Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO FIX THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES OF PAYMENT FOR BREADMAKING OR BAKING.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment for breadmaking or baking has made the following determination, namely:—

1. That all previous determinations made by the Board be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this determination comes into force and is operative.

2. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to—

All persons engaged in breadmaking or baking shall be 1s. 1½d. per hour, or £2 14s. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

3. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices shall be as follows:—

1st year's experience at trade	..	7s. 6d.	per week of 48 hours.
2nd	..	10s.	..
3rd	..	17s. 6d.	..
4th	..	22s. 6d.	..
5th	..	27s. 6d.	..

4. That the number of improvers who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the breadmaking trade shall be one improver to every five persons receiving the minimum wage of £2 14s. per week, as determined by the Board, except in weeks in which a general holiday in the breadmaking trade is observed, when the total amount received by each of the five persons referred to may be proportionately reduced.

5. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to such improvers shall be as follows:—

Under 18 years of age.

1st year's experience at trade	..	10s.	per week of 48 hours
2nd	..	15s.	..
3rd	..	20s.	..
4th	..	30s.	..

Over 18 years of age.

1st year's experience at trade	..	15s.	per week of 48 hours.
2nd	..	20s.	..
3rd	..	25s.	..
4th	..	30s.	..

And thereafter 1s. 1½d. per hour, or £2 14s. per week of 48 hours.

6. That any male person over the age of sixteen years who may be employed in breadmaking or baking for more than 48 hours per week shall be paid for such extra hours time and a third.

7. That the above determination shall come into force from and after the 5th day of August, 1907.
