MURDER.

MAN MURDERED AT SUNRISE GULLY, NEAR KANGAROO FLAT.

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on Wednesday, 18th September, 1907, a man named Joseph Wendell was found dead in his hut at Sunrise Gully, near Kangaroo Flat, and whereas a *post-mortem* examination disclosed four bullet wounds on the body, and the evidence given before the Coroner pointed to the conclusion that death occurred from gunshot wounds on or about Sunday, the 15th September, 1907, and whereas the Coroner recorded the verdict "That the deceased was murdered by some person or persons unknown": Notice is hereby given that a Reward of £200 will be paid for information which will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender or offenders who caused the death of the said Joseph Wendell.

A By-law of the Town of Williamstown made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 and section 35 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 74, for prohibiting spitting and expectorating in certain places, and for preventing nuisances and securing the healthfulness of the said Town and its inhabitants.

1. No person shall spit or expectorate on the footpath of any street or road or on any pavement, floor, or wall of any place open to or frequented by the public.

2. Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

SHIRE OF BORUNG.—BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890 and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Borung, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. If in the opinion of the Council the removal of a fowl-yard, any part of which is within 25 feet of a dwelling-house, is possible and is necessary for the health of any of the residents in its vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of it or of the premises of which it forms part, to remove or alter it so that no part of it shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling-house.

2. No person shall, within 25 feet of a dwelling-house, establish or construct a fowl-yard, or cause one to be constructed or established, or within such distance permit any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowl-yard.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Borung.

4. Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Health Act, 1890. **SHIRE OF ORBOST.**

BY-LAW NO. 19.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Orbost, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Township of Orbost, in the parish of Orbost, County of Croajingolong.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy in such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall construct in such manner that the pan may be removed therefrom without being lifted, a suitable floor of battens three inches apart for the pan to rest upon, and cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material sufficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall, at least once a week, cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid, and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by super-heated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall clear and keep clear and free from all obstructions an approach or passage way to the trap-door or opening in the said privy or closet through which the pan has to pass.

12. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1908 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also for dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor, but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Five shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half-a-mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is payable in moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1908.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1908.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1908, shall be as follows:—

(a) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

(b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police station, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, show grounds, cricket ground, bowling green, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1908; such rates shall be payable by equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of July and the 31st day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball-taps to prevent overflow.

IV. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be agreed upon.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1908. And such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and receive the said rates and charges.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at

Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust) situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1908.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound five shillings per annum shall be payable.

2A. Upon properties valued at Twelve pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings per annum be payable, in accordance with section 261 of the *Water Act 1905*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust's district before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* on the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes; and any owner or occupier using more water than (in the opinion of the Trust or its officer) they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use, except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this regulation, provided that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1908, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.
5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.
6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.
7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate that would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).
8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1908.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 1893), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the municipal roll of the Shire of Beechworth has been presented to the Governor in Council, notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th day of August, 1907, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into four separate ridings, to be named the East Central Riding, the West Central Riding, the South Riding, and the North Riding, the several boundaries of which are herein set forth and described, that is to say :—

SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH RE-SUBDIVIDED.

EAST CENTRAL RIDING.

Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 13, section D, parish of Beechworth, being the north-east angle of the town boundary of Beechworth; thence by the said town boundary southerly, westerly, and northerly to the intersection of the Melbourne and Lower three miles roads, being the south-east angle of allotment 9, section P1; thence north-easterly by the Melbourne-road, Bridge-street, and Ford-street to William-street; thence by William-street south-easterly to High-street; thence by High-street north-easterly to Alma-road; and thence by Alma-road north-easterly to the commencing point.

WEST CENTRAL RIDING.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

BY-LAW NO. 50.

A By-law of the Borough of Ararat, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

(i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways specified.

(ii.) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(v.) That the weight carried on any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundred-weight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who shall have received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

(a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.

(b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Ararat.

Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver

or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commences to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—
