No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, and the particulars required in the "order form" given, and an order obtained, when the Trustees will cause all graves to be dug or re-opened, as the case may be; but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees.

8. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give same.

9. Applications for interment shall be made to the Secretary as early as possible.

10. The hours for burial shall be: on week days, from September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery, without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace; such certificate shall be delivered up to the gate-keeper or sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

13. That every person dressing, attending, digging graves, or doing any other work within the cemetery shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—

First—That no rubbish, clay, or other material re-

First—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing, attending, digging, or reopening graves shall be placed on any grave, and when placed on any adjoining ground, or path, shall be removed immediately after interment or completion of work.

Second—That all refuse and other material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once, by, or at the expense of the person causing same, and if the ground is in any way cut up the same shall be neatly levelled off, and left in the same order as before. Third—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for dressing graves, or any other purposes, without permission from the Trustees.

- 9. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
- 10. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan to the Trustees.
- 11. No servant or other person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof unless he has special authority from the Trustees.
- 12. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.
- 13. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.
- 14. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.
- 15. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.
- 16. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of
- 17. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on a certificate of minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

20. No re-interment or removal from another Cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister authorized in that behalf.

21. That no interment shall be permitted in any private 21. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

22. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the decensed person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds fifty but

shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds seventyfive, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

For all butter factories, the sum of One pound.

Meat Supervision Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE BRANDING OF CARCASSES OR MEAT.

THE Board of Public Health in and for the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, doth hereby repeal all Regulations hitherto made for the Branding of Carcasses or Meat, and doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

owing Regulations, that is to say:—
(1) These Regulations shall apply to the Metropolitan
Meat Area, the Geelong Meat Area, and the
Warrnambool Meat Area, and to any other Meat
Area which may hereafter be constituted under
the Meat Supervision Acts.

(2) Carcasses or meat, whether fresh, frozen, dried, preserved, or chilled, when passed and certified as fit for human consumption, shall be branded by means of a heated appliance with a legibly seared brand or mark, which shall include letters indicating the name of the Municipal Council or other body under whose authority the said carcasses or meat have been passed and certified

The letters of the brand shall be in the form of Roman capitals not less than one-quarter of an inch in height.

- (3) Where the whole of the animal, including its viscera, has been examined, the brand or mark shall be in the form of a circle not less than 1½ inches in diameter. The outline of the circle shall be broken at fifteen places evenly distributed, and the letters shall be arranged within the circle in two parallel lines, the first or first two letters forming the upper line and the rest forming the lower line as shown hereunder.
- (4) Where only the carcass of an animal without its viscera or only a part of a carcass has been examined the brand shall be in the form of a T of which the horizontal line shall be not less than one and a quarter inches long and the vertical line not less than five-eighths of an inch long. The outline of the T shall be broken in six places as evenly distributed as practicable, and the letters shall be arranged so that the first or first and second shall be above and the rest below the horizontal line of the T as shown hereunder.
- (5) In the case of the carcasses or meat being branded under the direction of the Board the letters of the brand shall be—B P H



In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and in the Local Government Act 1903, and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the City of Bendigo, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, being By-law No. 23, that is to say:

Every occupier of a house or premises, and every owner of an unoccupied house or premises, shall, if required to do so by the Council, cause all house refuse,

organic waste matter, or edible substances to be kept, while on the premises, in rat-proof receptacles, and shall, Unless there is a dog or a cat efficient in both cases for rat-killing, kept in such house or premises, and given constant access to the places therein where rats are likely to go from cover, set in suitable places a trap or traps for catching rats, and shall cause all rats caught to be kept,

And shall also, if required to do so by the Council, the Officer of Health, or an Inspector of the Council, take either or both of the following measures, namely:

I. Cause sulphur fumes or other tethal gas to be pumped into the places in the premises likely to better the council of the places.

2. Lay effective poison baits in such places as the

2. Lay effective poison baits in such places as the rats are known to frequent.

Every person who shall by any Act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach be committed or continued.

pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Go-*ernment Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and ayers of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, order lows:—

s. Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels. So pierson shall use or cause or procure any other to use on any public highway any traction engine her vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections.

prohibition, however, shall not apply to-

Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricul-tural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space interven-ing between such bars does not exceed five inches; or. inches; or,

- (b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and ex-tending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceed-ing three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case-
 - (1.) That the owner of such engine has pre-viously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly autho-rized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the en-gine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
 - (II.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any road-way, bridge, or culvert by such en-gine or any vehicle drawn by it.
 - (III.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
 - (IV.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.
 - (v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exdeed three hundredweight for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

So long as the fires of a traction are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embank-ments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforescen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unwards.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or, driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Weoden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used 8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off, steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this by-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
 (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five
- pounds.

 (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district [or throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district, that is to say: (describing them)].

12. This By-law shall rescind all previous By-laws purporting to the Regulation of Traction Engine Traffic in the Shire of Frankston and Hastings.
