## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

## BY-LAW No. 204.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal all previous By-laws, Conditions, Practices, Instructions, Classifications, Fares, Rates, and Charges whatsoever as relate thereto or conflict therewith:—

The several Fares, Rates, and Charges which shall be imposed in respect of the conveyance of Passengers, and the carriage of Parcels, Excess Luggage, &c., and Live Stock by passenger trains over the Victorian Railways, and the Classification and Conditions under which Passengers will be conveyed, and Parcels, Luggage, &c., and Live Stock carried by passenger trains shall be as set forth in this By-law.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the fifteenth day of August, 1908.  $_{\circ}$

## DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS.

Wherever in the Passenger Fares Book the following terms are used, such terms shall have the meaning prescribed in the definition or interpretation shown hereunder in respect of each such term:—

## GENERAL BY-LAWS.

## Melbourne time to be observed .-

r. Melbourne time is to be observed at all stations.

## Passengers to obtain tickets and deliver up the same on demand. Tickets not to be used for any other day than for which issued.—

2. No passenger shall enter at a booking station, or travel from any such station in any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners unless furnished with a pass or ticket entitling him to enter or travel therein.

Any intending passenger on paying the prescribed fare will be furnished with a ticket, and every passenger shall show his pass or ticket to, and allow it to be marked by, any authorized employé of the Commissioners whenever so required by such employé, and the holder of any return ticket shall, if so required, produce the return half on the forward journey. Every pass or ticket, whether single, return, or periodical, shall be delivered up on demand of any such employé.

employé.

Any ticket not used on the day, within the period, or for the journey for which it was issued, and any return ticket not used within the prescribed time, shall be deemed cancelled.

Any person who shall travel without a proper pass or ticket, or who shall fail or refuse to show or deliver up such pass or ticket upon demand as aforesaid, shall pay the fare from the station whence the train originally started, or the then previous checking station (if any) which ever shall be the nearer to the end of his journey, and, in addition, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Any person who shall use or attempt to use any pass or ticket in contravention of, or be otherwise guilty of a breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Sale and purchase of tickets. Passengers using expired tickets.—

3. Tickets are the property of the Commissioners, and are not transferable. Any person not duly authorized by the Commissioners who shall sell or attempt to sell any pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or who shall use or attempt to use a transferred pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or a licket, the time for using which has expired, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Any person who shall travel on such pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket or expired ticket, shall in addition be liable to pay the fare which he would have been liable to pay for the journey. Tickets are the property of the Commissioners, and are not transferable.

## Booking at intermediate stations to continue journey by same train.-

4. No passenger, unless he join the train at a stopping place where tickets are not issued, "or unless he be the then holder of an ordinary full fare ticket to the intermediate station at which he alights, and also rebooks at the full ordinary rate without deriving any advantage as regards fare by the double booking, shall take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Tickets only to be used between stations named thereon and by proper trains.

5. No ticket, whether single or return, shall be used by a passenger for a journey other than that between the stations named thereon, or to a station between those so named, and in the latter event only if the passenger, by so using the ticket, derive no advantage as regards fare. A Workman's Ticket and an Excursion Ticket shall not be used for any other train than that for which they may have been issued. A holder of a Workman's Weekly Ticket who leaves a train on the forward journey at any station before the destination shown on such ticket, shall not continue his journey to such destination except upon payment of the ordinary fare from the place at which he resumes such journey.

Any person who uses or attempts to use a ticket in contravention of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Any person who shall use a ticket for any other station than that for which it is available shall pay the difference (if any) between the sum actually paid and the fare between the stations from and to which the passenger has travelled, in addition to the penalty.

### Breakage of journey on tickets.-

6. No passenger shall break his journey at an intermediate station and thereafter proceed by a subsequent train on the same ticket, unless by permission of the officer-in-charge, or authorized by the regulations of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Defaced tickets not to be recognised.

7. No ticket shall be recognised by any employe of the Commissioners unless the number, date, and names of the stations on such tickets are legible.

Any person who shall use or attempt to use any ticket defaced, mutilated, altered, or illegible in any of the above particulars, will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and, in addition to the amount of the fare, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Passengers not to place their feet on seats. -

8. No passenger shall place his foot or feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## Expectorating on station premises or rolling stock .-

o. No person shall expectorate upon the floor or any other part of any carriage, vehicle, waiting-room, or platform of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## Male passengers not to enter waiting-rooms or carriages set apart for females.-

10. No male person shall enter any room, carriage, or other vehicle set apart for the accommodation of females, and any such person who shall enter such room, carriage, or other vehicle, or remain therein after being warned to leave the same, may be removed therefrom, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Full fare passengers only to travel in smoking compartments.—

11. No person shall travel in any compartment of any carriage set apart for smoking unless 11. No person shall travel in any compartment of any carriage set apart for smoking unless he shall have paid the adult fare for the time being in force, notwithstanding he may be the holder of a certificate purporting to authorize him to travel at a less fare. Any person found so travelling, who refuses either to pay such adult fare or to quit such compartment when required so to do by an authorized employé of the Commissioners, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## Smoking in places not set apart for the purpose.-

12. No person shall smoke in any shed or covered platform of a station, or in any building, or on any pier, jetty, or wharf of the Commissioners, or in any carriage, or other vehicle, or compartment thereof not specially provided for that purpose. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## Entering or leaving carriages when in motion, &c.-

13. No person, other than an employé of the Commissioners, shall, without reasonable excuse, enter, or leave, or attempt to enter or leave any carriage or other vehicle while the train is in motion, or elsewhere than at the side of the carriage or other vehicle adjoining the platform or other place appointed by the Commissioners for persons to enter or leave the same. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Opening carriage doors or getting through windows.—

14. No person, other than an employé of the Commissioners, shall, without reasonable excuse, enter or leave any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners by getting through a window, or shall open a locked carriage door with a key or other instrument at any time, or any door, whether locked or not, while the train is in motion. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Travelling on roof, steps, &c., of carriage.

15. No person, other than an employé of the Commissioners, shall, without reasonable excuse, travel on the roof, steps, or footboard of any carriage or other vehicle, or on an engine or on any portion of any carriage or other vehicle not intended for the conveyance of passengers. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds

## Persons intoxicated or committing any nuisance.-

16. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in a carriage or other vehicle, or be upon any station or premises of the Commissioners, and no person shall in or upon any such carriage, vehicle, station, or premises, commit any nuisance, or gamble, or write, or use any insulting, indecent, obscene, blasphemous, abusive, or offensive words, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this Bylaw may be summarily removed from such carriage, vehicle, station, or premises, and shall be liable, in addition, to a penalty not exceeding Tea pounds.

17. The Commissioners may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious or contagious disease. No person who has any such disease shall, without the authority of the Commissioners, resort to or come upon any premises of the Commissioners, or travel, or attempt to travel, on any railway. No person who has charge of any person who has any such disease shall, without the like authority, aid or assist the person having any such disease to travel, or attempt to travel, on the railway. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from any such premises or from any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners, and shall forfeit any fare which he may have paid, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Making use of means of communication between passengers and Railway servants.

18. No person shall make use of the means of communication between the passengers and employés of the Commissioners in charge of a train, or apply any brake, without reasonable excuse. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Gratuities not to be offered to Employes -

19. No person shall give or offer a gratuity to any employé of the Commissioners under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## Obstructing employes in the execution of their duty -

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any employé of the Commissioners in the execution of his duty. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Lost property or documents found to be handed over. -

21. Any person who finds any lost property upon any station or premises, or in or upon any carriage or vehicle, of the Commissioners shall immediately hand over the same to the officer-in-charge of the railway station at or nearest the place where such property was found, or to the guard in charge of the train. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Injuring or removing Railway property-

22. No person shall wilfully or negligently injure any lining, shutter, or blind, or break or deface any window, or remove or injure any number-plate, notice, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any lamp of, or in, any carriage, or otherwise damage any fittings, carriage, or other property of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this Hylaw shall be liable to pay the amount of the damage done, and, in addition, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Persons omitting to shut and fasten gates, &c .-

23. No person shall omit to shut and securely fasten any gate set up at either side of the railway for the accommodation of the owner or occupier of the adjoining lands as soon as he and any vehicle, cattle, or other animals under his care have passed through the same. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Posting placards on Railway property or premises.—

24. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Commissioners, shall post, stick, paint, or write, or cause to be posted, stuck, painted, or written, any placard, bill, advertisement, or other matter within or on any post, fence, gate, platform, wall, building, or other property or premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Sales on Railway premises.—

25. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Commissioners, shall sell or attempt to sell any article on any railway premises. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Trespassing on Railway premises.—

a6. No person shall wilfully trespass upon any railway, pier, wharf, jetty, station, land, or other premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Persons to leave Railway premises when required to do so .-

27. Any person (unless holding a platform ticket), not being an intending passenger in possession of a ticket, who does not leave any premises of the Commissioners when required so to do by an authorized employé of the Commissioners, may be removed therefrom, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Persons crossing at unauthorized places.-

28. No person shall cross, or attempt to cross, any line of railway elsewhere than at an authorized crossing-place, or cross, or attempt to cross, any line of railway at an authorized crossing-place when warned so not to do by an employe of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Persons crossing Line to use overbridge or subway where provided.

29. No person on foot (excepting a person in charge of a vehicle or live stock) shall cross, or attempt to cross, any line of railway on the level at a station, or any other place where an overbridge or subway is provided. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Unauthorized persons soliciting custom.-

'30. No person, unless duly authorized in writing by the Commissioners, shall come in or upon any carriage, vehicle, or premises of the Commissioners, for the purpose of removing any passenger's luggage for reward unless engaged by him for such purpose, and no person, unless so authorized as aforesaid, shall solicit custom or hire in or upon any carriage, vehicle, or premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from such carriage, vehicle, or premises, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Drivers of vehicles to be provided with written licence.-

31. No driver of any hackney carriage, omnibus, cart, dray, or other public vehicle shall ply for hire within any premises of the Commissioners without a licence in writing from them. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds:

## Drivers of vehicles to obey directions of Railway Officers .-

32. Every driver of an omnibus, cab, carriage, cart, dray, or other vehicle shall, while in or upon any station, yard, or other premises of the Commissioners, obey the reasonable directions of any authorized employé of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Horses, vehicles, &c., not to be driven at dangerous speed.-

33. No person shall drive any horse or horses attached to a vehicle, or drive any motor-car or other machine through, into, or out of any railway station, yard, or premises of the Commissioners, at a rate of speed involving danger to others. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Horses, bicycles, &c., not to be ridden or driven except where set apart . therefor.-

34. No person shall ride or drive any horse, or any bicycle, motor-car, or other machine aga. No person shall ride of drive any noise, or any blocker, motor-car, or other machine upon or along any railway, pier, wharf, jetty, platform, or any pathway, subway, or other way used in connexion with any of the railway stations, buildings, piers, wharfs, or jetties vested in, used by, or under the control of the Commissioners, and set apart for the exclusive use of pedestrians. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Traction engines, road engines, or other vehicles crossing Line .-

35. No person shall take or attempt to take across any railway on the level any traction engine, road engine, or any vehicle of whatsoever description the weight of which on any wheel exceeds 3 tons or 6 tons on any axle, or any vehicle or contrivance having thereon any load exceeding 14 feet in height or 12 feet in width, or any load that is exceptional and will cause, or will be likely to cause, an obstruction of the railway, unless such person shall have given 48 hours' previous notice, in writing, of his intention to so cross, particularizing the place and time where and when he intends to cross, and the name and address of the owner of such engine, vehicle, or load to the Station-master or Officer in charge of any railway station, which is also a telegraph station, or the railway station next adjacent to the point at which such person proposes to so cross such railway, provided a man be in charge of such station, and unless and until such person has made such provision as may be tequired by the Commissioners to prevent any injury being done to railway property or such railway by reason of the crossing of such engine, vehicle, or load. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Loaded firearms not to be carried .-

36. No person shall, without the written authority of the Commissioners, take or place into or upon, or discharge from or upon any premises, carriage, or other vehicle of the Commissioners any loaded firearm. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Missiles, rubbish, &c., not to be thrown.—

37. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, at or from any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners, or on to any railway, or any station building, pier, wharf, jetty, land, or other premises vested in, used by, or under the control of the Commissioners, any glass, stone, or other missile, or any filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### Polluting water in Railway reservoirs, &c .-

38. No person shall bathe in or pollute the water of any reservoir or tank connected with any railway of the Commissioners, and no person shall fish or shoot in, over, or upon any such reservoir or tank without the consent in writing of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Poison not to be placed on Railway Station, &c .-

39. Any person putting or placing any poison, or any poisoned meat, grain, or any poisoned substance whatsoever, on or upon any railway, railway station, or railway reserve, save with the authority of the Commissioners, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Sewage, drainage, &c., not to be placed or emptied on Railway premises.--

40. No person shall permit to flow, or empty or place or cause or suffer to flow or to be emptied or placed, any sewage, night-soil, drainage, or other offensive matter, on to or upon any railway, or any station, building, pier, wharf, jetty, land, or other premises vested in or used by or under the control of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### Animals not to be driven across the line at unauthorized places. -

41. No person, whether with or without a vehicle, shall ride or drive, or attempt to ride or drive, any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, across any line of railway on the level thereof when a train is in sight and in motion coming towards such place, or when warning of its approach has been given by a whistle, or when warned so not to do by an employé of the Commissioners. Every person when crossing shall use all possible despatch to cross such line. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Allowing animals to stray on Railway premises or lands.—

42. No person shall drive or negligently allow any cattle, horse, sheep, swine, or other animal to stray upon any line of railway or premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### Conveyance of dogs or other animals in carriages.—

43. No person shall take into or have in his charge in any carriage or other vehicle intended for the conveyance of passengers, any dog or other animal, except under the conditions imposed for the conveyance of such dog or other animal. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds; and any such dog or other animal may be forthwith removed from any such carriage or vehicle, and from the premises of the Commissioners.

#### Diseased animals on Railway premises. -

44. The Commissioners may refuse to catry any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, bird, or other live stock which they reasonably believe to be diseased. No person shall wilfully or negligently drive or bring, or cause, or permit to be driven or brought upon or into any station yard, shed, or premises of the Commissioners, any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, bird, or other live stock, having or suffering from any disease whatsoever. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Destroying, damaging, or defacing By-Laws.—

45. Any person who destroys, damages, or defaces, or tampers with any copy of a By-law exhibited or placed on any railway premises shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

### By-Laws not to be waived ---

46. No employé of the Commissioners has any authority to waive, dispense with, or vary these By-laws or any of them.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR PASSENGER TRAFFIC.

(Supplementary to General By-Laws shown on Pages 13-20.)

- 1. ALL TRAFFIC is carried subject to the Railways Acts and the By-laws of the Commissioners, as well as to the following Regulations.
- 2. Times of Trains.—The times stated in the published Time-Tables are those at which it is intended, so far as the circumstances will permit, that the trains should arrive at, and depart from, the various stations; but the Commissioners do not guarantee the departure or arrival of trains at the times stated, nor will they be responsible for delay or any consequences arising therefrom.
- 3. Before commencing their journey, passengers should refer to the published Time-Tables, or make inquiry from the officer in charge, to ascertain whether they can reach their destination on the desired date. The Commissioners will not be responsible for any loss or detention arising from the omission of passengers to adopt this course.
- 4. Tickets issued at intermediate stations when there is room in Trains.—Where passengers are booked at an intermediate station for any train, it is in all cases on condition that there is room in such train, and when there is not sufficient room for all such passengers, those booked for the longest distance shall have the preference, and those booked for the same distance shall have priority according to the order in which they are respectively booked.
- 5. Passengers to have Tickets Ready.—Passengers are requested to have their tickets in readiness for inspection at the places where they are required to be shown.
- 6. Suburban Passengers not Booked by Country Trains.—Except where otherwise specified passengers will not be booked to travel by any country trains between any two stations within a radius of ten (10) miles of Melbourne, or between Melbourne and any such stations. Provided that passengers holding either All-Lines, or Sectional Periodical Tickets available for the journey, may be picked up at any Station within the Suburban radius at which trains are scheduled to pick up passengers, and may be set down at any station within the Suburban radius at which trains are scheduled to set down passengers.
- 7. Entering Stations.—No person will be allowed to enter any station on the Suburban Lines, or any other station at which the barrier system is in force, unless provided with a proper ticket, which must be produced for inspection.
- 8. Platform Tickets.—Platform Tickets are issued at Melbourne and country stations to persons who require admission to the platforms.
- 9. Passengers should procure Tickets before the arrival of the train at the station from which they intend travelling, as no tickets will be issued after the arrival of the trains at the platform, except at Refreshment Room stations, where tickets will be issued up to five minutes before the advertised time of departure of trains.
- 10. Tickets Lost or Mislaid.—The Commissioners do not undertake to refund money or make allowance in respect of any ticket, pass, or symbol which has been lost or mislaid.

## 11. Refunds on Surrendered Tickets-

- (a) PORTIONS OF RETURN TICKETS,—In bond fide cases in which the holders of the return halves of tickets are prevented from travelling on the return journey, a refund will be allowed of the difference, if any, between the return fare paid and the single fare, provided that application be made to, and the ticket is lodged with, the General Passenger and Freight Agent before the expiry of the period for which it is available.
- (b) Periodical Tickets.—Refunds, as under, will be allowed on periodical tickets surrendered to the General Passenger and Freight Agent during their currency:—
  - Monthly Tickets.—One return journey for each day the ticket is in the passenger's possession will be charged for at the ordinary return fare, and the balance refunded.
  - Quarterly Tickets.—The time during which the ticket is in the passenger's possession will be charged for on the monthly fare basis, and the balance refunded.
  - Half-yearly Tickets.—The time during which the ticket is in the passenger's possession will be charged for on the monthly or quarterly fare basis, as the case may be, and the balance refunded.
  - Yearly Tickets.—The time during which the ticket is in the passenger's possession will be charged for on the monthly, quarterly, or half-yearly fare basis, as the case may be, and the balance refunded.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS—continued.

12. Periodical Tickets.—Periodical Tickets are available up to the date of expiry printed, written, or engraved on them by the employés of the Commissioners. The journey may be broken at any intermediate station between those named or symbolized on the tickets. Quarterly, Half-yearly, and Yearly Tickets are issued on the first day of January, April, July, and October. They will, however, be issued during the currency of a quarter upon payment of the full charge for a Quarterly, Half-yearly, or Yearly Ticket from the first of the ensuing quarter and a provata charge for the unexpired portion of the current quarter. Suburban Monthly Tickets are issued on the first day of the month, and are available up to and inclusive of the first day of the succeeding month. Country Monthly Tickets are issued on the first day of the month, and are available till the last day of the month. Suburban or country monthly tickets can be obtained during the currency of a month on payment of the full rate for the succeeding month, plus a provata charge for the unexpired portion of the current month.

When a pro rata ticket is required Form P19 must be filled in and signed by the applicant. For sample of form see page 162.

Yearly, Half-yearly, and Quarterly Tickets may be renewed seven days, and Monthly Tickets three days, prior to the first of the month, but the ticket then current must be given up. New applicants can only obtain such tickets on or after the first day of the month except as provided above

13. Deposits on Periodical Tickets.—Deposits on Periodical Tickets are required as under. The ticket must be returned within seven days after expiry, or the deposit will be forfeited, unless the holder can satisfy the Station-master that he was absent from the district, or unable to return it through illness:—

The deposits prescribed in Clause B will also apply to Periodical tickets issued between station within the suburban radius of Ballarat and Buninyong, North Creswick and Newtown.

Any passenger seeking renewal of his or her Monthly Ticket, and being unable to produce the old ticket, will be charged One shilling.

- 14. Lost Periodical Tickets.—When a Periodical Ticket is lost, the person to whom it was issued can obtain a duplicate on handing to the Station-master at the station where the original ticket was procured a declaration (Form P53) made before a Justice of the Peace, stating when, and, as well as possible, the circumstances under which the ticket was lost, and paying 10 per cent. of the value of the ticket for the unexpired time it could have been used, minimum 1s. It will, in addition, be necessary to pay the cost of preparing a new ticket, which, in the case of Country lines tickets will be 2s. 6d. each, and Suburban lines tickets 1s. each, provided that no charge shall be made for Monthly Suburban Tickets. When a platform ticket is lost a declaration must be made as prescribed above for periodical tickets, and a charge of One shilling made for the duplicate ticket. See sample of form on page 180.
- 15. Periodical Ticket-holders unable to produce their Tickets.—Periodical Ticket holders shall pay the ordinary fare for travelling whenever they cannot produce their tickets to the employés of the Commissioners.
- 16. Children.—Children not exceeding three (3) years of age will be carried free, and above three (3) years, and not exceeding fourteen (14) years of age, will be charged half-fare.
- 17. Conditions under which Periodical Tickets are Issued.—All Periodical Tickets are issued subject to any alteration which may be made in the trains during the currency of such tickets, and holders will not be entitled to any allowance or compensation on account of any change in the time, or reduction in the number of trains.
- 18. Fractional Parts of Days, Pence, and Miles shall, unless otherwise specified, be charged as under:—
  - 1. DAYS .-- Any fractional part of a day as one day.
  - 2. Pence.—Except where otherwise specified, fractions of one penny less than one halfpenny will not be charged for; halfpenny and over will be charged for as one penny, provided that in calculating half fares on the suburban lines a farthing will be charged as a halfpenny, and three farthings as a penny.
  - 3. Miles.—Except where otherwise specified, fractions of a mile less than half-a-mile will not be charged for, half-a-mile and over will be charged for as one mile.

- 19. Passengers not to lean out of Carriage Doors or Windows.—No passenger shall project or lean his head, or other part of his person out of any doorway, window, or other aperture of, or in any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners, and the Commissioners will not be liable for injury which a passenger may sustain in consequence of the non-observance of this regulation.
- 20. Sleeping-cars are intended only for the use of passengers requiring sleeping berths; passengers who are allowed to take seats therein, and who do not hold sleeping-berth tickets, shall vacate them and remove into another carriage when requested by the guard or conductor.
- 21. Giving Change.—In order to avoid inconvenience and delay, passengers should provide themselves with the exact amount of the fare, as Booking Clerks are not able at all times to give change.
- 22. Reserved Compartments.—On payment of six (6) First Class Fares, a First Class compartment can be reserved, entitling any number of passengers up to six (6) to travel in such reserved compartment.

On payment of eight (8) Second Class Fares, a Second Class compartment can be reserved, entitling any number of passengers up to eight (8) to travel in such reserved compartment.

To secure either of the foregoing concessions passengers must give notice to the station-master, at a terminal station, not later than two hours before the time of departure of the train, if the passengers are travelling from such station, or on the previous day if the compartment is required from an intermediate station. This accommodation cannot, however, be given during Christmas and Easter Holidays, or Melbourne "Cup" traffic, or at any other time when the traffic is heavy.

Persons suffering from contagious diseases may, subject to the provisions of General By-law 17 (see page 17), have a Second Class compartment, or a special van, reserved, on payment of 6d, per mile for the journey, minimum 10%, cutilling the patient and one attendant to travel. Excess Fare Ticket must be issued for the total charges.

- 23. Reporting Irregularities, &c.-lt is particularly requested that any irregularity, incivility, or misconduct on the part of employés may be reported to the General Superintendent of Transportation, Spencer-street, Melbourne.
- 24. Travelling by Goods Train. Goods Trains (those conveying explosives excepted) as per list shown in the addenda to the l'assenger Farcs Book, may be stopped to pick up er set down passengers at any station outside the Suburban Area (20 miles from Melbourne).

The following stations (to or from) are excepted from the concession, viz., Chewton, Garfield, Heyfield, Trentham, Jectho. Loch, Clyde, Wandong, Germantown, Musk, Myer, Jung, Great Western, and Armstrong on Up journey; Macedon and Riddell on Up journey when the train exceeds 25 vehicles.

When the North Geelong loop is open female passengers will not be booked nor allowed to travel to the loop by night Goods train ex Ballarat, and when male passengers are booking they are to be notified of the existing conditions necessitating their having to leave the train at a point some distance from North Geelong station.

Passengers shall hold a First Class Periodical Ticket, First Class Ordinary Return Ticket, or pay First Class Single Fare, and sign the required guarantee to enable them to travel as above. Passengers holding Second Class Periodical Tickets shall be charged the difference between the First and Second Class single fares between the stations that they are travelling from and to by goods train.

Passengers holding return halves of Second Class Return, or of any kind of Excursion (First or Second Class) Tickets, desiring to travel by Goods Trains on the homeward journey, shall be charged half the difference between the cost of the ticket held and the cost of a First Class Ordinary Return

Where only a portion of the journey covered by the ticket held is to be travelled by Goods Train the excess to be charged shall be the same as if the passenger held a ticket only between the stations that he is travelling from and to by Goods Train.

25. Booking Arrangements in Melbourne.—The Central Booking Office corner of Flinders and Swanston streets, and the Booking Offices at Spencer-street and Prince's bridge stations will issue tickets for Country stations at any time while the offices are open, and, if required, tickets may be obtained seven days prior to the date on which they are to be used.

#### AVAILABILITY OF TICKETS.

Single and Return Tickets issued between stations on the Suburban Lines, i.e., within a radius of 20 railway miles from Melbourne, will be available only on the day of issue. The journey can be broken at Melbourne, but not at any other intermediate station, unless the ticket is forfeited.

#### EXCESS FARES.

### 1. Travelling without a Ticket.

(A) When a passenger travels without a ticket and there is no attempt to defraud, the single fare from the starting or last checking station shall be collected, unless the Guard certifies to the station at which the passenger joins the train, in which case the single fare from such station only shall be charged, or, if the passenger wishes to make the return journey on the same day, a return card ticket may be issued, the return half being collected and the forward portion handed to the passenger.

Note.—An excess fare ticket shall be made out in the case of single journeys, and a card ticket may be issued when a return journey is to be made.

(n) Where, however, there is an evident attempt to defraud on the part of the passenger, the fare will not be accepted, the offender's name and address to be taken, and the case reported to the General Passenger and Freight Agent.

#### 2. Travelling to a Station beyond that for which the passenger's ticket is available.

(A) When a passenger wishes to proceed to a station beyond that for which his ticket is available, the fact should be notified at the station where the journey is commenced. The Booking Clerk will then collect the extra fare (which will be the ordinary single or return fare for the distance), and issue an Excess Fare Ticket covering the journey.

Examples:—(1) A passenger wishing to travel from Flinders-street to Camberwell, but only holding a ticket from Flinders-street to Hawthorn, should notify the fact and pay the excess fare at Flinders-street. (2) A passenger holding a first class ticket Melbourne to Toorak wishing to journey Melbourne to Hawthorn would pay at Flinders-street 3d. single, or 44d. return, as the case may be, these being the fares between Richmond (the junction station) and Hawthorn.

Exception.—Where the fares from adjoining stations on one line to another station are alike, passengers holding tickets from the nearer station may, on the return journey, travel without extra payment to the farther station, provided they do not break the journey.

(n) Passengers holding return or periodical tickets which are available for return to another station on an alternative route, and desirous of travelling beyond such station, shall be charged the single or return fare, as the case may be, from the junction station to the destination.

For Example.—A passenger holding a return or periodical ticket Caulfield to Melbourne is entitled to travel to Elsternwick on the return journey; if he desires to travel to, say. Brighton Beach, he must pay Excess Fare as from South Yarra, single or return, as the case may be.

(c) First-class Periodical Tickets or the return halves of first-class tickets can only be excessed for an extension of the journey on payment of the first-class fare.

#### 3. Holders of Second Class tickets desiring to travel First Class.

(a) Holders of second class periodical or daily tickets desiring to travel first class may do so on payment of the difference between first and second class fares for the full journey covered by the ticket, provided, however, that a periodical ticket holder joining the train at an intermediate station may have his ticket made available first class on payment of the excess fare for the balance of the journey. Minimum charge for single journey, 2d; and for return journey, 3d.

Ecumples.—(1) A second class periodical ticket between Melbourne and Brighton will not be excessed to a first class from Melbourne to Windsor, but only for the full journey to Brighton.

- (2) A second class periodical ticket holder between Melbourne and Brighton, joining the train at Windsor for Brighton, may have his ticket excessed first class for the journey to Brighton.
- (n) When a voucher is presented for a 2nd class daily ticket on the Suburban lines, and the passenger desires to pay the extra fare to enable him to travel 1st class, he may be allowed to do so, a 2nd class ticket being issued and an excess fare ticket for the change of class.

A 2nd class periodical ticket issued on a voucher will only be excessed to travel 1st class, or for an extension of route, for individual journeys.

Exchange of Periodical Tickets.—A Periodical Ticket may be exchanged for another one available between other stations on the holder paying the difference in fare, if any, for the unexpired time for which the ticket first taken out is available, plus the cost of a new ticket, viz., 1s.; the latter charge will not be made on monthly tickets. When it is desired to exchange a ticket for another station, Form P48 must be filled in and signed by applicant. For sample of form see page 162.

Students' Tickets.—Periodical Tickets will be issued between the applicant's home station and the station nearest the school he or she attends at two-thirds fare to male students over 18 years and up to any age attending schools, colleges, or universities registered with the General Passenger and Freight Agent, provided they are not in receipt of any remuneration whatsoever from any situation, on production of certificate signed by the Principal or Registrar; and to boys under 18 years of age, and females of any age, at half-fare under same conditions.

#### AVAILABILITY OF COUNTRY TICKETS

1. Single Tickets.—Single Tickets will be available for seven (7) days from the date of issue, e.g., Monday to Monday.

The journey shall be commenced on the date shown on the ticket, but may be broken at any intermediate station or stations outside that portion of the Suburban area which is bounded by Newport, Essendon, Supshine, Preston Reservoir, Camberwell, or Cauffeld stations, provided that the whole journey shall be completed within the time for which the ticket is available.

Should the journey be broken at any of the above named suburban stations, or at any station nearer to Melbourner, the ticket shall be collected, except where it is necessary for a passenger to change at one of these suburban stations from a Country Passenger or Goods Train to a Suburban Passenger Train, or vice versa, in order to reach his desired destination, in which case the journey shall be continued by the first available train.

Single Tickets issued between stations on the Ballarat and Buninyong line will be available for the day of issue only, and the journey cannot be broken on them.

2. Return Tickets.—Return Tickets will be available as follow:—

Should the journey be broken at any of the above-named Suburban stations, or at any station nearer to Melbourne, the ticket shall be collected, except where it is necessary for a passenger to change at one of these suburban stations from a Country Passenger or Goods Train to a Suburban Passenger Train, or vice versa, in order to reach his desired destination, in which case the journey shall be continued by the first available train.

Roturt tickets issued between stations on the Ballarat and Buninyong line will be available only on the day of issue, and the journey cannot be broken on them.

Single Tickets and the forward halves of Return Tickets issued between stations between Ballarat and North Creswick and Ballarat and Newtown inclusive, will be available only on the date-of issue; the return balves may be used at any time up to seven days from the date of issue, and the journey cannot be broken on them.

- 3. Holiday Excursion Tickets.—These tickets will be issued and be available only on the dates and by the trains as advertised from time to time. Whenever Holiday Excursion Tickets are issued to and from all stations the journey may be broken in the same was provided in clause 2 for ordinary return tickets; but in no-other instance can the journey, be broken on these tickets.
- 4. Week-end Excursion Tickets.—Except where otherwise specified (see page 74), Week-end Tickets may be issued at Holiday Excursion Fares, from any station to any other station distant more than 9 miles by the last train after 12 noon on Fridays, and by all trains on Saturdays, available for return till the last through train on the following Monday, provided that such tickets will not be issued for a journey which cannot be completed within the time above specified. The journey may be broken in the same way as provided in clause 2 for ordinary Return Tickets.
- 5. Cheap Excursion Tickets.—These tickets will be issued only on the dates and by the trains as advertised from time to time. They will be available for return for one (1) calendar month. The forward journey cannot be broken, but the return journey may be broken in the same way as provided in clause 2 for Ordinary Return Tickets, provided the date of expiry of ticket is not exceeded.

Cheap Excursion Tickets may be made available by Express trains on the return journey on payment of the difference between the single Fare and half the Cheap Excursion Fare between the stations the passengers desire to travel by the Express train.

6. Expiry of Ticket—Exceptions.—When any Single, Return, or Excursion Ticket expires on a day on which no train is Funning, such ticket will be available on the next day on which a train does run; with the exception that no Return Ticket issued on the last day of a month will be available beyond the last day of a later month. Example—A Cheap Excursion Ticket issued on 31st March will be available only to 30th April; one issued on 30th March being also available to 30th

Men the return journey is commenced by a through train on the last day for which a ticket is available, and such train does not arrive at its destination till the following day, the ticket may be honoured for the through journey.

7. Extension of Time for which Tickets are Available.—Return Tickets may be extended for a further period on application to the local station-master during the currency of the tickets on payment as prescribed hereunder. In all cases of extended time an "excess fare" ticket shall be issued and carried by the passenger with the extended ticket.

ORDINARY RETURN TICKETS. —Ordinary Return Tickets for distances not exceeding 20 miles will be extended for a period not exceeding two months from the date of issue on payment of the difference between the cost of the Return Ticket and two Single Fares, or, if cheaper, the difference between the cost of the ticket and the Return Fare for 21 miles.

Ordinary Return Tickets for distances exceeding 20 miles will be extended for a further period not exceeding two months on payment of the difference between the Return Fare and two Single Fares

HOLIDAY EXCURSION TICKETS.—Holiday Excursion Tickets will be extended for a period not exceeding two months from the date of issue on payment of the difference between the Holiday Excursion and Ordinary Return fares.

Week-End Excursion Tickets.—Week-End Excursion Tickets will be extended for a further period not exceeding two months from the date of issue on payment of the difference between the Week-end Excursion and Ordinary Return fares if presented on any day up to the Friday (inclusive) following the day of issue

Sunday Excursion Tickers.—Holders of Sunday Cheap Excursion Tickets may have their tickets extended to cover the same availability as a Week-End Ticket by payment, at any time up to the departure of the last train on Monday, of the difference between the Sunday Cheap Excursion and the Week-End Fares. These tickets, if so desired, may also be extended to cover the availability of an Ordinary Return Ticket, viz., two months, by payment not later than the Friday following the date of issue of the difference between the Sunday Cheap Excursion and the Ordinary Return Fares.

Chear Excursion Tickets.—Cheap Excursion Tickets will be extended for a period 'not exceed ing two months from the date of issue on payment of the difference between half the fare paid for the Cheap Excursion Ticket and the Single Fare between the stations for which the Cheap Excursion Ticket is available, and such payment will cover return by Express trains.

#### EXCESS FARES.

I. Travelling Without a Ticket.—When a passenger travels without a ticket and there is no attempt to defraud, the single fare from the starting or last checking station shall be collected unless the guard certifies to the station at which the passenger joins the train, in which case the single fare from such station only shall be charged. A passenger laving ridden beyond the destination station to which the ticket held by him is available may be issued an excess fare ticket for the return journey to such station, but only the single fare can be accepted from a passenger travelling without a ticket. An excess fare ticket for the return journey may be issued in the case of a child over age travelling on a half ticket. Excess fare tickets shall be issued in all cases. Where, however, there is an evident attempt to defraud on the part of the passenger, the fare will not be accepted, the offender's name and address to be taken and the case reported to the General and Freight Agent.

2. Travelling to a Station Beyond that for which the Passenger's Ticket is Available, able.—When a passenger wishes to proceed to a station beyond that for which his ticket is available, the fact should be notified at the station where the journey is commenced. The Booking Clerk will then collect the extra fare (which will be the ordinary single or return fare for the distance), and issue an excess fare ticket covering the journey.

# 3.—Holders of Second Class Tickets Desiring to Travel First Class.

Holders of Second Class Tickets desiring to travel First Class shall be charged as follow for the distance actually travelled in the higher class:—

- (a) Ordinary Single Tickets.-The difference between the First and Second Class Single
- (b) Ordinary, Holiday Excursion, Week-end Excursion, Cheap Excursion, and Concession Return Tickets.—Half the difference between the First and Second Class Return Fare, Ordinary, Holiday Excursion, Week-end Excursion, Cheap Excursion, or Concession, as the case may be, for either the forward or return journeys.
- (c) Periodical Tickets.—For Single Journeys between stations for which the ticket is available, the difference between the First and Second Class Single Fare. For Return Journeys between stations for which the ticket is available, the difference between the First and Second Class Return Fares.

Minimum Charge for Single journey, 2d.; for Return journey, 3d.

#### CALCULATING MILEAGE TO AND FROM DIFFERENT LINES.

Except as provided hereunder the fares charged for the conveyance of passengers travelling from one country line to another country line shall be computed via the junction station.

- (A) Mileage between the North-Eastern, Northern, and Midland lines, and the Western lines shall be calculated viā Spencer-street.
  (B) Mileage between the Echeuca and Heathcote lines and the Swan Hill and Wycheproof lines shall be calculated viā Bendigo.
  (C) Mileage between the Melbourne to Geelong and Geelong to Ballarat lines shall be calculated viā North Geelong.
  (D) Mileage between the Linton line and the Serviceton line shall be calculated viā Ballarat.
  (E) Mileage between the Buninyong line and the Geelong and Bacchus Marsh lines shall be calculated viā Ballarat.
  (F) Mileage between the Timboon line and stations on the Down side of Timboon Junction shall be calculated viā Camperdown.
  (G) Mileage between the Shelbourne line and stations on the Up side of Shelbourne Junction shall be calculated viā Maldon.
  (H) Mileage between the Shelbourne line shall be calculated viā Stratford.
  (I) Mileage between the Healesville, Warburton, and Gembrook lines and the Gippsland and South-Eastern lines shall be calculated viā Melbourne.
  (J) Mileage between the Northern, Midland, North-eastern, and Western lines, and the Eastern and South-eastern lines shall be calculated with one mile added for the viaduct between Spencer-street and Flinders-street. Where, however, the combined fares to and from Melbourne are cheaper than the through mileage fare, the former shall be charged. charged.

#### ALTERNATIVE ROUTES.

Passengers holding return halves of tickets may on the homeward journey travel from the station named on the ticket by another available route to their original starting station without additional payment. provided no benefit in mileage is derived. When the mileage by the alternative route to the original starting station is greater than that paid for on the forward journey such extra mileage shall be charged for at the ordinary single fare.

In the event of death, sickness, resignation, or dismissal of the holder of a Yearly or Half-yearly AllLines, or Sectional Ticket, upon which the transfer fees as above have not been paid at the time the original ticket is taken, a Yearly Ticket may be transferred twice, and a Half-yearly once, on payment of 10s. for each transfer.

# SPECIAL TRAINS.

`Special Trains to Fawkner or Spring Vale Cemetery.—The guarantee for a Special Train from Flinders-street to Fawkner or Spring Vale Cemetery will be £5, and only one class of ticket will be available by such train, viz., First Class Returns at 2s. each.

Private Special Trains.—Five shillings per mile will be charged, and ordinary fare for each passenger in addition; but the total charge will not be less than 8s. per mile for the torward journey, and 4s. per mile for the return journey, provided it is undertaken within 12 hours; minimum charge, 45. Detention of train beyond the time fixed will be charged for at the rate of 15s. per hour. The distance which a train has to be run empty to commence a service, will be charged for at the rate of 4s. per mile, but such charge is not to be in addition to the recognised minimum, if the combined full and empty charges do not exceed that sum:

In the event of any Private Special Train being required to run to a place at which there is not a siding or platform, a special undertaking, relieving the Commissioners from all liability, shall be given; and if it is necessary for it to return or advance to another station, full rates will be charged or the additional mileage run.

No private Special Train will be run on Sunday, except on payment of 25 per cent. extra.

Conveyance of Circuses.—When circuses are conveyed by Special trains, the charge shall be 10s. for each train mile on the forward, and 7s. 6d. for each train mile on the return journey, if completed within one month. The loading and unloading shall be performed by the owners or their agents at their own risk and expense, and the average revenue payable to the Department shall not be less than £20 per day in respect of each Special train. It the load of any such Special train hauled by one engine through the greater portion of the tour necessitates the use of a second engine over any steep grades, the charge shall be 25 per cent. extra in respect of the mil eage over which the second engine is used, provided that this extra charge will operate only when the load is in excess of that prescribed for DD class engine over the grade in question.

Excursion Trains to Pleasure Resorts.—()n dates specially advertised excursion trains will be run from Melbourne to different pleasure resorts outside the Suburban area at cheap fares.

The tickets will be available only by the special train on the forward journey, and for return for such periods and by such trains as may be advertised.

Special Trains for Excursion Traffic.—The farcs and guarantees to be charged in connexion with special passenger trains run at the convenience of the Commissioners for excursion and other traffic will be as shown hereunder:—

The Commissioners will not, however, undertake to supply a train between two points at a considerable distance from an engine depot at the ordinary guarantee rates, and will make an extra charge for placing the train in position if the circumstances warrant it.

- (A) Schools Excursions.—Fares (see page 93): Guarantee, 10s. per mile, and minimum charge, £5 per train.
- (B) FRIENDLY SOCIETIES, FACTORIES, TRADES SOCIETIES, AND SIMILAR ORGANIZATIONS.

  Fares: 12d. per mile, first class, and 1d. per mile, second class. Children under fourteen years of age will be charged half adult fare. If the excursion be a one-day excursion, the guarantee will be 10s. per line mile, and the minimum charge, £7 10s. per train; but if a longer period of availability up to one month be desired, the guarantee will be 15s. per line mile, and the minimum charge, £9 per train. In both cases, the tickets will be extended up to a period of two months from the date of issue on payment of the difference between half the fare paid for the excursion and the single fare between the stations for which the excursion ticket is available.
- (C) CRICKET, AND FOOTBALL MATCHES, AGRICULTURAL SHOWS, SPORTS, AND SIMILAR GATHERINGS HELD OUTSIDE THE MELBOURNE SUBURBAN RADIUS.

Holiday excursion fares will be charged, and the guarantee will be 10s. per line mile, with a minimum charge of £7 10s. per train. Children under fourteen years of age will be charged half adult fare.

In respect of the traffic under Clauses A, B, and C of this division, the promoters will be allowed a rebate of 10 per cent. of the gross revenue earned from the sale of railway tickets by such special trains, provided that the rebate so allowed shall not reduce the gross revenue therefrom below the amount of the specified guarantee, which must be lodged in each instance; and the Commissioners further reserve the right to decline to grant the rebate in any case where they consider that the mileage over which the special train or trains are required to run is excessive, or that the conditions in other respects are not such as to justify the rebate allowance.

# COUNTRY FARES—continued.

In view of the heavy demand for rolling-stock during the following periods, the rebate will not be allowed at such times, viz. :—From the 20th December to the 5th January, inclusive; from the Wednesday before Foundation Day to the Wednesday after, inclusive, from the Tuesday before Good Friday to the Wednesday after Easter Monday, inclusive; from the Thursday before Cup Day to the Tuesday after, inclusive; during the week the Royal Agricultural Show is held at Melbourne, and the Thursday, Friday, and Saturday previous thereto; or on such other days as the Commisioners may from time to time determine.

Holiday excursion fares will be charged, and the guarantee will be ros. per line mile, with a minimum charge of £7 ros. per train. Children under fourteen years of age will be charged half adult fare.

#### General.

- r. Special trains for return journeys are conditional that the return journey is made within twenty-four hours.
- 2. Special trains may be run for single journeys at 7s. 6d. per line mile. The minimum charge for each such train is £5.
- 3. The guarantee cheque for the special train should be forwarded to the General Passenger and Freight Agent, Melbourne, or lodged with the local Station master.
- senger and Preight Agent, Melbourne, or lodged with the local Station-master.

  4. The proportion of revenue allowed against a special train as a "set-off" to the amount guaranteed will, as a general rule, be the fares between the points only where the special train runs, or 101 such portion of the line upon which the special train is required. In the case of a special train run for a single journey at 7s. 6d. per mile, half of the full price of the return tickets held, or the whole price of any single tickets held, will be allowed (for that portion of mileage only of the line for which the special train is guaranteed) as a "set-off" to the guarantee.
- 5. When the revenue derived from a special train falls below the guaranteed amount, the shortage must be made up by the guarantor.
- 6. In arranging any excursions (either country or suburban) the following information should be furnished to the General Passenger and Freight Agent.

  - (A) Date and place of proposed excursion.
    (B) Is special train required?
    (C) Time of starting desired—going and returning. Where stop en route.
    (D) Probable number of excursionists.
    (E) Tickets required. Give class and quantity of each kind.
    (F) Date of previous similar excursion (if any).

# COUNTRY FARES—continued. SCHOOL EXCURSION FARES BY SPECIAL TRAINS.

The proportion of senior scholars shall not exceed two to every ten junior scholars, and of teachers one to every ten junior scholars. The fares apply to either Day or Sunday Scholas. The following public holidays will be exempt from these special fares, viz.:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, "Cup" Day, Hirthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. The fares on these public holidays will be the same as those charged to the ordinary travelling public, viz., Holiday Excursion Fares; or, if entirely within the Melbourne Suburban area, the usual Suburban Fares.

## SLEEPING BERTH FARES AND REGULATIONS.

Albury and Sydney.—Sleeping Berths between Albury and Sydney 10s. cach, in addition to First Class fare.

 ${\bf Melbourne~and~Adelaide.} \hbox{--Sleeping~Berths~between~Melbourne~and~Adelaide~l0s.~each,~in~addition~to~First~Class~fare.}$ 

Any sleeping berths vacant when the Up Adelaide Express leaves Serviceton may be allotted to passengers from Kaniva, Nhill, Dimboola, Horsham, Murtoa, or Stawell to Melbourne at the rate of 6s. cach.

Berths must only be booked conditionally that there are vacant berths when the Express arrives at the station where the berths are booked.

The Stationmaster, Sérviceton, will require to advise the stations named what berths, if any, are available when the Express leaves Serviceton, so that applicants may be notified whether or not berths can be provided for them, and each station must wire the other booking stations in advance when berths are let, in order that it may be known what berths are still available for booking.

General Regulations.—1. When a berth is applied for by telephone it may be reserved for one hour, but if the ticket be not taken out and the money paid for it by the expiration of that time the berth is to be re-let to any other passenger offering.

- 2. When passengers telegraph from country stations or outlying places for bertlis to be reserved, such reservation will be permitted. (The risk of the berth not being occupied is taken.)
- 3. In cases where berth tickets are purchased by passengers who afterwards decide not to use them, a refund of the amount paid will be allowed provided 12 hours' notice is given of the intention not to use the berths. If this notice be not given in respect of sleeping berths between Melbourne and Sydney, and Melbourne and Adelaide, a refund of the amount paid less 2s. 6d. will be made. In no case, however, will any refund be made unless it is clear that no loss of revenue has been sustained owing to the cancellation of the berth. Applications for refund must be made to the General Passenger and Freight Agent.
- 4. Commercial Travellers will be treated in the same way as ordinary passengers, and will require to present one of their tickets when ordering a berth if they be holders of a packet of sleeping berth tickets, otherwise they must pay cash.
- 5. Passengers from Melbourne to Brisbane who are desirous of booking sleeping berths from Sydney to Brisbane may do so on payment of the sleeping berth fare and subject to the condition that a berth is available. Certificate to be given the passenger who will present it to the Clerk in Charge of the Central Booking Office, Sydney, on arrival, and obtain a berth ticket or a refund of the fare paid if a berth is not available.

Immediately a berth is booked a wire must be sent to the Clerk in Charge of the Central Booking Office, Sydney, giving the necessary particulars.

A similar procedure will be followed by the other States in connexion with the following bookings of sleeping berths:—

- By ADELAIDE—In connexion with the booking of berths from Melbourne to Sydney and Sydney to Brisbanc.
- By BRISBANE—In connexion with the booking of borths from Sydney to Melbourne and Melbourne to Adelaide.
- By SYDNEY-In connexion with the booking of berths from Melbourne to Adelaide.

It is understood that when a telegram is received for a sleeping berth that an upper berth is to be reserved if a lower is not available, although the latter may be ordered, unless the wire specifically states that this is not to be done.

Passengers holding the return halves of 1st class cheap Inter-State Excursion tickets, who have paid the excess to entitle them to travel by the Express train, will be allowed Sleeping Berth tickets at the usual charge of 10s.

AVAILABILITY OF TICKETS. Single Tickets will be available for break of journey at any station, but the through journey must be completed within one month.

Ordinary Return Tickets will be available for six months, and the journey may be broken at any station, but the forward portion of the journey must be completed within one month.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be available only for the periods, and for break of journey, as specified in the instructions concerning their issue. They may be extended up to six months from date of issue on payment of the difference between the Ordinary Return and Holiday Excursion Fare, provided application is made during the currency of the ticket.

The above regulations apply also to tickets issued between Melbourne and Albury and Melbourne

Passengers holding tickets between Adelaide and Bendigo may travel vid Melbourne without

Ocean Steam-ship Tickets.—The conditions as to availability of Ocean Steam-ship Tickets are the same as those for ordinary Single and Return Tickets; subject, however, to the limitation prescribed in clause 4 on page 104. When the return steamer ticket held by the passenger is available for a longer period than six months, the return rail ticket may be extended to run concurrently therewith on application being made to the General Passenger and Freight Agent.

Note.—In respect to both single and return tickets the journey must be completed not later than twelve midnight on the last day for which the ticket is available.

# HOLDERS OF SECOND CLASS TICKETS DESIRING TO TRAVEL FIRST CLASS.

Holders of Second-class Tickets desiring to travel first-class shall be charged as follow for the distance actually travelled in the higher class:—

(a) Ordinary Single Tickets.—The difference between First and Second Class Single Fare.

(b) Ordinary, Holiday Excursion, and Concession Return Tickets.—Half the difference between the First and Second Class Return Fare, Ordinary, Holiday Excursion, or Concession, as the case may be, for either the forward or return journey.

LUGGAGE ALLOWANCE. First Class passengers are allowed 112 lbs., and Second Class 84 lbs. of bond fide luggage free of charge; with the exception that passengers holding First Class Cheap Excursion Tickets are allowed to carry, free of charge, only 56 lbs., and Second Class 42 lbs. of bond fide luggage.

#### CHILDREN.

Children not exceeding three (3) years of age will be carried free, and above three (3) years, and not exceeding fourteen (14) years of age, will be charged half-fare.

#### TICKETS NOT USED.

Holders of Inter-State Return Tickets, who are unable to make the return journey within the specified time, may obtain a refund on application to the General Passenger and Freight Agent.

The basis on which such refunds will be allowed is as follow:—

1. On Ordinary Return Tickets.—The difference between Ordinary Single and Return Fare.

2. On Holiday Excursion Tickets—The difference between Ordinary Single and Holiday Excursion Fare.

- 3. On other Cheap Return Tickets-One-third of the cost of the Return Ticket.

# OCEAN STEAM-SHIP PASSENGER REGULATIONS.

The regulations for the issue of Ocean Steam-ship Passenger Tickets shall be as prescribed

1. Incoming Steam-ship Passengers.—Passengers arriving by steamer from ports specified in Clause 6, and desirous of travelling by rail at Ocean Steam-ship Passenger Fares, will require to obtain a certificate in the form (see sample on page 178) from the Purser of the boat by which they travel for presentation at the office of the Steam ship Company, and such certificate must be signed by the passenger in the presence of the Purser. The Steam-ship Company will then issue to the passenger a certificate (see sample on page 179) which must also be signed by the passenger in the presence of, and witnessed by, the Issuing Officer. Both certificates must be presented at the Railway Booking Office when making application for the Ticket, and before issuing the Rail Ticket the Booking Clerk must obtain the passenger's signature on the black line on the face of the stubb of the Ticket, and compare the signature with the signatures on the Purser's and Shipping Company's certificates, and satisfy himself that they correspond.

In the case of a Return Ticket, the passenger will require to present the veturn vertice of the

In the case of a Return Ticket the passenger will require to present the return portion of the Ticket at the Booking Office on the date, the return journey is commenced, and affix his signature on the black line on the back of the stubb of the Ticket in the presence of the Booking Clerk, who, after comparing and satisfying himself that the signature corresponds with the signature on the face of the Ticket, will affix his initials and stamp the date underneath the passenger's signature on the back of the Ticket, and the Ticket will only be available to commence the return journey on such date.

Passengers taking out Return Tickets must be notified by the Booking Clerk that it will be necessary for them to present the return portions of Tickets at the Booking Office before commencing the return journey, and affix their signatures to the Tickets in the presence of the Booking Clerk on the date on which the return journey is to be made.

- 4. The Steam-ship Certificate can only be exchanged for a Rail Ticket within seven (7) days of the date the boat arrives or departs as the case may be, provided that passengers holding Circular loat Tickets, New Zealand, McIbourne, and Sydney may exchange their Boat Certificates for Rail Tickets at any time during the currency of their Circular Boat Tickets.
  - 5. Tickets issued to children are not required to be signed by them, or on their behalf.

## LUGGAGE AND PARCELS RATES.

# GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF GOODS, PARCELS, LUGGAGE, AND LIVE STOCK.

Supplementary conditions as follow are shown on the pages specified, viz.: --. Agricultural Shows, page 115. Live Stock, page 145.

#### 1. Non-liability of the Commissioners.

- Non-liability of the Commissioners.

  (a) The Commissioners will not be liable for the loss of, or injury to, any article or articles, or property of the descriptions following, that is to say:—Gold or silver coin of the realm or of any foreign State, or any gold or silver in a manufactured or unmanufactured state; or any precious stones, jewellery, watches, clocks, or time-pieces of any description; trinkets, gold or silver ores, bills, notes of any Bank; orders, notes, or securities for the payment of money; English, Colonial, or Foreign stamps; maps, writings, title-deeds, paintings, engravings, pictures, gold or silver plate or plated articles, glass, china, silks in a manufactured or unmanufactured state, and whether wrought up or not wrought up with other materials; furs, lace, or opium, or any of them, which shall have been delivered for carriage over the Victorian railways, when the value of such article or articles of property aforesaid shall exceed the sum of ten pounds, unless at the time of delivery thereof at the station or warehouse for the purpose of being carried, the value and nature of such article or articles, or property, shall have been declared by the person sending or delivering the same, and the increased rate for carriage hereunder set forth shall have been paid to and accepted by the employé duly authorized to receive the same.

  Insurance of Parcels.—Parcels over £10 in value will be carried at owner's risk unless
- (b) Insurance of Parcels.—Parcels over £10 in value will be carried at owner's risk unless insured, the charge for which is £1 per cent. on the declared value. Parcels declared of more than £100 value will only be carried under special agreement. Insurance charges must be prepaid.
- 2. (A) The Commissioners will not under any circumstances be responsible for loss or misdelivery of any packages improperly or insufficiently marked, directed, or described, nor for loss of or damage to, any packages which they or their employes may consider to be insufficiently or improperly packed or secured; nor will they be responsible for any loss or damage occurring to packages consisting of a variety of articles in the same package liable by breakage to damage each other or other articles, or arising from leakage due to bad vessels, or bad cooperage, or to fermentation.

  (B) Nor for damage to any articles of a fragile or brittle nature, such as marble ornaments or statuary, musical instruments, furniture, or toys, which are, in the opinion of the Commissioners or their employes, more than ordinarily hazardous, unless they shall be declared in writing and properly packed and protected, and the additional Risk rate be paid.   (E) Nor for any loss of or injury to any articles, packages, or things put into wrappers, hoves, packages, cases, or baskets, marked, described, returned, delivered, or represented as "Empties."

#### 3. Contents of Packages to be specified-

The Commissioners will not be bound to receive or forward any packages, whether at their lisk, or at the risk of the owner, unless the contents thereof be specified, if required, at the time of delivery for carriage. The Commissioners reserve the right to refuse packages which they or their employes may adjudge to be unsafe or unfit for carriage.

# . 4. Time of arrival or delivery not guaranteed-

The Commissioners do not guarantee under any circumstances the arrival or delivery of any tackages (perishable or otherwise) at any particular time, by any particular train, or for any particular market; neither do they undertake to advise consignees of the arrival of packages.

All packages must be fully and distinctly addressed.

#### 6. Consignment Notes-

The acceptance of a consignment note by or on behalf of the Commissioners shall not be regarded as evidence that the parcels, goods, or live stock specified therein have been received by them, unless the whole of the consignment is delivered to them at the same time with the consignment note, and a receipt therefor has been given by the proper employé of the Commissioners.

Attention is called to Sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section 7 of the "Railways Act 1904," No. 1946 repeated hereunder:—

PRETION IS CALLED TO SUB-SECTIONS (1) AND (2) or binding, and the description, value, value, the stock of goods delivered or offered for carriage or transit on any railway, or with respect to any consignment note or invoice or bill of lading, or refuses or neglects to give an account of any live stock or goods upon any railway, or to produce his consignment note, or invoice, or bill of lading to any officer or employé of the Commissioners demanding the same, or gives a false account, or removes, interferes with, or conceals, or attempts to remove, interfere with, or conceal, any part of such live stock or goods with intent in any such case to avoid the payment, or to conceal the non-payment of any rates payable in respect thereof, every person so offending shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds."

(2) If any consignment note, or invoice, or bill of lading in conexion with live stock or goods is presented, having the value, measurement, quantity, number, or weight of such live stock or goods understated, or the description misstated to the prejudice of the Commissioners on such consignment note or invoice, or bill of lading, the person responsible for the payment of the freight for such live stock or goods shall be liable to the payment of double the ordinary freight charges otherwise payable on such live stock or goods."

# 7. Consignees refusing to receive packages-

In the event of consignees refusing to receive packages invoiced to them, such packages will not be returned to the sending station until instructions have been obtained from the consignor, who will, if possible, be advised of the refusal..

# 8. Determination of weight-

All packages shall be charged according to their actual dead weight.

# 9. Consignees to give receipt-

A written receipt must be given by consignees for all packages received from the Commissioners. The Commissioners may demand proof of ownership or an indemnity-note signed by two approved sureties, if there be any doubt as to the person applying for the packages being entitled to receive same.

# ,10. Delivery of Goods-

The Commissioners reserve the right to deliver any packages at the address of the consignee, and to charge for such delivery, in all cases in which the consigner or the consignee of such packages does not give notice to the proper employé of the Commissioners that delivery will be taken at the railway station by the consignee.

# 11. Freight and other charges to be paid on demand-

II. Freight and other charges to be paid on demand—

The authorized charges on all packages must be paid on demand, and, in default, the Commissioners reserve the right to detain and sell the packages on which such charges are payable, or to detain and sell any other property which they may then or at any future time have in their possession belonging to the person by whom such charges are payable, in order to realize the amount due. If the amount realized be insufficient to cover all charges, the Commissioners may take legal proceedings to recover the deficiency.

The Commissioners may require the charges in respect of any packages to be paid at the forwarding station, or they may permit the charges to be collected at the destination station.

# 12. Consignments for Caretaker Stations and unattended Stations or Sidings-

The Commissioners will not accept delivery of packages for carriage to any caretaker, or unattended station, or siding, unless the consignor prepays all charges in respect of such packages.

# 13. Consignments, small or specially valuable-

The Commissioners do not accept for carriage by Goods trains any consignment weighing less than 14 lbs., nor any consignment of gold or silver plate, gold or silver in a manufactured state, watches, jewellery, precious stones, gold and silver coin or bullion, bills, bank notes, orders, notes of securities for the payment of money, stamps, or title deeds, but such consignments must be forwarded by Passenger trains at Parcels rates.

Claims for detention or loss of, or damage to, packages will not be recognised unless lodged in writing with the Commissioners within fourteen days after the date on which such packages were consigned, and no claim will be recognised if lodged after the packages alleged to have been damaged have been removed from the premises of the Commissioners.

#### Sale of packages—

Any packages on the railway premises, or stored elsewhere by the Commissioners, which are not claimed and removed by the owners may be sold by the Commissioners, after the expiration of the time hereinafter specified, and, after deducting any amount which may be due thereon for freight, storage, and other charges, including the expenses of sale, the Commissioners will pay the surplus (if any) to the owner on demand:—

- (A) Any packages likely to deteriorate may be sold forthwith.
  (B) All empties may be sold after the expiration of seven days.
  (C) All other packages may be sold after the expiration of six months.

#### 16. Explosives and other Dangerous Goods-

The Commissioners do not undertake the duties of Common Carriers in respect of the carriage by rail of gunpowder and other explosives or of aquafortis, oil of vitriol, lucifer matches, or any other inflammable or corrosive article, or any article likely to create damage by or in consequence of fermentation, and will accept such goods for carriage by rail only under special contents.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO SECTION 35 OF THE "RAILWAYS ACT 1890," No. 1135, WHICH PRESCRIBES THAT-

"If any person knowingly send by any railway any goods of a dangerous nature, and neglect at the time of so sending them to mark distinctly their nature on the outside of the package containing the same, or otherwise to give notice in writing to the bookkeeper or other officer or servant with whom the same are left, every person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds."

Explosive and dangerous goods will not be carried by Passenger trains except that-

- (a) Limited quantities of safety cartridges for sporting purposes, if securely packed in a substantial wooden case, marked "Safety Cartridges, Explosive," may be sent from Spencer-street, Flinders-street, and Princes' Bridge Parcels offices to country stations.
- (b) In cases of urgency, nitrous oxide and oxygen gases may, when contained in approved cylinders, and packed in strong wooden cases, be carried in limited quantities by Passenger trains. A limited quantity shall mean not more than five (5) cylinders.

# CONDITIONS IN RESPECT OF THE CARRIAGE OF ' EXHIBITS FOR AGRICULTURAL SHOWS, ETC.

r. The undermentioned conditions shall be applicable in respect of agricultural machines and implements, machinery, produce, live stock (including dogs, poultry, and other birds), buggies, motor cars, drays, waggons, and other goods of a like nature, sent for exhibition to Agricultural States

They may also, by special arrangement with the General Passenger and Freight Agent, be made operative in respect of :-

Agricultural machinery, sent for field trials. Ploughs sent for ploughing matches. Horses sent for horse parades.

2. The exhibits will, in the ordinary course, be carried in goods or cattle trucks, by goods mixed trains; but valuable animals may, if it be convenient to the Commissioners, be earried by Passenger trains.

3. When the exhibits are consigned on the forward journey, the consignor will require to declare, on the consignment note therefor, that they are for exhibition, specifying the Show for which they are intended, and the way-bill must be indorsed accordingly.

The ordinary freight charges shall be imposed and prepaid in respect of the forward journey in all cases, except that valuable animals carried by Passenger trains in accordance with clause 2 of this division will be charged goods train rates.

4. On the return journey any exhibits, or portion thereof, which are certified by the secretary of the Show as having been exhibited, and not sold, will be carried "free" to the station whence they were forwarded, provided the journey is completed at any time within one month from the date of despatch on the forward journey, and that a greater number of vehicles be not used for the carriage of the exhibits on the return journey than on the forward journey, otherwise ordinary freight charges will be imposed on exhibits carried in any additional vehicle. A certificate in the approved form must be handed in when the exhibits are consigned, and such certificate must be attached to the wavbill.

All exhibits, or part thereof, which have been sold, or are not accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, will be subject to the ordinary freight charges on the return journey, and such charges shall, in all cases, be made "to pay."

- 5. Exhibits, accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, may be forwarded on from one Show to another, subject to the freight charges, as prescribed in clause 3 of this division, being prepaid, and when the final destination is reached, they may be returned "free" to the original despatching station, conditionally on the observance of the provisions of clause 4 of this division. If, however, in proceeding to another Show, such exhibits be returned over, any portion of the line in respect of which the full freight charges have been paid on the forward journey, the exhibits may be sent free over such portion of the line.
- 6. All exhibits are carried solely at the risk of the owner, and must be loaded and unloaded by or at the expense of the consignors or consignees.
- 7. Owners of stock going to and returning from shows may be allowed free carriage of fodder, as specified hereunder, if it be loaded in the trucks with the animals:—

2 cwt. for each head of cattle each way.
2 cwt. for each horse each way.
20 lbs. for each pig or sheep each way.

- S. Exhibits from the Department of Agriculture, viz., wheat, straw in bulk, olive oil, wine, honey, &c., fruit (preserved), charts, &c, fibres, including flax, hemp (dressed and undressed), willows, manures, vegetable oil, eggs, also the necessary marquees, poles and pegs, tables, trestles, and fittings forwarded to the various Agricultural Shows in the State, shall be charged Class "A" rate, subject to the tariff for smalls.
- 9. Consignors should give not less than four (4) days' notice to the station-master of the number and description of live-stock trucks, and 48 hours' for other trucks, &c., required to load exhibits.
- 10. Judges appointed to act at Agricultural Shows will, on production of an approved certificate, be granted return tickets at Holiday Excursion Fares, and such certificate must be forwarded to the Auditor of Receipts, as the authority for the special issue.
- rr. If a full sheep-truck load of sheep, or a full cattle-truck load of horses, cattle, or pigs, has been paid for on the forward journey, and the whole of the stock has been returned "free," in accordance with the provisions of clause 4 of this division, one stock attendant in respect of each truck will be granted a refund of the return fare paid by him. He must travel in the truck or in the van of a goods train with the stock, and must provide himself with a copy of Form 154, duly completed by the station-masters at the forwarding and returning stations respectively. A receipt for the refund must be given on the certificate by the attendant, after which it must be forwarded to the Auditor of Receipts as a voucher.

# Passengers' Luggage.

A-Regulations with respect to Luggage Checks and Passengers' Luggage. Description, &c., of Luggage Checks used in Victoria, New South Wales, and South Australia.

Description.—The check is made of stout flexible card, in size 5 inches by 2 inches, with a metal eyelet at the bottom. It is perforated in centre, and when used the lower portion shall be attached by a strong cord to the article checked, and the upper portion handed to the passenger. Each portion of the check is similarly numbered.

Colours.—The check for each State is distinctively coloured, as follows:—

New South Wales
Victoria

For local traffic and all inward traffic from other States. Red White other States. GREEN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Printing.—The printing on the checks is uniform, with the exception that the issue for each State bears the name of that State—for instance, in the case of Victoria, the check for local traffic is headed "Victorian Railways," and the Interstate checks will be headed respectively "New South Wales and Victorian Railways," or "South Australian and Victorian Railways,"

Notice to Passengers.—A separate check is required for each package. Checks are only issued for free luggage in ordinary luggage receptacles, properly secured and plainly addressed, and delivered at least 15 minutes before train starting time.

To avoid paying storage charges luggage should be claimed immediately on arrival.

Delivery is effected on this check only, but a note should be taken of its number to facilitate restoration of the luggage should you lose the check.

To Issuing Staff.—Issue only for bond fide free luggage in proper receptacles, securely fastened and in good order. See that name and address are properly affixed, and that no old labels appear. Use usual luggage labels and way-bill on proper form. Each package requires a separate check.

To Destination Staff,—Check with way-bill. Match with passenger's duplicate. Collect and cancel duplicate, and send both pieces to the Claims Agent, Spencer street.

# LUGGAGE AND PARCELS RATES—continued.

## General Regulations Regarding Luggage.

1. Free luggage consists of wearing apparel and other similar personal belongings contained in a bag, carpet bag, trunk, box, portmanteau, value, or any other receptacle commonly used for the purpose.

Luggage will not be accepted for free carriage when contained in merchandise boxes, or cases, or in chest of drawers, or in bundles not properly covered and roped.

Checks will not be issued for such articles as the following, which in limited quantities are carried free, or are charged for at a reduced rate when accompanying passengers, viz.:—Artisans' tools; sportsmen's tackle and game; drovers' saddles; dentists' equipment; photographers' cameras; bicycles; buby carts, &c, commercial travellers' samples, theatrical paraphernalia; luggage on Cheap Excursion tickets.

- 2. The Commissioners will not be liable in respect of the loss, miscarriage, detention or non-delivery of passengers' luggage, carried or handed to the Commissioners for carriage by railway free or at excess rates unless the owner thereof has complied with the following conditions:—Nor for any package not distinctly addressed, or for which the owner has not obtained a luggage check, or paid the excess rates as prescribed hereunder; nor for any package of luggage, whether "checked" or "excess," the value of which shall exceed the sum of £10, unless such value shall be declared at the time of booking, and the insurance rate as set forth in Condition No. 1, clause b, page 113, be paid; nor for any loss, detention, miscarriage, or damage through the neglect by passengers of these By-laws, whether such neglect arise through insufficiency of time or other cause not attributable to the default of the Commissioners.
- 3. Delivery at station, &c.—Luggage must be delivered at the station at least fifteen (15) minutes before the departure time of the train by which the passenger desires the luggage to be carried.

If the quantity is within the free allowance, a numbered luggage cheek must be obtained by the passenger for each package, and the luggage labelled by the receiving porter to the passenger's destination.

If the quantity is in excess of the free allowance, excess luggage rates must be paid for the additional weight, and a receipt showing the amount paid, the number of packages, and the destination, must be given to the passenger. The receiving porter will affix an "excess" luggage ticket to the luggage, and label each package to the passenger's destination. The receipt takes the place of the luggage check in respect of excess luggage.

- 4. No employe of the Commissioners has any authority to undertake charge of or any responsibility in connexion with luggage left temporarily at a station unless each package has been booked at the cloak-room charges; or to place luggage in the van at the risk of the Commissioners, or to take any responsibility whatever, unless the luggage has been checked or paid for at excess rates, as above mentioned.
- 5. Passengers should see their luggage labelled, claim it at the place of destination on arrival of the train, and prove the ownership by giving up the numbered check or checks for each article or the receipts for the excess rates that have been paid.
- 6. After checks are issued, or a receipt for excess rates given for luggage about to be carried free, no package or parcel must be delivered, even temporarily, at any station to the owner thereof, unless he has returned the check or checks or the receipt for the luggage.
- 7. For purposes of proving ownership or obtaining delivery of luggage carried free or at excess rates, the checks issued represent the articles carried free, one check for each, and receipts for excess rates represent excess luggage; but both checks and receipts are transferable, and passengers are not bound to see in person after their luggage, either in paying for it checking it before it is put in the van, or on obtaining delivery. Passengers may do this through any person not an employed of the Commissioners. Luggage will not, except as hereinafter provided, be delivered unless the checks or receipts for excess rates are produced; but any person producing them will receive the luggage as and for the owner.
- 8. Any passenger losing his checks, or receipts for excess rates, will be required, before he can obtain his luggage, to make a declaration to that effect, giving the numbers of the checks and a description of the luggage; also to guarantee the Commissioners against any loss or claim from wrong delivery. And should the evidence as to ownership appear to the Commissioners insufficient, it will be in the power of the Commissioners to detain the said luggage.
- 9. No employe of the Commissioners is authorized to act as an agent of the passengers in collecting checks or "excess" receipts at a station for the purpose of obtaining luggage from the guard. The passengers, personally, or by their agents, must give up the checks or receipts and claim delivery.

Passengers must have their names, and the station to which they are proceeding, distinctly marked on their luggage; and if the luggage be left behind and forwarded by a subsequent train, through neglect of this precaution, ordinary parcels rates will be charged. To prevent mistakes, passengers should also have all old labels and addresses removed from their luggage.

11. First Class passengers are allowed to carry with them by the same train 112 lb. and second-class passengers 84 lb., weight of bona fide passengers' luggage free of charge. Passengers holding First-class Cheap Excursion Tickets are allowed to carry, free of charge, only 56 lb., and Second-class, 42 lb. of bona fide passengers' luggage. Half-fare passengers are only allowed half these weights.

The free luggage allowance referred to above does not apply in the case of any Coach or Boat journeys for which the Commissioners issue Through Rail and Coach, or Rail and Boat tickets, and pourneys tor which the Commissioners issue Through Rail and Coach, or Rail and Boat tickets, and passengers will require to make their own arrangements as to luggage with the Coach Proprietors, or the Steam-ship Companies, as the case may be.

Photographers are allowed to carry their camera and stand, if not weighing more than 28 lbs. in all, free, when travelling by rail.

Dentists' instruments and equipment, artisans' and mechanics' tools, and the riding saddle of a drover, will be carried free, providing they accompany passengers, and do not exceed the weight allowed.

Bona fule sportsmen are allowed to carry game free-First Class, 56 lbs., Second Class, 42 lbs. -as

Most the start be placed in the carriage unless to solve have a stablishments will be allowed to carry one parcel at a time "free," as personal lugage, for delivery to people living in the suburbs. The weight shall not exceed 56 lbs., and the parcel shall be of a size that may be taken into the carriage without inconvenience to other passengers.

Ordinary parcels rates shall be charged on a size that may be taken into the carriage without inconvenience to other passengers.

#### All excess above these weights shall be charged "Parcels" rates-

12. Passengers tickets shall be sighted by the Luggage Porter before checking luggage, and if luggage nippers are provided the letter "L" shall be nipped on the ticket, and if special nippers are not provided the letter "L" shall be written on the face of the ticket in ink or indelible pencil.

Checks will not be issued to any station to which the ticket held is not available; neither will the passengers' luggage be divided by checking part of it to one station and part to another.

Luggage will not be checked for stations where there is no official in charge unless the passenger sgrees to claim delivery immediately on arrival of the train, and if the delivery be not so taken the luggage will be carried on to the nearest manned station and waybill marked accordingly.

Passengers with luggage breaking their journey will require to have the luggage labelled accordingly before starting. The Commissioners will not be responsible for any 'delay or inconvenience that may occur in consequence of the neglect of passengers to observe this regulation. If a passenger from Melbourne to Bendigo, for example, has his luggage labelled and checked hereto, yet breaks the journey at Castlemaine, the Commissioners will not be responsible to put at his luggage there, and they will further reserve the right to charge for such luggage at parcels ates for the distance that it is carried beyond the station where the journey was broken.

- 13. It is optional with passengers to require cheeks for luggage according to the e conditions: but should they omit to do so, their luggage will be carried entirely at their own risk, whether lost, miscarried, or left behind.
- 14. All unclaimed luggage kept at a station twelve hours after its carriage by railway will be charged cloak-room rates for each package, and the Commissioners will sell the articles it unclaimed at the expiry of six months.

#### Luggage between Suburban and Country Stations.

- 1. (a) Luggage accompanying passengers from South Suburban stations to country stations on the Northern, Midland, Western, South-Western and North-Eastern lines will not be labelled at the suburban station direct to the country station, but will be dealt with as follows —
- (p) Luggage from stations on the Heidelberg, Preston and Fitzroy lines will be labelled to Prince's-bridge only, except that if the passengers travel from the Preston line by trains running direct to Spencer-street their luggage may be labelled to the latter place.
- (c) Luggage accompanying passengers from stations on the Brighton line may be labelled through to Spencer-street as there is a through service.
- (b) Luggage accompanying passengers from stations on all other South Suburban lines will be labelled to Prince's-bridge, Flinders-street or Spencer-street as required, but passengers should be specially asked whether they intend transferring at South Yarra, Richmond, or Flinders-street, as the case may be, and travelling through to Spencer street by train before the luggage is labelled to that cheful.

Passengers should be instructed to claim and arrange for the transfer of the luggage from the metropolitan station to which it is labelled to the proper country platform.

- metropontan station to which it is labelled to the proper country platform.

  (E) Luggage accompanying passengers from South Suburban stations to country stations on the Eastern system, and nice versá, will only be booked to the junction or metropolitan station concerned, except in the case of luggage accompanying passengers between a suburban and a country station on the same line and such passengers hold through tickets for the journey, when the luggage may be labelled to the destination; provided that luggage may be booked between a South Suburban station and a country station on another line on the Eastern system if the passengers hold through tickets for the journey—e.g., a passenger purchasing a through ticket from Camberwell to Mornington may have his luggage booked through to Mornington on the forward journey, and through to Camberwell on the return journey.
- (F) Luggage accompanying passengers from country stations on the Eastern system to North Suburban stations will only be booked to Flinders-street or Prince's-bridge, as the case may be, and passengers are to be instructed to arrange for the transfer from these stations to Spencer-street.
- 2. (a) Luggage accompanying passengers from North Suburban stations to country stations on the Eastern system will not be labelled beyond Flinders-street, and the passengers are to be instructed to claim it there and arrange for its transfer to the country platform at Flinders-street or Prince's-
- bridge.

  (a) Luggage accompanying passengers from North Suburban stations to country stations on tl. C. Northern, Midland, Western, South-Western and North-Eastern lines, and rice versa, will only be booked to the junction station or Spencer-street, except in the case of luggage accompanying passengers between a suburban and a country station on the same line and such passengers hold through tickets for the journey, when the luggage may be labelled to the destination, provided that suggage may be booked between a North Suburban station and a country station on another line on the above sections if the passengers hold through tickets for the journey, e.g., a passenger purchasing a through ticket from Williamstown to Geelong may have his luggage booked through to Geelong on the forward journey and through to Williamstown on the return journey.
- (c) Luggage accompanying passengers from country stations on the Northern, Midland, Western, South-Western, and North-Eastern lines to stations on the South Suburban lines will only be booked to Spencer-street, and passengers are to be instructed to claim the luggage there and arrange for its transfer to Flinders-street or Prince's-bridge, as the case may be, except in cases where the special transfer fee is paid as prescribed in Clause 3.

#### 3. Special Transfer at Melbourne by the Department.

Passengers booking from any country station on the Northern, Midland, Western, South-Western, or North-Eastern lines may, if they so desire, have their luggage sent to stations on any of the Suburban lines to which trains run direct from Spencer-street, viz., Essendon, Williamstewn, Coburg, and Brighton lines.

A fee of 3d. per package, minimum 6d., shall be charged for transferring such luggage at Spencer-street from the Country to the Suburban train, and such fee must be prepaid.

The luggage is to be waybilled on parcels waybill form, and the transfer fee entered on a separate line on the waybill.

Any luggage in excess of free allowance shall be charged the excess luggage rate plus the transfer fee of 3d. per package, minimum 6d.

Luggage checks will be issued subject to the conditions and charges shown above, and the numbers of the luggage checks are to be inserted on the transfer waybill.

In all cases where a transfer fee is charged, a red label must be attached to each package, and special effort is to be made to insure prompt despatch being given to such luggage at Spencer-

A supply of labels will be sent to all stations on the Northern, Midland, Western, South-Western, and North-Eastern lines, and any further supplies may be requisitioned for in the usual manner.

In every case in which luggage is forwarded under these conditions the passengers must be distinctly informed that the luggage will be forwarded from Spencer-street, North Melbourne, or Footscray, as the case may be, as soon after the arrival of the country train as may be found practicable, and that the Department will not undertake to transfer such luggage in time to catch any particular Suburban train. This is very important, and must be invariably attended to.

#### Luggage from one Country Line to another.

Luggage from country stations on the Northern, Midland, Western, South-Western, and North-Eastern lines to country stations on the Eastern and South-Eastern lines, and vice versa, may be booked through when the passenger has a through ticket for the journey; but if the passenger does not hold a through ticket, the luggage will be labelled to the metropolitan station concerned.

#### B-Special Delivery Check to be Used for Luggage for Melbourne.

The following system of checking passengers' luggage from country stations direct to residences, hotels, &c., is in operation in conjunction with Messrs Mayne, Nickless and Co., the Departmental Contractors.

The advantages of the system in saving delay and annoyance, and avoiding the necessity of arranging at Melbourne for delivery of their luggage must be explained to passengers, and every effort made on the part of the staff to popularize the system with the travelling public.

Special delivery checks are in use expressly for this purpose, and, when these are employed, the ordinary luggage check is not required.

Description of Check.—The check is made of stout flexible card, in size 5½ inches by 2 inches, with a metal eyelet at the top.—It is perforated in the centre, and when use I the Upper portion will be attached by a strong cord to the article checked, and the Lower portion handed to the passenger. Each portion of the check is similarly numbered.

Colour. -The colour of the check is White, with a Red Bar.

Folding Go-carts carried in the train by which the owners are travelling as passengers shall be charged half perambulator rates; unaccompanied by owners, parcels rates plus 50 per cent.

Bicycles with extra parts attached shall be charged parcels rates plus 50 per cent. Bicycles carried in the train by which the owners are travelling as passengers, having the handles and nedals unshipped, and packed in narrow trunks open for inspection, shall be charged the rates prescribed above for bicycles accompanied by owners. No charge shall be made for the trunk.

The values and consecutive numbers are printed in conspicuous red figures on each piece of the ticket, and great care shall be taken to see that the corresponding portion of ticket is collected before delivery of any machine bearing the eyeletted portion of a ticket is given. In no case shall delivery be given unless the check portion of the ticket is produced.

At the larger stations when a pa-senger takes his Bicycle from the Van the Porter on the Barrier Gate will be held responsible for collection of both portions of the ticket.

The filling up of the tickets shall be promptly performed at the different Booking-office windows. No way-bills are required. Guards shall deliver the machines either to the owners or to the station officials at the station shown on the ticket.

The tickets shall be issued in their proper consecutive order, and the commencing and closing numbers entered in the Train and Classification Books in the usual way. Care shall be taken to see that all machines for which these tickets are issued are carried by rail.

Should a passenger after purchasing a Bicycle Ticket decide to postpone his joarney, the ticket shall be collected and its value refunded. If such a ticket be not again required on that day it shall be forwarded to the Auditor of Receipts for a credit note.

The machine shall in all cases be carried in the train by which the owner is travelling as a passenger. The owner will be required to register its number with the Department, and give a guarantee that it is for his personal use and will not be sold.

Motor Cycles when charged with naphtha, petroleum, gas, or other highly inflammable liquid or vapor will not be accepted for conveyance on any train.

Sample Bicycles.—Agents; representing recognised Bicycle Agencies of Victoria, will be allowed to carry with them one case not exceeding 3 feet 7 inches in height, by 6 feet 1 inch in length, by 14 inches in width, containing not more than two sample bicycles, tree of charge, provided that the total weight does not exceed that allowed to commercial travellers.

Bicycle Covers.—Covers for the protection of bicycles are on hire at Spencer-street, Prince's-bridge, Flinders-street, Mordialloe, Frankston, Mornington, Camberwell, Lilydale, Upper Ferntree Gully, Bacchus Marsh, Ballarat, Ararat, Stawell, Hamilton, Geelong, Queenseliff, Colac, Camperdown, Warrnambool, Woodend, Daylesford, Kyneton, Castlemaine, Bendigo, Echuca, Maryborough, Benalla, Wangaratta, Wodonga, Beechworth, Bright, Dandenong, Warragul, and Sale. The charge for use of the covers shall be for use of the covers shall be-

in addition to the freight on the machine.

The covers are numbered, and shall in every instance be way-billed to and from the destination and forwarding stations. No. of cover shall be shown on way-bill.

The parts of the machine which are most liable to damage are indicated by a circle on the cover, and particular care shall be exercised by the staff when handling the machines.

Whenever a bicycle is received at a country station in a cover, and the person to whom it is consigned makes known that he desires to use it for the return of a machine within three days the cover may be held for that period.

Each portion of the ticket is numbered; one part shall be affixed to the parcel, and the other retained by the owner and presented when delivery is required. On any such parcels not removed within 24 hours charges in accordance with the foregoing scale will accrue.

#### LICENSED LUGGAGE PORTERS.

Porters are licensed to assist presengers with their luggage at Spencer-street, Flinders-street, and Prince's bridge stations.

Rates of Charges.—Each porter shall be entitled to claim and be paid by the person employing him in respect of his services, at the following rates, and no more:—

The minimum charge shall be as for 100 ozs. or £100 in each case.

Gold Dust, and Silver in bars, from Melbourne to Williamstown or Port Melbourne, shall be charged 5s. per 1,000 ozs.

The above charges will be made, and the Gold Dust or Coin will be carried on condition of its being in charge of owners or an escort provided by them, and at their risk, and that the Commissioners will not be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, unless arising by reason of any defect or insufficiency in the carriage or truck provided by the Commissioners.

The Associated Banks (The Australasia, Victoria, London, Colonial, National, New South Wales, Union, and Commercial) pay an annual sum for the carriage of their Gold and Treasure on all lines. All Gold and Treasure in charge of representatives of these banks shall be passed free. The escort will pay the ordinary passenger fares, but no compartment will be reserved for them, unless specially ordered by the General Passenger and Freight Agent.

Returned empty Gold boxes for these banks shall be carried free by either Goods or Passenger trains.

#### 29. Commercial Travellers' Samples—

Commercial Travellers holding First-class ordinary or periodical tickets will be allowed 11 cwt. of Commercial Travellers holding First-class ordinary or periodical tickets will be allowed I cwt. free.

Any quantity in excess of those weights will be carried at one-half of the ordinary parcels rates—
minimum 28 lbs.; maximum, 12½ cwt. Over 12½ cwt. a carriage truck shall be employed, at 6d. per
truck per mile—minimum, 20 miles, and maximum weight, 50 cwt.

The Commissioners reserve the right to limit the quantity of commercial travellers' sample which may be carried on any passenger train should the conditions render it necessary.

Travellers shall produce an authority from the firms they represent.

Travellers can forward their samples by any ordinary train at these rates, notwithstanding they do not accompany them, on signing Risk Note (form P.L. 23).

do not accompany them, on signing Risk Note (form P.L. 23).

Samples can be booked through on a straight "up" or "down" route (but not for circular journeys) and the journey may be broken for a period not exceeding fourteen days. At stations where journey is broken, samples shall be carefully re-weighed.

They will be waybilled through to final destination by the station of original departure, the remark "journey broken" being made on way-bill and signed by the waybilling clerk. One of the forms (P.L. 22) will, at the same time, be filled up and hunded to the traveller, who will present it at each station where he stops, and he shall sign for his samples on each occasion of taking delivery. On presenting the samples again for transmission, the form shall be handed to the station-master, who will enter the next destination on it, initial it, and hand it back to the traveller. it back to the traveller.

Excess samples may be either prepaid or forwarded "to pay" at half parcel rates provided the traveller makes it known at the despatching station that he has excess weight to be invoiced, and arranges for the samples to be waybilled accordingly.

If, however, samples are found in excess at the end of a journey, full parcel rates will be charged.

These conditions will also apply to samples in excess of the quantity included on a periodical ticket ided it is booked beforehand. If found in excess at the conclusion of a journey, full parcels rates provided it is booked beforehand.

Travellers holding Yearly or Half-yearly tickets will be allowed the privilege of twenty-four hours free cloak-room for their samples, and the quantity franked by their ticket may precede or follow them by any train, without their signing Risk Note (Form P.L. 23).

Samples shall be properly booked at the Parcels Office at least fifteen minutes before the train departure time, every information being given as to whether the traveller accompanies them or not, and the proper forms filled up and signed.

Samples shall be contained in tins or leather packages of a handy size, and shall have the firm's name or initials legibly painted on them. If contained in cases or other packages in which merchandise for sale is generally packed, ordinary parcels rates will be charged.

Sample bicycles, see page 124.

Samples cannot be booked from one main line to another, with the journey to be broken at Melbourne. If it is intended to break the journey at Melbourne, the samples cannot be booked beyond that station, and will be booked afresh on resuming the journey.

Travellers shall claim their samples on arrival at destination; and if they do not wish to take immediate delivery, shall properly book them at the cloak-room, otherwise they will be treated as overlanded, and charged full parcels rates.

These regulations apply only to goods used bona fide as samples. If the goods or any portion of them be sold, ordinary parcels rates will be charged.

Any samples not booked in accordance with the foregoing Regulations will be charged as ordinary

Sample Type-writing Machines carried by Travellers.—Type-writing Machines are not considered as ordinarily coming under the heading of commercial travellers' samples, but in bond fide cases, where the machines are provided for exhibition as samples, a special permit will be issued at the office of the General Passenger and Freight Agent entitling commercial travellers to carry not more than two machines, the weight of which shall be included in the recognised luggage allowance

#### INTER-STATE LUGGAGE, PARCELS, ETC., RATES.

All carried subject to the provisions of Clauses 6, 17, and 15 of the General Parcels Rutes, payes 127 and 128.

Insurance of Parcels.—Parcels over £10 in value will be carried at owner's risk unless insured, the charge for which is £1 per cent. on the declared value. Parcels declared of more than £100 value will only be carried under special agreement.

On prepaid parcels for which the proper amount has not been paid, the undercharge shall be collected from the consignee at the prepaid rates.

Packed Parcels in hampers, crates, bags, cases, or other packages shall be charged quadruple the ordinary parcels rates, and the onus of proving that parcels are not packed shall rest with consignors or consignees.

# LIVE STOCK RATES.

CONDITIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF LIVE STOCK.—SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CARRIAGE. (See Goods Rates Book, page 8.)

1. The Commissioners will not be liable for the loss of or injury to any live stock in excess of the amounts specified hereunder, unless at the time of delivery thereof at the station or siding for the purpose of being carried, the value of such live stock shall have been declared by the consignor thereof, and the insurance rate as under for carriage shall have been paid to and accepted by the proper employé of the Commissioners.

On live stock insured at the risk of the Commissioners, power is reserved to them to regulate the number of animals which shall be carried in each truck, and the Commissioners will not be responsible for any loss or injury which may occur to such live stock during the loading or unloading, or during transit, when such loss or injury arises from fear or restiveness, or through such live stock being suffocated or trampled upon, and without negligence on the Commissioners' part.

The Commissioners' liability is limited as follows, viz.:—For any horse,  $\mathcal{L}_{50}$ . For any neat cattle, per head,  $\mathcal{L}_{20}$ . For any sheep, pig, dog, or other small animal, per head,  $\mathcal{L}_{1}$ .

Provided that in all cases any animal exceeding in value £100 shall be insured only under special agreement.

- 2. The Commissioners may decline to receive live stock for carriage on Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, or on any proclaimed holiday, or on any day immediately preceding such Sunday or holiday when through transit cannot be provided.
- 3. The Commissioners will not be bound to receive any live stock for carriage to or from any railway station which is not equipped with platforms, yards, and other suitable facilities for loading and unloading live stock, provided that, at the option of the Commissioners, live stock may be received for carriage to or from such places, if the owners accept all risk and undertake the loading and unloading, and sign the prescribed requisition form.
- 4. The number of animals must be so limited that the gross weight in any one vehicle shall not exceed its weight-carrying capacity.
- 5. No live stock shall be brought to any railway station except on the condition that the owner accepts all risk of injury to such live stock on the premises not arising from gross negligence on the part of the Commissioners, and the Commissioners shall be held free from all risk and responsibility, in respect of loss or damage to such live stock arising in connexion with loading or unloading, or from suffocation, or being trampled on, bruised or otherwise injured in transit, or from fire, or where the loss or injury arises from fear or restiveness, or from any other cause whatsoever, not arising from gross negligence as aforesaid; and all fastenings in either horse boxes or trucks, must be made secure by the consignor, upon whom shall rest the sole responsibility therefor.

sole responsibility therefor.

The Commissioners will not be responsible for any particular number of live stock specified as being loaded into any truck for carriage by rail.

- 6. The Commissioners do not guarantee, under any circumstances, the arrival or delivery of live stock at any particular time, by any particular train, or for any particular market, neither do they undertake to advise consignees of the arrival of live stock.
- on they undertake to advise consignees of the arrival of live stock.

  7. All live stock must be removed from the railway premises immediately after it is unloaded; or if left will remain at the owner's risk and expense, and may be sent to agistment or livery. The cost of such sending and of such agistment and livery shall be paid by the owner, and such cost must be paid on demand as part of the authorized charges; and such stock, if not removed within seven days, may be sold by auction by order of the Commissioners, and the proceeds applied in payment of all expenses incurred, and the balance thereof handed over to the owner on demand.

#### LIVE STOCK RATES—continued.

8. Rugs, bridles, saddles, or other trappings forwarded with horses, or other animals, are carried entirely at the risk of the owner, and the Commissioners accept no responsibility for damage done to these articles, unless forwarded and charged for as parcels.

9. When a vehicle is only partly occupied by a consignment, the Commissioners reserve the right to full it up to its full carrying capacity with other stock, if full truck has not been paid for.

10. Requisitions for the carriage of live stock by rail shall be made on the prescribed form, unless it be necessary to requisition therefor by telegram or letter, or through an employé of the Commissioners at any station or siding, when such requisition shall be subject to the same conditions as if made on the prescribed form.

11. The acceptance of any requisition or cash deposit by any employé of the Commissioners at any station or siding shall not be taken to imply that the required vehicles will be supplied until such acceptance is confirmed by the proper employé of the Commissioners.

12. Any requisition for the carriage of live stock which has been lodged with and accepted by the Commissioners cannot be withdrawn, neither can the required number of vehicles be reduced, nor the specified destination station altered, except as follows, viz.:—

(A) When notice is given of any desired withdrawal, reduction, or alteration, not less than three clear days (excluding Sundays) before the date specified for such live stock to be loaded, the requisition can be cancelled or modified as desired, conditionally on the forfeiture of the cash deposit lodged in respect of each vehicle so withdrawn, reduced, or altered

(B) But if less than three clear days' notice (excluding Sundays) be given, the full amount of the freight charges to the specified destination station in excess of the cash deposit lodged shall be paid in respect of each vehicle so withdrawn, reduced, or altered.

altered.

13. The Commissioners may refuse to carry any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, bird, or other live stock, which they reasonably believe to be diseased. No person shall wilfully or negligently drive or bring, or cause, or permit to be driven or brought upon or into any station yard, shed, or premises of the Commissioners any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, bird, or other live stock, having or suffering from any disease whatsoever. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

14. Horse boxes are subject to the same regulations in respect of penalties as are prescribed in condition No. 12 for live stock trucks.

Requisitions for horse boxes may be lodged with a Station-master, but such requisitions should be lodged not less than 48 hours prior to the time at which the loading is required to be done. A cash deposit of £1, or the actual amount of the freight charge if it be less than the deposit specified, must be lodged when the requisition is made. The consignors must ascertain whether or not the horse boxes can be provided before bringing the animals to the station to be loaded, as the acceptance of the deposit will not be held to imply that the horse boxes requisitioned for can be supplied.

Sporting Dogs, accompanying Passengers, shall be charged rate and a half for the return journey, dog's ticket to be available for same period as passenger's return ticket.

Dogs in Truck loads, 1s. per truck per mile. Minimum, 20s.

Hounds in Packs for hunting purposes sent in truck loads shall be charged single rate for double journey, viz., is. per truck per mile. Minimum, 20s.

Dogs sent to recognised Coursing Meetings shall be charged ordinary rates on forward journey, but will be returned free to the station whence they were sent on production of a certificate from the Secretary of the Coursing Club that they were entered and unsold.

\* Dogs in limited numbers may be sent in the van, provided attendants accompany and hold them; attendants to pay ordinary fares. When forwarded in large numbers a special vehicle may be provided for them. Senders should give notice beforehand of the number of dogs to be sent so that arrangements may be made.

Dogs, or Puppies not over six months old, in crates or cages in vans of Passenger trains, shall be charged 50 per cent. additional on Ordinary Parcels rates. The maximum rate for either one or two Puppies, not over six months old, in crates or cages, shall not exceed the mileage charge for a full-grown Dog.

Dogs shall be-provided with chains or other sufficient means to secure them, otherwise the Commissioners will not be responsible for their safety. They shall bear the address in full if unaccompanied by a passenger.

Reserved Compartments for Dogs.—Persons in charge of Dogs may have a Second Class compartment reserved for them by Passenger trains, provided there is sufficient accommodation in the train, on payment of Five Second Class fares (which will entitle any number of attendants up to five to travel) and the ordinary rates for the dogs. Any attendants over five to pay ordinary fares.

#### LIVE STOCK RATES—continued.

Where there is an unoccupied Second Class compartment, owners of Dogs may be allowed to take them into it on payment of ordinary fares for themselves and the Dogs, and without regard to the uninimum of five fares above stipulated, but in all cases the convenience of passengers shall be first consulted. When a compartment is reserved, the five fares shall be paid.

Ferrets, in boxes, shall be charged Ordinary Parcels rates.

#### CHARGES FOR THE CARRIAGE OF RACE-HORSES.-O.R.

A consignment on the proper form (No. P.L.18. See sample on page 149) shall be made out and signed by the consignor when consigning the horse or horses to the race meeting, the name and age of each lorse being duly given.

This same consignment note shall be presented and given up when booking for the return journey, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from the Secretary of the Racing Club that the horse or horses were entered for one or more races during the meeting. Should any doubt arise as to what constitutes a Race Meeting, the point will be decided by the Committee of the Victoria Racing Club.

Horses shall be at the station one hour before the due starting time of the train.

The journey may be broken with Race-horses on any line either going to or returning from races, but before resuming the journey a certificate shall be produced from the Secretary of each Racing Club showing that the horses have been entered for one or more races during the meeting in the locality where the journey was broken. Horses to be entitled to free carriage shall be returned within a fortnight after the conclusion of the Race Meeting at which they last raced, and not later than two months from the date of despatch from the original forwarding station.

In cases where two or three horses are loaded in one box and booked as one consignment to a race meeting they shall be returned together, or freight will be charged for each extra horse box used.

If the foregoing conditions be not complied with, the rates prescribed above will be IMPOSED FOR THE RETURN JOURNEY.

Note.—The rates quoted above for two or three horses or stallions loaded in one box apply to horse boxes with three stalls. Pace-horses for same owner sent in truck loads to race meetings shall be charged 1s. 3d. per truck per mile, minimum 35s., on the forward journey, and, if unfold, will be returned free on compliance with above conditions.

#### HUNTERS' HORSES.-O.R.

Hunters' Horses will be carried in horse boxes, at 6d. per mile for each horse on the forward journey; minimum, 10s. each horse; and will be returned free at the convenience of the Commissioners, on production of a certificate from the Master of the Hunt at any time within the hunting season (which extends from May to the end of September) showing that the horses took

part in Hunting.

Hunters' Horses may, at the convenience of the Commissioners, be carried in cattle trucks by Passenger trains, at Goods train rates, and returned free, as above.

Police horses carried to and from Public Demonstrations shall be charged single rate for the double journey on production of a certificate from Police Department, showing that the horses took part in the demonstration.

#### POLO PONIES.-O.R.

Ponies used in Polo Matches will, at the convenience of the Commissioners, be carried by passenger trains in horse boxes when such are available, and charged on the forward journey as if loaded in cattle truck, and conveyed by goods trains. One F, or each three (3) stalls in FF or FFF boxes to be considered as equivalent to a full cattle truck. They will be returned free on production of a certificate from the Secretary of the Polo Club showing that the ponies took part in the match.

The following minimums to apply to polo ponies loaded in horse boxes:-

#### CONCESSIONS TO OWNERS OR THEIR DROVERS.

The following concessions will be granted to Owners, or bond fide Drovers acting for them, travelling in charge of Live Stock:—

- (a) One second class return Drover's pass will be issued for not less than three full trucks belonging to one owner sent at one time, and two return passes for fourteen trucks, or a train load of not less than fourteen trucks, available for return for seven days. Each Owner or Drover travelling on a pass may take two dogs with him free of charge.
- (b) A return ticket at Holiday Excursion fare will be issued to Owner or Drover in charge of not less than one full truck load, available for return for seven days; form P.31 to be filled in, Goods Train Guarantee Form not required. (See sample of Form on page 173.)
- (c) Owner or Drover in charge of less than one full truck will be allowed the privilege of travelling in van of Goods train at second class fare; Goods Train Guarantee form to be signed.

In all cases Owners or Drovers who obtain above concessions shall travel by the same train as the stock under their care, otherwise they will require to pay ordinary fares.
