ORDER IN COUNCIL. SEAMEN DESERTERS IN NICARAGUA. Buckingham Palace, 1st March, 1907.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of March, 1907. PRESENT:

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894, it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Government of the Republic of Nicaragua will give due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in that country.

Now therefore His Majesty by virtue of the power vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare that the said section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 shall apply in the case of the Republic of Nicaragua. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless ted by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed the committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or sarubs.
