## Factories and Shops Acts.

### DETERMINATION OF THE FARRIERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier has made the following Determination; namely:—

(1) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier shall be—

Foreman (i.e., a responsible person in charge of a fire)	.. ..	52s.	for a maximum number of 48 hours per week
All other journeymen	.. ..	48s.	.. .. ..

(2) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier shall be the following:—

IMPROVERS.

NUMBER.

(4) That the number of improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place in which the process, trade, or business of a farrier is carried on shall be one improver to every three adult males or fraction thereof.

OVERTIME.

(5) That any male employé over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a farrier who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(6) That the above Determination shall come into force on and after the 3rd day of June, 1907.
