By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

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MELBOURNE CUP, ETC., EXCURSIONS.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KYABRAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Made 23rd September, 1907.

THESE Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid to the Secretary on application.

3. Any person desiring ground shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a certificate of right of burial, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of the ground allotted thereby as a family or private

burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, fence, or other erection thereon.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or any other erection, shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing, with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner, and every such erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the graves.

6. The Trustees will not permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment in this or any other cemetery until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the license for dis-interment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, and the particulars required in the "order form" given, and an order obtained, when the Trustees will cause all graves to be dug or re-opened, as the case may be; but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees.

8. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give same.

9. Applications for interment shall be made to the Secretary as early as possible.

10. The hours for burial shall be: on week days, from September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery, without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace; such certificate shall be delivered up to the gate-keeper or sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

13. That every person dressing, attending, digging graves, or doing any other work within the cemetery shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—

First—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing, attending, digging, or re-opening graves shall be placed on any grave, and when placed on any adjoining ground, or path, shall be removed immediately after interment or completion of work.

Second—That all refuse and other material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once, by, or at the expense of the person causing same, and if the ground is in any way cut up the same shall be neatly levelled off, and left in the same order as before.

Third—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for dressing graves, or any other purposes, without permission from the Trustees.

14. No person shall remove, take, pluck, or destroy any flowers, trees, shrub, plant, or in any way interfere with anything in or connected with the cemetery without the permission of the Trustees to do so.

15. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms or fireworks discharged, within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

17. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, and numbers of the graves, and a register of all burials, with all information therein, shall be kept for public information by the Trustees.

18. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BURWOOD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Burwood Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) :—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a certificate of right of burial, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the required particulars given, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary or Sexton.

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before time fixed for the burial.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other months of the year, except on Sundays, when the usual hours for funerals will be from Two till Five p.m. throughout the year.

9. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

10. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan to the Trustees.

11. No servant or other person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof unless he has special authority from the Trustees.

12. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.

13. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

14. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.

15. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.

16. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

17. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on a certificate of minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

18. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, at the charge set out in the schedule.

19. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

20. No re-interment or removal from another Cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister authorized in that behalf.

21. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

22. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given.

SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai made under the Health Acts for fixing the fees payable for the registration of persons carrying on the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, and butter factories.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, order as follows :—

“That the fees for the annual registration of all persons carrying on the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, purveyors of milk, and butter factories, in the above

Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, in accordance with the regulations of the *Health Act 1890*, shall be, for each registration, as follows:—

Where the number of cows kept does not exceed ten, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds ten, but does not exceed thirty, the sum of Five shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds thirty, but does not exceed fifty, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds fifty, but does not exceed seventy-five, the sum of Ten shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds seventy-five, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

For all butter factories, the sum of One pound.

That By-law No. 6 of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai for fixing the fee for registration at Five shillings is hereby repealed.

That this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Phillip Island and Woolamai, immediately after its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Resolution for passing this By-law No. 9 agreed to by the Council on the twenty-second day of July, 1907, and confirmed on the seventeenth day of August, 1907.

Meat Supervision Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE BRANDING OF CARCASSES OR MEAT.

THE Board of Public Health in and for the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, doth hereby repeal all Regulations hitherto made for the Branding of Carcasses or Meat, and doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

(1) These Regulations shall apply to the Metropolitan Meat Area, the Geelong Meat Area, and the Warrnambool Meat Area, and to any other Meat Area which may hereafter be constituted under the Meat Supervision Acts.

(2) Carcasses or meat, whether fresh, frozen, dried, preserved, or chilled, when passed and certified as fit for human consumption, shall be branded by means of a heated appliance with a legibly seared brand or mark, which shall include letters indicating the name of the Municipal Council or other body under whose authority the said carcasses or meat have been passed and certified.

The letters of the brand shall be in the form of Roman capitals not less than one-quarter of an inch in height.

(3) Where the whole of the animal, including its viscera, has been examined, the brand or mark shall be in the form of a circle not less than 1½ inches in diameter. The outline of the circle shall be broken at fifteen places evenly distributed, and the letters shall be arranged within the circle in two parallel lines, the first or first two letters forming the upper line and the rest forming the lower line as shown hereunder.

(4) Where only the carcass of an animal without its viscera or only a part of a carcass has been examined the brand shall be in the form of a T of which the horizontal line shall be not less than one and a quarter inches long and the vertical line not less than five-eighths of an inch long. The outline of the T shall be broken in six places as evenly distributed as practicable, and the letters shall be arranged so that the first or first and second shall be above and the rest below the horizontal line of the T as shown hereunder.

(5) In the case of the carcasses or meat being branded under the direction of the Board the letters of the brand shall be—B P H

And in the case of the carcasses or meat being branded by or under the direction of a meat inspector of a Municipal Council the letters of the brand shall be those as set out opposite the name of each of the undermentioned municipal districts:—

A. In the case of beef, on the upper surface of the tongue, and on each side of the carcass—

- (1) On the outside of the buttock;
- (2) On the flank;
- (3) On the outside of the ribs; and
- (4) On the inside of the ribs near the backbone.

- B. In the case of veal if the carcass has been flayed then on each side of the carcass—
- (1) On the outside of the buttock;
 - (2) On the flank; and
 - (3) On the outside of the ribs or on the inside of the ribs near the backbone.
- C. In the case of mutton and lamb—on the shoulders and legs.
- D. In the case of pork—on each side of the carcass, on the cheek, the hand, the loin, and the leg.
- E. In the case of a non-flayed carcass taken to an appointed place—on the breast and either on the leg or on the inner surface of the flank.

AGRICULTURAL LABOURERS' ALLOTMENTS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE.

BON VISTA ESTATE.

THE allotments mentioned in the Schedule hereunder will be available for application till 15th November, 1907. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of coal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The coal supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be the best of its kind. The house coal must be free from shale, small coal, dust, ashes, or other impurities, and the smith's coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. No other coal will be received. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the coal so rejected or returned.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the coal.

4. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply, and when supplied in bags the bags remain the property of the contractor, and must be removed by the contractor at his own expense within three months after delivery.

5. Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.

6. At the time of delivering the coal the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the coal accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

7. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned to the contractor.

8. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.

9. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

10. The contractor will be bound to deliver coal for vessels, except in the case of dredges, into the vessels' bunkers.

11. When baskets are used in the delivery of coal they are all to be of one size, and the contractor will be bound to tare the baskets when so required by the officer taking delivery. In other cases the contractor will be bound to satisfy the officer receiving that the weight or quantity is correct.

12. Coal must be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.

18. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such coal or coke as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected coal or coke and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition No. 14.

19. Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules; such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. 3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., cross-ways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

6. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any firewood, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the wood so rejected or returned.

7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition No. 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney; coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of firewood by the Commonwealth Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. per day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted as in condition 3, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

BY-LAW No. 23.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the provisions of the Health Acts and of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and in the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the City of Bendigo, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, being By-law No. 23, that is to say:—

Every occupier of a house or premises, and every owner of an unoccupied house or premises, shall, if required to do so by the Council, cause all house refuse,

organic waste matter, or edible substances to be kept, while on the premises, in rat-proof receptacles, and shall.

Unless there is a dog or a cat efficient in both cases for rat-killing, kept in such house or premises, and given constant access to the places therein where rats are likely to go from cover, set in suitable places a trap or traps for catching rats, and shall cause all rats caught to be killed.

And shall also, if required to do so by the Council, the Officer of Health, or an Inspector of the Council, take either or both of the following measures, namely:—

1. Cause sulphur fumes or other lethal gas to be pumped into the places in the premises likely to harbour rats.
2. Lay effective poison baits in such places as the rats are known to frequent.

Every person who shall by any Act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach be committed or continued.

This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Bendigo.

REGULATION OF TRACTION ENGINE TRAFFIC.
—SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.

BY-LAW NO. 17.

A By-law of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

(i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(ii.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this by-law be liable to the following penalty:—

(a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.

(b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district [or throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district, that is to say: (describing them)].

12. This By-law shall rescind all previous By-laws purporting to the Regulation of Traction Engine Traffic in the Shire of Frankston and Hastings.
