REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING METHODS FOR THE ANALYSIS OF MILK, CREAM, AND MALT EXTRACT.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the following regulations prescribing the method of analysis to be applied in the analysis of milk, cream, and malt extract or digestive or diastasic malt extract, that is to say--

(1) MILK.

Milk Fats.—The proportion of milk fats shall be determined gravimetrically by means of—

(a) Adams' absorbent paper extraction process; or

(b) Babcock's asbestos extraction process; or

(c) Bell's maceration method as described by Thorpe in the Journal of the Chemical Society, 1905, volume 87, pages 206-225. This method is approved or as specially suitable in the case of sour milk.

Total Solids .- The proportion of total solids shall be

(a) in conjunction with Babcock's asbestos method or with Bell's maceration method; or
(b) by evaporation of a separate sample in a flat dish finally exposed to a temperature of at least 100 deg. C., and not exceeding 105 deg. C. until weight is constant.

until weight is constant.

Solids not Fat.—The proportion of solids not fat shall be determined by deduction of milk fats from total solids.

Ash.—The proportion of ash shall be determined by evaporation and subsequent incineration at a low temperature, extraction of char with water, ignition of residue and subsequent addition of aqueous extract, drying and ignition at a dull red heat. The residue and soluble extract may be separately weighed.

(2) CREAM.

Milk Fats.—The proportion of milk fats shall be determined by any one of the methods prescribed for determining the proportion of milk fats in milk.

(3) MALT EXTRACT OR DIGESTIVE OR DIASTASIC MALT EXTRACT.

Tetal Solids.—The proportion of total solids shall be determined by evaporation to dryness by either of the methods prescribed for determining the proportion of total solids in milk.

Diastasic Power.—The diastasic power shall be determined by the method as described by Harrison and Gair in the Pharmaceutical Journal of 28th July, 1906, pages 94-96. The starch paste used in the process shall be prepared from pure potato starch.

Any analyst, whether for the prosecution or for the defence, failing to declare in his certificate of analysis that he has followed the prescribed method in his analysis, is liable to disqualification for appointment as an analyst under the Health Acts.

# TALBOT BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1907 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Borough of Talbot which has been duly proclaimed a Water Supply District, also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district.

The following are the rates which the occupiers on

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

- 1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).
- 2. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (20) annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound.
- 3. For every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 4. Government Departments, Railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
- 5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Trust, the following charges shall

Post-office, Two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons, minimum 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police station, Two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons, minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.

State school, Two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons, minimum 15,000 gallons per annum.

- 6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.
- 7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.
- 8. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for the engine cylinder. the engine cylinder.
- o. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half-acre and 200,000 gallons per
- 10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 per acre when supplied from the open race.
- II. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.
- 12. For water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny (rd.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The beforementioned rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1907, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly or as may be demanded.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE FOR A METROPOLITAN CRICKET GROUND.

CITY OF MELBOURNE FOR A METROPOLITAN CRICKET GROUND.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant of the Reserve in the City of Melbourne for a Metropolitan Cricket Ground, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as and for a place for playing at cricket, and for conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as to the admission of the public and otherwise as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such regulations as to the admission of the public and otherwise as shall from time to time be made by the Trustees for the time being of the said premises, and for no other purpose whatsoever. And whereas by section 200 of the Land Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public nurpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section to of the Land Act 1901, and has vested such lands in Trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such lands, with the approval of the

Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section. Now, therefore, we, James McLaughlin, Thomas Frank Morkham, Roderick Murchison, James Williamson Skene, George Fairbairn, the Honorable John Emanuel Mackey, the Honorable John Murray, the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, K.C.M.G., and the Honorable William Alexander Watt, the Trustees for the time being of the said premises, do hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said Reserve in the City of Melbourne for a Metropolitan Cricket Ground:—

### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows:-
- rst Division—The Pavilion, Members' Grand Stands, Tennis Courts, Press Box and Scorers' Box, and Members' and Ladies' Reserves.
- and Division-The Public Grand Stand and the enclosure connected therwith.
- 3rd Division-The Playing Ground.

- 4th Division-The remainder of the Reserve.

Subject to the direction of the Trustees, the Reserve shall be managed, in accordance with these regulations, by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, but for so long only as the constitution thereof at the date of these regulations remains unaltered in any respect, unless the alterations be made with the consent of the Trustees. Provided always that wherever in these regulations it is provided that any act, matter, or thing shall or shall not be done, with or without or subject to the Trustees' approval or consent the Trustees, if they think fit, may in each of such cases direct the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club to do or not to do any such act, matter, or thing, and the Trustees shall, notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, have full power and authority, after such Committee has been directed as hereinbefore set forth, to do or not to do (as the case may be) any such act, matter, or thing, and any act, matter, or thing auxiliary thereto. 2. Subject to the direction of the Trustees, the Reserve auxiliary thereto.
- 3. Every person shall be admitted to the 4th Division free of charge from sunrise to sunset except as hereinafter
- provided.

  4. Admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Division of the Reserve shall be restricted to Members of the Melbourne Cricket Club, and the Trustees of the Reserve, and to such other persons as may be authorized to enter such part of the Reserve by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, with the approval of the Trustees, subject to these regulations.

  5. During the cricket season the Reserve shall not be used for any purpose other than cricket without the approval of the Trustees.

  6. The Reserve shall not at any time be used otherwise than for athletic games and sports, without the approval

6. The Reserve shall not at any time be used outerwise than for athletic games and sports, without the approval of the Trustees.

7. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

8. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, and deserve in the Reserve.

may offend against decency as regaths diess, language, or conduct.

8. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

9. No fires shall be lighted in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club.

10. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, turnstiles, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

11. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, or other animals, except as provided in Clause 12.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

13. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure on the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

14. The erection of all new buildings and improvements made or effected upon the Reserve, and all matterrelating to alterations and repairs to the buildings and improvements, shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, who may at any time authorize any person to enter and inspect the buildings and improvements, and the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club shall be bound to execute and carry out all such improvements (including buildings), alterations, and repairs as the Trustees may, in writing, from time to time direct.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne-Cricket Club first obtained.

16. No person except workmen couployed in the Reserve and article without the consent in writing, of the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne-Cricket Club first obtained.

17. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith

removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof :-

(a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
  (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
  (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other outdoor game or sports or amusements, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
  (d) Being found in any part of the 1st or 3rd Division of the Reserve, and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Division of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these regula-

tions.

18. Applications for the use of the Reserve shall be made to the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, and no application for the use of the Reserve for any International, Inter-State, or other cricket or football match or outdoor game of public importance shall be refused, without the approval, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and every such application shall be deemed to have been refused by such Committee, unless it be finally dealt with no later than one month after the receipt thereof by such Committee.

19. Any club or any association or persons that may be allowed to use the Reserve for any purpose shall abide by these regulations, and by any order given by the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, or by the Trustees in reference to the Reserve and the buildings, erections, and enclosures for the time being thereon, and such use shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee for the time being of the Melbourne Cricket Club, with the approval of the Trustees, may think fit to impose.

20. The maximum scale of fees which shall be charged and collected by the Trustees for admission to the 2nd and 4th Divisions of the Reserve on such days as it may be set apart for cricket matches or football matches, or any other outdoor games or sports or amusements, shall be as follows:— 18. Applications for the use of the Reserve shall be made

as follows:

(a) For admission of every person to the 2nd Division during any International, Inter-State, or other important cricket match or other outdoor game, or any minor cricket match or football match or other outdoor game or sports or amusements, such a sum as the Trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Five shillings

such a sum as the Trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).

(b) For admission of every person to the 4th Division during any International, Inter-State, or other important cricket match or football match, or other outdoor game, or any minor cricket match or often outdoor game or sports or amusements, such a sum as the Trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.). Every person offending against any of these regulations shall on conviction before any Justice be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff of Crown Lands, officer, servant, or constable (as the case may be), and taken before some fustice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10). - 1.   2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.
- 3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the

property of the Government, and no charges or expenses what soever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

- 4. All orders for supplies will commate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.
- 6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.
- 7. Orders must receive prompt execution: and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplier, or giving the contractor twenty-four hours notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.
- 11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself.
