SUPPLEMENTARY CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR THE EXTRADITION OF FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

With reference to Mr. Chamberlain's circular despatch of the 25th of July, 1901, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony, a copy of an Order of His Majesty in Council giving effect to a supplementary Convention between the United Kingdom and the United States of America for the extradition of fugitive criminals signed on the 12th of April, 1905, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Washington on the 21st of December, 1906.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. RELATING TO THE UNITED STATES EXTRADI- TION ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1907.

BUCKINGHAM PALACE, 11TH FEBRUARY, 1907.

*At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of
February, 1907.*

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in

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the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, between His Majesty and the President of the United States of America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following :—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the United States of America, being desirous of enlarging the list of crimes on account of which extradition may be granted under the Conventions concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, with a view to the better administration of justice and the prevention of crime in their respective territories and jurisdictions, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, to wit :

His Britannic Majesty, the Most Honourable Henry Charles Keith Petty-Fitzmaurice, Marquess of Lansdowne, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And the President of the United States, the Honourable Joseph Hodges Choate, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States at the Court of His Britannic Majesty;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, which were found to be in due and proper form, have agreed to and concluded the following Articles :—

ARTICLE I.

The following crimes are added to the list of crimes numbered one to ten in the first Article of the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and to the list of crimes numbered eleven to thirteen in Article I. of the Supplementary Convention concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, that is to say :—

14. Bribery, defined to be the offering, giving, or receiving of bribes made criminal by the laws of both countries.

15. Offences, if made criminal by the laws of both countries, against bankruptcy law.

ARTICLE II.

The present Convention shall be considered as an integral part of the said Extradition Conventions of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the thirteenth December, one thousand nine hundred, and the first Article of the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, shall be read as if the lists of crimes therein contained had originally comprised the additional crimes specified and

numbered fourteen and fifteen in the first Article of the present Convention.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged either at Washington or London as soon as possible.

It shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the laws of the High Contracting Parties, and it shall continue and terminate in the same manner as the said Convention of the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

In testimony whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention in duplicate, and have thereunto affixed their seals.

Done at London, this twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged at Washington on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-second day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the United States and of the said Convention with the President of the United States of America.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

WELLINGTON PROVINCE.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

REGULATION RELATING TO THE USE OF HARMLESS COLOURING MATTER IN CERTAIN ARTICLES OF FOOD.

THE Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following regulation amending the regulations made by the said Board on the 11th May, 1906, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th August, 1906, relating to the labelling of articles of food or of wrappers or receptacles containing articles of food mixed with preservative substances or with foreign colouring matters, that is to say:—

Notwithstanding anything in clause I. of the said regulations it shall not be necessary to set forth or indicate by label or by any other means the presence of harmless vegetable colouring matter in butter or whole-milk cheese, or of harmless colouring matter in raspberry jam or plum jam.

This regulation shall take effect from the thirty-first day of March, 1907.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Packages as described hereunder shall be exempt from all of the provisions of section 15 of the *Pure Food Act* 1905 relating to labelling:—

Unsealed packages of articles of food (excepting tea, coffee, and mixed articles of food within the meaning of section 46 of the *Health Act* 1890) packed on retail premises for early sale.

2. Packages of the articles of food named or described hereunder shall be exempt from such of the provisions of

section 15 of the *Pure Food Act* 1905 as require information, by an accompanying or attached label, tag, or statement, as to the weight or number or measure or volume of the contents:—

- (a) Mixed articles of food within the meaning of section 46 of the *Health Act* in unsealed packages packed on retail premises for early sale.
- (b) Aerated waters.
- (c) Ginger in jars or in fancy packages.
- (d) Soup sausages.
- (e) Ginger-beer powders and other beverage-powders.

3. Articles of food in packages as described hereunder shall, subject to the conditions stated, be exempt from such of the provisions of section 15 of the *Pure Food Act* 1905 as require on an accompanying label the name and address of the vendor or maker thereof or agent therefor, or of the owner of the rights of manufacture:—

Any package to which is affixed a label bearing a registered trade mark approved by the Board of Public Health: provided that the proprietor of the said registered trade mark shall have given to the Board an undertaking in a form approved by the Board, accepting, in respect of any such package purchased unopened, all the responsibilities imposed by section 16 of the *Pure Food Act* 1905, and provided further that to every such package a label is attached stating that the proprietor of the said registered trade mark accepts full responsibility under the said Act for the contents of the said package.

4. The sale by approximate weight or measure is hereby allowed in the case of any article of food (except milk, infants' food, and invalids' food) packed in a glass or stoneware receptacle, provided that the actual weight or measure is not more than five (5) per cent. under the labelled weight or measure of the contents of such receptacle, and provided further, that by the use of the word "approximate" or "approximately" it is clearly set out in the label that the stated weight or measure of the contents of the said receptacle is approximate.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against the *Pure Food Act* 1905 is liable on conviction to the penalty prescribed therein.

These regulations shall take effect from the thirty-first day of March, 1907.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 24.

GENERAL RATE.—RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate made in accordance with the provisions of the said by-laws or regulations for payment of which rate such persons shall have become liable prior to or at the date of this by-law coming into operation; nor to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate; nor to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said by-laws or regulations prior to the date of this by-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of section 62 of the *Water Act* 1905, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands

within the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any urban division thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands and for watering cattle or other stock—

- (1) Of all lands in the first division, comprising all lands in the aforesaid district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described hereunder comprised within the second division, and excepting and excluding all lands set out and described hereunder comprised within the third division—a rate of Sixpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

4. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

5. For making and levying such rate the net annual value of the lands set out in the valuation made by J. A. Carey, valuer, returned on the twenty-second day of February, 1907, and adopted by the said Commission on the fourth day of March, 1907, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless such valuation be altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act* 1905, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

ADDITIONS TO CERTAIN CLAUSES RELATING TO RESIDENCE
AREAS.**

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Bendigo, begun and holden at Bendigo, in the said district, on the 4th day of December, 1906, it is ordained by the said Board as follows (that is to say):—

That the following addition be made to clause 15 of section IX. of General By-law No. 14, enacted on the 1st day of May, 1894, referring to residence areas:—

“Except in the Borough of Eaglehawk, where no person will be entitled to take up more than one-quarter of an acre within one mile and a half of the Town Hall, and such residence area shall not have a frontage of more than 66 feet to any road or street, except corner blocks facing two or more streets or roads, when any such block shall not have a frontage of more than 165 feet to any street or road.”

And also, that the following addition be made to clause 17, section IX., of the General By-law No. 14, enacted on the 1st day of May, 1894, referring to residence areas:—

“Except within one mile and a half of the Town Hall, in the Borough of Eaglehawk.”

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING BY-LAW.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust district, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st April, 1907.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure, to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purpose beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings.

12th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick-work, or plastering.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust on the 25th March, 1907.

WHEREAS by section 128 of the *Water Act* 1905 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by the occupier or owner of any land or tenement liable to be rated by any Waterworks Trust.

direct to or from any premises abutting thereon at a
greater speed than four miles an hour.

3. Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor
car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between
sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front
thereof, and shall keep the same lighted so as to exhibit
an adequate light in the direction in which such person
is proceeding.

4. Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor
car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the
near or left hand side of the road, and whenever over-
taking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or
any horse or other beast of burden, such person to the
right or off side thereof, and any such person over-
taking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or
any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger
proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a
reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon,
cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other
beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a
bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his
or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any
motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or
other beast of burden, and where such horse or other
beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall
cease to be under the due control of the person for the
time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding
such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount
as speedily as possible and render assistance if required,
and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reason-
ably necessary.
