SUPPLEMENTARY CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR THE EXTRADITION OF FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

RELATING TO THE UNITED STATES EXTRADITION ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1907.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals. His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in No. 47.-APRIL 17, 1907.-4366.-1.

the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, between His Majesty and the President of the United States of America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following:

America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following:—
His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the United States of America, being desirous of enlarging the list of crimes on account of which extradition may be granted under the Conventions concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, with a view to the better administration of justice and the prevention of crime in their respective territories and jurisdictions, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, to wit:

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, which were found to be in due and proper form, have agreed to and concluded the following Atticles:—

ARTICLE I.

ARTICLE 1.

The following crimes are added to the list of crimes numbered one to ten in the first Article of the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and to the list of crimes numbered eleven to thirteen in Article I. of the Supplementary Convention concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, that is to say:—

14. Bribery, defined to be the offering, giving, or receiving of bribes made criminal by the laws of both countries.

15. Offences, if made criminal by the laws of both countries, against bankruptcy law.

ARTICLE II.

The present Convention shall be considered as an integral part of the said Extradition Conventions of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nide, and the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, and the first Article of the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, shall be read as if the lists of crimes therein contained had originally comprised the additional crimes specified and

numbered fourteen and fifteen in the first Article of the

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged either at Washington or London as soon as possible.

It shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the laws of the High Contracting Parties, and it shall continue and terminate in the same manner as the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

In testimony whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention in duplicate, and have thereunto affixed their scals.

Done at London, this twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged at Washington on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Ilim by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-second day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the United States and of the said Convention with the President of the United States of America.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

REGULATION RELATING TO THE USE OF HARMLESS COLOURING MATTER IN CERTAIN ARTICLES OF FOOD.

THE Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers HE Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following regulation amending the regulations made by the said Board on the 11th May, 1906, and published in the Government Gazette of the 8th August, 1906, relating to the labelling of articles of food or of wrappers or receptacles containing articles of food mixed with preservative substances or with foreign colouring matters, that is to say:—

Notwithstanding anything in clause I. of the said regulations it shall not be necessary to set forth or indicate by label or by any other means the presence of harmless vegetable colouring matter in butter or whole-milk cheese, or of harmless colouring matter in raspberry jam or plum jam.

This regulation shall take effect from the thirty-first day of March, 1907.

REGULATIONS EXEMPTING PACKAGES OF ARTICLES OF FOOD FROM CERTAIN LABEL-LING PROVISIONS OF THE PURE FOOD ACT 1905, AND ALLOWING SALE BY APPROXIMATE WEIGHT OR MEASURE.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the regulations following, that is to say :-

r. Packages as described hereunder shall be exempt from all of the provisions of section 15 of the Pure Food Act 1905 relating to labelling:—

Unsealed packages of articles of food (excepting tea, coffee, and mixed articles of food within the meaning of section 46 of the Health Act 1890) packed on retail premises for early sale.

2. Packages of the articles of food named or described hereunder shall be exempt from such of the provisions of

section 15 of the Purc Food Act 1905 as require informa-tion, by an accompanying or attached label, tag, or state-ment, as to the weight or number or measure or volume of the contents :-

- (a) Mixed articles of food within the meaning of section 46 of the Health Act in unscaled packages packed on retail premises for early sale.
- Aerated waters.
- (c) Ginger in jars or in fancy packages.
- (d) Soup sausages.
- (e) Ginger-beer powders and other beverage-powders.

3. Articles of food in packages as described hereunder shall, subject to the conditions stated, be exempt from such of the provisions of section 15 of the Pure Food Act 1905 as require on an accompanying label the name and address of the vendor or maker thereof or agent therefor, or of the owner of the rights of manufacture :-

Any package to which is affixed a label bearing a registered trade mark approved by the Board of Public Health: provided that the proprietor of the said registered trade mark shall have given to the Board an undertaking in a form approved by the Board, accepting, in respect of any such package purchased unopened, all the responsibilities imposed by section 16 of the Pure Food Act 1905, and provided further that to every such package a label is attached stating that the proprietor of the said registered trade mark accepts full responsibility under the said Act for the contents of the said package.

The sale by approximate weight or measure is hereby

4. The sale by approximate weight or measure is hereby 4. The sale by approximate weight or measure is hereby allowed in the case of any article of food (except milk, infants' food, and invalids' food) packed in a glass or stoneware receptacle, provided that the actual weight or measure is not more than five (5) per cent. under the labelled weight or measure of the contents of such receptacle, and provided further, that by the use of the word "approximate" or "approximately" it is clearly set out in the label that the stated weight or measure of the contents of the said receptacle is approximate.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against the Pure ood Act 1905 is liable on conviction to the penalty prescribed therein.

These regulations shall take effect from the thirty-first day of March, 1907.

- 5. For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by J. A. Carey, valuer, returned on the twenty-second day of February, 1907, and adopted by the said Commission on the fourth day of March, 1907, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless such valuation be altered or amended as provided by the Water Act 1905, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.
