PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1907, at Heyfield, and from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Beaufort;

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1907, at Castlemaine, Maldon, and Traralgon, and from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Rosedale and Tarnagulla;

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the shire of Wyndham described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said shire of Wyndham and annexed to the shire of Bacchus Marsh.

Area described in petition:—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 124, parish of Mouyong; thence south-westerly by the Geelong to Bacchus Marsh-road to the south-east angle of allotment 85; thence west by the south boundary of allotments 85 and 84 to the Balliang Creek; thence north along that creek to the north-west angle of allotment 129; thence east by the north boundary of allotments 129, 128, 125, and 124 to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the whole of their traffic to and from the Parwan and Bacchus Marsh Railway stations is over roads in the shire of Bacchus Marsh, and they desire that the said shire should receive the benefit of receiving their rates.

PROHIBITION OF NETTING IN THE SOUTH-WEST PASSAGE, NEAR MOUTH OF MOYNE RIVER.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in this field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him thereon of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination:

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*riid voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW NO. 82.

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered eighty-two (82), for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, erections or hoardings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows :—

1. The by-law numbered seventy-five confirmed by the Council of the said Municipality on the second day of August, One thousand nine hundred and four, for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, erections or hoardings, is hereby repealed.

2. No wooden building shall be constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool bounded on the north by Raglan-parade, on the east by Banyan-street, on the south by Merri-street, and on the west by Henna-street, at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, nor at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any "wooden building," nor at a less distance than ten (10) feet from any stone, brick, or iron building, save and except as hereinafter provided by this by-law.

3. No building constructed or made of iron, and having iron walls supported upon or attached to wooden frames or supports, shall be constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clause two (2) of this by-law, at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, nor at a less distance than ten (10) feet from any other building.

4. No building constructed or made of iron and having iron walls supported upon or attached to iron or metal frames or supports, shall be constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clause two (2) of this by-law, at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from any street frontage.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law to the contrary—

(a) Additions may be made in wood or iron to any wooden building existing at the date of the confirmation of this by-law, provided that upon the completion of such additions the whole building, inclusive of such additions, shall be at least twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, twenty (20) feet from any wooden building, and ten (10) feet from any stone, brick, or iron building; and

(b) Additions may be made in iron to any iron building existing at the date of the confirmation of this by-law, provided that upon completion of such additions the whole building, inclusive of such additions, shall be at least twenty (20) feet from any street frontage, ten (10) feet from any wooden building, and ten (10) feet from any stone, brick, or iron building; and

(c) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Banyan-street on the western side at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Merri-street, Timor-street, Koroi-street, Lava-street, and Raglan-parade; and

(d) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Raglan-parade on the southern side at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where the said street is intersected by Banyan-street, Liebig-street, Kepler-street, Fairy-street, or Henna-street; and

(e) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any building up to or abutting on the frontage of Henna-street on the eastern side at a distance of not less than one chain either north or south respectively of where the said street is intersected by Raglan-parade, Lava-street, Koroi-street, Timor-street, or Merri-street; and

(f) Any wooden or iron building may be constructed, erected, or placed at any distance from any buildings up to or abutting on the northern frontage of Merri-street or Artillery-crescent at a distance of not less than one chain either east or west respectively of where either of the said streets is intersected by Henna-street, Fairy-street, Kepler-street, Gilles-street, Liebig-street, or Banyan-street.

6. Every person desirous of constructing, erecting, or placing any building described or referred to in clauses two, three, four, or five of this by-law shall submit to the Council of the Town of Warrnambool a plan, specification, and description of any such proposed building, and until the consent of the said Council shall have been obtained in

writing, no person shall construct, erect, or place any such building within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clause two (2) of this by-law.

7. The roof of every building hereafter constructed, erected, or placed within that area of the Town of Warrnambool described in clause two (2) of this by-law shall be composed of slate, tiles, iron, or other non-inflammable material.

8. No building the outer walls or roof of which shall consist either wholly or partially of canvas, calico, or similar inflammable material shall be constructed, erected, or placed on any land or in any position within the boundaries of the Town of Warrnambool without the consent in writing of the Town Council having been first obtained.

9. No person shall construct, erect, or place any hoarding for advertisement or other purpose within ten (10) feet of any public highway without the previous consent in writing of the Council.

10. Nothing contained in this by-law shall apply to or have operation in respect to Government buildings of any kind.

11. It shall be lawful for the Council of the said Municipality to pull down and remove any buildings, erections, or boardings erected or constructed contrary to the provisions of this by-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or boardings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any penalties due by the owner thereof.

12. Any person wilfully constructing, erecting, or placing any building or hoarding upon any land contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and for every successive conviction in respect of any successive similar offences against any of the provisions of this by-law to a penalty not exceeding One pound (£1) for each day such building or hoarding is suffered to remain after such conviction.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law "a wooden building" shall mean and include a building of any kind of which any or all of the outer walls thereof are constructed, erected, or placed or made either wholly or partially of wood, save and except such interpretation shall not mean or include any building or erection the outer walls of which are constructed of metal or iron supported upon or attached to metal or wooden frames.

14. Clauses two, three, four, five, six, and seven of this by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the Municipal District of the Town of Warrnambool, that is to say, the area bounded on the south by Merri-street, on the east by Banyun-street, on the north by Raglan-parade, and on the west by Henna-street; and clauses one, eight, nine, eleven, and thirteen of this by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Town of Warrnambool.

Resolution for passing this by-law was agreed to by the Council the thirty-first day of July, 1906, and confirmed the twenty-eighth day of August, 1906.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW NO. 83.

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, made under Section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered eighty-three (83), for regulating the market place and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market will be held, and for repealing By-law No. 71 for regulating the market and other matters connected therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgessess of the Town of Warrnambool order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Victoria Market, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market, situated between Raglan-parade, Kepler-street, Spencer-street, and Liebig-street, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle and articles.

2. The said market shall be open for the sale of cattle and articles, save and except pigs, on every Wednesday, from the hour of sunrise to sunset; and on every Tuesday the said market shall open for the sale of pigs only from the hour of sunrise to sunset.

3. The said market shall be open for receiving of cattle and articles for sale on every Monday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday (public holidays excepted) from the hour of sunrise to sunset.

4. No cattle or articles shall be received for sale at the said market on any Tuesday after the hour of half-past eleven o'clock a.m. (11.30 a.m.) or on any Wednesday after the hour of eleven o'clock a.m. (11 a.m.), and no person shall sell or offer for sale any cattle or articles in the said market before the opening or after the closing of the said market.

5. On every Wednesday the first sales of cattle or articles shall be commenced not later than half-past eleven o'clock a.m. (11.30 a.m.), and the sales of cattle or articles shall be conducted in the order following:—

- 1st (first), Sheep.
- 2nd (second), Fat Cattle.
- 3rd (third), Store Cattle.
- 4th (fourth), Horses.
- 5th (fifth), Articles or Sundries.

6. On every Tuesday the first of sales of pigs shall be commenced not later than half-past eleven o'clock a.m. (11.30 a.m.), and at every such sale all auctioneers or salesmen shall draw lots for order of priority of selling, and they shall, in the order of such drawing, sell or submit for sale the whole of the pigs at their disposal in the said market, and all fat pigs shall be sold or disposed of first, and then all the store pigs shall be sold or otherwise disposed of.

7. On every Wednesday, when sales are to be held in the said market, all auctioneers or salesmen shall draw lots for priority of order of selling cattle or articles, and the auctioneer or salesman first in such drawing shall sell or otherwise dispose of any cattle or articles for a period not longer than half of one hour, the time to be indicated by a clock placed in the said market, or till the sooner conclusion of his sales or other disposal of any cattle or articles, when the auctioneer or salesman next in such order of drawing shall sell or otherwise dispose of any cattle or articles in a like manner, and so on until all the auctioneers or salesmen shall have sold or otherwise disposed of any cattle or articles, and should all the cattle or articles in the said market be not then sold or disposed of, the sale shall be continued in the order of drawing and in a like manner as aforesaid, provided always that should any auctioneer or salesman have sold or otherwise disposed of any particular class of cattle or articles before the expiration of the half of one hour, as aforesaid, he shall cease to sell or offer for sale or otherwise dispose of any cattle or articles till all the said cattle or articles shall be sold, offered for sale, or otherwise disposed of in the order of sales as set forth in clause five (5) of this by-law, provided always that this clause shall not apply to fat cattle save so far as it provides for the order of selling and priority of order of selling.

8. No auctioneer or salesman shall sell or otherwise dispose of any fat cattle for more than fifteen (15) minutes at any continuous period of time.

9. The collector or inspector of the said market shall ring a bell at the time appointed for the commencement of sales in accordance with the lots drawn for priority of order of selling, and should the auctioneer or salesman drawn first in the order of priority of selling not commence the sale of such cattle or articles within five (5) minutes of the ringing of the bell, he shall be placed at the bottom of the list of auctioneers or salesmen in the order of priority of selling, thereupon the collector or inspector of the said market shall again ring the bell, and should the auctioneer or salesman second in order of priority of selling not commence the sale of cattle or articles within five (5) minutes thereafter, he shall be placed at the bottom of the list of auctioneers or salesmen, and the like course shall be adopted as to all the other auctioneers or salesmen.

10. On every Monday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday, when sales are to be held in the said market, all auctioneers or salesmen or other persons shall conduct such sales in accordance with such directions, either verbal or written, as may be given by the Council, or the collector or inspector of the said market, both as regards time, order of selling, and drawing of lots for priority of order of selling.

11. No person shall obstruct the collector or inspector of the said market in the performance of his duties, or release or remove any cattle or articles from the said market, or remove any cattle or articles from one part of the said market to another part of the said market, without the consent of the collector or inspector thereof, nor shall any person wilfully open any gate or lock, or fastening of any gate, or open or break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, nor cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or to be guilty of any indecent or gross conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

12. All cattle or articles not removed from the said market by the hour of eight o'clock a.m. on the morning next after any sale shall have been held in the said market shall be removed by the collector or inspector of the said market at the expense and risk of the owner of any such said cattle or articles.

13. In this by-law cattle shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, or swine.

14. By-law No. 71, relating to the above, passed on the 31st day of August, 1897, is hereby repealed.

This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Town of Warrnambool.

Resolution for passing this by-law agreed to by the Council the eighth day of January, 1907, and confirmed the twelfth day of February, 1907.
