informal were improperly admitted and counted by such Returning and Presiding Officers.

6. That contrary to section 148 of the Electoral Act, Presiding Officers permitted other than themselves to assist an incapable voter.

7. That voters were so unduly delayed by the Presiding Officers that they were unable to vote.

8. That persons who improperly influenced voters were allowed by Presiding Officers in the polling booth.

9. That certain persons were allowed to vote twice at such election.

10. That Presiding Officers improperly influenced voters, and permitted voters to vote other than as in section 147 of the Electoral Act.

11. That the Returning Officer illegally and in spite of the application of the petitioner under section 164A of the Act, permitted a recount only of part of the ballot-papers.

12. That several persons were unable to vote owing to no polling being held at the appointed polling places.

13. That several postal ballot-papers were wrongly and improperly admitted as votes in the scrutiny at such election.

14. That your petitioner claims that he had a lawful majority of votes, and that he, and not the said Albert Clayton Palmer, should have been declared and returned as the lawfully elected member at such election.

15. That there were generally such undue influence, illegal practices, irregularities, and illegalities tending to benefit the said Albert Clayton Palmer at such election as are sufficient to void such election.
