REGULATIONS.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby makes the following amendments of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations gazetted on the 30th December, 1902, and amended on the 28th April, 1904, *vide Government Gazette* of the 11th May, 1904, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

Repeal Clause 13.

Add Clause 13. Absence from office or district, or from duty.—No officer shall be absent without leave from his office or place of business, or from the district to which he is appointed, or from duty; provided that if an officer who has not obtained leave be prevented by sudden illness or other emergency from attending his office, place of business, or to his duty, immediately report such absence to the Permanent Head and furnish evidence proving to the satisfaction of such Permanent Head that his absence without leave was unavoidable and was not due to any misconduct, such officer shall not be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

*Repeal Clauses 26 and 26A.**Repeal Clause 32.*

Add Clause 32. Insolvency.—If the estate of any officer be sequestrated, either voluntarily or compulsorily, for the benefit of his creditors, such officer shall report the same immediately to the Commissioner through the Head of his Department, and furnish a statement of his assets and liabilities, together with an explanation of the cause of such sequestration.

PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by section 7 of the *Libraries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1110), a majority of the Trustees for the time being of the body politic and corporate, named the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria, do hereby repeal all the Rules and Regulations which have heretofore been made pursuant to the section and Act aforesaid, and which have not previously been repealed, and do make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS OF THE GENERAL BODY OF TRUSTEES.

1. *Ordinary Meetings.*

The Trustees shall meet monthly, unless the President direct to the contrary.

2. *Special Meetings.*

A Special Meeting shall be convened by the Librarian on the direction of the President, or on the requisition of any two Trustees.

3. *Quorums and Adjourned Meetings.*

Three Trustees shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not formed within half-an-hour of the time named, the meeting, whether ordinary or special, shall be called for a day to be named by the Trustee or Trustees then present; but if no Trustee be present, the business will be adjourned until the next monthly meeting.

4. *Notice of Meetings.*

The Trustees shall be duly supplied by the Librarian with at least three days' notice of the day, hour, and place of every monthly meeting, and of all motions to be made or special matters to be considered thereat; and any Trustee may hand to the Librarian a notice of motion in writing, which it shall be the Librarian's duty to insert in such notice-paper, and also in a book to be called the Notice of Motion Book.

5. *Sections.*

For the more convenient and effectual performance of the duties imposed upon the Trustees, there shall be four Committees dealing respectively with—

1. The Library.
2. The National Gallery.
3. The Industrial and Technological Museum.
4. The National Museum.

6. *Office Bearers.*

1. There shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Treasurer, and a Chairman of each of the Sectional Committees elected annually in the month of April, and each shall remain in office until his successor be appointed.

2. The President shall preside at the meetings of the Trustees; in his absence, the Vice-President; in the absence of both the meeting shall elect its Chairman.

3. The Treasurer shall sign all vouchers and financial documents.

4. The Chairman of any meeting of Trustees or of any Committee meeting shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes shall give a casting vote.

7. *Committees.*

Each Sectional Committee shall meet monthly. Three members shall form a quorum. A special meeting for the consideration of business shall be convened on the requisition in writing of any two members.

The President, Vice-President, and Treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of every Committee.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY.

1. The Museums and Galleries shall be open daily, during such hours as may be appointed, except on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such other days as the Trustees may by special order direct.

2. The Library shall be open on week days, Christmas Day and Good Friday excepted, from Ten a.m. until Ten p.m.

3. The Lending Library shall be open on week days (public holidays excepted), from Twelve noon until Eight p.m.

4. The Industrial and Technological Museum shall be open on week days from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., and on Sundays during such hours as the Trustees may from time to time direct.

5. The National Museum shall be open on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday in each week from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., and on Sundays during such hours as the Trustees may from time to time direct. The National Museum shall also be open on Thursday if a public holiday fall on that day.

6. The National Gallery shall be open on week days from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., and on Sundays during such hours as the Trustees may from time to time direct.

7. Any visitor behaving in an unbecoming manner, or being in the opinion of the officer in charge unfit to remain in the Institution, shall be excluded therefrom.

THE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

The Reference Library.

1. No book is to be taken out of the Library except by special permission of the Trustees.

2. In making extracts from books no person shall lay the paper upon which he is writing on the book he is using.

3. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited. Ink is not to be used except by special permission.

4. Children under fourteen years of age are not admitted.

5. No person, unless he be a medical practitioner, a medical student, or an attorney or barrister-at-law, shall be admitted to the Medical Department without permission from the Librarian or from the officer in charge of the Library.

6. No person shall be admitted to the Fine Arts section without permission from the Librarian. All books in this section must be used under the supervision of the officer in charge at a table provided for the purpose, and must be returned to him.

7. Books removed from the shelves must not be replaced by readers.

8. Unless the Trustees otherwise direct, no person shall be allowed to have direct access to the shelves except on the presentation of a certificate signed by two ratepayers or by some person or persons deemed satisfactory for the purpose by the Librarian or officer in charge.

The Lending Library.

1. The Lending Library shall be open on week days (public holidays excepted), from Twelve noon until Eight p.m.

2. Any person satisfying the Librarian that he is a ratepayer of any municipality within the State of Victoria may borrow books from the Lending Library.

3. Any other person having reached the age of fifteen years who shall deliver to the Librarian a guaranty signed by two such ratepayers, may borrow books from the Lending Library.

4. Every application for the loan of books, and the guaranty required by the next preceding regulation, shall be in the form provided from time to time by the Trustees.

5. The Librarian may issue to any person entitled to borrow, on his or her personal application, a borrower's ticket, the production of which shall authorize its holder for twelve months to borrow books subject to the regulations of the Lending Library.

6. A borrower's ticket may be issued to any person who is physically incapable of applying personally, or to any person who resides more than ten miles from Melbourne, without personal application, on receipt of the necessary forms duly filled in and signed, provided that a statement in writing of the reason for not attending in person be given to the Librarian, and a reference given to some local magistrate, clergyman, or ratepayer.

7. Borrowers must return books personally or by messenger. The Trustees will neither undertake to receive nor issue books by post.

8. All books borrowed must be returned to the Librarian within a fortnight, and for every failure to comply with this condition the borrower shall incur a fine, to be paid to the Librarian, of Threepence for each day or portion of a day.

9. No book can be obtained from the Lending Library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred, and made full compensation for any loss, damage, or cost of repair.

10. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

11. Borrowers must see that books are in good order before taking them from the Library. If any book be found to be written on, or otherwise injured, borrowers are required to report the fact to the Librarian.

12. Any borrower returning a book which has been written upon, marked, or otherwise injured, shall, within one week of the date upon which the injury has been notified to him, replace such book or pay to the Librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured, or shall pay such sum for the cost of repair as may be assessed by the Librarian. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series on depositing with the Librarian its full value, or a new and satisfactory copy.

13. Borrowers ceasing to use the Library are required to return their tickets to the Librarian in order to have them cancelled, as, until the tickets are returned, borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.

14. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify, on forms supplied for the purpose, the change to the Librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

15. Borrowers losing their tickets are required to give immediate notice in writing to the Librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.

16. If a borrower's ticket be lost, a second ticket may be issued after two days from the date on which the loss is notified in the manner provided in the case of the issue of the ticket in the first instance. If the second ticket be lost, one month must elapse from the time of the notification of the fact to the Librarian before a third ticket shall be issued.

17. Borrowers must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any other person.

18. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the Library, nor exchange them with each other.

19. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole work necessary, several volumes may be issued together.

20. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.

21. The Librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Lending Library, or who is, in his opinion, for other reasons not to be entrusted with books.

22. Every book must, under a penalty of Five shillings, be returned to the Librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.

23. Books will not be issued to any person suffering from an infectious disease, nor to any person living in the same house as one suffering from an infectious disease. Borrowers are required to report at once to the Librarian in the event of the outbreak of any such disease in the house in which he or she may be dwelling.

Travelling Libraries.

Conditions upon which cases of Books will be lent by the Trustees.

1. Books may be lent to the Trustees or Committees of Mechanics' or Literary Institutes, or to the Councils of Municipalities.

2. The borrowers shall place the books lent in a suitable apartment to be approved by the Trustees, and shall admit the public to the use of the books therein for such hours as may be appointed by the local Committee.

3. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited.

4. The local Committee shall pay all the expenses of taking the books from and returning them to the Public Library, Melbourne.

5. The local Committee shall give security to the satisfaction of the Trustees in an amount equal to the value of the books, book case, and cover lent to them, that such books, book case, and cover will be returned at the expiration of the period of the loan in good condition, regard being had to reasonable wear.

6. The local Committees and sureties are to be liable for—

1. The value of any volume not returned, or where a work consists of more than one volume the value of the work, set, or series to which the volume belongs.

2. The estimated value of the injury done to any volume, work, set, or series, book case, or book case cover.

7. When any work, set, or series, rendered imperfect, is replaced by the local Committee, the imperfect work, set, or series shall be handed over to such Committee.

8. The Trustees shall be the sole judges of the value of or injury done to any volume, work, set, or series, or book case.

THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

Rules for Students in the Schools of Drawing and Painting and Fine Arts.

1. The period of studentship is limited to five years, but it may be extended from time to time by the permission of the Trustees in favour of meritorious students on report from the Director.

2. The year shall consist of 42 weeks, divided into two terms. There shall be a vacation of eight weeks, commencing on a day to be fixed by the Director in the week preceding Christmas Day; and also a vacation of two weeks, commencing on the second Monday in July.

3. An applicant for admission as a student shall be admitted on probation, and shall prepare drawings within the School of Drawing; and on the same being approved by the Director the applicant shall, on payment of fees, be registered as a student.

4. No person under fourteen years of age shall be admitted as a student, except by special permission of the Trustees.

5. Any student not making due progress shall be reported by the Director to the Trustees, who shall decide whether such student shall be allowed to continue to attend the classes.

6. Before admission to the School of Painting a student shall submit to the Trustees a drawing of a figure from the antique, a drawing of a head from the antique, a drawing of an anatomical figure, drawings of hands or feet, and a perspective drawing; and all these drawings shall be done in the School at the National Gallery.

7. Once in every three years a travelling scholarship worth £150 per annum, tenable for three years, and a bronze medal may, if the Trustees think fit, be awarded for the highest merit attained in a competition for—

(a) an original painting;

(b) a figure drawing from life;

(c) a life-sized painting from the nude.

For the original painting 150 marks may be awarded as against 50 for each of the other two subjects.

8. The title of the original painting intended for competition shall be submitted by each candidate to the Trustees for their approval. The outside measurement of the canvas of such painting shall be at least 18 feet, but the proportions shall be left to the competing student. Such original painting shall contain not less than two whole human figures, and shall (under the supervision of the Director) be painted in the school at the National Gallery, during any one term, by a student who, for not less than eighteen months or more than four years, has attended the painting class at the National Gallery, or at any School of Art subsidized by the Government of Victoria.

9. No student shall be eligible to compete unless under twenty-five years of age on the day of the publication of these rules in the *Government Gazette*, nor unless at the time of entering for such competition such student is under twenty-eight years of age, and has in every case been domiciled in the Commonwealth of Australia or New Zealand for the previous seven years.

10. Any intending competitor for the Travelling Scholarship who has not attended the painting classes at the National Gallery for at least three terms, shall submit to the Trustees a figure drawing from the life and a life-sized painting from the nude, accompanied by a certificate from the Director of some School of Art subsidized by the Government of Victoria at which he or she is at the time attending, that such works are the unaided and original productions of such intending competitor, and if the Trustees decide that such works are of sufficient merit to qualify the student to compete, such works may be considered as two of the subjects required for the final competition for the Travelling Scholarship; but a competitor at such competition may substitute therefor any figure drawing from the life or painting from the nude (as the case may be) made during the term in which he or she is a student at the National Gallery.

11. The holder of the Travelling Scholarship shall for the purpose of study attach himself or herself for a period of at least two years to one of the great Art Schools of Europe, to be approved by the Trustees, and shall, during the time of such scholarship, forward a quarterly report as to the work upon which he or she is engaged.

12. The holder of the Travelling Scholarship shall, during the first year of tenure of such scholarship, paint and present to the Trustees a study from the nude; during the second year of tenure the holder shall paint and present to the Trustees a copy of some well-known painting by an Old Master, of which there is not already a copy in the National Gallery; and during the third year of tenure the holder shall paint and present to the Trustees an original picture.

13. An exhibition of the students' work shall be held annually.

14. No work done by students in the schools is to be taken away from the schools, without the permission of the Director, before it has been submitted for competition and exhibition at the Students' Annual Exhibition.

15. No student who has in any year been awarded a prize at the annual exhibition of the students' work shall be eligible to receive a similar prize in the same department in any subsequent year, except in the life figure class, in which class a similar prize may be won twice.

16. Students shall pay in advance to the Librarian the term fee fixed by the Trustees, and will not be admitted to the class-rooms except upon production of the receipt.

17. No student who has been absent from the classes for a term, or who has been irregular in attendance, except on account of actual illness, or from such cause as shall be deemed sufficient by the Trustees, shall be permitted to compete for the Travelling Scholarship or to rejoin the classes except after application to the Director and by permission of the Trustees.

18. No person will be allowed to copy any picture, drawing, or work of art in the Galleries of Painting and Sculpture without having first obtained permission in writing from the Trustees, and such permission shall specify the part or parts, if any, of any such picture or work of art not to be included in the copy.

19. All students shall sign the students' book on every day they attend before entering the gallery.

20. All students shall, when leaving the gallery, remove or carefully put away all materials used by them in drawing or painting.

21. The Trustees will not be responsible for the loss of or injury to property which any student may have left in the gallery.

22. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct on the part of any student will subject such student to suspension by the Director. The matter shall be reported by the Director to the Trustees at their next meeting, and the offence, when proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees, shall subject such student to exclusion for such period as they may think fit.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE SMALL IMPROVED HOLDINGS ACT 1906.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of March, 1907.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the *Small Improved Holdings Act 1906* (6 Edw. VII. No. 2053), power is given to the Governor in Council to make Regulations for the various purposes specified in such section and for fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations :—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations the words "Minister" and "substantial and permanent improvements" shall have the respective meanings set forth hereunder—

"Minister" shall mean Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey in and for the State of Victoria.

"Substantial and permanent improvements" shall mean dams, wells, cultivation, fencing, clearing, or draining of an allotment and the erecting of a habitable dwelling or of farm or other buildings upon and permanently attached to the soil of such allotment.

2. No person shall be eligible to become a probationary tenant of a Small Improved Holding unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he fulfils the following requirements :—

- (a) That such person is at least twenty-one years old.
- (b) That he is a natural born or naturalized subject of His Majesty;
- (c) That during the last three years he has not been convicted of habitual drunkenness, larceny, or any indictable offence;
- (d) That he is unable by his personal means to become possessed of land suited to his requirements;
- (e) That he will, if so required by the Minister, forthwith transfer to the Crown all or any property of which he is possessed, authorizing the Minister in his discretion to sell such property to such extent as the Minister thinks fit, and deduct from the proceeds the total sum advanced to such tenant or lessee pursuant to this Act, and after such total sum is deducted to pay any balance remaining to such tenant or lessee; and
- (f) That he is prepared to himself, or by the help of his family, cultivate and work a small allotment of land.

3. Every application for a Small Improved Holding shall be made in the form set forth in Schedule A hereto, and every applicant shall make the declaration therein set forth, and shall satisfy the Minister that he is eligible and a fit and proper person to become a probationary tenant.

4. Any eligible person may in the same application apply for some particular allotment, or alternatively for one of several allotments to be specified in such application.

5. No allotment shall contain land exceeding in value the sum of £200, exclusive of cost of surveying, clearing, and draining it and making necessary road access thereto, and exclusive of buildings and fencing thereon, and the area of every allotment shall be indicated on the plan of subdivision.

6. The probationary tenant of every unimproved allotment shall during the term of his permissive occupancy thereof make on such allotment substantial and permanent improvements, exclusive of the cost of materials advanced in connexion therewith, as set forth hereunder :—

During the first six months substantial and permanent improvements of the value of £20.

During the second six months additional substantial and permanent improvements of the value of £10.

During the third six months further substantial and permanent improvements of the value of £20.

7. Every *Gazette* notice announcing that allotments are available for Small Improved Holdings shall notify where the plan of subdivision may be inspected, and the date up to which applications will be received.

8. On approval of an application for an allotment by the Minister, permissive occupancy thereof shall be granted to the applicant in the form set forth in Schedule B hereto.

9. Applications for advances of necessary materials for erecting dwellings and fencing, implements and live stock shall be made in the form prescribed in Schedule C hereto.

10. Should the Minister sanction the advance of materials, implements, or live stock to the probationary tenant of an allotment, an order as prescribed in Schedule D shall be issued to such person as may be authorized by the Minister to procure the materials, implements, or live stock.

11. On production of the order, the materials, implements, or live stock (as the case may be) to the value mentioned therein may be supplied, and on such order, together with the required receipt and declaration being forwarded to the Minister, the amount of claim shall be remitted.

12. Applications for weekly advances for work done by probationary tenants shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule E hereto, and shall be lodged with the foreman, who shall forthwith forward them to the Minister, together with the certificate in each case as to the value of the work done by the tenant.

13. All weekly advances (less the legal deductions) shall be forwarded to the foreman, who shall pay the amount to the respective probationary tenants and obtain acquittances on the form prescribed in Schedule F hereto.

6. That I am prepared to myself, or by the help of my family, to cultivate and work this small allotment; and
7. That with respect to this application I am not an agent or a servant of or a trustee of any other person.

8. That I have not entered into nor promised to enter into any agreement to permit any other person to acquire by purchase or otherwise the allotment in respect of which this application is made or any part thereof or any interest therein.

9. That this application is made in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act and of the Regulations thereunder; and

10. That the replies to the questions set forth hereunder are true and correct in every particular.

WHEREAS it is provided under section 6 of the *Money Lenders Act 1906*, No. 2061, that the Governor in Council may make regulations respecting the registration of money lenders (including the prescribing of the conditions for registration and the grounds on which they may be removed from the register) whether individuals, firms, societies, or companies, the form of the register and the particulars to be entered therein, and the fees to be paid on registration and renewal of registration not exceeding One pound for each registration or renewal, and respecting the inspection of the register and the fees payable therefor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the said provisions, doth make the following regulations:—

1. Applications for registration or renewal of registration as a money lender under the *Money Lenders Act* 1900, No. 2001, shall be made to the Registrar-General in the form or to the effect of schedule one to these regulations.
2. The application shall be signed in the case of a person or persons by the person or persons desiring to be registered, or by some one duly authorized on his, her, or their behalf. In the case of a corporation the application may be sealed with the common seal of the corporation or may be signed on its behalf by its proper officer.
3. Whenever any such application is received by the Registrar-General, the proper officer shall immediately indorse thereon a number, and every such application shall be numbered successively according to the order of time in which the same is received, and shall immediately be entered according to such number in the register hereinafter provided for.
4. Upon registration the Registrar-General shall issue in respect of the same a certificate in the form or to the effect of schedule two to these regulations.
5. The renewal of any such registration may be made during the last month of the period for which such registration was effective, and any such renewal shall date as from the day of the expiration of the prior registration.
6. Upon such renewal the Registrar-General shall give a certificate of renewal or indorse the date of such renewal on the certificate of registration.
7. Upon the change in the place or places of business of an individual registered as a money lender, or upon the change of any kind in a firm, society, or company so registered, or in its place or places of business, the registration of such money lender shall cease to have effect, and shall entail a fresh registration, which must be made within one calendar month of such change.
8. There shall be kept in the office of the Registrar-General, in the form of schedule three to these regulations, a register in which the names of all registered money lenders shall be entered, together with the other particulars specified in the said schedule.
9. The fee to be paid in respect of each registration, or the renewal thereof, shall be the sum of One pound.
10. A fee of One shilling shall be paid for the inspection of the entry in the register in respect to the record therein of each registered money lender.
11. Any person may, on the payment of a fee of One shilling, obtain a certified copy of any entry in such register.
12. The grounds on which the name of any money lender may be removed from the register shall be the conviction for any offence against the provisions of the

Money Lender Act 1906 or for any indictable or infamous offence. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, of any such conviction the registration of such money lender shall, if the Governor in Council so direct, cease to have effect, and his name shall be removed from the register, and a notification of such removal shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

13. Any registered money lender ceasing to carry on business as a money lender may have his name removed from the register.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1903 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by measurement: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the

Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, viz.:-

The weight by measurement of each of the descriptions or classes of goods named in the Schedule hereunder shall, in the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, be that specified in the said Schedule in each case respectively, that is to say:-

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the

property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. 6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Waranga, made under Part VII., section 197, sub-sections 23 and 29, of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 1, for regulating the hours during which, and the conditions on which, locomotive engines or rollers, impelled by steam or electricity, may proceed over any road within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Waranga order as follows:—

1. 3. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than One pound.

4. This By-law shall, save where hereinbefore otherwise provided, apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Waranga.
